PRESEASON GAME 3: REDSKINS VS. RAVENS

JUST THE FACTS

• The Baltimore Ravens return to M&T Bank Stadium for their third preseason game when they host the Washington Redskins in another "Beltway Battle" contest. Kickoff for the Aug. 23 showdown is at 7:30 p.m. Baltimore (2-0) has produced victories in its opening two preseason games, while Washington brought a 1-0 mark into its Monday night (Aug. 18) tilt against the Cleveland Browns.

• In a game that featured TDs by the Ravens' offensive, defensive and special teams units, Baltimore upended the host Dallas Cowboys, 37-30, last Saturday night (Aug. 16). **OLB Courtney Upshaw** kicked off the game's scoring on Dallas' opening drive when he posted a 26-yard FR-TD. **WR/RS Deonte Thompson** then produced a marvelous 108-yard KOR-TD following a Cowboys' TD pass. **QB Joe Flacco**, who finished the contest 9-of-17 for 113 yards, completed 8 of his final 10 passes, including a 19-yard scoring rainbow to **WR Torrey Smith**. The Ravens rushed for 151 yards, including a game-high 59 and 1 TD by rookie **RB Lorenzo Taliaferro**.

• Guided by head coach **John Harbaugh**, Baltimore has advanced to the AFC Championship game in three of the past six seasons. Impressively, the Ravens, Colts, Patriots and Packers are the only teams to earn a playoff berth in five of the previous six seasons, with Baltimore also making six postseason appearances in the past eight years.

• The Ravens are looking to rebound from an 8-8 campaign in 2013 after missing the playoffs for the first time since John Harbaugh's 2008 arrival. How close were the Ravens to earning a postseason berth last year? They were tied 17-17 near the end of the third quarter in the season-ending loss at Cincinnati, needing only that victory to clinch their sixth-straight playoff berth. In a season filled with close contests, the 2013 Ravens played an NFL-high nine games decided by 3 points or less, producing a 5-4 record in those games.

• Baltimore ends the preseason at New Orleans on Aug. 28. The Ravens then open regular season play with three-straight division games: Sept. 7 vs. Cincinnati, Sept. 11 vs. Pittsburgh and Sept. 21 at Cleveland.

HARBS SAYS

"We used these first two games as building blocks, and we're making progress. We've stacked a lot of good days in training camp, and with the two games, plus the three days of practice against the 49ers, we are in a good position. We're improving, and we're coming together. We'll grind through the practices this week, and we'll be ready to play the Redskins at our place on Saturday."

INJURY REPORT

Standout **CB Lardarius Webb** (back) and **G Will Rackley** (concussion) missed the initial two preseason games, while **CB Asa Jackson** (ankle) was out for the game at Dallas. Players lost for the season include the following: **DE Kapron Lewis-Moore** (torn Achilles on Aug. 10), fourth-round draft pick **DE Brent Urban** (torn ACL on July 30) and veteran **CB Aaron Ross** (torn Achilles). Ross sustained the injury while taking his conditioning test prior to the start of training camp and has been placed on Injured Reserve. **DT Terrence Cody** is on the Physically Unable to Perform list while recovering from offseason hip surgery.

WR STEVE SMITH, SR. ON HIS IMPACT "It's been a good transition. ... What do I bring to the table? What do I have that is of value? I just look at these young guys, and I talked to [them] and said there's not too many more training camps that I'll be participating in, for obvious reasons. ... It just comes to a point where, obviously, we've got to be transparent with each other. We've got to be able to know each other's weaknesses, and we've got to [know] their strengths, and vice versa. That's really what I'm

working on with these guys, is being able to know when they need some help with some things, and also when I need some help with some things. That's been really fun and cool to go through."

WHAT'S GOING ON?

BALTIMORE GROUND GAME IS GRINDING-

When Gary Kubiak was hired as Baltimore's new offensive coordinator, he made it clear that his attack will emphasize a strong running game: "Offensively, that's where everything starts for us. We've got to be able to run the football to make the rest of it go."

Halfway through their preseason slate, the Ravens certainly have produced their fair share of success in the ground game, averaging 194.0 rushing yards in their opening two contests. Through games of Aug. 17, rookie fourth-round draft pick **RB Lorenzo Taliaferro** (130 yards and 1 TD on 29 carries) leads the league in rushing, while **RB Bernard Pierce** (92 yards and 1 TD on 17 carries) stands fifth.

What are your goals for the upcoming season? "I would like to help lead our running backs to be in the Top 5 in the NFL, as far as rushing goes. I would also like to lead the NFL in catches as a fullback."

What is your best attribute as a fullback? "I think it's my toughness. To play that position, you have to be tough. It's in the job assignment, so I think that bodes well there."

What have you done to improve as a blocker since last season? "I spent a lot of time working on body position and being explosive with my hands."

How have you adjusted to Gary Kubiak's new system? "It wasn't that it was difficult, because I think we did a good job of taking our time and not really rushing into it. We didn't overwhelm ourselves. But now that we're three weeks into training camp, it almost feels like second nature, because we've spent so much time on it."

Have you formed a special bond with anyone in particular since your rookie year? "We have a really tight team, so I think I've forged a lot of good bonds. I get teased that I hang out with the tight ends all the time, so you'll see me with Dennis Pitta and Owen Daniels a lot."

If you could go back in time, what advice would you give to your 18-year-old self? "I would say: 'Don't worry so much, be confident that your preparation will pay off and that things will work out."

Favorite karaoke song: "Sweet Caroline." Summer job as a teenager: "When I was a freshman in high school, I worked at McDonalds, and then every other summer I baled hay." QUOTH THE RAVENS BALTIMORE ROOTBALL

"When a young quarterback wins a ring – and claims Super Bowl MVP honors in the process – he immediately joins the conversation as an elite quarterback candidate. Thus, [Joe] Flacco deserves consideration, based on his ability to guide the Ravens to a championship with stellar play in the pocket (see: 11 touchdowns against zero interceptions in the 2012 postseason). With a strong career resume that includes a 62-34 regular-season record and five playoff berths in six seasons, it is hard to dispute Flacco's effectiveness as the Ravens' starter."

Fox Sports' Zac Jackson on reasons for optimism regarding the Ravens' 2014 campaign:

"They're still the Ravens; still a team with big-stage experience, big-name players and a winning culture. History says they've rarely been down two years in a row and will almost always have more hits than misses when it comes to the draft and free agency, and the focus certainly has been sharpened after going from the top of the mountain to missing the playoffs. ... If the playmakers are better, the Ravens can return to the league's top tier."

QB Joe Flacco on mastering the Ravens' new offense:

"It's a lot about the way Gary [Kubiak] teaches the offense. He makes it black and white. He knows what he wants, and he knows what he doesn't want, and I'm a guy who likes to run the offense based on the way the coordinator set it up to be run. So yes, it's a nice fit, because I trust myself to make the right decision. When it's very black and white on what you're supposed to do, it makes it very easy for me to go out there and do it. You're going through your progressions and getting the ball to the guy who is open and where the ball should be, and I love that."

TE Owen Daniels on the difference between Gary Kubiak, the head coach, and Gary Kubiak, the offensive coordinator:

"I never realized how good of a teacher he was. Being a head coach, you oversee a lot of things; you're not as hands on. Now I can see him as a teacher in the meeting rooms, installing the offense, on the practice field really coaching the guys up. He's a fantastic teacher. He's going to be a head coach again someday – I guarantee it. I'm just happy to see him as an OC. We're all lucky to have him as our OC right now."

MMQB.com's Andy Benoit on the Ravens' offseason signing of WR Steve Smith, Sr.:

"NFL free agency has become its own entity, popular enough to warrant three-hour television specials and keep the Twitter trolls busier than usual. Every roster move draws an almost embarrassing amount of scrutiny. So how was there not a bigger deal made about Steve Smith, Sr. signing with the Ravens? It wasn't just the most underrated signing of this offseason; in terms of 2014 impact; it was the best signing, period."

Head coach John Harbaugh on first-round draft pick LB C.J. Mosley's ability and strengths:

"He's a really sharp guy. He really understands football. One of the things we think is really important here [is football I.Q.] Our scouts do a good job of trying to figure out football I.Q. And what is that exactly? [It is] guys who really understand the game and pick things up quickly, and C.J. is one of those guys. You don't have to tell him [something] more than once, and he makes corrections quickly."

DE Chris Canty on what he saw from LB Daryl Smith and his impact on the Ravens' defense:

"He's a very smooth linebacker, very effective. [He] has a good feel for the game, understands the defense and can put himself and other players in position to make plays. I think that's one of the best things that he does, making sure that he coordinates everything and gets everybody set. He just has a knack for being in the right place at the right time to be able to make that big play for us. It's great to be able to line up with a guy like that – that has that kind of command and that has that kind of feel for the game and for the defense."

Head coach John Harbaugh on how OLB Pernell McPhee has looked during training camp:

"Pernell has really done well. Pernell McPhee is a big, physical edge-setter. Of course, I think he could've done better [last year]. We had that conversation already. To me, Pernell McPhee can be a premier outside [linebacker] in the National Football League. That's our ambition for him this year, and I know that's what he expects of himself."

ESPN analyst and former NFL WR Keyshawn Johnson on WR Torrey Smith's place in Baltimore:

"Torrey is a good kid, and that means a lot. You want people that represent your organization the right way. You want to be proud of your guys. If you can find someone who can play, and he's a good person, then you make sure you hold onto him."

ESPN.com's Jamison Hensley on T Eugene Monroe's value:

"Although Monroe isn't a Pro Bowl blocker, he's the best left tackle that the Ravens have had since Jonathan Ogden retired. He's consistent, athletic, hard-working and young. At 27, he can be the long-term answer to Joe Flacco's blind side."

RAVENS' TWO-STRAIGHT TOP 5'S

In 2013, senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin of *The Dallas Morning News* ranked the Ravens' special teams unit No. 5 in the league in his annual comprehensive ratings system that is based on 22 categories, assigning points according to each standing — 1 for best, 32 for worst. In 2012, Gosselin ranked the Ravens' unit No. 2 in the NFL, just behind the Vikings, who finished first.

SPECIAL FORCES



Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg**, a 36-year coaching veteran, has guided a strong special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008.

• In 2013, Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker** set franchise records in FGs made (38) and FGs attempted (41).

Going 38-of-41 on FGAs, Tucker produced a franchise-record 140 points (tied for sixth in NFL), while his 6 FGs of 50+ yards tied (several players) for the NFL's most. Tucker kicked an impressive 3 game-winning FGs on the season, including a 61-yarder at Detroit.

• Additionally, in 2013, the Ravens' kickoff return unit averaged 26.4 yards per return, ranking second in the NFL. Baltimore's punt return unit averaged 14.2 yards per return, good for the NFL's third-best mark. The Ravens posted an NFL-high 20 punt returns of 20+ yards.

• In 2012's Super Bowl-winning season, the Ravens' special teams units excelled. Led by Pro Bowl **RS Jacoby Jones**, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in kickoff return average (27.3), also setting a team record. Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR) and averaged an NFL-best 30.7 yards per kickoff return. Jones also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in Super Bowl history with his 108-yard KOR-TD.

• Prior to Baltimore, Rosburg built a successful NFL special teams resume both with the Browns (2001-06) and Falcons (2007). Under his leadership, Cleveland's special teams units were consistently ranked among the NFL's best. Over a five-year span (2002-06), the Browns' special teams were ranked as the top NFL unit in Rick Gosselin's annual comprehensive special teams report.

• Four Ravens players have earned Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012) and K Justin Tucker (2013).

• Dating back to 2011, Baltimore has produced 6 total kick return TDs (3 PR & 3 KOR), tying (Den., Min. & Ten.) for the NFL's most.

A STRONG RETURN

COORDINATORS NOTES

THE KUBIAK ATTACK



Gary Kubiak, a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent the past eight seasons (2006-13) as head coach of the Houston Texans, was hired as the Ravens' offensive coordinator on Jan. 27. Under his guidance, Houston earned back-to-back AFC South crowns from 2011-12 and two playoff berths. Kubiak

owns a Texans' franchise-record 63 total wins, posting a 63-66 overall mark (61-64 regular season, 2-2 postseason).

• Prior to his time with the Texans, Kubiak spent 11 seasons (1995-2005) as the Denver Broncos' offensive coordinator, also coaching the quarterbacks during his first eight seasons. Under his guidance, Denver's offense reached new heights behind the likes of QB John Elway, TE Shannon Sharpe and RB Terrell Davis, with the team earning seven postseason trips and back-to-back Super Bowl titles (1997-98) during that span. As Denver's offensive coordinator, the Broncos averaged NFL bests in yards per game (365.0) and points per game (25.2) from 1995-2005.

TEXANS SUCCESS

Under **Gary Kubiak**, the Texans earned their Top 6 all-time offensive outputs in scoring, total offense and passing yards from 2007-12. During this time, the Texans also boasted the franchise's Top 3 rushing outputs, including the NFL's No. 2 ground attack in 2011 when they posted a franchise-record 153.0 yards per game. From 2008-12, Kubiak's offense was one of only two teams (Denver) to have its total offense, passing offense and rushing offense each rank in the Top 5 at least once during that span.

Ravens new offensive coordinator **Gary Kubiak** has either been an OC (Denver Broncos, 1995-2005) or head coach (Houston Texans, 2006-13) for 19 NFL seasons. During these 19 seasons...

• Kubiak's offenses have ranked among the NFL's Top 10 scoring units 14 times.

• Additionally, a Kubiak-led attack has ranked in the NFL's Top 10 in yards per game on 13 separate occasions. (Impressively, Kubiak's offensive units have finished in the Top 5 in yards per game 11 times during his 19 seasons as an OC or HC.)

Rick Dennison, the Ravens' new quarterbacks coach, has been with Kubiak nearly every step of the way, serving on Denver's coaching staff in various capacities from 1995-2009 and as the Texans' offensive coordinator from 2010-13. In addition to Kubiak and Dennison, the following offensive coaches are new to Baltimore: **Brian Pariani** (TEs), who coached both Denver's (1995-2004) and Houston's (2006-13) tight ends, **Bobby Engram** (WRs), who played 14 NFL seasons at wideout, and **Thomas Hammock**, (RBs) an 11-year college coaching veteran.

PEES LEADS THE "D"

Dean Pees, an 11-year NFL-coaching veteran, was promoted to defensive coordinator on Jan. 27, 2012, after guiding the Ravens' LBs for two seasons. He is the sixth "D" coordinator in franchise history. Pees, who was New England's "D" coordinator from 2006-09, leads a Baltimore unit that in 2013 finished with

the following NFL rankings: points (22.0 ppg, 12th), net yards (335.5 ypg, 12th), passing (230.1 ypg, 12th) and rushing (105.4 ypg, 11th).

SMITH WAS SCINTILLATING

WR Torrey Smith excelled in 2013. With 6 receptions for 121 yards in Week 5 at Miami, Smith became the first Raven since Qadry Ismail in 1999 to post back-to-back 100-yard receiving games. (Ismail had three straight that year.)

• In Week 15 at Detroit, Smith (37) moved past Derrick Mason (35) to produce a franchise record in receptions of 25-or-more yards.

• Smith had 13 catches gaining 25-plus yards in 2013, just 1 shy of the franchise single-season record set by WR Michael Jackson (14) in 1996.

• Smith's 1,128 receiving yards in 2013 were the second most in Ravens single-season franchise history (Jackson – 1,201 in 1996).

• Smith, who produced a 17.4-yard receiving average in 2013, pulled in a 42-yard bomb in Week 16 vs. NE, marking his eighth catch of 40-or-more yards in 2013.

Head Coach John Harbaugh on Torrey Smith: "In my opinion, he's a premier player in the National Football League. ... He works his rear end off. He has a great attitude. You have to pull the guy back. You have to grab him and say, 'Hey, man. Take a blow!' You have to do that, because he's like a horse – he'll run himself until his heart explodes. He'll do it. He's just a great, great young man."

TORREY'S COURAGEOUS NIGHT

WR Torrey Smith played in the 2012 Week 3 Sunday night victory over New England after his brother, 19-year-old Tevin Jones, passed away in a motorcycle accident that morning. Smith posted 6 catches for 127 yards and 2 TDs in the come-from-behind win, producing the third 100-yard game of his young career.

SMITH BIG IN SUPER BOWL RUN

In the 2012 thrilling, double-overtime Divisional Playoff win at Denver (38-35 on 1/12/13), **WR Torrey Smith** caught 59-yard and 32-yard TD passes, helping mark the first game in NFL playoff history that a QB (**Joe Flacco**) threw 2 TDs of 59-plus yards (the other being to **WR Jacoby Jones** on a 70-yarder). In the 2012 postseason, Smith recorded a 21.2 yards-per-catch average, reeling in 11 passes for 233 yards.

LONG BALL LOVE

WR Torrey Smith ranks first in Ravens franchise history in yards-percatch average, posting a 17.2 mark over the three seasons in which he's caught 164 passes for 2,824 yards and 19 TDs. Dating back to his rookie campaign (2011), his 17.2 average ranks fifth in the NFL.

Ravens **CB Jimmy Smith**, the team's 2011 first-round draft pick (27th overall), was outstanding in 2013. Smith totaled 16 passes defensed (third most on the team), adding 2 INTs, 2 forced fumbles and 58 total tackles in his first season as a regular starter. In the season's final 15 games, the Ravens allowed

just 18 passing TDs, tied (New Orleans) for the NFL's sixth fewest. Baltimore also yielded 215.7 net passing yards a game during this span, the NFL's eighth-best mark.

THE DOMINANT DT



One of the NFL's most disruptive forces, **DT Haloti Ngata** was named to his fifth Pro Bowl in 2013. Perhaps the NFL's most athletic defensive tackle, Ngata stops the run (497 career tackles), rushes the passer (23.5 career sacks) and can even drop into coverage (3 career INTs).

Baltimore has a history of strong run defense, and with Ngata's help since 2006, has been consistently sturdy on the ground.

Two-time Pro Bowl TE Owen Daniels, who signed with the Ravens this offseason, owns the NFL's longest active streak of consecutive games (88) with a reception by a TE. Daniels, one of five AFC TEs to produce more than 50 catches in two of the past three seasons, boasts receptions in 97 of his 100 career contests as well. Daniels has established

In 2013, **K Justin Tucker** earned his first Pro Bowl honor by setting team records in FGs made (38) and FGs attempted (41), with both figures tying (Stephen Gostkowski) for the NFL's most. Tucker had a franchise-record 140 points (tied for sixth in NFL), while his 6 FGs of 50+ yards tied (several players) for the NFL's most.

• In addition to his Pro Bowl honor, Tucker was named Special Teams Player of the Month (November) and AFC Special Teams Player of the Week three times.

• Tucker made 33-straight FGs at one point during the 2013 season, ranking as the NFL's fourth-longest streak of all time.

• His 6 FGs made on 12/16 at Detroit set a team record and were a single-game NFL high in 2013. Against the Lions, he became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- and 60-yard range in a game.

• Tucker kicked 3 game-winning FGs in 2013, including a franchiserecord 61-yarder at Detroit. (He now has 6-career game-winners.)

• He is now 24-of-26 during his career when the Ravens are losing a game, and he's 16-of-17 when Baltimore is down by 7 points or less. The Pro Bowler is 12-of-13 in the last 2 minutes of a game during his career, and he's 22-of-24 in the fourth quarter.

Since moving training camp to the Under Armour Performance Center in Owings Mills three years ago, the Ravens have remained committed to hosting special groups from the surrounding Baltimore communities during these practices. Among such notable groups were veterans from the Wounded Warrior Project, an organization offering programs, services and events to help wounded vets navigate life at home, and Athletes Serving Athletes, a nonprofit organization that pairs volunteer athletes with individuals living with disabilities enabling them to compete in road races. RAVENS LAUNCH CAPOLOGIST PROGRAM

Earlier this summer, the Ravens launched LifeJourney Capologist, an innovative program that will allow middle and high school students to simulate managing the Ravens' salary cap. In conjunction with the organization LifeJourney, the Capologist program exposes students to real-life opportunities and career interests for them to pursue. Over 500,000 Maryland middle and high schools students will be eligible to use the program by signing up online. The program will be integrated into their current math coursework and will be available during after-school programs. Ravens senior vice president of football administration **Pat Moriarty** heads the program. To the best of the Ravens' knowledge, they are the first professional sports team to create a simulation and technology application to the salary cap.
