BALTIMORE RAVENS AT INDIANAPOLIS COLTS

Preseason Game 3 — Aug. 20, 2018 8:00 p.m. ET — Lucas Oil Stadium (70,000)

JUST THE FACTS

- The Baltimore Ravens (2-0) will square off against the Indianapolis Colts (1-0) at Lucas Oil Stadium on ESPN's Monday Night Football (Aug. 20, 8 p.m. ET). Before that, the Ravens travel to Indy on Aug. 16 and will then spend two days (Aug. 17-18) holding joint practices with the Colts at the Grand Park Sports Complex in Westfield, IN.
- After kicking off the preseason with a 17-16 win over Chicago in the Hall of Fame Game, Baltimore bested the L.A. Rams, 33-7, last Thursday in front of a home crowd. Led by **QB Joe Flacco** for one series, the first-team offense opened the game by driving 70 yards in 10 plays, with Flacco finding **FB/DL Patrick Ricard** for a 9-yard TD to cap the push. The 11th-year signal-caller was 5-of-7 for 71 yards (143.5 rating), hitting offseason additions **WR John Brown** (17 yards), **WR Michael Crabtree** (30) and **TE Hayden Hurst** (12) in the process. Baltimore's defense held L.A. to 170 total yards while posting 4 sacks including 1 by **OLB Terrell Suggs** and forcing 2 turnovers.
- In 2017, the Ravens won six of their last nine games, finishing second in the AFC North with a 9-7 record and falling one game short of earning a playoff berth (lost on tiebreaker to Buffalo).
- A Week 17 home win over the Bengals was needed to earn the playoffs. However, Baltimore's hopes were dashed when Cincinnati produced a 49-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-12 with just 44 seconds remaining to earn a hard-fought, 31-27 victory that closed out the season in heartbreaking fashion.
- John Harbaugh is in his 11th year at the Ravens' helm, leading the team to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 full seasons. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have played in three AFC Championships, while in 2012, he guided the franchise to its second Super Bowl title. Including playoffs (10-5), the Ravens are 104-71 since Harbaugh's 2008 arrival, posting the NFL's fourth-most total victories.

HARBS SAYS

HEAD COACH JOHN HARBAUGH ON HIS PLAYERS' ENERGY AND ATTITUDE:

"The guys are keeping the energy up. They're doing a great job. Guys are working hard every day. The attitude has been A-plus, and the effort has been A-plus from Day One until now, and that's all you can ask for as a coach. And not just on the practice field – in the meeting room, in the training room, in the weight room, everywhere – the guys have been just outstanding. I'm really excited about the guys."

INJURY UPDATE

Six-time Pro Bowl **G Marshal Yanda** (offseason shoulder surgery) was activated from the PUP list on Aug. 4, but has not played. Yanda missed 14 games in 2017 with a broken ankle. Currently on PUP are **WR Quincy Adeboyejo** (thigh), **LB Bam Bradley** (knee) and **CB Jaylen Hill** (knee).

NOTE THE QUOTE

WILLIE SNEAD IV ON BALTIMORE'S OFFSEASON FREE AGENT WR SIGNINGS:

"I think Joe [Flacco] has a lot of confidence in us. Just from the little time that we've been together, just talking to him in the locker room, to coming out here on the field and making plays while he's throwing us the ball – he has a lot of confidence in our group. We just all bring something very different to the table. [Michael] Crabtree is 10 years in and brings that old vet mentality, that different swagger. Me and 'J.B.' [John Brown] came in together in 2014, and he brings that speed downfield. Me – I work the slot, I work everywhere, blocking, especially."

- The Ravens return **six offensive players** who started at least 12 games in 2017. Additionally, six-time Pro Bowl **G Marshal Yanda**, who missed 14 games with a broken ankle, returns from injury.

SPOTLIGHT: RB ALEX COLLINS



Ht. 5-10 Wt. 208 Exp. (NFL/Ravens): 3/2 College: Arkansas Hometown: Fort Lauderdale, FL

Tell us about the two German Shepherds you own? "Their names are Scrappy and Chaos. I got them while I was in college. They look vicious, but they're not. I trained them myself."

Was it difficult training the dogs yourself? "They're eager dogs and full of energy. No,

teaching them isn't hard. I can teach them anything. Obedience is their best 'trick.' They listen and follow directions, but sometimes they're like me [and don't]. They like to play and run around."

You have a lot of tattoos. Which tattoo is the most meaningful to you? "I have on my left arm just random tattoos, like animals. I have a snake, a dog paw, a shark, a scorpion – just random stuff. Then on my other arm, it's more spiritual. I have the sacred heart, the date I got saved, a cross, the Bible verse, 'Walk by faith, not by sight,' and a stairway to heaven. It's a whole bunch of spiritual stuff."

What was your reasoning behind the two distinct themes? "One is just the tattoo-side of it, because once you start getting tattoos, it's addicting, and you're going to want to fill space. The other arm was all meaningful to me."

Do you have a favorite show that you binge watch? "I was a Netflix kind of guy. I used to binge watch Prison Break. I pulled a few all-nighters watching Grey's Anatomy — there's a lot of drama I enjoy. Anything that has action and drama and makes you want to keep watching and wonder what happens next. That's what gets me hooked. It's like a super long movie — a three-, four-day movie [while] eating a bunch of snacks."

What's your favorite emoji? "The smirk face. I like to miscommunicate, so I'll just put a bunch of emojis down and have somebody try to figure out what I'm trying to say."

Who is the best player that's ever covered you? "That's a tough one, because the linebacker position is the main one that covers running backs. Going against Pro Bowlers like C.J. Mosley in practice is difficult. But I was also at Seattle and had to go against Bobby Wagner and K.J. Wright. But to have C.J. Mosley and Bobby Wagner, and to get that great work from those caliber of players, it's hard to decide."

Do you trade jerseys with fellow players? "For the most part, it's people I know or am cool with. I don't just go ask random guys, because it's more meaning behind it [if you know them]. I have them hanging up in my house."

If you weren't playing football, what would you be doing? "I would probably want to be coaching, or getting into something like social work to be able to change kids' lives and lead them in the right direction."

QUOTH THE RAVENS



DT Brandon Williams on 16-Year Veteran OLB Terrell Suggs:

"He's pretty much the blueprint of what a Raven is. If you're not watching what 'Sizz' does, and how 'Sizz' prepares, how he studies his film, how he works out here on the field every day, then there's something wrong with you. You shouldn't be out here."

Assistant head coach/tight ends Greg Roman on what has surprised him about rookie TE Hayden Hurst:

"He was so impressive before the draft. We really felt like, I think to a man, that he was a very professional young man. I don't know that anything really jumps out at me other than once he gets to do something and understand it, he's got it, he locks it down. We always knew he was fast, we knew he had good hands, we knew he was competitive. I think he's showing us [that] we're going to be able to use him in a variety of ways. He might be spilt out there, split out here in the backfield, wherever. He's a guy that you can line up anywhere, and that's been very encouraging."

John Harbaugh on the development of rookie T Orlando Brown Jr.: "They say one of the best abilities is availability, and he's been available every single practice to improve. He's the kind of player that gets better with every rep, too. He's very smart. He takes the lesson learned from the previous rep and applies it to the next rep, and I think you see, in his play, the results of that."

WR Willie Snead IV on if he feels like people hope the three free agent wide receiver additions (John Brown, Michael Crabtree and himself) will revive the Ravens' passing game: "Yes, I think so. I think it's just a matter of time. These [next] couple weeks, we're going to be trying to get better and better. 'Crab' [Michael Crabtree] tells me every day, 'We're going to be doing something serious this year.' And I believe it, too. I just think that we just need to keep building that time with [Joe] Flacco and just know, when he flushes the pocket, what we need to do to get open. Or, what he's looking for in certain coverages and how he sees each of us. 'J.B.' [John Brown] is the 'go get it.' For me, he's going to put it on me and 'Crab.' I think once we all get a feel for each other, once the season starts, it's going to be exciting, man. I can't wait. It's definitely going to revive this whole offense."

S Eric Weddle, entering his third year in Baltimore, on why he feels at home with the Ravens:

"From the outside, I was just always envious of Baltimore, the city, the defense, the playoff atmosphere, the head coach. My personality, my work ethic, my team-first attitude fits exactly with what 'Harbs' [John Harbaugh] and this place is all about. I didn't have to change anything about who I am, my personality. I can be a little outspoken at times, but at the end of the day, all my coaches and all my teammates know that all I want to do is win and have what's best for the team. It's been an amazing two-plus years. I never would have thought in a million years that I'd have this much fun and love this place as much as I have. I feel like I've been here my whole career."

OLB Terrell Suggs on what excites him about the Ravens' defense in 2018:

"A lot of things excite me about this year's unit. It's the same thing we've had for a couple years. It's definitely depth. The personnel we have is very rare. We've had legendary defenses in the past, but we've never been this deep at every position, so that's something exciting to look forward to. And we can be a fresher team coming down the stretch in December and January football."

NFL Network's Nate Burleson on why WR Michael Crabtree will be successful in Baltimore:

"I've learned not to question Crabtree's skill level, as he's been one of my favorite receivers to watch the last few seasons. He's a chain-mover with great hands and someone a quarterback can count on when in dire need of a first down. Joe Flacco's going to look for him often in the red zone, and Crabtree will eventually become Flacco's favorite target in 2018."

John Harbaugh on if free agent WR John Brown has been better than expected:

"I would agree with that. He has been better than we expected. Obviously, we've had high hopes for him, but [he's] better than advertised – probably even better than what the tape showed, I would say. He's been a complete receiver for us."

NFL.com's Marc Sessler on K Justin Tucker:

"He's nothing short of the best kicker in club history and a future Hall of Famer. Tucker is 15-for-17 on kicks of 50-plus yards over the past two seasons and — while others tediously botch chip shots — perfect on all 205 of his career extra points. *NFL.com* senior analyst Gil Brandt listed Tucker as the greatest kicker of all time, a sentiment tough to disagree with."

CB Brandon Carr on how much his starting streak of 160-consecutive games means:

"I take pride in just being available each and every week. I take pride in taking care of my body, trying to play through as many injuries – whether they're big or small – as I can. But, I've been blessed throughout my career just to kind of be lucky and stay out of the way, stay out the fray of everything and play through the injuries I have. But at this point in my career, I'm just enjoying the game of playing football. I'm enjoying being back on the East Coast. I'm enjoying being back in Baltimore. This environment is nothing but football-friendly for me. But as far as just the streak and all, everything has to come to an end at some point. But my goal, my job, is to come out here and compete, battle for a starting job and to keep the streak alive as long as I can."

2018 COACHING CHANGES

- The Ravens promoted **Don "Wink" Martindale** to defensive coordinator, **Mike Macdonald** to linebackers coach and **Sterling Lucas** to quality control defense. The moves came following the departure of former defensive coordinator Dean Pees, who originally retired following the season, but later decided to return to coaching as Tennessee's defensive coordinator.
- Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, **LB C.J. Mosley** has developed into one of the NFL's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls in his first four seasons.
- The Ravens also hired **James Urban** as their quarterbacks coach, while **Greg Roman** was promoted to assistant head coach. Urban spent the past seven years as the Bengals' wide receivers coach. Prior to that, he was the Philadelphia Eagles' quarterbacks coach in 2009 and 2010, when he helped direct Pro Bowl seasons for Donovan McNabb ('09) and Michael Vick ('10).
- Roman, who was hired by the Ravens in 2017 as the team's senior offensive assistant/tight ends coach, will continue his work coaching the TEs.

2017 SEASON HONORS

OLB TYUS BOWSER

2018 SCHEDULING NOTES

- The Ravens will open and close their 2018 regular season schedule by playing home games at M&T Bank Stadium (Week 1 vs. the Buffalo Bills and Week 17 vs. the Cleveland Browns).
- Two of the Ravens' first four games this season will be nationally televised, with both of those primetime contests occurring on the road (including a Week 4 Sunday night game at Pittsburgh).
- The Week 4 primetime battle at Pittsburgh (9/30) begins a stretch when Baltimore will play four of five games on the road. (This includes three-consecutive away games from Weeks 4-6: at Pittsburgh, at Cleveland and at Tennessee.)
- Four of the Ravens' first six games will be played on the road, as will five of their first eight.
- The Ravens will not leave Baltimore in the month of November, with all three games being played at M&T Bank Stadium. (Baltimore's bye falls on Nov. 11, marking the second-straight year with a Week 10 bye.)
- Six of the Ravens' first nine games are against 2017 playoff teams. Starting in Week 4 at Pittsburgh, Baltimore embarks on a six-game stretch when the Ravens will face five 2017 postseason participants.
- The Ravens play five division opponents in the first 10 games.
- All three of Baltimore's divisional road games will be completed by Week 5. (This is the earliest the Ravens will have ever finished their AFC North Division road schedule, with the previous earliest occurring in Week 9 of 2014.)
- After playing five preseason games, including the final three in 11 days, Baltimore opens the regular season by playing two games in a five-day span, with the second on the road (at Cincinnati).

• The Ravens' 2018 regular season radio team will feature Sandusky, with former Ravens standouts OLB Jarret Johnson and TE Dennis Pitta. Sandusky delivers the play-by-play for the broadcast team, while Johnson and Pitta will rotate games as analysts. All Ravens games can be heard on 98Rock WIYY (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM, baltimoreravens.com, in the Ravens mobile app (when fans are in Baltimore) and on 21 regional affiliates. This network broadcasts each Ravens game and spans three states – Maryland, Pennsylvania and Delaware – and Washington, D.C.

INTs by S Eric Weddle, who in 2017 tied (A.J. Bouye) for the NFL's third most. In his first two seasons (2016-17) as a Raven, he has 10 INTs, which rank No. 1 among all NFL safeties in that span.

NFL defenders, including Ravens second-year **OLB Matthew Judon**, who posted at least 50 tackles, 15 tackles for loss, 8 sacks and 2 forced fumbles in 2017. Judon joined Jadeveon Clowney, Chandler Jones, Cameron Jordan and Von Miller in the elite group.

NFL ranking of 2017 rookie CB Marlon Humphrey's defensive passer rating (49.6), among players who were targeted a minimum of 15 times. The first-round pick also snagged 2 INTs.

All-time NFL ranking for K Justin Tucker's FG% (90.2), including a 91.9 mark (34 of 37) in 2017. Tucker made 19-straight boots to close out the season, with his lone misses coming from 58, 62 and 46 (blocked) yards.

FLACCO HEATED UP

QB Joe Flacco missed all of training camp with a back injury, but returned to start Week 1. As he eased back into football shape, his first several weeks of the season weren't up to his standards. Additionally, Flacco was adjusting to the Ravens' reshuffled offensive line, which experienced many early-season injuries, but eventually gelled to become a team strength. Below are Flacco's statistics in the final seven games, when he and Baltimore's offense began to hit its stride, and the team went 5-2.

SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS



LB Ray Lewis - 2000 Super Bowl XXXV MVP

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.



THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of only eight teams (NE 9; GB 8; Pit. 7; Atl., Bal., Cin., Ind. & Sea. 6) to earn at least six postseason berths in the last 10 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in each of those playoff campaigns.)
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 13.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the third-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 10 seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first 10 years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

SEASONS RAVENS: 11TH NFL: 18TH

Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (202) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 90.2% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (202-of-224 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and inside the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 VS. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. RB Bobby Rainey Jr. posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while WR Michael Campanaro registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens became the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's second-most blocked kicks (13, tied), including an NFL-high (tied) 4 in 2016.

A 23-year NFL coaching veteran, Mornhinweg, who joined Baltimore as QBs coach in 2015, is a former head coach of the Lions (2001-02). He has also served as offensive coordinator for the New York Jets (2013-14), Philadelphia Eagles (2004-12) and San Francisco 49ers (1997-2000).


DON "WINK" MARTINDALE & DEFENSIVE NOTES

"WINK" TO LEAD THE DEFENSE

On Jan. 9, 2018, the Ravens promoted **Don "Wink" Martindale** to defensive coordinator following the retirement of Dean Pees. Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, **LB C.J. Mosley** has become one of the league's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls.

The 2018 campaign will mark Martindale's 14th season coaching in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he served as the Broncos' defensive coordinator.

"'Wink' has earned the promotion to defensive coordinator," **John Harbaugh** stated. "His aggressive mentality will serve to take our defense to new levels. He is obviously respected by players, many of whom have already benefited from his direct coaching at the linebacker position. He knows the ins and outs of what we have been about on defense and has been an important contributor to our success on that side of the ball. This is an exciting day for Wink and his family, and also one for the Ravens."

- ✓ The Ravens produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3 – the most in a season since the 2003 Patriots).
- ✓ Baltimore allowed 18.9 points per game, which ranked No. 6 in the league. It marked the seventh time during the John Harbaugh Era (2008-17) the Ravens produced a Top 10 scoring "D."
- ✓ The Ravens' defense ranked 12th overall (325.1 ypg), producing the NFL's 10th-best pass defense (213.8 ypg).

SHUT 'EM DOWN

The Ravens have posted an NFL-high 13 shutouts since their 1996 inception, a mark that includes three opponent "blankings" this season. Baltimore is the fifth team – and first since 2003 (NE) – in the past 30 years to record at least three shutouts in a season.





2017 TURNOVER DIFFERENTIAL

- In 2017, the Ravens' +17 turnover ratio ranked No. 1 in the NFL. Baltimore's 34 total takeaways (22 INTs & 12 FRs) also ranked No. 1 for the season.
- Baltimore's +14 turnover margin since Week 8 (final nine games) was the NFL's best mark (Chargers were second at +10).
- The Ravens' 22 interceptions ranked No. 1 in the NFL, with the Jaguars finishing second with 21.
- After registering a +4 turnover ratio in Week 1 at Cincy, the Ravens followed up that performance with a +3 outing vs. Cleveland. In each game, Baltimore produced 5 takeaways, marking the first time in franchise history the Ravens have boasted back-to-back games forcing 5 turnovers.

QB Joe Flacco is the Ravens' all-time leading passer in every major category. Flacco, who led Baltimore to a Super Bowl XLVII victory in 2012 (and earned game MVP honors), has completed 10 seasons as the Ravens' signal caller. In 2017, he connected on 64.1 percent of his passes for 3,141 yards, 18 TDs and 13 INTs.



ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

PERHAPS THE BEST YEAR EVER

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).

- ✓ Since PATs were moved back in 2015, Tucker (95-of-95) is the only NFL kicker yet to miss.
- ✓ Tucker is a four-time AFC Special Teams Player of the Month, which ranks one more than legends S Ed Reed & K Matt Stover for the most POM awards in Ravens history. (Tucker has also earned seven AFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.) "Tuck" earned his fourth POM award in Nov. 2017, going 8-for-8 on FGAs and 6-for-6 on PATs.
- ✓ Tucker's 6 FGs on 12/16/13 at Det. set a team record and a single-game NFL high in 2013. Against the Lions, he became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- & 60-yard range in a game.



PLAY 60 GRANT

The Ravens Foundation, Inc. recently awarded \$100,000 in grants to 26 nonprofit organizations around the Baltimore area.
