BALTIMORE RAVENS AT MIAMI DOLPHINS

Preseason Game 4 — Aug. 25, 2018 7:00 p.m. ET — Hard Rock Stadium (64,767)

JUST THE FACTS

- The Baltimore Ravens (3-0) will battle the Miami Dolphins (0-2) at Hard Rock Stadium on Saturday, Aug. 25, with kickoff set for 7 p.m. This marks the Ravens' second-straight preseason road contest (won 20-19 at Indianapolis on Monday, Aug. 20) and continues a stretch where Baltimore plays three games over an 11-day span.
- The victory at Indy marked Baltimore's 11th-consecutive preseason win dating back to 2016. In the contest, **QB Joe Flacco** continued his strong preseason slate, completing 7 of 9 passes for 72 yards and 1 TD to **WR John Brown** (7 yards). Playing in two games so far, Flacco is 12-of-16 for 143 yards, 2 TDs and 0 INTs (141.4 rating).
- The Ravens' defense produced 4 sacks and forced 3 turnovers against Indianapolis. This preseason, Baltimore has allowed just 243.3 yards and 14.0 points per game (both marks ranking third best in the NFL). The Ravens have also forced NFL highs in sacks (12) and takeaways (9), posting a +5 overall turnover differential.
- In 2017, the Ravens won six of their last nine games, finishing second in the AFC North with a 9-7 record and falling one game short of earning a playoff berth (lost on tiebreaker to Buffalo).
- A Week 17 home win over the Bengals was needed to earn the playoffs. However, Baltimore's hopes were dashed when Cincinnati produced a 49-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-12 with just 44 seconds remaining to earn a hard-fought, 31-27 victory that closed out the season in heartbreaking fashion.
- John Harbaugh is in his 11th year at the Ravens' helm, leading the team to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 full seasons. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have played in three AFC Championships, while in 2012, he guided the franchise to its second Super Bowl title. Including playoffs (10-5), the Ravens are 104-71 since Harbaugh's 2008 arrival, posting the NFL's fourth-most total victories.

HARBS SAYS

HEAD COACH JOHN HARBAUGH ON THE RAVENS' 2018 TRAINING CAMP:

"We've been getting a lot of work done, and our guys have done a really good job. I think it's probably about as good as I've ever seen. I'd have to say this has been our best camp, in terms of guys focused on improving every day and becoming one percent better at what they do from one day to the next, and they keep building on that. That's what I'm proud of."

INJURY UPDATE

Six-time Pro Bowl **G Marshal Yanda** (offseason shoulder surgery) was activated from the PUP list on Aug. 4, but has not played. Yanda missed 14 games in 2017 with a broken ankle. Currently on PUP are **WR Quincy Adeboyejo** (thigh), **LB Bam Bradley** (knee) and **CB Jaylen Hill** (knee).

NOTE THE QUOTE

QB JOE FLACCO ON FREE AGENT ADDITION WR JOHN BROWN:

"John is doing a really good job making things happen really quick. I don't know if you've noticed, but we've hit him down the field, we've hit him back shoulder, everything. I really think that's a credit to him and just how well he can get off the ball and get going vertical and put those DBs in a bad position. When you don't get that, it makes it a little bit tough to hang back there and figure out where you're going to put the ball. I think him in particular, he's just been doing a great job of beating guys off the line and showing guys what he's made of."

- The Ravens return all **11 defensive starters** from 2017. This unit produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3). Baltimore allowed 18.9 points per game, sixth best in the NFL.
- The Ravens return six offensive players who started at least 12 games in 2017. Additionally, six-time Pro Bowl G Marshal Yanda, who missed 14 games with a broken ankle, returns from injury.

What's the most memorable game you've played in? "I'd probably say last year, the [Dec. 10] Pittsburgh game, just because it was a primetime game at Pittsburgh. It was just a crazy atmosphere, a close

game. I scored my second touchdown ever. Before that, it would probably be from high school. My sophomore year of high school, we went undefeated and won our first championship ever for our school [David Prouty HS in Spencer, MA]. There were a lot of plays made in that game, and it was such a close game. It was 11-7, and we won. It was kind of snowing. We had so many sets of brothers [on the team]. I played with my brother that year. There were probably eight sets of brothers on the team. That whole year was just so special, because the year before that we went 2-9. The next year we went 13-0. We were all so close. It was just an awesome year."

What did you want to be when you were little? "That's a question that, growing up I never really knew. Some people wanted to be a dentist or a doctor. For me, I remember I was in CCD [religion class], and I got asked that question when I was seven or eight. I told them I wanted to be a cashier, just because I thought it was so cool! I had no idea. I always, for some reason, felt like I wanted to be a professional athlete. I always just had that mindset. It's a dream; you never actually know if it's going to happen, and now it's happening."

If you could only eat one food for the rest of your life, what would it be? "Probably Chinese food. I love crab rangoon, boneless spare ribs, General Tso's chicken, some lo mein. For some reason, it's just so good to me. And there are always so many kinds, even food to go."

Do you have any hidden talents? "Growing up, for a couple years, I played piano. I know how to play a little bit. I haven't played in a while, but I played from third through sixth grade. I took lessons."

What would people be surprised to know about you? "I have a twin sister. She's eight minutes older. She doesn't really brag about it. I'm also the ninth child. I'm the baby. It's by marriages, though. My mom had three, my dad had three, and together they had three. My twin sister is like 5-4, maybe a little over 100 pounds, so she's small."

What is something you wish you were good at? "Public speaking. I wish I could just do it without being so nervous. It's really impressive when people can really just say what they want, and it makes sense. For me, sometimes, the only way I can do it is when I get emotional. That's when I can speak my mind."

What advice would you give your younger self? "Maybe in high school, just to take the football recruiting process more seriously, I'm from a small town, so coming out of high school, I only had two offers. One of them was D-II, and one was Maine. I wish I had taken it a little more seriously to get more looks. But, at the same time, I always believe everything happens for a reason."

QUOTH THE RAVENS

DON MARTINDALE ON OLB TERRELL SUGGS' ABILITY TO GUIDE YOUNG PLAYERS:

"'Sizz' is good with all of them in that room. He is fantastic, and he can break down each guys' game and say, 'Here's what I need to see from you.' It really sounds like a coach, but obviously, it means a lot more when 'Sizz' is saying it to them – a guy who has been Defensive Player of the Year and all his accolades, Pro Bowls and everything else."

ESPN's Jamison Hensley on his expectations of TE Hayden Hurst to start for the Ravens:

"The first-round pick is the best pass-catching tight end on the team. ... Hurst should make an immediate impact after standing out in the offseason with his hands, route running and quickness. How much does Baltimore's passing game rely on this position? Only four quarterbacks since 2012 have completed more than 500 passes to tight ends: Drew Brees, Philip Rivers, Tom Brady and [Joe] Flacco."

DT Brandon Williams on LB C.J. Mosley, who has earned a Pro Bowl invitation in three of his first four seasons:

"I feel like C.J. can go as high as he wants to go and be whoever he wants to be. He's got that much talent. He's got that much leadership ability, and I'll follow him anywhere. I think C.J. can be a premier – can be, is, will be forever – a premier linebacker in this league."

John Harbaugh on OLB Tim Williams' progression into his second year with the Ravens:

"Tim Williams' growth from Year One, I would say is remarkable. It's shown up in the game. It's been showing up in practice. I think even before that, it showed up in his work ethic — in the weight room with Steve [Saunders], with Steve's staff, putting the time in throughout the offseason, throughout the summer, and that kind of attention to detail with the process. That kind of work ethic tends to pay off when the lights come on, and that's what we've seen with him."

Secondary coach Chris Hewitt on CB Tavon Young:

"Tavon is coming right back to where he was [before last year's knee injury]. He's getting his quickness back. One thing about Tavon is he has always been a top competitor. One of the things we always talk about in our room is having top competitors. He's one of those guys that he's the energy bus that we were missing last year in that slot."

K Justin Tucker on being considered one of the most recognizable faces for the Ravens:

"I take it as a high compliment, and it's also high responsibility. It's a challenge. It's an opportunity to meet the standards and hopefully exceed them, that the big names that have come through this organization have set for years before I've ever been a thought as a Baltimore Raven. The Ed Reeds, the Ray Lewises, the Terrell Suggs, the Joe Flaccos, the Matt Stovers, the Todd Heaps ... It's definitely something that I acknowledge and appreciate and respect. It's important, not just as a football player, to do your best on the field, but to be as involved as you can in the community in a positive way."

S Eric Weddle on the 2018 Ravens' outlook:

'Wink' [Martindale] is going to take us to the next level. I already see it on a lot of levels within our defense. I look at our offense and the struggles we had offensively throughout [2017], with Joe [Flacco] missing all of training camp and the offensive line was in constant flux. I think our O-line is going to be a top unit in the NFL. I look at the weapons we've added to help Joe, whether it's the receivers or tight ends, and I look at the work Joe has put in. I see the work nobody else sees, because I'm here every day. Seeing some of the throws he's made and his confidence and how his body is holding up, it gives me confidence. We were one play away last year. Why wouldn't I be excited or have high aspirations for the team when I look at the additions, I look at our head ball coach, the leadership he brings, the calmness? I think we're primed for a big year."

OLB Terrell Suggs on what excites him about the defense:

"A lot of things excite me about this year's unit. It's the same thing we've had for a couple years. It's definitely depth. The personnel we have is very rare. We've had legendary defenses in the past, but we've never been this deep at every position, so that's something exciting to look forward to. And we can be a fresher team coming down the stretch in December and January football."

WRs coach Bobby Engram on how impressed he is with the free agent WR additions of John Brown, Michael Crabtree and Willie Snead IV:

"Extremely. I love the fact that they're great football players, but also, the classroom is important to them. Extra work, all the things they've done to get to this point, they're continuing to do that. I like the leadership that all three of them bring. Everybody's got a little different style of leadership, but they all lead nonetheless."

DB Anthony Levine Sr. on special teams coordinator/associate head coach Jerry Rosburg and the Ravens' special teams culture:

"We had guys before us that Jerry taught, who taught us, and then we'll teach the guys behind us. Jerry is that big figure that the core guys look up to, and we're the sergeants, and the other guys will follow. It's like a chain of command. He trusts us as much as we believe in him. We feel like we get the best coaching, so we go out there and try to show the league that our coach is the best, and we play that way. If it wasn't for Jerry, I have no idea where I'd be. I'd probably be out of the league right now. He's believed so much in me, and he puts so much trust into me. He coaches me hard. I don't know, man. I look up to him a lot, and I'd never want to let Jerry down. I look at him as family."

2018 COACHING CHANGES

- The Ravens promoted **Don "Wink" Martindale** to defensive coordinator, **Mike Macdonald** to linebackers coach and **Sterling Lucas** to quality control defense. The moves came following the departure of former defensive coordinator Dean Pees, who originally retired following the season, but later decided to return to coaching as Tennessee's defensive coordinator.
- Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, **LB C.J. Mosley** has developed into one of the NFL's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls in his first four seasons.
- The Ravens also hired **James Urban** as their quarterbacks coach, while **Greg Roman** was promoted to assistant head coach. Urban spent the past seven years as the Bengals' wide receivers coach. Prior to that, he was the Philadelphia Eagles' quarterbacks coach in 2009 and 2010, when he helped direct Pro Bowl seasons for Donovan McNabb ('09) and Michael Vick ('10).
- Roman, who was hired by the Ravens in 2017 as the team's senior offensive assistant/tight ends coach, will continue his work coaching the TEs.

2018 SCHEDULING NOTES

- The Ravens will open and close their 2018 regular season schedule by playing home games at M&T Bank Stadium (Week 1 vs. the Buffalo Bills and Week 17 vs. the Cleveland Browns).
- Two of the Ravens' first four games this season will be nationally televised, with both of those primetime contests occurring on the road (including a Week 4 Sunday night game at Pittsburgh).
- The Week 4 primetime battle at Pittsburgh (9/30) begins a stretch when Baltimore will play four of five games on the road. (This includes three-consecutive away games from Weeks 4-6: at Pittsburgh, at Cleveland and at Tennessee.)
- Four of the Ravens' first six games will be played on the road, as will five of their first eight.
- The Ravens will not leave Baltimore in the month of November, with all three games being played at M&T Bank Stadium. (Baltimore's bye falls on Nov. 11, marking the second-straight year with a Week 10 bye.)
- Six of the Ravens' first nine games are against 2017 playoff teams. Starting in Week 4 at Pittsburgh, Baltimore embarks on a six-game stretch when the Ravens will face five 2017 postseason participants.
- The Ravens play five division opponents in the first 10 games.
- All three of Baltimore's divisional road games will be completed by Week 5. (This is the earliest the Ravens will have ever finished their AFC North Division road schedule, with the previous earliest occurring in Week 9 of 2014.)
- After playing five preseason games, including the final three in 11 days, Baltimore opens the regular season by playing two games in a five-day span, with the second on the road (at Cincinnati).

• The Ravens' 2018 regular season radio team will feature Sandusky, with former Ravens standouts OLB Jarret Johnson and TE Dennis Pitta. Sandusky delivers the play-by-play for the broadcast team, while Johnson and Pitta will rotate games as analysts. All Ravens games can be heard on 98Rock WIYY (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM, baltimoreravens.com, in the Ravens mobile app (when fans are in Baltimore) and on 21 regional affiliates. This network broadcasts each Ravens game and spans three states – Maryland, Pennsylvania and Delaware – and Washington, D.C.

Sacks by **OLB Terrell Suggs**, tying for the NFL's 11th most. In an amazing 15 completed seasons, his 125.5 career sacks rank No. 2 among active players, only behind Julius Peppers (154.5).

INTs by S Eric Weddle, who in 2017 tied (A.J. Bouye) for the NFL's third most. In his first two seasons (2016-17) as a Raven, he has 10 INTs, which rank No. 1 among all NFL safeties in that span.

NFL defenders, including Ravens second-year **OLB Matthew Judon**, who posted at least 50 tackles, 15 tackles for loss, 8 sacks and 2 forced fumbles in 2017. Judon joined Jadeveon Clowney, Chandler Jones, Cameron Jordan and Von Miller in the elite group.

NFL ranking of 2017 rookie CB Marlon Humphrey's defensive passer rating (49.6), among players who were targeted a minimum of 15 times. The first-round pick also snagged 2 INTs.

All-time NFL ranking for K Justin Tucker's FG% (90.2), including a 91.9 mark (34 of 37) in 2017. Tucker made 19-straight boots to close out the season, with his lone misses coming from 58, 62 and 46 (blocked) yards.

FLACCO HEATED UP

QB Joe Flacco missed all of training camp with a back injury, but returned to start Week 1. As he eased back into football shape, his first several weeks of the season weren't up to his standards. Additionally, Flacco was adjusting to the Ravens' reshuffled offensive line, which experienced many early-season injuries, but eventually gelled to become a team strength. Below are Flacco's statistics in the final seven games, when he and Baltimore's offense began to hit its stride, and the team went 5-2.

SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS



LB Ray Lewis - 2000 Super Bowl XXXV MVP

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.



THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of only eight teams (NE 9; GB 8; Pit. 7; Atl., Bal., Cin., Ind. & Sea. 6) to earn at least six postseason berths in the last 10 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in each of those playoff campaigns.)
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 13.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the third-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 10 seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first 10 years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

ROSBURG LEADS RAVENS SPECIALISTS

SEASONS RAVENS: 11TH NFL: 18TH Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (202) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 90.2% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (202-of-224 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and inside the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 VS. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. RB Bobby Rainey Jr. posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while WR Michael Campanaro registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens became the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

A 23-year NFL coaching veteran, Mornhinweg, who joined Baltimore as QBs coach in 2015, is a former head coach of the Lions (2001-02). He has also served as offensive coordinator for the New York Jets (2013-14), Philadelphia Eagles (2004-12) and San Francisco 49ers (1997-2000).


DON "WINK" MARTINDALE & DEFENSIVE NOTES

"WINK" TO LEAD THE DEFENSE

On Jan. 9, 2018, the Ravens promoted **Don "Wink" Martindale** to defensive coordinator following the retirement of Dean Pees. Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, **LB C.J. Mosley** has become one of the league's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls.

The 2018 campaign will mark Martindale's 14th season coaching in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he served as the Broncos' defensive coordinator.

"'Wink' has earned the promotion to defensive coordinator," **John Harbaugh** stated. "His aggressive mentality will serve to take our defense to new levels. He is obviously respected by players, many of whom have already benefited from his direct coaching at the linebacker position. He knows the ins and outs of what we have been about on defense and has been an important contributor to our success on that side of the ball. This is an exciting day for Wink and his family, and also one for the Ravens."

- ✓ The Ravens produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3 – the most in a season since the 2003 Patriots).

- ✓ The Ravens' defense ranked 12th overall (325.1 ypg), producing the NFL's 10th-best pass defense (213.8 ypg).



2017 TURNOVER DIFFERENTIAL

- In 2017, the Ravens' +17 turnover ratio ranked No. 1 in the NFL. Baltimore's 34 total takeaways (22 INTs & 12 FRs) also ranked No. 1 for the season.
- Baltimore's +14 turnover margin since Week 8 (final nine games) was the NFL's best mark (Chargers were second at +10).
- The Ravens' 22 interceptions ranked No. 1 in the NFL, with the Jaguars finishing second with 21.
- After registering a +4 turnover ratio in Week 1 at Cincy, the Ravens followed up that performance with a +3 outing vs. Cleveland. In each game, Baltimore produced 5 takeaways, marking the first time in franchise history the Ravens have boasted back-to-back games forcing 5 turnovers.

QB Joe Flacco is the Ravens' all-time leading passer in every major category. Flacco, who led Baltimore to a Super Bowl XLVII victory in 2012 (and earned game MVP honors), has completed 10 seasons as the Ravens' signal caller. In 2017, he connected on 64.1 percent of his passes for 3,141 yards, 18 TDs and 13 INTs.

Super Bowl XLVII MVP **QB Joe Flacco** was masterful during the Ravens' 2012 playoff run, completing 73 of 126 passes for 1,140 yards, 11 TDs and 0 INTs to produce a 117.2 passer rating. 



ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

PERHAPS THE BEST YEAR EVER

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

TIM WHEATLEY AWARD

On Aug. 14, **DT Brandon Williams** was recognized for his work in the community servicing various charitable organizations. Additionally, 24 of the teams in attendance are currently members of the Ravens "Teams on the RISE," a program that allows teams to "Play Like A Raven" all year long through tournaments, clinics and halftime field games.
