JUST THE FACTS

- Riding a two-game winning streak in what has been an injury-riddled and somewhat bizarre season, the Baltimore Ravens (4-7) square off against the Miami Dolphins (4-7) in Week 13. Kickoff for this Dec. 6 game is set for 1 p.m. at Sun Life Stadium, where Baltimore has won four-consecutive contests (including playoffs) during the **John Harbaugh** Era.
- Playing their first game since the start of the 2008 season without **QB Joe Flacco**, the Ravens had new heroes emerge when they beat the Browns, 33-27, on Monday night in Cleveland. As with the first 10 games of the Ravens' season, the outcome was in doubt until the final series. **DE Brent Urban** blocked Cleveland K Travis Coons' 51-yard, game-winning FG attempt with 3 seconds to go. **S Will Hill III** then scooped up the ball and raced 64 yards for the winning TD as time expired. (Urban was playing in his first NFL game after missing his rookie year and most of 2015 with knee and arm injuries.) The Browns had tied the game at 27-27 with 1:47 remaining when backup QB Austin Davis hit WR Travis Benjamin for a 42-yard TD. In his first start since 2013, **QB Matt Schaub** threw 2 TD passes but also 2 INTs, one of which was returned for a Browns' TD.
- All 11 Ravens games have been decided by no more than 8 points this season, making Baltimore the first team in NFL history to have each of its first nine, 10 and 11 games decided by 8-or-fewer points.
- In all seven defeats, the Ravens have had an opportunity to tie the game or take a lead in the final two minutes of play, or like in Week 10 vs. Jacksonville, they led with a second to go but lost when time expired.
- Baltimore's seven losses have been decided by 32 points, producing the NFL's second-slimmest average margin of defeat at 4.57 points (Cincy, 3.5).
- Five of Baltimore's first seven games this season were on the road, with the Ravens dropping close contests at Denver, at Oakland, at San Francisco and at Arizona. In addition to Monday's win at Cleveland, Baltimore won in primetime during an overtime thriller at Pittsburgh on Oct. 1.

COACH HARBS SAYS

"We're excited with our young players, the ones getting extended playing time as we move through this season. We tell them how good they are, because they are good. We're excited for them. Some are getting opportunities they didn't anticipate. They're excited for this playing time. They are showing everyone they belong in the NFL. Maybe some good can come from what we are experiencing this season. Moms and dads can point to the Ravens and say, 'Look at them. They're going through unexpected tough times, and they keep finding a way to hang in there and keep battling.'"

WHAT'S GOING ON?

RAVENS SPECIALISTS CONTINUE TO SHINE

All four Baltimore victories this season have come courtesy of clutch plays by the Ravens' special teams unit. **K Justin Tucker**, the second-most accurate kicker in NFL history, has hit 3 game-winning FGs, while last Monday's victory at Cleveland came at the hands of a blocked FG (**DE Brent Urban**) that **S Will Hill III** returned 64 yards for a contest-clinching TD as time expired. Additionally, in that game, rookie **RS Kaelin Clay** returned a punt 82 yards for a TD. Here are several key notes about Baltimore's 2015 standout special teams unit:

- Ravens have blocked a kick (2 PATs, 2 FGs and 1 punt) in five-straight games, a feat that hasn't been accomplished since 1983 (Atlanta Falcons)
- Ravens rank No. 1 in team PR average (13.7) and No. 9 in KOR average (25.6)
- **P Sam Koch's** 44.3 net average ranks No. 1 in the NFL, and his 47.7 gross is fifth
- Tucker's 51 KO touchbacks and 89.5% TB percentage rank No. 1 in the NFL

NOTE THE QUOTE

QB MATT SCHAUB ON STEPPING UP IN PLACE OF INJURED PLAYERS

"That's part of this league. No matter what role you're in, what position you are on the team - whether you're a starter, you're a backup - you have to prove every day that you belong. Whether you've played two years, 12 years, 18 [years], you have to prove every day that you still can do it, and you can play at a high level and compete. That has been my approach each and every day."

INJURY REPORT

- **TE Maxx Williams** (concussion) left Monday's Browns game and did not return, while starting O-linemen **LT Eugene Monroe** (shoulder) and **LG Kelechi Osemele** (knee, second-straight game) did not play.
- Eleven starters have missed a combined 33 games this season, including **DE Chris Canty** (calf - 4), **QB Joe Flacco** (knee - 1), **RB Justin Forsett** (arm - 1), **TE Crockett Gillmore** (calf - 2), **S Kendrick Lewis** (knee - 1), **LT Eugene Monroe** (concussion/shoulder - 5), **G Kelechi Osemele** (knee - 2), **WR Steve Smith Sr.** (Achilles/back - 4), **OLB Terrell Suggs** (Achilles - 10), **CB Lardarius Webb** (thigh - 1) and **C Jeremy Zuttah** (pectoral - 2).
- The Ravens have 17 players on Injured Reserve, including Flacco, Forsett, Smith Sr., Suggs, Zuttah, **WR/RS Michael Campanaro** (back), **CB Will Davis** (knee), first-round draft choice **WR Breshad Perriman** (knee), who was injured on the first day of training camp, and **RB Lorenzo Taliaferro** (foot). Former starter **TE Dennis Pitta** (hip) is on the Physically Unable to Perform (PUP) list and will not return this year.

Since he entered the NFL in 2006, **OLB Elvis Dumervil's** 31 games with at least 1.5 sacks tie for the NFL's most. "Doom" has two such games this season – including his 1.5-sack effort in Monday's win at Cleveland – to help increase his team-high 6 sacks. In the 2014 win at Miami, he registered 3.5 sacks in the game as part of Baltimore's 6 total QB drops.

SPOTLIGHT: KAMAR AIKEN

What is it like to play in your hometown of Miami, growing up just a few miles from Sun Life Stadium, as a professional athlete? "It's fun. It's always good to go back home. It feels like high school again. I have a lot of fans down there that support me, so it's always fun to go back and be able to play the game in front of them and my family."

What advice has Steve Smith Sr. given to you during his time as a Raven? "How to approach the game every day as far as practices, how to take care of your body, doing the little stuff, film study – the little details that we might forget. 'Grandpa Steve' is what we call him, and he always calls us and tries to critique us on little stuff. He gives advice on anything small [and tells us] to pay attention to the little details."

How has WRs coach Bobby Engram helped develop your game? "Bobby we can relate to, because he played the game, and he played the game for so long. Everybody is always all ears when he is talking to us, because we know he played the position. He understands what it takes to be successful at this level. He's probably one of the best coaches I've had since I've been in the league."

How is the team able to stick together despite facing adversity this season? "Stay the course. We know we're not used to having a losing record; we're used to winning. We're going to stay the course, continue to work hard, and that's all you can do to set yourself up for success."

After interning with the Secret Service and FBI in the offseason, what division of these departments most interests you? "I wouldn't do Secret Service, because it's too time consuming. FBI, I would be a special agent out in the field. I can't be in an office. I would have to be out there in the field undercover and stuff like that."

Since you are certified in scuba diving, is there a place in the world on your bucket list to explore? "Probably Aruba. It's something that growing up you're always saying you want to go there, and you hear a lot of people talk about it."

Which Raven is the... Toughest: "Marshal Yanda." **Most creative:** "Justin Tucker." **Most thrifty:** "Me. I'm the cheapest person you'll find." **Best chef:** "Morgan [Cox] makes popcorn – really good popcorn. He has his own recipe, but he doesn't want to tell us." **Most stylish:** "Elvis [Dumervil]. He goes a little over and beyond." (laughter) **A big brother:** "Steve [Smith Sr.]. Elvis is one too, because I've known Elvis since I was probably seven or eight [years old]. He went to school with my brother, so I've known him since I was small."

With 4 points on Sunday at Miami, **K Justin Tucker** will become the fastest kicker in NFL history to record 500 career points. "Tuck" has produced 496 points in 59 games since he signed as a rookie free agent with the Ravens in 2012.

- Tucker is the second-fastest kicker in NFL history to reach the 400-point milestone, doing so in his 48th game – the 2014 season finale vs. Cleveland. (Stenerud is the lone kicker to hit 400 faster than "Tuck," doing so in 47 games.)

John Harbaugh on the preparation and skill needed to have five-straight games with a blocked kick:

“To have something like that happen, I don’t think you can say that’s something you plan out and prepare for. I will give credit to our guys starting with [special teams coordinator/associate head] coach [Jerry] Rosburg and Chris Horton, our assistant special teams coach. Those guys are phenomenal. They do an amazing job of coaching technique. Then, our leadership in the room with guys like Albert McClellan and Anthony Levine and others who do a great job, just taking that room and making it something they can be proud of and they believe in. We played hard on special teams [Monday Night]. I think it goes back to leadership. We have a lot of good special teams players; we’re very well coached.”

BaltimoreRavens.com columnist John Eisenberg on the Ravens’ special teams unit:

“It’s been a rough year for the Ravens’ defense and also for the offense at times, but their special teams units are nothing short of sensational in 2015. ... Specialists Justin Tucker and Sam Koch are among the game’s best. Baltimore ranks among the league leaders in many coverage and return categories. The one thing they hadn’t done in 2015 was reach the end zone on a return, and [Kaelin] Clay checked that off the list with a blazing [punt] runback down the right sideline [at Cleveland]. The Ravens have lacked playmaking on offense and defense this season, but not on their special teams.”

OLB Elvis Dumervil on the Ravens’ thrilling win at Cleveland:

“It was great to be over on the sidelines [celebrating]. It was a long time coming. It’s been kind of [a tough] story all year. I think we’re maturing as a team and trying to really learn how to win. [It was a] great effort by everybody.”

Rookie WR/RS Kaelin Clay on his 82-yard PR-TD at Cleveland in just his second-career NFL game.

“It feels good, but you never have any satisfaction in it because you know you can do better, and you know you can do more. That’s always been my mindset. I’ve never been happy with certain results. I wanted to get another one and another one and another after that. For me, it kind of feels like I’ve taken some weight off my shoulders. I’m going to have to prove it every week now. That’s my goal, to be smart with the ball and just go out there and provide a spark for my team.”

ESPN.com’s Jamison Hensley on the Ravens’ no-quit mentality and approach this season:

“[The Monday night Cleveland] victory, especially in this wild fashion, shows how this team has refused to give up on [head coach John] Harbaugh. This season, the Ravens have lost key starters to injuries (quarterback Joe Flacco, wide receiver Steve Smith, linebacker Terrell Suggs and running back Justin Forsett), and they’ve lost a game on an official’s error. Still, Baltimore has found a way to stay in every game this season, which is a testament to the effort Harbaugh demands from his players. All 11 of the Ravens’ games have been decided by eight points or fewer, which extends their NFL record.”

Browns head coach Mike Pettine on FB Kyle Juszczyk:

“You can see he has become a bigger part of [the offense], and for good reason. He made some plays against us last year, he made some plays against us in the first game, and he’s a guy we certainly have to be aware of. I have a lot of respect for him, and I think he’s one of the better fullbacks in the league.”

Offensive coordinator Marc Trestman on the veteran experience QB Matt Schaub brings to the offense:

“I think it’s big. No. 1, he’s a decorated veteran in the National Football League. He has a lot of familiarity with the offense. He’s a mature quarterback who’s played in all different environments, and our players know that – and that gives them all a sense of confidence – and you can see it [in practice].”

G Marshal Yanda on T Rick Wagner’s continued development:

“He’s really grown into a consistent player that plays at a high level. I think Rick has done a great job working every day, getting better, and his consistent play is there. He’s not up and down; he’s definitely taken into that role where he has become a consistently good player. [There is] nothing but [getting] better for him; he’s going to keep getting better and better. He’s playing at a high level – he is.”

TE Crockett Gillmore on how the team is chasing perfection:

“Our aspirations, the way we practice, we’re striving for perfection every day. I don’t feel there’s any more sense of urgency from the beginning of the season to now. You’re always chasing that goal. Your expectations and what we need to do [doesn’t change]. If that’s what we need to do to win, then we’re going to have to pull it out that way.”

Playing their first game since the start of the 2008 season without **QB Joe Flacco** starting under center, the Ravens had new heroes help beat the host Browns, 33-27, last Monday at FirstEnergy Stadium. As with the first 10 games of the Ravens' season, the outcome was in doubt until the final series. **DE Brent Urban** blocked Cleveland K Travis Coons' 51-yard, game-winning FG attempt with 3 seconds left in the game, and then **S Will Hill III** scooped up the ball and raced 64 yards for the winning touchdown as time expired. Urban was playing in his first NFL game after missing his rookie year and most of 2015 with knee and arm injuries. The Browns had tied the game at 27-27 with 1:47 remaining when backup QB Austin Davis hit WR Travis Benjamin, who had gotten behind Hill III, for a 42-yard TD. The Browns put themselves in a position to win after CB Tramon Williams stole a **QB Matt Schaub** pass at Baltimore's 46-yard line at the 50-second mark. Three plays later, the Browns were at the Ravens' 33 setting up for the winning FG that was eventually blocked. Schaub, making his first start since 2013 when he was with the Houston Texans, threw 2 TD passes and an INT that was returned for a Browns' TD. Baltimore jumped to a 10-0 first-quarter lead after an 82-yard punt return for a TD by **WR/RS Kaelin Clay** and a 49-yard **K Justin Tucker** FG. A 31-yard FG by Coons put the Browns on the scoreboard in the second quarter. But, the Ravens came right back with a Schaub-to-**RB Javorius Allen** 13-yard TD to make the score 17-3. Cleveland closed the gap to 17-13 at the half with a QB Josh McCown scramble and 10-yard TD toss to WR Marlon Moore and a 21-yard Coons' FG. The Browns took their only lead of the game, 20-17, on LB Karlos Dansby's theft of Schaub. Dansby raced 52 yards for the score. Schaub bounced right back, leading the Ravens on a 12-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a 10-yard TD pass to **WR Kamar Aiken** to make the score 24-20 after three quarters. A 35-yard Tucker FG extended the Ravens' advantage to 27-20 with 9:05 left in the final period. Schaub completed 20 of 34 for 232 yards, while Browns starter McCown was 21-of-38 for 212 before leaving the game with 8:29 remaining with a shoulder injury. Aiken caught 6 for 80 for Baltimore, while the game's leading receiver, Browns TE Gary Barnidge, grabbed seven for 91.

Ravens 28, Dolphins 13 • Dec. 7, 2014 • Miami, FL

Despite a slow first-quarter start, the Ravens rallied for a 28-13 come-from-behind victory at Miami. The Dolphins jumped to a 10-0 lead, limiting Baltimore to three-straight three-and-outs and just 22 yards in the initial period. In the final three quarters, the Ravens out-gained the hosts 425 to 161 yards, outscoring the Dolphins 28-3. Miami took a 3-0 lead with a K Caleb Sturgis 46-yard field goal. After another three-and-out for the Ravens, the Dolphins scored their only touchdown of the game on QB Ryan Tannehill's 3-yard bullet to WR Brian Hartline. The Ravens closed the gap to 10-7 at the end of the first half with a 12-play, 97-yard scoring drive that ended with a 1-yard **QB Joe Flacco** strike to **WR Steve Smith Sr.** The Ravens made it back-to-back scoring series when they took their first possession of the third quarter to the end zone for a 14-10 lead on a Flacco-to-**WR Kamar Aiken** 13-yard TD. Miami closed the gap to 14-13 early in the fourth quarter on Sturgis' second FG (34 yards). The Ravens responded with another long TD drive, this one ending with a **RB Justin Forsett** 2-yard TD that made the score, 21-13. Controlling the game and the clock, the Ravens assembled another TD series on their next possession. Flacco's 1-yard TD plunge provided the final 28-13 margin. Flacco finished with 25 completions on 33 attempts and threw 1 INT to go with his pair of TD throws. Smith Sr. caught 7 passes for 70 yards, while Aiken, who grew up just a few miles from Sun Life Stadium, grabbed 6 for 65. Forsett rushed 13 times for 71 yards, part of the 183 yards on the ground for Baltimore. The Ravens sacked Tannehill 6 times, including 3.5 by **OLB Elvis Dumervil**, who set a new single-season team mark with 16 sacks. **OLB Terrell Suggs** added 1.5 QB takedowns.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. THREE-STRAIGHT TOP 3s

In 2014, senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin of *The Dallas Morning News* ranked the Ravens' special teams unit No. 5 in the league in his annual comprehensive ratings system that is based on 22 categories, assigning points according to each standing — 1 for best, 32 for worst. In 2013, Gosselin also ranked the Ravens' unit No. 5, and in 2012, he awarded them the No. 2 spot (behind Minnesota).

RAVENS THRIVE W/ ROSBURG



Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg**, a 36-year coaching veteran, has guided a strong special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008.

- In 2014, **P Sam Koch** produced the NFL's No. 3 gross average (47.4) and No. 1 net average (43.3), setting the Ravens' single-season records for each. Dating back to 2014, Koch's 47.5 gross average ranks No. 2 in the NFL (min. 65 punts), while his 43.7 net average is No. 1.

- Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's second-most FGs (121) since entering the league in 2012. "Tuck" has connected on 121 of 138 FGAs to post an 87.7 success rate, the second-best mark in league history. He was 29-of-34 (84.4%) in 2014, with his 5 misses coming from 54, 54, 55, 57 & 64 (blocked). In 2013, Tucker set franchise records in FGs made (38) and FGs attempted (41). Going 38-of-41 on FGAs, he produced a franchise-record 140 points.

- In 2012's Super Bowl season, the Ravens' ST units excelled. Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in kickoff return average (27.3), also setting a team record. Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR) and averaged an NFL-best 30.7 yards per kickoff return. Jones also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in Super Bowl history with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's Week 9 game at Pittsburgh, Jones added another 108-yard KOR-TD to his stellar resume and now has 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards during his career.)

- Impressively, Baltimore has ranked in the NFL's Top 5 in KOR average four times over the past seven seasons.

- Prior to Baltimore, Rosburg built a successful NFL special teams resume with both the Browns (2001-06) and Falcons (2007). Under his leadership, Cleveland's special teams units were consistently ranked among the NFL's best. Over a five-year span (2002-06), the Browns' special teams were ranked as the top NFL unit in Rick Gosselin's annual comprehensive special teams report.

- Four Ravens players have earned Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012) and **K Justin Tucker** (2013).

A STRONG RETURN

Since 2008, when **Jerry Rosburg** became the Ravens' special teams coordinator, Baltimore owns the NFL's No. 1 KOR average (25.4).

TRESTMAN TAKES THE "O"



Marc Trestman was hired as the Ravens' offensive coordinator on Jan. 20, replacing Gary Kubiak. Trestman, the former Chicago Bears' head coach (2013-14), is a 31-year coaching veteran who has 20 years of NFL coaching experience, including eight as an offensive coordinator (see chart below).

During his time in the NFL, he has helped teams to eight playoff appearances, two conference championship games and a Super Bowl berth (XXXVII as offensive coordinator of the Raiders).

- In the five seasons prior to his Chicago arrival, Trestman was a head coach in the Canadian Football League, leading the Montreal Alouettes to back-to-back Grey Cup Championships in 2009 and 2010. He was named the CFL's Coach of the Year in 2009.
- In its first year (2013) under Trestman, Chicago's "O" posted several records by gaining a franchise-best 6,109 net yards. The 2013 Bears also finished second in team history with 445 points.
- QBs Jay Cutler and Josh McCown both had career years in 2013, with McCown setting the single-season franchise record in passer rating (109.0) and completion pct. (66.5), while Cutler finished second in Bears single-season history with a 63.1 completion %.
- In 2013, Pro Bowl RB Matt Forte ranked second in the NFL with 1,339 rushing yards and was third in yards from scrimmage (1,933), while Pro Bowl WRs Alshon Jeffery & Brandon Marshall were sixth and 11th, respectively, in NFL receiving yards.

PEES LEADS THE "D"



Dean Pees, a 12-year NFL-coaching veteran, was promoted to defensive coordinator on Jan. 27, 2012, after guiding the Ravens' LBs for two seasons. He is the sixth "D" coordinator in franchise history. Pees, who was New England's "D" coordinator from 2006-09, leads a Baltimore unit that in 2014 allowed the NFL's sixth-fewest points (18.9) and the eighth-fewest yards (336.9) per game. Baltimore was one of five teams (Buf., Det., KC & Sea.) to rank in the Top 8 in both points and yards allowed.

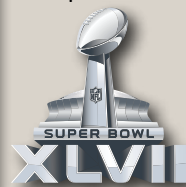

- In Baltimore's last six playoff games (5-1 record), Flacco has thrown 17 TDs and 2 INTs. Completing 119 of 200 passes for 1,691 yards, he owns a magnificent 111.1 QB rating.

- Flacco has thrown at least 2 TDs in eight-straight playoff games, marking the longest streak in NFL postseason history.

Ravens **OLB Elvis Dumervil** played remarkably well in 2014. Tying a career high from 2009, "Doom" ranked third in the NFL in sacks (17) and set the Ravens' single-season sacks record. Impressively, Dumervil's -127.5 sacks yards in 2014 ranked as the league's second most, behind J.J. Watt's 140.0 on 20.5 sacks. Over the past three years, Dumervil has registered 32.5 QB drops, a mark that ranks fourth in the NFL (see shaded chart below).

The first-ever Ravens' rookie to earn Pro Bowl honors, **LB C.J. Mosley**, Baltimore's 2014 first-round draft choice (17th overall), was the NFL's only player with at least 125 tackles, 3 sacks and 2 interceptions last season. Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month in October of 2014, Mosley topped his class with 129 tackles (eighth in the NFL).

CB Jimmy Smith, one of the NFL's top cornerbacks and the Ravens' 2011 first-round pick, suffered a foot injury last season in Week 8 at Cincy and was placed on Injured Reserve for the rest of the year. Rarely targeted last season, Smith finished with 8 PD, 28 tackles and 1 INT in eight games.

- This past April, the Ravens signed Smith to a four-year contract extension, locking him up to a long-term deal before he entered the final year of his rookie contract. (Smith is now signed through 2019.)
- In 2013, he had 16 passes defended (third on the team), adding 2 INTs, 2 FFs and 58 tackles in his first year as a regular starter.
- In Week 1 at Denver this season, Smith had a 24-yard INT-TD, his first-career score and sixth-career pick. He also led the team with 8 tackles. In 2015, Smith leads the Ravens with 8 passes defended (tied, L. Webb).

- ✓ **CB Jimmy Smith** is one of six players (Kwon Alexander, Lavonte David, Adam Jones, Tyrann Mathieu & Ron Parker) with at least 40 tackles, 2 INTs, 8 PD and 1 sack in 2015. Smith had a pick-6 in Week 1 at Den. (first-career TD) and an end zone INT vs. Cincy in Week 3.

In the 2012 Week 10 win over Oakland, **P Sam Koch** scored his first-career TD on a fake FG in the third quarter, scampering 7 yards for the score in the Ravens' 55-20 victory.

RAVENS IRONMAN

In 2014's Week 2 win vs. Pit., **P Sam Koch** passed OLB Jarret Johnson (129 games from 2003-11) for the longest streak (now 155 games) in Ravens history. Koch has not missed a game in his NFL career.

STARTS UP FRONT FOR "O"

In 2015, the Ravens returned their entire starting offensive line from 2014, marking the first time in team history that all five starters reunited in the trenches. Since 2014, Baltimore's O-line unit has been very good. Here are a few notes about the standout group:

- Permitted just 19 sacks in 2014, the second fewest in team history (17 in 2006) and in the NFL (Denver, 17).
- The unit helped protect **QB Joe Flacco**, who posted a career best in passing yards (3,986) and TD passes (27) in 2014.
- In 2014, **RB Justin Forsett** produced a career-high 1,266 rushing yards (NFL's fifth most) and led the league with a team-record 17 rushes of 20-plus yards, earning his first Pro Bowl. This season, Forsett's 641 rushing yards rank 13th entering Week 13.
- According to STATS, the Ravens' O-line posted a 72.1 "production index" score in 2014, the NFL's fourth-best mark.
- The Ravens have allowed just .034 sacks per pass play since 2014, ranking as the NFL's best figure (Oakland is second at 3.9).

Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker** ranks as the NFL's second-most accurate kicker of all time. He's connected on 121 of 138 FGAs to produce an 87.7 success rate.

- In 2013, he made his first Pro Bowl by setting team records in FGs made (38) and FGAs (41), with both figures tying (Stephen Gostkowski) for the NFL's most.

Tucker also had a franchise-record 140 points (tied for sixth in NFL).

- In addition to his 2013 Pro Bowl, Tucker was named Special Teams Player of the Month (November) and AFC Special Teams Player of the Week three times in 2013. In 2014, he was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week (Week 3) and Month (November).

- Tucker made 33-straight FGs at one point during the 2013 season, ranking as the NFL's fifth-longest streak of all time.

- His 6 FGs on 12/16/13 at Det. set a team record and were a single-game NFL high in 2013. Against the Lions, he became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- & 60-yard range in a game.

- Tuck has earned two AFC Player of the Week honors in 2015 (Week 4 at Pit. & Week 8 vs. SD, both contests in which he hit game-winners).

- He is now 49-of-54 during his career when the Ravens are losing a game, and he's 36-of-39 when Baltimore is down by 7 points or less. The Pro Bowler is 25-of-32 in the last 2 minutes of a half during his career, and he's 46-of-51 in the fourth quarter.
