JUST THE FACTS

- Win, and they're definitely in – for the seventh time in head coach **John Harbaugh's** 10-year tenure.
- The Baltimore Ravens (9-6), looking to also capture their eighth playoff berth in 12 seasons, host the Cincinnati Bengals (6-9) to close out regular season play. Kickoff for this AFC North battle is set for 4:25 p.m. from M&T Bank Stadium. With a victory over the Bengals, Baltimore, which has won five of its past six games, will return to the postseason for the first time since 2014.
- The Ravens lead the all-time series, 22-21, vs. the Bengals, including a 20-0 victory in Week 1 at Cincinnati. In that game, Baltimore forced 5 turnovers (4 INTs and 1 FR) and posted 5 sacks, including 2 from **OLB Terrell Suggs**. The Ravens' ground game was also stout, with Baltimore rushing 42 times for 157 yards.
- Last Saturday in a 23-16 home win over Indianapolis, **QB Joe Flacco** was 29-of-38 for 237 yards, 2 TDs and 0 INTs to lead the Ravens' charge. Baltimore's defense, which thwarted a late comeback by the Colts when **CB Maurice Canady** broke up a fourth-down pass deep in Ravens' territory to seal the game, allowed 296 yards and posted 2 sacks (**DT Willie Henry** and **OLB Za'Darius Smith**.) **K Justin Tucker** nailed all 3 of his FG attempts and extended his consecutive kicks made streak to 17, also surpassing 800 points for his career.
- The Ravens have earned a playoff berth in six of the past nine full seasons. Since **John Harbaugh's** arrival in 2008, Baltimore has posted the NFL's fourth-most total victories (104), won the league's second-most playoff games (10), advanced to three AFC Championship contests, and in 2012, captured the World Championship in SB XLVII.

COACH HARBAUGH SAYS

JOHN HARBAUGH ON WHAT'S AT STAKE IN WEEK 17'S GAME VS. CINCINNATI:

"We have to put everything we have into this game. Everything we've done from the beginning, right down until today – you go all the way back to training camp and OTAs – it all comes down to one game. That's what the National Football League can be sometimes, and that's what it is for us. What could be better – at home, in front of our fans, with everything that we've worked for on the line? We can't wait to kick off on Sunday."

SPOTLIGHT: K JUSTIN TUCKER

Do you have New Year's Eve traditions? "I always come up with a New Year's resolution. For 2018, my resolution will probably be taking my shoes off at the garage door and making sure I put my laundry away in a timely manner. My wife will appreciate those."

What is the most memorable kick of yours? "In college it would be my senior year on Thanksgiving night, when I hit the game-winner at Texas A&M. As far as in the last six years, I can come up with a good handful, but the 38-yarder with a few minutes left in the Super Bowl to put us ahead by five points changed the dynamic of the game. Making that is one I really feel good about. If it goes the other way, the game is completely different, and we might not all have rings."

If you were to create a kicker using three traits, how would you build the kicker? "When you are talking about the clutch factor, you have to include Adam Vinatieri in that conversation. In regards to leg strength or just a guy that sticks out as a pure ball striker, it would be Stephen Gostkowski. A guy who is known for being crazy accurate, you have to talk about Dan Bailey. If you combine those traits with those particular guys, you are looking at a pretty solid NFL kicker."

How would your son describe your job? "Well, he is still pretty little, so it would be difficult. It would probably be four words that he knows very, very well: 'Raven,' 'Poe,' 'daddy,' and 'kick.'"

What was your mindset going into a rookie tryout with the Ravens in 2012? "As with my entire career, I have always tried to take everything one kick at a time. Whatever opportunities I got to kick a ball in front of someone with some sort of pull, I was going to do everything I could. The thought process to me was, 'Do everything you can to make that one kick.' When you get another opportunity, do everything you can to make that one kick."

What are your favorite traits of John Harbaugh? "It has to be his enthusiasm and passion for football, and then, his appreciation of the details and the finer points. As a specialist, that is something I can relate to. Having an appreciation for the finer details, the intricacies and nuance that comes with NFL football, that stands out to me."

How would you describe the Ravens' locker room? "We have an excellent balance with a lot of personalities and backgrounds. Guys know how to have a good time, but we also know how to work and buckle down when it is time to be serious. I think we do it in a unique way here, because everyone feels free to let their personality shine all within something that is bigger than themselves."

QUOTE THE RAVENS

LB C.J. MOSLEY ON NEEDING A WIN IN WEEK 17 TO MAKE THE PLAYOFFS:

“It feels good to be back in that position. After all of the hard losses, the tough wins, it’s crazy how many games you play in a season, and it seems to always come down to the last few weeks of the season. We had our chance last year, and [we were] one play away. Now, it’s all in our hands right now. For the older guys and the vets that have been in the playoffs with the Ravens, we’ve got to make sure we keep the younger guys focused. When you think about it, the guys from last year or two years ago, they haven’t been in a playoff game before. So, it’s been a while. We’ve got to make sure we have everyone focused. You definitely don’t look past the Bengals; you always know that’s a tough game, and we’ve got to make sure we start fast.”

QB Joe Flacco on how it feels now with everything coming down to one game:

“We’ve been in this situation a bunch of times. I keep saying that I think we’re a very excited and very confident football team. We’ll be itching to get back out there on Sunday and to get the game underway. But we’ve got to go about our business the right way, continue to do what we’ve been doing, and I think we’ll be all right. But it’s a tough team we’ve got coming in here next week. We all know that.”

S Eric Weddle on the Ravens’ late-season playoff run:

“I think that we are really coming into our own. We’re playing the style and game that we envisioned at the beginning of the season. Our offensive line has been together for six or seven games in a row, and we got ‘Woody’ [Danny Woodhead] back. Defensively, we have continued to get better. Obviously, Pittsburgh was a tough game for us, but we’ve rebounded in the last couple of weeks. With the game on the line, having to stop [the Colts], it shows a lot of character about what we are as a team and what we are as a defense. We are playing well, winning five out of six. We are a team with momentum, and we have to get one more.”

DT Brandon Williams on the Ravens battling to earn a tough victory last Saturday vs. the Colts:

“It shows heart, it shows soul, it shows how hard we fight. You look left and right and see your brothers, and they’re going to do whatever it takes to win. They are going to fight for you and with you. That’s what the Ravens are all about.”

WR Mike Wallace on what the outsiders say about the Ravens’ receiving group and passing game:

“We don’t listen to the outside noise. When you’re with someone 6-7 months every day, you know what type of person and player they are. It might not go your way every week, but sometimes that’s through some fault of your own. That’s just the way the game goes. We know people are quick to write somebody off, ‘They didn’t do that; they don’t do this.’ People can say whatever they want, but that’s what makes this game great. We take all those comments and use it as fuel and we just keep grinding it. And then you see the outcome.”

OLB Terrell Suggs on if close games sharpen a team when moving forward in a playoff push:

“It means you are battle-tested. We have been in every type of situation this year. You do not make the same mistakes, you make new ones. Mistakes are for learning. Everything that we busted or made a mistake on in the first 16 weeks, we have to look at that and nip it in the bud so we can play lights out this week. It is going to take a phenomenal effort on our part. We are putting all our eggs in one basket. Everything is on the line to play a division foe. They are going to come in and be ready, and we have to do everything with our job to make sure we are ready.”

S Tony Jefferson on the team’s confidence:

“We know what’s ahead of us, and we know what’s at stake. We’re excited about the opportunity. It is always good when your future is in your own hands. You don’t have to depend on anyone else. We just have to go out and get this one last win, and we are in The Dance.”

QB Joe Flacco on being a battle-tested team, such as winning a close game against Indianapolis last Saturday:

“A lot of the games we’ve won this year, I feel like we’ve won by a decent margin, but at the same time, we’ve dealt with tough losses. We’ve had a couple of tough victories, and I think those are always huge. They really are – they really test the character of a football team, and you can really find out a lot about what you have. Our goal’s to get to the playoffs, and once you get to those games, you can’t rely on winning those games by 20 or 30 points. You have to rely on being able to play 60 minutes and being able to have the nerve and everything else that goes along with that. Winning the game on the last drive and stopping the team on the last drive – a lot of things go into that. So, the fact that we’ve had to deal with this is definitely a positive.”

DT Willie Henry on preparing for Cincinnati this week:

“It is going to be very focused, understanding that we have a goal, and that is to get to the playoffs. I do not see anything less than coming in with a work week, a work mindset, knowing that we have to get ready for this opponent that is not going to come in here and give us a ‘W.’”

WEEK 16 RECAP: RAVENS 23, COLTS 16

The Ravens won for the fifth time in six games when they survived strong winds and pouring rain in a 23-16 victory over the Colts at M&T Bank Stadium. To earn the playoffs, the Ravens have to beat the visiting Bengals on Sunday (12/31). This game was in doubt until **CB Maurice Canady** knocked the ball away from WR T.Y. Hilton on a fourth-and-10 at the Baltimore 17-yard line with 1:43 left in the battle. Despite the conditions, neither team turned the ball over, but the Ravens dominated time of possession, 35:48 to 24:12. **QB Joe Flacco** directed 5 scoring drives of at least 10 plays, the best the Ravens' offense produced since the 2011 season. After a three-and-out by the Colts to open the contest, the Ravens made a 14-play, 52-yard series that ended with a 30-yard **K Justin Tucker** FG. The Ravens made it 10-0 in the second quarter on a 6-yard Flacco-to-**WR Michael Campanaro** TD (10 plays, 71 yards). As they did all game, the Colts bounced back, getting to within 3 (10-7) after a QB Jacoby Brissett 14-yard TD throw to RB Frank Gore. Tucker made it 13-7 at the half with a 39-yard FG. Baltimore opened the second half with another long drive (11 plays, 57 yards), and Tucker converted a 36-yard FG to take a 16-7 lead. Indianapolis responded with a pair of K Adam Vinatieri FGs (48 and 38 yards) to bring the Colts within 3, 16-13, after three quarters. The Ravens then ate clock and jumped to a 23-13 advantage when Flacco found **TE Maxx Williams** for a 4-yard TD at the end of a 14-play drive that started the fourth quarter. Vinatieri's 30-yard FG put the Colts within a TD (23-16) with 4:33 left in the game. Indy then made it dramatic when LB Anthony Walker blocked a **P Sam Koch** punt that was recovered at the Ravens' 27-yard line with 2:36 left in the contest. The Colts moved to the 10 before a 7-yard sack by **OLB Za'Darius Smith** set up Canady's important pass defense on the fourth down. Flacco finished with 29 completions on 38 passes for 237 yards. **TE Benjamin Watson** and **RB Danny Woodhead** each caught 5 for 40 and 33 yards, respectively. Brissett was 16-of-33 for 215 yards, including 6 to Hilton for 100 yards, while Gore added 68 rushing yards. **S Tony Jefferson** blocked a Vinatieri FG attempt in the first quarter.

LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his nine full seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under his guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of seven teams with at least six playoff berths in the past nine seasons (2008-16): GB (8), NE (8), Bal. (6), Cin. (6), Ind. (6), Pit. (6) & Sea. (6).
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 11.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the second-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first nine seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first nine years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists:

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST **Brendon Ayanbadejo** (2008), K **Billy Cundiff** (2010), RS **Jacoby Jones** (2012), K **Justin Tucker** (2013 & 2016), LS **Morgan Cox** (2015 & 2016) and P **Sam Koch** (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl K **Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (200) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 90.1% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (200-of-222 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P **Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2014, Koch posted the NFL's No. 3 gross (47.4) and No. 1 net (43.3) averages, both career highs and Ravens records.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS **Jacoby Jones** in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 vs. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. RB **Bobby Rainey Jr.** posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while WR **Michael Campanaro** registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens are the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's second-most blocked kicks (13, tied), including an NFL-high (tied) 4 in 2016.






DEAN PEES & DEFENSIVE NOTES



- The Ravens are 12-3 at home all time against teams from the *West Coast* (Oak. – 5-1, SD – 3-1, SF – 2-0 and Sea. – 2-1).
- In the Ravens' history, Baltimore has hosted 17 games when the temperature was below 40 degrees. Impressively, the Ravens are 15-2 in these contests, winning 15 of the past 16.

TOP "D" AT HOME

Baltimore has permitted an NFL-best 16.4 ppg at home during the **John Harbaugh** Era. Under "Harbs," the Ravens are 29-0 at home when allowing 10 points or fewer. In 18 of those games, the Ravens gave up no more than 7 points.

ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.' He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

A TREMENDOUS 2016

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)



WALTER PAYTON MAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

The Baltimore Ravens have selected **TE Benjamin Watson** as their recipient for the 2017 Walter Payton Man of the Year Award. Benjamin, his wife, Kirsten, and their five children assist countless individuals both in the Baltimore community and internationally through their One More Foundation. In June, Benjamin and Kirsten wife traveled to the Dominican Republic to help fight human sex trafficking and slavery alongside the International Justice Mission (IJM).
