## HOUSTON TEXANS vs. BALTIMORE RAVENS



(4-6) WEEK 12 – MONDAY, NOV. 27, 2017 (5-5)

### JUST THE FACTS

- It's a Maryland-Texas primetime showdown when the Baltimore Ravens (5-5) square off against the Houston Texans (4-6) on Monday Night Football (Nov. 27). These AFC foes will kick off at 8:30 p.m. for a game that is nationally-televised on ESPN. Baltimore has not played at home in over a month, last doing so on Oct. 26 when it beat Miami, 40-0, on Thursday Night Football.
- The Ravens lead the all-time series, producing a 6-2 mark against the Texans, including a 3-0 record at M&T Bank Stadium. The teams last played in 2014, when Houston won, 25-13, at NRG Stadium. Under **John Harbaugh**, Baltimore is 4-2 (5-2 including playoffs) vs. the Texans.
- Last Sunday (Nov. 19) at Green Bay, Baltimore's defense suffocated the Packers' offense, producing 6 sacks and forcing 5 turnovers in a 23-0 shutout victory. **OLB Terrell Suggs**, **OLB Matthew Judon** and **DT Willie Henry** each posted 2 sacks, while **CB Jimmy Smith**, **S Eric Weddle** and **CB Marlon Humphrey** recorded INTs. **QB Joe Flacco** was an efficient 22-of-28 for 183 yards and 1 TD (**WR Mike Wallace**) in a game that marked Baltimore's NFL-best third shutout of the season.
- In their 22nd year of existence, the Ravens have earned a playoff berth in six of the past nine full seasons. Since head coach **John Harbaugh's** arrival in 2008, Baltimore has posted the NFL's fourth-most total victories (100), won the league's second-most playoff games (10), advanced to an impressive three AFC Championship contests, and in 2012, captured the World Championship in SB XLVII.

### COACH HARBAUGH SAYS

**JOHN HARBAUGH ON HIS TEAM'S UNIQUE ABILITY TO FOCUS ON THE TASK AT HAND:**  
"It's a pretty rare team in the way that they brush off adversity. They don't get distracted. Everything is straight ahead, eyes downfield, and they just try to improve. They just look at the next opponent. In a game like [the Green Bay win], they will be excited, but it will be about moving on to Houston. And after disappointing losses, they have been the same way. Nobody's pointing a finger. Nobody's wallowing in self-pity. We've had a great two weeks of practice. The positive energy has been really just amazing. I just love this team."

### INJURY UPDATE

Standouts on Injured Reserve include Pro Bowl **RG Marshal Yanda** (ankle), **LG Alex Lewis** (shoulder), **DE Brent Urban** (foot) and **CB Tavon Young** (knee). Starting **LT Ronnie Stanley** missed last week's game at Green Bay with a concussion sustained in Week 9. The Ravens have used both of their Injured Reserve - Designated for Return allowances, activating **RB Danny Woodhead** and **CB Maurice Canady**.

### NOTE THE QUOTE

**OLB TERRELL SUGGS, WHO LEADS BALTIMORE WITH 7.5 SACKS IN HIS 15TH SEASON:**  
"From the moment I played my first snap in the NFL [in 2003], I've only been one type of player, one brand of player. I cherish and relish every game. I love being a Raven, and it's who I am. It's in my DNA. Like I said before, I only know one way to play. And that's The Raven Way."



## SPOTLIGHT: CB JIMMY SMITH



**Ht:** 6-3 **Wt:** 210 **Exp. (NFL/Ravens):** 7/7  
**College:** Colorado **Hometown:** Colton, CA

**What would it mean to you if you made the Pro Bowl?** "It would mean a lot. That has actually been one of my goals. I've been in the NFL for seven years, and I haven't made it yet. I was an alternate last year. When the team plays well, that's when you get those nods."

**You've been known to be a very superstitious player. Is it true you're trying to be less superstitious this year?**

"I'm trying to fall out of the superstition, but there's a few things I do ritually every game. One of them is listening to Kirk Franklin's 'Gonna Be a Lovely Day.' There's another one you'll only see on the field before a game: Right before we do the seven-on-seven, I go up to Mike Wallace and sometimes Jeremy Maclin or Breshad Perriman, if they're there, and I do this little weird dance. Win, lose, it doesn't matter; I do it every game."

**You're very calm during a game. Have you ever showed any crazy emotion in a game?** "My senior year of high school, my team was ranked No. 1 and undefeated. We were playing another undefeated team. The game came down to the wire, and we lost by a point because of a two-point conversion. I cried, threw my helmet. My brother told me, 'Don't ever cry over a football game again.' So, I haven't done it from that day forward. It's probably why I don't show much emotion."

**What would you say is your biggest achievement outside of football?** "My kids. I have two sons."

**Is fatherhood easier with your second son?** "My first kid is still really young, so I'm learning and getting used to being a father. He says 'Dad' now, which trips me out. He'll say, 'Thank you, Dad!' I'm like, 'Oh, that's weird.' (laughs) He used to call me 'Papa,' so now, 'Dad' just sounds different."

**Did you always play defense?** "No, I played wide receiver and tight end in high school. I got more college scholarships to play wide receiver than I did to play corner, just because of my height and size."

**What's your favorite vacation spot?** "My house, going home and relaxing. I don't go to many places, to be honest with you. I do want to go to Croatia and Greece. I want to travel Europe a little bit."

**If you weren't playing football, what would you be doing?** "I would be in the secret service or a homicide detective. My mom was always into those kind of shows, so I would watch it growing up. I'd watch it on TV and figure the case out on my own, before the show was over."



### **QB JOE FLACCO ON HIS RELATIONSHIP WITH JOHN HARBAUGH:**

“The relationship we’ve built, I can go into his office and close the door and have a conversation, and we can both walk out of that room feeling better than when we walked into it. ... He’s always in my corner, and that’s big. When your coach is able to confidently support you, it means a lot. Even though it might not go a long way publicly, it goes a long way in the locker room.”

### **John Harbaugh on QB Joe Flacco:**

“Even the best quarterbacks ever, guys like [Tom] Brady and [Aaron] Rodgers and [Johnny] Unitas – those guys had their bad moments. It goes with the position. Joe, or any quarterback, is going to take responsibility for whatever issues the team has. But for me, it’s your obligation and duty as a coach to have all of your players’ backs, none more so than the quarterback. That having been said, it’s genuine. Because I genuinely like the guy, and I genuinely believe that no matter what happens, he is honestly trying to do everything he can to win football games.”

### **S Eric Weddle on what RB Danny Woodhead brings to the offense after missing games 2-9 this season:**

“He gives us a shot in the arm. He gives us some juice, some energy. He is a guy that creates matchups, not only in the running game, but also in the passing game. It gives Joe [Flacco] another weapon when things may not be open. He can always check it down or see the matchup. The thing with ‘Woody’ is there are not many linebackers or safeties in this league that can cover him. When you know you have that matchup, you get him the ball and let him work.”

### **OLB Terrell Suggs on the Ravens’ Week 11 shutout at Green Bay, their third this season:**

“It doesn’t mean [anything] if we don’t make the playoffs. It’s good, but if we don’t get in, y’all aren’t even going to remember them. Y’all won’t remember them. It’s a good thing to build on, but we’ve got to keep going. We have to keep getting these wins. If we win six out of these next seven, we have a good chance of getting in [the playoffs]. I don’t care if we give up 19 points, 35 points; as long as we are winning games, we will take that. We’ve had shutouts, and we’ve come back after games and not played so well. We have to build on that. I said it before, ‘The worst thing in the world is mediocrity.’ We don’t want to be mediocre. We want to take the next step. We want to get above .500.”

### **OLB Matthew Judon on his role on the Ravens’ defense, for which he has 5 sacks:**

“The more I’m out there, hopefully the more impact I can have on the game. Sometimes I’m in coverage, and sometimes I’m blitzing. We keep changing it up, and it’s hard for opposing offenses to know what I’m doing.”

### **LB C.J. Mosley on individual accomplishments and working to establish himself as the next great Ravens MLB:**

“I pride myself in being the inside linebacker and one of the captains on this team and on this defense. At the end of the day, you want to be known as one of the best linebackers in the league, but I am not really a big individual guy. As long as the team is winning, as long as the defense is doing good, I am happy with that. As long as I am playing my part in it, that is all that matters.”

### **The Baltimore Sun’s Childs Walker on the emergence of rookie first-rounder CB Marlon Humphrey:**

“Many fans and analysts were surprised when [the Ravens] picked cornerback Marlon Humphrey in the first round ahead of defensive end Jonathan Allen and tight end O.J. Howard. Humphrey was probably the least touted of that Alabama trio, but he’s been excellent. ... If he weren’t around, the Ravens would be living in fear of [Jimmy] Smith’s tender Achilles tendon. Instead, they know they have a world-class athlete and fierce one-on-one defender to plug in whenever [Jimmy] Smith needs to take a series off. Humphrey hasn’t played as much as some of the other cornerbacks from his draft class, and thus, hasn’t received as much national hype. But he could evolve into a Pro Bowl player.”

### **John Harbaugh on the defense leading the NFL in INTs:**

“The system is built really well, in terms of the way we run our coverages, but really it is the guys back there playing. Eric [Weddle] and Tony [Jefferson] are doing a great job of disguising, and our corners are making plays in tight coverage. We have had some batted balls. We have disrupted with our pass rush. Those are the things that generally lead to interceptions, and I just think our guys deserve all the credit for it.”

### **Offensive coordinator Marty Mornhinweg on if RB Alex Collins’ success is something he expected:**

“He initially showed great quickness and speed. You really never know until they’ve been given an opportunity in a league game; then you really find out a lot. I’ll tell you about Alex: He’s getting better every day, as well – with little things, all the details. It was a heck of a job by our personnel department, heck of a job by Thomas [Hammock, RBs coach] for getting him prepared, and a heck of a job by Alex getting himself prepared to play at a high level.”

## TOP RAVENS-TEXANS CONNECTIONS

### PRO CONNECTIONS

- Ravens senior offensive assistant/tight ends coach **Greg Roman** served as both the Texans' tight ends (2002-03) and quarterbacks (2004-05) coach.
- Baltimore **QB Ryan Mallett** spent the 2014 season and 2015 offseason with Houston.
- Ravens Midwest area scout **Dwaune Jones** participated in the Texans' training camp as a wide receiver in 2002.
- Texans defensive line coach **Anthony Weaver** was the Ravens' 2002 second-round draft pick and played in Baltimore from 2002-05.
- Houston college scouting coordinator **Matt Jansen** served as a player personnel assistant from 2013-14 with Baltimore. Also, before joining the Texans as a pro scout, **Tolu Lasaki** spent six seasons with the Ravens assisting the pro and college scouting departments in various personnel assistant capacities.
- Houston assistant director of pro personnel **Larry Wright Jr.** and corporate communications manager **Allie LeClair** started their careers as interns for the Ravens. Wright worked in scouting (2000) and LeClair served in the public relations department (2012).

### COLLEGE CONNECTIONS

- Texans head coach **Bill O'Brien** was the running backs coach at Maryland from 2003-04. Texans head strength and conditioning coach **Craig Fitzgerald** played for Maryland from 1994-96 and was the assistant director of strength and conditioning coach for the Terrapins from 2000-05.
- Ravens rookie **OLB Tyus Bowser** played from 2012-16 at the University of Houston, where he appeared in 48 games, earning second-team All-AAC honors in 2016.

## WEEK 11 RECAP AT GREEN BAY

### RAVENS 23, PACKERS 0 • WEEK 11, NOV. 19 • LAMBEAU FIELD

The Ravens stole the ball 5 times, scoring 13 points after those turnovers, recorded 6 sacks and produced their third shutout in 10 games when they beat the Packers, 23-0, at Lambeau Field last Sunday. These are the most shutouts the Ravens have registered since their historic defense claimed four in 2000. Baltimore's defense intercepted 3 QB Brett Hundley passes, including 1 by **CB Jimmy Smith** in the Ravens' end zone at the end of the game's opening drive. **S Eric Weddle** also secured an INT, as did rookie **CB Marlon Humphrey**, who had the first of his NFL career. **QB Joe Flacco** was 22-of-28 for 183 yards, including a sharp 21-yard TD strike to **WR Mike Wallace** on the opening series of the third quarter. That made the score 13-0 after 2 **K Justin Tucker** FGs (32 and 39 yards) gave the Ravens a 6-0 halftime advantage. (On two of Green Bay's third quarter possessions, the Packers attempted fourth-down conversions and were stopped by the powerful Ravens defense.) Tucker added a third FG in the final quarter, a 23-yard boot that gave the Ravens a 16-0 lead. The final points came when **RB Alex Collins** scored his first TD as a Raven with a 3-yard run. That score was set up by Humphrey's INT. Hundley completed 21 of 36 for 239 yards, including 8 to WR Davante Adams for 126 yards. **RB Danny Woodhead**, in his first game back since the season opener, led the Ravens with 5 catches for 21 yards. **WRs Mike Wallace** (56 yards) and **Jeremy Maclin** (34), along with Collins (22), had 4 receptions each. Collins added 49 rushing yards. Baltimore enjoyed outstanding field position throughout the game with **P Sam Koch** landing 5 punts inside the 20. **OLB Terrell Suggs**, **OLB Matthew Judon** and **DT Willie Henry** each produced 2 sacks. The victory was **John Harbaugh's** 100th overall as the Ravens' head coach.

LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

## THE HARBAUGH FILE

**John Harbaugh** has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his nine full seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under his guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

### Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of seven teams with at least six playoff berths in the past nine seasons (2008-16): GB (8), NE (8), Bal. (6), Cin. (6), Ind. (6), Pit. (6) & Sea. (6).
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 11.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the second-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first nine seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first nine years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists:

### SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST **Brendon Ayanbadejo** (2008), K **Billy Cundiff** (2010), RS **Jacoby Jones** (2012), K **Justin Tucker** (2013 & 2016), LS **Morgan Cox** (2015 & 2016) and P **Sam Koch** (2015).

### PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl K **Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (188) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 89.5% career success mark, "Tuck" is the second-most accurate kicker in league history (188-of-210 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P **Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2014, Koch posted the NFL's No. 3 gross (47.4) and No. 1 net (43.3) averages, both career highs and Ravens records.

### RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS **Jacoby Jones** in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

### 2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 vs. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. **RB Bobby Rainey Jr.** posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while **WR Michael Campanaro** registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens are the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

## BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's most blocked kicks (12, tied), including an NFL-high 4 (tied, Mia.) in 2016.



Rushing Yards Per Game by Ravens in 2017 (NFL's 13th-best mark)



**ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:**

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

## A TREMENDOUS 2016

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)



# RAVENS IN OUR COMMUNITY

## USO MILITARY CARE PACKAGE STUFFING

Following the Ravens' bye week, the team partnered with United Service Organizations (USO) of Metropolitan Washington-Baltimore to put together care packages for military children. On Monday, Nov. 13, over 40 Ravens staff members were joined by Ravens head coach **John Harbaugh** (pictured bottom left) and various Ravens players at the Under Armour Performance Center, where they worked together to stuff over 1,500 care packages. The package stuffing was part of the Ravens' *Salute to Service* campaign, and the "Polar Express"-themed packages will be delivered to local military families during the holiday season.



## PLAY 60 SCHOOL VISITS

Throughout the season, the Baltimore Ravens have been surprising students at local elementary and middle schools that have excelled in the Ravens' *PLAY 60 Challenge*. Several local schools completed the challenge by encouraging their students to become physically active for at least 60 minutes every day. On Oct. 30, **DE Bronson Kaufusi** (pictured right), and **QB Josh Woodrum** visited the first of three elementary schools whose children recorded the most hours spent exercising over a two-week period. Each of the three winning schools will receive a *PLAY 60* assembly featuring Ravens cheerleaders, mascot Poe and a surprise visit by current Ravens players.



## COCA-COLA MILITARY COMBINE

On Nov. 18, the Ravens and Coca-Cola invited 120 service members from four military branches to participate in a combine competition at the Under Armour Performance Center. Through a partnership with USO of Metropolitan Washington-Baltimore, each service branch competed against one another in sets of football and military training drills. At the end of the competition, members of the Navy branch were crowned victorious. As winners of the military combine, these individuals earned the opportunity to lead the Ravens onto the field during the *Salute to Service* game on Nov. 27 against the Houston Texans.





## JOHN HARBAUGH MONDAY PRESS CONFERENCE: WEEK 12 VS. TEXANS

**Opening statement:** “Good to see you guys. A lot of travel – did everybody get back safe? Apparently you have, since you are here.” (Reporter: “No delays.”) “No delays? You had no delays? I wish we could say the same. (laughter) We had some good bonding time in the plane, in the airport. We had the lottery winners with us, too; you probably didn’t know that. They were great – great people. We had some fun with them in the airport, and it’s all good. It was a good day all around. I am really happy with the performance of the players. The coaches did a tremendous job preparing for that game, and they have throughout the season with their guys. Now, the preparation is on for the Houston game.”

**You will probably not get sick of talking about the defense, but yesterday’s performance also included a great job against the run, which is something you have had difficulty against. Could that be the start of a trend? (David Ginsburg)** “We have been pretty good the last few weeks and overall through the season. We have probably had a couple of games where we weren’t as good. But we need to be great against the run the rest of the year; there is no question about that. That is going to be critically important if we are going to play good defense.”

**Was there some form of alignment or was it just DT Brandon Williams in the middle did the job and everyone around him did their job? (David Ginsburg)** “Yes, everyone did their job, ran hard to the ball. We were very physical up front. We played good run defense.”

**You guys lead Buffalo for that final playoff spot. Do you pay any attention to the standings, or is it just winning and it will take care of itself? (Todd Karpovich)** “The latter – win, and it will take care of itself. It is not like we do not know what is happening. We certainly know who does what. We watched some games, because the TVs were on in the airport there, so we watched some games that were on. But you have to take care of yourself. What did Al Davis say?” (Reporter: “Just win.”) “Just win, baby. That is really what we have to do.”

**You are always going to be excited when you win and your defense pitches a shutout like that, but DT Willie Henry with two sacks, OLB Matt Judon with two sacks and CB Marlon Humphrey had an interception. When you have guys that are younger players and not necessarily proven commodities, even though you are excited about them, is there an extra level of excitement thinking what they are doing now, but also thinking big picture? (Luke Jones)** “It is. It is good to see guys you had hopes for. Those are young guys that we drafted that are practicing and developing. Maybe media and fans have not heard much about [them], because fans are not at practice every day. Then, you want to get guys to the games and see how they grow and develop once they get out there. Those are guys, and there are other guys, too. We have a good group of young players. But those three guys that you mentioned are very deserving of being mentioned. And yet, at the same time, you forge ahead. There is no reading the press clippings. Those guys have to play better next week, and the opponent is going to know them more. The opponent will be more aware of those players in the future than they have been in the past, and they are going to have to step up their game accordingly.”

**Alongside of those young guys, you had hopes for OLB Terrell Suggs. Has it surprised you that he has been able to bring it with the same intensity and success? (Stan Charles)** “I would say, in some ways, yes, because of how long he has been playing. There are not many players in any sport – especially in this sport – that can play that many years and maintain the high level that he has played at. I really think he is playing the best football I have seen him play in a number of years, this year. I would credit the hard work. So, in that aspect, I am not surprised, because I saw the hard work he put in through the offseason and training camp. It seems to be paying off in a big way.”

**A lot of fans were surprised about T Ronnie Stanley’s concussion and the fact that it lasted through the bye week and has carried into this week. When did it happen? Was it the final play there or at the end of the fourth quarter? (Jerry Coleman)** “It was towards the end of the fourth quarter. I do not know exactly what play it was. It was on a screen pass.”

**Obviously, everyone is different with that, so it is just something that you are going to have to monitor this week? The bye week was just some time down where T Ronnie Stanley was able to recover, but still, more time is necessary? (Jerry Coleman)** “Yes. You really already answered it. It is different for everybody. Concussions are what they are – they are very unique. You are not going to put a player out there until he is healed, and that is up to the doctors. I am sure Ronnie did everything he was told to do, as far as trying to get right, and he will continue to do that.”



The criticism of the offensive line, there has been some, yet the running game has done pretty well this year. Without getting a total evaluation of the offensive line, your response to the criticisms out there where some say they don't give QB Joe Flacco enough time, yet the running game seems to have prospered for the most part this year behind that offensive line. **(Jerry Coleman)** "Right." *(Reporter: "Do you think the criticisms are fair?")* "I don't get into judging it. I do not evaluate it. I do not even know what they are, really to be honest with you. I think that we need to continue to improve in every area. That is really the bottom line. Wherever you are at, in any particular spot, whether it is the offensive line, which is what you are asking about, or the secondary or the quarterback, the defensive line, you strive for improvement and you try to improve and get better every single week. In some cases, it is one percent better, and in some cases, you can use more improvement than that. That is what we are working hard for, trying to play your best football the next week, continue to do that through the season, and that is what those guys are really working hard to do, and we will see next Monday night if we can continue to improve there."

**We talked yesterday about your 100th career victory, and I saw the video of the locker room. What kind of a moment was that when you get handed the game ball? (Jamison Hensley)** "I'm not great at describing those moments, but it was fun. A winning locker room is really fun. Hey – I haven't been given too many game balls over the years, you know? That was pretty cool. For it to be handed to you by Terrell Suggs is a great honor, because my respect for him is as high as it can be. It's just fun. That's one thing about coaching ... I think anyone who has coached at any level ... You guys have done a lot of coaching, you know. It kind of keeps you young. When you're coaching, you're right there with guys, or the girls, that you're coaching. You're in there; you're part of it. To me, that's the great thing about this business."

**What explanation were you given on the ball that they ruled a touchback? Did they say that OLB Tyus Bowser had touched it and had been in the end zone? (Stan Charles)** "They said that they couldn't tell. It's in New York, so it's hard for the [officials] on the field to really explain the reasoning. I don't think they always know." *(Reporter: "I'm not trying to get you in trouble, but did you think it was a touchback?")* "I thought it was the greatest punt in the history of football. Seriously! I thought it was the greatest punt play in the history of football, or at least, the history that I've seen. I've seen all the punts in the National Football League for the last 20 years, and that's the best one I've ever seen."

**Was it explained to you who was mouthing off or said something to the referees to get a 15-yard penalty of that nature? (Jerry Coleman)** "Yes, it was. It was announced, too. Ryan Mallett was the offender. You're welcome to ask him what he said; I won't repeat it here." *(Reporter: "Did you hear it?")* "No, I didn't hear it." *(Reporter: "Did it merit [the penalty]?")* "If he said what the officials said he said, sure. He will be disciplined, here, in-house, I promise you, because as much as I love Ryan Mallett, I'm not cool with that. He knows it. He's a competitor; he's into the game. He and I talk a lot, about the offense and the calls and things like that, during the game. But, [special teams coordinator/associate head] coach [Jerry] Rosburg and his special teams coaches – they don't need his help on special teams; they're doing just fine. We've played, pretty much, penalty-free on special teams for a lot of games here, so it's a point of emphasis. Until Ryan starts sitting in this room in special teams meetings – unless he's cheering for us – we probably aren't going to need his help that way."

**On a serious nature – even though his name is Ha Ha – Clinton-Dix is accusing C Ryan Jensen of dirty play. Is there any evidence of that after watching tape? He accused him of taking a dirty shot at DT Kenny Clark. (Jerry Coleman)** "I can't speak to his comments. I talked to Ryan after the game, and he explained to me what happened. When I watched the tape, that was exactly what I saw. Basically, what happened was Ryan was blocking, and Kenny was engaged in the block. Our running back got hit from the side hard, from the outside in, and got knocked right into Kenny Clark's legs. He got bent over [backwards] and Ryan was blocking him. Ryan said he felt it right away, and said he felt him bending backwards, and tried to hold him up. When you look at the tape, that's what I saw. He was really trying to hold him up; he wasn't pushing him over the pile. He felt really bad about it. I know he has every intention to get a hold of Kenny and let him know."

**So many four- or five-year veterans were so excited after the game about the performance, but they kept using the word "consistency." You guys have proven this season that you can play with anybody, and beat anybody, when you're playing at your best. Is that the next step, do you think, for this team to get to the next level? You haven't won back-to-back games since Week 1 and Week 2. (Jeff Zrebiec)** "I do. That's the thing – we have to play winning football. The formula begins to present itself as the season wears on here, as to what that is for us. We need to put that together for a string of football games."

**You spent the offseason improving the defense. When you see a defense that has forced all those turnovers and gotten three shutouts – what does that say about this defense and the determination to make it among the best in the league? (David Ginsburg)** "The story is still to be written, as to what this defense is. We're in the process of doing that. So, really, it's nose to the grindstone to try to accomplish that. What it says about that, I think, will be better said at the end of the year. We have a lot of work



to do. We have a really good offense coming in here, with a really good offensive coach who knows how to attack defenses in a great way. Really, that's where our focus has to be."

**CB Marlon Humphrey played more snaps than CB Brandon Carr yesterday. Is that a result of Marlon bringing a different element to the secondary? (Ed Lee)** "It's just the way it worked out. Like I said last night, all three of those guys are considered starters, and they're all going to play probably different amounts, different games, [depending on] how they're feeling [and] what's going on. Sometimes, it might just be happenstance; I don't think there's anything to read into it."

**How excited are you to have a home Monday Night Football game? (Garrett Downing)** "I'm excited, but I'm kind of past all of that. I'm excited for the fans – big time. I'm really excited for the fans. Monday Night Football is a lot of fun, and we've been in a lot of stadiums – as you're alluding to – with the opposing crowd rocking. I'm looking forward to seeing our crowd in there shaking the place up a little bit. It should be fun."

**Are you going to adjust your schedule? A few weeks ago, you said you fell asleep at halftime. (Jerry Coleman) (laughter)** "I definitely won't fall asleep at halftime of our Monday night game. (laughter) I might be accused of that by some of you at times. (laughter) But, I'll try to stay awake."

**You talked about the young players before. DT Willie Henry, specifically, where has he grown his game from the start of the season? (Ryan Mink)** "He's just more consistent with his technique. He has really established himself as a physical player; he's getting his hands and his feet where they're supposed to be against the various blocks. That's not easy to do, because you see a lot of blocking schemes against some really good blockers in the course of the game, and he's just getting better and better at doing that. He has a lot of talent, he's playing really hard, and it's coming together for him."

**Coach, can you talk a little bit about the special teams? Two of the big returns set up scores in the game, one right at the end of the half and another at the beginning of the second half. (Jim Forner)** "No question. Great point. Our special teams are playing at a really high level – penalty free, except for Ryan Mallett. (laughter) Obviously, you can see that's on my mind a little bit. But the two big returns ... The punt return that set up the score and then the kickoff return ... What we did at the end of the half, too, we scored a field goal, and then we got the touchdown [to open the second half]; that was a 10-point swing. We kind of call that at halftime a 'possession sandwich,' where we try to get the ball at the end of the half and to start the half, and if you can score on both of those, it's a real big factor in winning games. So, that was a 10-point part of the game right there, and that was huge, obviously. Special teams were a big part of that. And then the kickoff return was beautifully blocked. Chris Moore did a great job with it. [Michael] Campanaro on the punt return ... Our guys made adjustments on the punt return, just to explain to you ... This is a formation-motion punt team, so we start off in a slot-formation, which is unusual, motion the gunner to the right, and Chuck Clark, who is a rookie, made the adjustment perfectly, where they were able to bump the vice all the way across to where he and the corner were on the right side and get that vice player blocked, which is really hard to do. That was the key to setting up that return."

**Were you aware that WR Mike Wallace might do the "Lambeau Leap?" (Jerry Coleman)** "I thought it was great. I wasn't aware of it. I would have done it myself if I could still jump at all. (laughter) We had a lot of fans there. I don't know if you knew that or not. We had a lot of fans there. I mean, man, the 'O' was loud, [there was] a lot of purple, and when we came out for pregame I was amazed by how much purple we had there. You see a lot in Miami and places like that, but that was pretty special for our fans. It was a real big statement for Ravens fans to show up the way they did in Lambeau."

**Do you have an update on ILB C.J. Mosley? (Ed Lee)** "Nothing negative, just kind of where it was at – just a sprain."

**No prayers needed yet? (Jamison Hensley)** "Pray. Always pray. Prayers are always needed. It says in the Bible to pray constantly. Pray continuously, always pray. You especially, buddy." (laughter)
