DETROIT LIONS VS. BALTIMORE RAVENS

Week 13 — Sunday, Dec. 3, 2017 1 p.m. ET — M&T Bank Stadium (71,008)

JUST THE FACTS

- The Baltimore Ravens (6-5), winners of two-straight games, and the Detroit Lions (6-5) square off at M&T Bank Stadium on Sunday, Dec. 3. Kickoff for this AFC-NFC tilt is set for 1 p.m. in a contest that marks Baltimore's sixth home game of the season (3-2 record). The Ravens currently hold the sixth seed in the AFC playoff race.
- The Ravens lead the all-time series, producing a 3-1 mark vs. Detroit. Under head coach **John Harbaugh**, Baltimore is 2-0, last winning a thrilling 18-16 battle at Ford Field in 2013. In that game, with :38 seconds remaining, **K Justin Tucker** nailed a franchise-record 61-yard FG to secure a Baltimore victory on Monday Night Football.
- Last Monday night, Baltimore upended the Houston Texans, 23-16, behind another strong performance from the defense. **OLB Terrell Suggs** tallied 2 sacks and a clutch FF (recovered by **DT Willie Henry**) late in the fourth quarter, while **S Tony Jefferson** and **DB/LB Anthony Levine Sr.** registered INTs, adding to Baltimore's NFL-best 18 picks this season. The Texans were limited to a season-low 66 rushing yards, while Baltimore posted 139 rushing yards, with **RB Alex Collins** totaling a game-high 60 yards and 1 TD.
- In their 22nd year of existence, the Ravens have earned a playoff berth in six of the past nine full seasons. Since head coach **John Harbaugh**'s arrival in 2008, Baltimore has posted the NFL's fourthmost total victories (101), won the league's second-most playoff games (10), advanced to an impressive three AFC Championship contests, and in 2012, captured the World Championship in SB XLVII.

INJURY UPDATE



Having been in Baltimore 12 years, how has the organization changed? "I feel like for the most part, it has stayed the same, just because of the types of people this organization brings in. The organization always brings in such a good group of people with free agents and draft picks that really

correlate well with the rest of the team, whether it be in the locker room or the way they play. They all have the same goal in mind, they are all great men, and we all bond very well together."

As the two players who have been here the longest, what is your relationship with Terrell Suggs? "We have a complicated relationship, but it is a good one. It is one of those things where Friday he steals my jersey, and he wears that as well as random articles of clothing throughout the week. I usually have to go somewhere random to find my own gear. But, it has been a great 12 years to be with such a dedicated and legendary guy like 'Sizz.' He keeps it entertaining."

Who would your ultimate golfing foursome be? "I'd say, me, Joe Montana, Will Ferrell and Dave Kindig from 'Kindig-It Design."

What is the last book you read? "Well, currently I'm reading 'Shoe Dog' by Phil Knight. I'm about three quarters of the way through, and it is incredible."

When did you realize you had a future in punting? "Ever since I started playing soccer in fourth grade, I always kicked farther than all the other kids, so I always took a liking to it. I ended up doing the duties on flag football and then, I went to tackle football. I began to get really good at it, so I just kept doing it."

What specialist did you look up to most? "Jeff Feagles. His directional ability was amazing. A couple other guys were Sean Landeta and Tom Tupa, but I always looked up to Jeff Feagles the most."

If you could learn any skill, what would it be? "I'd like to know how to build a car from start to finish. I think that would be pretty awesome."

We are very soft spoken, but Justin always keeps us together and keeps it fun. He basically just makes us realize that when we are out there on the field, we are there to have fun."

AT A STRONG PACE

As noted on page 1, the Ravens have tallied an NFL-high 26 takeaways this season, including a league-best 18 INTs. The 26 forced turnovers stand as the third most through the first 11 games of a season in Ravens franchise history.

SUGGS CONTINUES TO SIZZLE

With his 9.5 sacks this season (NFL's eighth most), **OLB Terrell Suggs** owns 124 career sacks, which rank 18th in NFL history (since sacks became an official stat in 1982). With 2 more sacks, Suggs will pass Dwight Freeney (125.5) for 17th, while 3 sacks would make him vault Hall of Famer Derrick Thomas' 126.5.

QUOTH THE RAVENS

LB C.J. MOSLEY ON CONTINUING THE RAVENS' TRADITION AT MIDDLE LINEBACKER:

"It makes you want to strive for greatness. You always want to be the best that you can be and keep the tradition going as a defensive player on the Ravens and as a middle linebacker. Look at a player like Terrell Suggs. He's one of the last ones of that generation of Ravens. That's what you want to think about when it comes to your future. You just want to keep everything going the right way. The NFL is a job and all that, but I plan on being here for a long time. I want to be one of those last Ravens that is giving to the next generation."

Defensive coordinator Dean Pees on if he's amazed at how well OLB Terrell Suggs continues to play in Year 15:

"Yes, that's actually pretty well put, because I really am. I've been around guys that have been in the league for a long time, and you, generally, can see when things start dropping off a little bit. Maybe he's a step slower, but boy, I'll tell you what – he doesn't play like it. The thing about Suggs is he just brings [it]. It's his defense. To me, he's our guy; he's our leader. He's the guy that brings emotion out here to practice every day. He loves being here; he loves being in the building; he loves football, and it's contagious. A lot of times, I think as he goes, we go. Has he slowed a step? Probably, if you timed him, but he doesn't play like it."

John Harbaugh on OLB Matthew Judon:

"He just continues to improve. He is a very talented guy, a very smart player. He does not make the same mistake twice. He understands the concept of the defense, and when you get out there, and you know what is going on around you and what other people are supposed to do, you make good decisions. He has done that. He is a very smart player, and for a 270-pound-plus guy, he is a really good athlete. He is living up to our expectations right now."

Monday Night Football analyst Jon Gruden on OLB Matthew Judon, who has 5 sacks this season:

"He is one of the emerging stars in pro football."

S Tony Jefferson on what the key is for the defense continuing to create turnovers:

"We have a goal. We have a turnover margin goal, so weekin and week-out, we try to accomplish that or get close to that. Our mindset is to take the ball away and have the offense protect the ball. We did that, and I think it is an old saying – 'If you win the turnover battle, you usually win the game.' We have to continue to do that. We have some tough offenses coming in that we will have to slow down and play 'Raven football.'"

WR Mike Wallace on playing in Baltimore:

"When you are home and in a place where they accept you, that's like heaven. I love it here. It's been great. It's just given me back that sense of self. I'm happy they gave me an opportunity to re-establish myself. I want to go hard for these last games. We're going to get where we want to be."

RB Alex Collins on the three-headed monster in the backfield, with him, RB Javorius Allen and RB Danny Woodhead:

"Well, that's exactly what it is. We know our capabilities and what we are good at. We do a great job of working with each other in our different situations and different schemes. Whatever the coaches need us to do, we do. There's so much love among us. We all look out for each other during practice, making sure we do right by each other and stand for each other all the time. So, it flows great. There's a great atmosphere in that room."

RB Javorius Allen on the Ravens' running backs group:

"We all feel like we're capable of doing everything. We're just trying to make plays. That room is amazing. The chemistry that we have right now is outstanding. I love it. We push off each other. We feed off each other. When one of us gets a great run, we all want to get a great run. We never think any one of us is getting all the reps, and that's what's so special about this group."

John Harbaugh on QB Joe Flacco's comment about the offense needing to take it to another level:

"That's something that we talk about every day. That's something that we're fighting to do. The first step is getting our guys back. We continue to work throughout the season. We have to keep grinding, get a little bit better every single day, every single week, in everything we do — in the run game, pass game, pass protection — all of those things. Joe was exactly spot-on. We're just like everyone else in this league — we're trying to win the whole thing. We're not there yet, but they don't play that game yet. So, the first step is the next step, and the next step is our next game. We have to be good enough to figure out how to win the next game and keep building off of that."

Marty Mornhinweg on QB Joe Flacco's toughness:

"He's a tough dude. It's just that simple. Most of the really good quarterbacks, they have that toughness — both mentally and physically. He has that mental toughness; he's also very, very tough physically. You have to be tough to play in this league at quarterback. Toughness goes a long way. I've done this for a while, and as I've gotten more and more experience, the toughness and the character of really any player goes a long, long way. So, those things are important, and Joe has all of that."

- Ravens head coach **John Harbaugh** began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Western Michigan from 1984-86. His brother, **Jim Harbaugh**, is currently the head coach at Michigan.
- Baltimore special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** had stints at Northern Michigan as a graduate assistant (1981-82), linebackers coach (1983-85), and defensive coordinator/secondary (1986), as well as serving as the LBs/special teams coach for Western Michigan (1987-91).
- Ravens defensive coordinator **Dean Pees** served in the same role at Michigan State (1995-97).
- CB Brandon Carr (Flint) and OLB Matthew Judon (West Bloomfield) are both Michigan natives and attended Grand Valley State.
- Several Ravens attended college in Michigan: **DT Willie Henry** (Michigan), **DE Chris Wormley** (Michigan) and national scout **Lonnie Young** (Michigan State).

• Ravens **DT Carl Davis** and **WR Breshad Perriman** hail from Detroit. ... Lions Injured Reserved **LB Brandon Copeland** is from Sykesville, MD, and Detroit college scouting coordinator **Joe Kelleher** is a Potomac native. LAST TIME VS. LIONS IN BALTIMORE

On 12/13/09, it was a record-setting day for the Ravens when they beat the Lions, 48-3, in a cold rain. Baltimore established a then-team record with 548 yards of total offense (308 rushing – second best in Ravens history – and 240 passing). RB Ray Rice led the way with 166 ground yards and 1 TD on just 13 carries, while RB Willis McGahee added 76 and 2 scores on 12 attempts.

WEEK 12 RECAP VS. HOUSTON

RAVENS 23, TEXANS 16 · WEEK 12, MONDAY, NOV. 27 · M&T BANK STADIUM

Houston scored a touchdown on its first possession, and that was the only time the Texans found the end zone in the Ravens' 23-16 win at M&T Bank Stadium last Monday night. That drive was helped by 3 Ravens' penalties, including a pass interference call that gave the Texans the ball on the Baltimore 4-yard line. The Ravens stole the ball 3 times, with 2 coming late in the fourth quarter when they clinched the game. The Ravens were turnover-free, helping them win their third game in the last four outings. The victory moved Baltimore to 6-5 and kept the team firmly in the playoff mix (sixth position). The Ravens scored 10 points off of their takeaways, kept a drive alive with a completed pass on a fake punt, and converted a fourth-and-1 to continue another TD series. RB Lamar Miller's 4-yard run gave the Texans a 7-0, first-quarter lead. The Ravens tied the game, 7-7, early in the second guarter when RB Javorius Allen ran 10 yards for the score, which was set up by P Sam Koch's fake punt pass to WR Chris Moore for 22 yards to the Houston 19. On the Ravens' next possession, QB Joe Flacco flipped a lateral to RB Alex Collins on a fourth-and-1 from the Texans' 37, and the quick RB raced 29 yards to the 8, setting up his 8-yard TD run for a 14-7 advantage. K Ka'imi Fairbairn (25 yards) and K Justin Tucker (53 yards) then exchanged FGs to make the score 17-10 at the half. Fairbairn's 36-yard FG was the only score in the third quarter (17-13). Those two then made kicks on consecutive fourth-quarter possessions Tucker from 31 yards and Fairbairn from 37 – giving the Ravens a 20-16 lead. **OLB Terrell Suggs** then stripped-sacked QB Tom Savage, and DT Willie Henry won the scrum for the fumble to set up the game's final score, a 49-yard Tucker FG. DB/LB Anthony Levine Sr. stopped Houston's final drive with an INT with 2:26 left in the contest. The Ravens kept possession until the end, converting a first down on a 25-yard run by Flacco. The Ravens rushed for 139 yards, with Collins earning 60 of those. Baltimore's defense was stout again, limiting the Texans, who entered the game as the NFL's No. 6 rushing offense, to a season-low 66 yards. Suggs produced 2 sacks to up his team best to 9.5 for the season. It was the 10th-straight home primetime win for the Ravens, who are 12-1 in night games in Baltimore under John Harbaugh.



In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing firsthalf performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his nine full seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under his guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of seven teams with at least six playoff berths in the past nine seasons (2008-16): GB (8), NE (8), Bal. (6), Cin. (6), Ind. (6), Pit. (6) & Sea. (6).
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 11.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the second-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first nine seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first nine years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

ROSBURG LEADS RAVENS SPECIALISTS

SEASONS RAVENS: 10TH NFL: 17TH

Special teams coordinator/associate head coach Jerry Rosburg has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists:

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and **P Sam Koch** (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (191) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 89.7% career success mark, "Tuck" is the secondmost accurate kicker in league history (191-of-213 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2014. Koch posted the NFL's No. 3 gross (47.4) and No. 1 net (43.3) averages, both career highs and Ravens records.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 VS. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. RB Bobby Rainey Jr. posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while WR Michael Campanaro registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens are the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's most blocked kicks (12, tied), including an NFL-high 4 (tied, Mia.) in 2016.



NOTE THE QUOTE

ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

A TREMENDOUS 2016

In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)


