JUST THE FACTS

• The Baltimore Ravens (7-6) travel to battle the Cleveland Browns (0-13) on Sunday, Dec. 17, in a matchup that kicks off at 1 p.m. ET. Baltimore has won three of its past four games (and four of the past six) and looks to remain in the thick of the AFC playoff race.

• Against Cleveland, the Ravens lead the all-time series, 28-9. Under head coach **John Harbaugh**, Baltimore is 17-2 vs. the Browns, winning the past four games. In Week 2 this season, Baltimore forced 5 turnovers to best the Browns, 24-10, at M&T Bank Stadium. Baltimore's "D" recorded 4 INTs and 1 FR, adding 3 sacks, 10 QB hits and 9 PD. On offense, **QB Joe Flacco** was an efficient 25-of-34 for 217 yards and 2 TDs, while Baltimore also racked up 136 rushing yards.

• Last Sunday, Pittsburgh K Chris Boswell's 46-yard FG with 42 seconds left in the game gave the host Steelers a 39-38 win over the Ravens at Heinz Field. Baltimore climbed out of a 14-0, second-quarter deficit in this thriller, taking a 31-20 third-quarter lead and a 38-29 edge with 6:44 left in the game. But Pittsburgh, which produced 545 yards of offense, mounted a comeback of its own behind a stellar performance from QB Ben Roethlisberger, who passed for 506 yards. Flacco completed 20 of 35 passes for 269 yards, 2 TDs and an INT, while **RB Alex Collins** rushed for 120 yards on 18 carries (adding 46 receiving yards), helping the Ravens to a season-high 413 yards.

• The Ravens have earned a playoff berth in six of the past nine full seasons. Since **John Harbaugh's** arrival in 2008, Baltimore has posted the NFL's fourth-most total victories (102), won the league's second-most playoff games (10), advanced to three AFC Championship contests, and in 2012, captured the World Championship in SB XLVII.

COACH HARBAUGH SAYS

JOHN HARBAUGH ON FIGHTING FOR A PLAYOFF SPOT WITH THREE GAMES TO GO:

"We are looking forward to an opportunity to win the next game and what that entails. We are in it. We have earned our way to be in it. We are right there [fighting for] a Wild Card berth. But there are three games left, and we have to make it happen for ourselves. We understand that, and we are excited about that. [It is] a big challenge. It is the National Football League. Those will be three very challenging football games for us, but we are capable of doing it."

Starters on Injured Reserve include Pro Bowl **RG Marshal Yanda** (ankle), **CB Jimmy Smith** (Achilles), **LG Alex Lewis** (shoulder), **DE Brent Urban** (foot) and **CB Tavon Young** (knee). The Ravens have used both of their Injured Reserve - Designated for Return allowances, activating **RB Danny Woodhead** and **CB Maurice Canady**.


NOTE THE QUOTE

STEELERS QB BEN ROETHLISBERGER ON OLB TERRELL SUGGS, WHO LEADS THE RAVENS WITH 11 SACKS IN HIS 15TH SEASON:

"He is a freak. He is one of the best I have ever played against. I have a lot of respect for him, and he is playing at a really high level. He does not show any signs of slowing down. I wish he would, though."

Note: Suggs has produced **125.5** career sacks. With **1** more tackle, he'll reach **900** for his career, joining Ray Lewis (2,643) in the elite Ravens group.

SPOTLIGHT: TE BENJAMIN WATSON



Ht: 6-3 Wt: 251 Exp. (NFL/Ravens): 14/2

When you played for the Browns, what was your perception of the Ravens? "My entire time in the NFL, the Ravens have always been a physical team. You knew that when you play the Ravens, you are going to have Ray Lewis, [Terrell] Suggs, and you are always going to have to know where Ed Reed is. Haloti Ngata, Jarret Johnson – the list goes on. It has always been a physical game, and that has always been their M.O."

Is there anything you have learned now that you didn't know from afar? "This organization has a lot of fun. It is really loose here. Guys who came from here would tell me how the culture is and how this organization lets you be yourself. Being in here, it really is about players' personalities. Guys are able to be themselves, and that is something that coach [John] Harbaugh loves. He enjoys guys to play with their personalities, too. If you are a guy that likes to talk – talk. If you are a guy that likes to joke – joke. It allows guys to play loose, and it allows guys to play to their fullest potential."

A lot of young players say you mentor them. Who did the same for you? "Daniel Graham, who played tight end in the league for 11 or 12 years with New England and Denver. He taught me what it meant to be a pro. He showed me how I could get my body ready and my mind ready. I credit him and Christian Fauria as guys I looked up to."

Who is the best player you have lined up against? "Michael Strahan was really good. I had to block him my rookie year, and the first time I saw him, I called my dad and said, 'I don't know if I can play in this league.' Another guy is No. 55 [Terrell Suggs]. As a tight end, he is someone that you have to block, and you have no idea how to defend. He is capable of running over you or running around you. Most guys can do one or the other, but 'Sizz' can do both."

If you could witness one historical event, what would it be? "I would love to have heard Martin Luther King deliver his speeches. On the flip side, I'm glad I didn't live during that time, because many of the freedoms blacks have now, we didn't have at that point. In retrospect, hearing some of the speeches and seeing what he and Malcolm X did, it would have been tough because of the circumstances."

Is it true that you hold the bench press record at Georgia? "I think I still have it. It was crazy – 565 pounds. I probably couldn't do half of that today. (laughter) That was a good 16 or 17 years ago. We would have competitions at the end of every summer. Initially, I did 555. Then, a D-lineman did 560, because he wanted to do more. I was like, 'Well, let me try one more time,' and I put 565 on there!"

THE TURNOVER GAME

The Ravens have produced the NFL's No. 2 turnover differential (+13). Baltimore has also registered the league's second most takeaways (29), including 11 over the past four games.

QUOTH THE RAVENS

QB JOE FLACCO ON BOUNCING BACK AFTER A TOUGH WEEK 14 DEFEAT:

"I think we have a pretty short memory around here. I think we'll be good at [bouncing back]. We better. We better get over it quickly. We have everything we want in front of us. We've got to go get it."

BaltimoreRavens.com's John Eisenberg on the Ravens' Week 14 offensive performance against the Steelers:

"It was brilliant, nothing short of that. [Alex] Collins performed like an All-Pro, shedding tacklers and finding daylight as he showed a national TV audience what a find he's been. The line dominated for a second straight week, opening holes and giving [Joe] Flacco time to throw. An unusual array of guys made plays, including Chris Moore, Javorius Allen, Mike Wallace and Patrick Ricard. It's been a tough slog for the offense this season, but the unit has finally come together, it seems, with impressive results."

LB C.J. Mosley on the Ravens learning from their tough, thrilling loss at Pittsburgh last week:

"We didn't get the result that we wanted. Being in that environment, Sunday night, playing in a rivalry, for a lot of the guys, that's probably the closest they've felt to a playoff game. If anything, it should be a morale boost, I would say. We just have to make those minor adjustments so we can finish close games like that."

S Eric Weddle on the 39-38 loss at Pittsburgh:

"This is going to sting for a while, especially for the guys on defense, because we care so much, and we hold ourselves to a high standard. Look, we have three games, two of them at home. If we win, we're going to go to the playoffs with a three-game winning streak and winning six out of seven. Hopefully this will build our character and make us better in the long run."

John Harbaugh on RB Alex Collins:

"Alex has done a great job. I have been impressed. He is a great story. It is one of the great stories in the NFL this year. It is nice to see when a guy like Alex Collins – who is a great individual and hard worker – gets an opportunity, he is able to make the most of it and have that kind of success. It is something for people who love the National Football League and fans or parents with their kids, you can say, 'See, you can do it, too.' That is how I look at it, and he has done a great job."

NFL Network Analyst Daniel Jeremiah on the Ravens withstanding injuries to key starters:

"The Ravens are so tough and resilient. Some of these other teams crumble after injuries. No excuses in Baltimore. Credit their culture built by Ozzie Newsome."

ST coord./assoc. head coach Jerry Rosburg on P Sam Koch:

"He's got excellent ball control, he can hit it right, he can hit it left, he can get it wide, and he can hit narrow. Also, all the balls that you're talking about inside the 20, or inside the 10, even, some of those are coming from outside the pooch range, and that also has to do with ball control. It's a different kind of punt, but as we all know, Sam is an outstanding directional punter, so he can pinpoint the ball and try to put it close to the sideline and hopefully get a decent bounce off of it. Sometimes it bounces well, and sometimes it doesn't. That ball is a funny-shaped object."

The Baltimore Sun's Childs Walker on the "Wolfpack" trio of K Justin Tucker, LS Morgan Cox and P Sam Koch:

"They are a team within a team. They walk out to practice together. They leave the field together. You might hear Koch tease Tucker for being a superstar and a motormouth. But you'll almost never hear a member of the triad take credit for an accomplishment without citing the other two. What unites them, along with [Jerry] Rosburg and kicking coach Randy Brown, is an unstinting compulsion to deconstruct and perfect every microsecond of each punt or field goal attempt."

Offensive coordinator Marty Mornhinweg on WR/RS Chris Moore, who continues to emerge as the Ravens' No. 3 WR after a TD catch in Week 14 at Pittsburgh:

"Chris is a heck of a special teams player and [is] getting better and better. He's coming on now. I've been impressed with Chris. I think he's feeling comfortable with his assignments and alignments. He has some experience now. I don't want to speak too soon, but he's been impressive as of late. Not always, but a high percentage of the time, when a man is a really good special teams player, he ends up being a really good position player. So, I'm hoping that's the case."

John Harbaugh on first-round pick CB Marlon Humphrey:

"Marlon has a good mindset. He's going to be tested. There are going to be good moments, and there are always, when you play that position – I don't care whether you're a rookie or a veteran – you're going to have moments where they'll make a play. The league is built that way; it's built for playmakers to make plays in the passing game, and that's just going to happen, and you're going to have to bounce back and make the next play and understand how that works. Marlon seems like he has a good understanding of that. He plays hard, he plays focused, he's developing his technique and things like that. He's a very talented guy."

TOP RAVENS-BROWNS CONNECTIONS

PRO CONNECTIONS

- Ravens general manager/executive VP and Hall of Fame **TE Ozzie Newsome** played 13 seasons in Cleveland. After his playing career, he then held positions as a scout, assistant to the head coach/offense/pro personnel, and director of pro personnel before moving to Baltimore as VP of player personnel in 1996.
- Baltimore ST coordinator/assoc. head coach **Jerry Rosburg** was the Browns' ST coordinator from 2001-06, while Ravens D-line coach **Joe Cullen** held the same title in Cleveland for one season (2013). ... Secondary coach **Chris Hewitt** served as an intern with the Browns in 2001 through the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship Program.
- The Ravens' staff is comprised of many who were invited to join the franchise when it moved from Cleveland: SVP of football administration **Pat Moriarty**, SVP of public & community relations **Kevin Byrne**, VP of football video operations **Jon Dubé**, SVP of operations **Bob Eller**, VP of IT **Bill Jankowski** and VP/head certified athletic trainer **Mark Smith**.
- Ravens senior personnel assistant **George Kokinis** was the Browns' GM in 2009. Kokinis began his career with Cleveland as an operations intern (1991) and then as a scout (1992-95). ... Baltimore director of pro personnel **Vincent Newsome** played two seasons (1991-92) for the Browns before becoming a special assignment scout for the team from 1993-95.
- Ravens **TE Benjamin Watson** played with Cleveland from 2010-2012. ... Selected by Cleveland in the draft were **RB Terrance West** (third round, 2014) and **TE Vince Mayle** (fourth round, 2015).
- Browns head coach **Hue Jackson** was the Ravens' QBs coach for two seasons (2008-09). ... Browns senior offensive assistant **Al Saunders** served the same role for the Ravens from 2009-10.
- Browns director of player personnel and Baltimore native **Chisom Opara** spent the 2004 season as a player personnel assistant with the Ravens after signing with the team as an undrafted free agent in 2003. ... Browns director of college scouting **Bobby Vega** spent the 2004 summer as a player personnel intern with Baltimore.
- Browns **DL Trevon Coley** (2016) and **DL Jamie Meder** (IR) (2014) both originally signed with the Ravens as rookie free agents. ... **CB Reggie Porter** (IR) was on Baltimore's 2017 practice squad.

COLLEGE CONNECTIONS

- The following Ravens coaches have coached college football in the state of Ohio: head coach **John Harbaugh** (Cincinnati 1989-96), special teams coordinator/associate HC **Jerry Rosburg** (Cincinnati 1992-95), defensive coordinator **Dean Pees** (Miami of OH 1983-86, Toledo 1990-93, Kent State 1998-2003), linebackers coach **Don Martindale** (Defiance 1986-97, Cincinnati 1996-98) and senior offensive assistant/QBs coach **Craig Ver Steeg** (Cincinnati 1990-93).

WEEK 14 RECAP: AT PITTSBURGH

Pittsburgh K Chris Boswell's 46-yard field goal with 42 seconds left in the game gave the host Steelers a 39-38 win over the Ravens at Heinz Field. Baltimore climbed out of a 14-0, second-quarter deficit in this thriller, taking a 31-20 third-quarter lead and a 38-29 edge with 6:44 left in the game. But Pittsburgh, which produced 545 yards of offense, created a comeback of its own. The Ravens saw their three-game winning streak stopped, while the Steelers won their eighth consecutive. The Steelers' "Killer Bs" combination was spectacular, with QB Ben Roethlisberger throwing for 506 yards, including 11 passes to WR Antonio Brown for 213 of those. RB Le'Veon Bell produced 125 yards and scored 3 touchdowns. Bell scored the game's first 2 TDs, the initial on a 20-yard pass from Roethlisberger and the second on a 1-yard run. A **QB Joe Flacco**-to-**WR Chris Moore** 30-yard TD made the score 14-7 in the second quarter. An 18-yard TD scamper by Ravens **RB Alex Collins** and 2 Boswell FGs (52 and 43) made the score 20-14 at the half. Baltimore roared back in the third quarter, outscoring the Steelers 17-0 on a **K Justin Tucker** 47-yard FG and TDs by **RB Javorius Allen** (1 yard) and **FB/DL Patrick Ricard** (6 yards from Flacco). A 24-yard Boswell FG and a 1-yard TD by FB Roosevelt Nix (from Roethlisberger) made the score 31-29 with 9:15 remaining in the contest. A 9-yard Allen TD put the Ravens up 38-29 before Bell's third TD (11 yards) made the score 38-36 with 3:29 left. Flacco completed 20 of 35 for 269 yards to nine different receivers, with 2 TDs and an INT on the game's opening drive. Collins rushed for 120 yards on 18 carries, helping the Ravens to a season-high 413 yards. Roethlisberger was 44-of-66 and was sacked 3 times. TE Jesse James grabbed 10 for 97 yards. The win clinched the AFC North for Pittsburgh.

Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



**QB Joe Flacco - 2012
Super Bowl XLVII MVP**

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his nine full seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under his guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of seven teams with at least six playoff berths in the past nine seasons (2008-16): GB (8), NE (8), Bal. (6), Cin. (6), Ind. (6), Pit. (6) & Sea. (6).
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 11.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the second-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first nine seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first nine years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists:

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST **Brendon Ayanbadejo** (2008), K **Billy Cundiff** (2010), RS **Jacoby Jones** (2012), K **Justin Tucker** (2013 & 2016), LS **Morgan Cox** (2015 & 2016) and P **Sam Koch** (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl K **Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (195) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 89.9% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (195-of-217 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P **Sam Koch's** 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2014, Koch posted the NFL's No. 3 gross (47.4) and No. 1 net (43.3) averages, both career highs and Ravens records.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS **Jacoby Jones** in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 vs. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. RB **Bobby Rainey Jr.** posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while WR **Michael Campanaro** registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens are the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.





Rushing Yards Per Game by Ravens in 2017 (NFL's Ninth best)



"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.' He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

A TREMENDOUS 2016

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)



JOHN HARBAUGH MONDAY PRESS CONFERENCE: WEEK 15 AT BROWNS

Opening Statement: “It is good to see you guys. I appreciate you being here. We are back at it – coaches, players. We have had about 20 players in working out today, and the coaches have been at it, really, since we got back, in terms of finishing up the Pittsburgh tape, delving into it, in terms of what we can learn and the ideas that we can use going forward to improve, and then going to work on Cleveland. That is where we are, and I will take any questions that you have.”

Going back to the end of the game, after the field goal by the Steelers with 42 seconds left, you guys have the ball. The decision in terms of the call there ... There was two passes, one run. Was there consideration in running the ball, perhaps again on third down or maybe on first down? (Jerry Coleman) “Not once we were out of timeouts. We had to get the clock stopped and get the ball down the field. Once Jeremy [Maclin] got hurt with only 40 seconds, we needed a chunk play. Running the ball, clock running ... We need chunk plays at that point. You have to try to push the ball down the field and get chunk plays.”

I believe the question was more of when there was 3:29 left. It was the second to last drive. (Jamison Hensley) “Oh, yes. Well, yes, we could have run it. You can pass it. You do whatever you can to try and get yards. If it works, it is a good call, and if it doesn’t work, it is not a good call.”

Leading into WR Jeremy Maclin with his situation, was there an effort to try and get him off the field? Or was it just something where he could not get off and it ended up costing you a timeout that you needed? (Jerry Coleman) “Right – he couldn’t get off. I think that was clear. Did you see it?” (Reporter: “I saw it, but there was questions by the fans, because he came back two plays later.”) “He was laying there. A player has to get off on his own power. You can’t go out there. As you said, could you get him off the field? If you go on the field, they stop it. It is an injury timeout. That is how it works.”

Moving forward, you have three games to go. You control your own destiny. Obviously, that would be the position you would want to be in, besides winning the division. Does that situation perhaps make the loss last night a little more palatable? (David Ginsburg) “We are looking forward to an opportunity to win the next game and what that entails. We are in it. We have earned our way to be in it. We are right there during a Wild Card berth, but there are three games left, and we have to make it happen for ourselves. We understand that. We talked about it last night in the locker room with the guys. The guys have been in today talking about it, and we are excited about that. [It is] a big challenge. We have to go on the road, and we have to beat Cleveland. We have to come back and beat Indianapolis. We have to come back and beat Cincinnati. It is the National Football League. Those will be three very challenging football games for us, but we are capable of doing it. We expect to do it, but we have to have all hands on deck for the next challenge, and that is what we are going to do.”

When a guy goes off offensively for the other team, reporters and fans always ask why you didn’t double them or give them more attention. Looking back at the film, when you go over the play calls and stuff, were there certain times you wish you would have given Steelers WR Antonio Brown more attention, specifically on that long catch on Pittsburgh’s last possession. (Jeff Zrebiec) “Sure, that is what you do. I am sure baseball pitchers wish they had not thrown a fastball when they threw a fastball or a curveball when they hung one in there for a home run. You always look at it that way.”

With the way CB Marlon Humphrey was playing and doing so well, was there a discussion of putting him on Steelers WR Antonio Brown? (Jamison Hensley) “Yes, there is always a discussion like that, but that is not our gameplan. Then, we have to basically lock into man coverage at that point, and Ben [Roethlisberger] knows you are doing that. Those are easy fixes from an outside perspective, but we are playing multiple defenses, and we are trying to keep them off balance. That doesn’t really work when you start chasing a receiver all around the field; it exposes your coverage.”

How did you feel CB Marlon Humphrey played as a starter? (Ed Lee) “I thought he played well.”

Is there anything that stood out to you about how CB Marlon Humphrey played? (Ed Lee) “No. I thought he played well.”

Did you get out of the game pretty well, health-wise? (Jeff Zrebiec) “It looks like we did. It doesn’t appear to be anything too serious.”



Did WR/RS Chris Moore have a hip injury? I think they said that on the TV broadcast? (Luke Jones) “He had an issue. [I’m] not really going to get into diagnosing it, but we’ll see as the week goes on how serious it is. He’s pretty optimistic today, so we’ll keep our fingers crossed.”

How has WR/RS Chris Moore emerged? Clearly, special teams has been his knack for the last year or two, but [he is] emerging more as a consistent contributor at receiver. (Luke Jones) “He really made some plays. I thought Chris came up, obviously, with a touchdown pass, which was big. The sideline catch, the diving catch, was big. He’s coming on. So, that’s exciting for us, and hopefully he’s out there next Sunday.”

Was there anything to be gained last night, in terms of confidence and knowing that you can go out there in a hostile situation and put up the points and go toe-to-toe with a team like that? (Jerry Coleman) “I don’t know. You can ask the players. Our guys are confident. I don’t think they really need that. Maybe the fans will be more confident – which is cool. But, the players are confident. They believe in themselves, and you just have to keep working. If you keep working, you get that much better. We said all along: You improve *that* much, then you get a lot better – especially this time of year. We’re working hard to improve that way, every single day. The guys have really worked hard to get a little bit better every single day and stack that up and see if it can multiply for us into success. The story is still to be written on that. It needs to be applied to winning a game – all three phases working together. All three phases could have done something. We get one more stop, one more first down, one more score – whatever it might be – one more play on special teams, we win the game. That’s how all of our guys look at it; that’s how our coaches look at it; that’s how we look at it. We’re trying to win games. We really don’t need assurance. We just need to get ready for the next game.”

Cleveland had a two-touchdown lead on the Packers. Is [Cleveland] a better team than when you saw them in Week 2? I realize you’re early in the game film, but I’m sure you’re looking at it as a challenge. (David Ginsburg) “We have to go win the game. I’d probably have a better answer for you on Wednesday about that, after having a chance to study it more. I’m sure they’ll be very motivated. They’re very well-coached. They have very good players, playmakers – added a big playmaker recently – and [their] defense is very tough to game-plan against. It’s a very creative defense. We just have to get ready to go play and win.”

What are you seeing from WR Jeremy Maclin the last couple of weeks? It just seems like he and QB Joe Flacco have had a lot of plays where they’ve been out of sync. Is there anything sticking out, as far as why they’re just not connecting? (Luke Jones) “No, not really.”
