Preseason Game 5 – Aug. 30, 2018 7:30 p.m. ET – M&T Bank Stadium (71,008)

### JUST THE FACTS

• The Baltimore Ravens (4-0) close out preseason play when they host the Washington Redskins (1-2) on Thursday, Aug. 30. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. from M&T Bank Stadium and marks the Ravens' third game in the last 11 days.

• This past Saturday, Baltimore notched its 12th-consecutive preseason win (dating back to 2016) by stopping the host Dolphins, 27-10. In the contest, **QB Robert Griffin III** started and finished the game 9-of-15 for 66 passing yards, also running for 41 yards on 5 carries. Rookie first-round **QB Lamar Jackson** was 7-of-10 for 98 yards and 1 TD (134.6 rating), also rushing for 39 yards and 1 TD (19 yards) on 3 attempts. Baltimore's defense was stout, limiting Miami to 221 total yards and registering 5 sacks and 2 INTs.

• This preseason, starting **QB Joe Flacco** has played in two games, completing 12-of-16 for 143 yards, 2 TDs and 0 INTs (141.4 rating). The Ravens' defense has allowed just 237.8 total yards and 13.0 points per game, with both marks ranking in the NFL's Top 5. The Ravens have also forced NFL highs in sacks (17) and takeaways (11), posting a +7 overall turnover differential.

• In 2017, the Ravens won six of their last nine games, finishing second in the AFC North with a 9-7 record and falling one game short of earning a playoff berth (lost on tiebreaker to Buffalo).

• A Week 17 home win over the Bengals was needed to earn the playoffs. However, Baltimore's hopes were dashed when Cincinnati produced a 49-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-12 with just 44 seconds remaining to earn a hard-fought, 31-27 victory that closed out the season in heartbreaking fashion.

• John Harbaugh is in his 11th year at the Ravens' helm, leading the team to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 full seasons. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have played in three AFC Championships, while in 2012, he guided the franchise to its second Super Bowl title.


### **INJURY UPDATE**

Six-time Pro Bowl **G Marshal Yanda** (offseason shoulder surgery) was activated from the PUP list on Aug. 4, but has not played in the preseason. Yanda missed 14 games in 2017 with a broken ankle. **DT Willie Henry** (umbilical hernia) and rookie first-round pick **TE Hayden Hurst** (foot) both recently underwent surgery and will miss several weeks. Rookie fourth-round pick **WR Jaleel Scott** (undisclosed) was placed on the Reserve/Injured list and will miss the season, while sixth-round **S DeShon Elliott** sustained a broken forearm on Saturday at Miami and will be sidelined indefinitely.

### **RETURNING PLAYERS**

- The Ravens return all **11 defensive starters** from 2017. This unit produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3). Baltimore allowed 18.9 points per game, sixth best in the NFL.
- The Ravens return **six offensive players** who started at least 12 games in 2017. Additionally, six-time Pro Bowl **G Marshal Yanda**, who missed 14 games with a broken ankle, returns from injury.

**Is it true you raced an Olympic gold medalist?** "I raced Natasha Hastings [2016 4x400 meter relay Olympic champion]. It was unexpected – I didn't know how serious it was going to be. I saw her warming up, and

she looked serious, so I thought I should get serious. It was a 25-yard race. It was fun, light-hearted. I won."

You proposed to your girlfriend last December. How'd you do it? "I had her and my family walking from a parking garage to the spot in the Harbor, and we walked a nice little way. The wind was biting; it was really cold. They were all dressed up. She thought we were going to dinner, but everyone else knew. We finally got to the waterfront, and we were taking pictures, and I did it. We met in college."

If you could play any other position, what would it be and why? "Running back. That's what I played in high school. I love getting the ball, making plays, scoring touchdowns."

Who is the best teammate you've ever had? "I'll go back to my high school days, with one of my best friends, Davon Grayson. We pushed each other to different levels just to get to college. We pushed each other through high school with the time and the hours we put in. He played wide receiver and also DB with me, so we were out there working. Right now, he's battling some injuries, so he's trying to make his way into the league."

What is the best advice you ever received? "Keep your head down and work. That's all you can do at the end of the day – no matter what level you're on. You can't get frustrated with the bad. You can't get too high with the good stuff. You have to stay even, keep your head down and work at all times."

Is that your mentality now heading into Year Two? "Yes, that's how I look at it. At times, you never know – you could be a starter at any moment. But you have to be humble at the same time, because you might not be getting as much time on defense as you would like or would think to get. So you just have to stay humble and even-keeled."

Was this always your mentality, or was this a mindset you adopted recently? "My mentality definitely has changed. Going into Year Two, I have a lot more confidence, more knowledge of the game, and the game slows down for you so you can see things happen and make more plays. I would definitely say that I have more confidence, am having fun and have more knowledge of the game."

Which player would you love to sit down and have dinner with? "Ed Reed. Just to chop it up with him, being that he's a Baltimore Raven, played the same position. I'd like to just to see how he breaks things down. Before I even came to Baltimore, I would always watch his clips, watch him make plays."

## DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR DON "WINK" MARTINDALE ON THE RAVENS' 2018 DEFENSE:

"I really like where we're going and where we're heading with the defense. I think this defense is starting to take along the personality of the city, like all the great Ravens defenses do – from Dundalk to West Baltimore to Carroll County. I like how we're coming together. I like how we're not flinching."

### ESPN analyst Louis Riddick on the Ravens' offense:

"This is the football team that I think is going to be the breakout offense of the season. They've got weapons on that side of the ball."

### QB Joe Flacco on QB Robert Griffin III:

"Rob is great. He's a real good guy, real confident guy and throws the ball really well. He moves around really well. I've really enjoyed being here the last few months with him, and hopefully he can stick around for a long time in the same role he's in right now."

# Offensive coordinator Marty Mornhinweg on the offseason free agent additions of WR John Brown, WR Michael Crabtree and WR Willie Snead IV:

"All of them have had just an excellent camp. They're all three very smart guys. They're all three talented, and they're all three really natural types of players. So, things come to them easily. And, typically, if you tell them what to do, they're going to do it the first time. If not, they're going to get it done the second time, so things go fast with them. Chris Moore has had an excellent camp as well, and then we've got a host of men that are just battling. So, it's good to see. It brings out the best in everybody when you have that competition going on."

# T Orlando Brown Jr. on the attitude/approach to his rookie season after a disappointing Combine performance in March:

"If anyone would ask me after the Combine if I was going to have a good NFL career, I would have told you, 'Yes.' This is what I do; I play football. I'm not the strongest guy. I'm not the fastest guy. But no one on the field plays with more will than me, more effort and more hustle. That's been one of the reasons that I've been able to be so successful is because I focus on that. I focus on my craft, and I try to never take a step back and only go forward. Being here at the [Ravens'] franchise, the sky's the limit. I'm just going to continue to grow as a person and as a player."

### Secondary coach Chris Hewitt on S Chuck Clark:

"The thing about it is with our young guys, I see those guys as future starters or as starters right now. I have no problem if any one of our starters – being 'T.J.' [Tony Jefferson] and Eric [Weddle] – [went down], that Chuck could step right in there and continue to keep on doing that job. Chuck is extremely smart. He can line everybody up, he can manage the defense, and on top of that, he's a great athlete. He has every attribute to become a great player in this league. To me, he's a third starter."

# CB Brandon Carr on growth he's seen in second-year CB Marlon Humphrey, who was a first-round pick in 2017:

"I can tell he's more comfortable on the field. He's confident. He's come into his own – his personality, both on and off the field. He's a special guy. I'm looking forward to seeing him making plays. He has a ton of confidence in his ability and what he can do out there on the field. I see a big attitude change for him this year, because he knows that a he can go out there and play with the best of them. We already knew that, but now he can [show everyone]. He had some success last year. We look for him to build on it this year."

# P Sam Koch on how he and K Justin Tucker look to grow and maintain his success each season:

"Me and [Justin] Tucker, each year we come out here, and it's like starting over. We go out there, and we try to focus on the fundamentals that we had from last year and build upon those – from punting, to the timing of the snap, to the timing of just the whole operation with the punt team and the rest of the guys. It takes a lot of time to build that up, and with these preseason games it's been very helpful. So it's one of those important things. And with Tucker and Morgan [Cox] on field goal snaps, it's all that timing and building the foundation."

# K Justin Tucker, the most accurate kicker of all time, on if he sets goals heading into each season:

"Sure. I think generally, I just want to do well. I want to help my team win. More than anything, I try to take – at this point – I try to take it one kick at a time. That's advice I got from my agent coming in here my rookie year. It's kind of rang true ever since I've been here. Just taking it one kick at a time has led to us making a lot of kicks. But more generally, more broadly speaking, it's about putting points on the board and putting our team in a position to win games. That gets me more fired up than anything, than any individual accolade, because I've been fortunate enough to experience what a postseason run, what a Super Bowl win feels like. That's always a goal. We're chasing that – anything less than that is subpar."

### John Harbaugh on the Ravens' deep tight ends group:

"We're very pleased with the tight ends group. We have a deep group. There are the four [Nick Boyle, Maxx Williams, Hayden Hurst and Mark Andrews] that everybody talks about, then there are a couple more guys. Vince Mayle has had a tremendous camp. We've talked about Darren Waller coming on. We have a young guy, the Keizer kid [Nick Keizer], from a Division II school in Michigan. [He] has really done a good job, so we're just pretty impressed with the whole group."

### 2018 COACHING CHANGES

• The Ravens promoted Don "Wink" Martindale to defensive coordinator, Mike Macdonald to linebackers coach and Sterling Lucas to guality control - defense. The moves came following the departure of former defensive coordinator Dean Pees, who originally retired following the season, but later decided to return to coaching as Tennessee's defensive coordinator.

• Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, LB C.J. Mosley has developed into one of the NFL's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls in his first four seasons.

• The Ravens also hired James Urban as their quarterbacks coach, while Greg Roman was promoted to assistant head coach. Urban spent the past seven years as the Bengals' wide receivers coach. Prior to that, he was the Philadelphia Eagles' quarterbacks coach in 2009 and 2010, when he helped direct Pro Bowl seasons for Donovan McNabb ('09) and Michael Vick ('10).

• Roman, who was hired by the Ravens in 2017 as the team's senior offensive assistant/tight ends coach, will continue his work coaching the TEs.



### 2018 SCHEDULING NOTES

• The Ravens will open and close their 2018 regular season schedule by playing home games at M&T Bank Stadium (Week 1 vs. the Buffalo Bills and Week 17 vs. the Cleveland Browns).

• Two of the Ravens' first four games this season will be nationally televised, with both of those primetime contests occurring on the road (including a Week 4 Sunday night game at Pittsburgh).

• The Week 4 primetime battle at Pittsburgh (9/30) begins a stretch when Baltimore will play four of five games on the road. (This includes three-consecutive away games from Weeks 4-6: at Pittsburgh, at Cleveland and at Tennessee.)

• Four of the Ravens' first six games will be played on the road, as will five of their first eight.

• The Ravens will not leave Baltimore in the month of November, with all three games being played at M&T Bank Stadium. (Baltimore's bye falls on Nov. 11, marking the second-straight year with a Week 10 bye.)

• Six of the Ravens' first nine games are against 2017 playoff teams. Starting in Week 4 at Pittsburgh, Baltimore embarks on a six-game stretch when the Ravens will face five 2017 postseason participants.

• The Ravens play five division opponents in the first 10 games.

• All three of Baltimore's divisional road games will be completed by Week 5. (This is the earliest the Ravens will have ever finished their AFC North Division road schedule, with the previous earliest occurring in Week 9 of 2014.)

• After playing five preseason games, including the final three in 11 days, Baltimore opens the regular season by playing two games in a five-day span, with the second on the road (at Cincinnati).

• Produced by the Emmy Award-winning Ravens Productions team, preseason games will air on WBAL-TV, WJLA (Washington, D.C.), WGAL (Harrisburg, Pa.), WFXR (Roanoke, Va.), WWCW (Roanoke, Va.), WMDT (Delmarva area) and KFVE (Honolulu, Hawaii), and will be simulcast on WBAL Radio and 98Rock.

### **REGULAR SEASON RADIO**

• The Ravens' 2018 regular season radio team will feature Sandusky, with former Ravens standouts OLB Jarret Johnson and TE Dennis Pitta. Sandusky delivers the play-by-play for the broadcast team, while Johnson and Pitta will rotate games as analysts. All Ravens games can be heard on 98Rock WIYY (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM, baltimoreravens.com, in the Ravens mobile app (when fans are in Baltimore) and on 21 regional affiliates. This network broadcasts each Ravens game and spans three states -Maryland, Pennsylvania and Delaware - and Washington, D.C.

### LB Ray Lewis - 2000 Super Bowl XXXV MVP

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



# QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing franchise's second World the Championship. After an amazing firsthalf performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

### THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

### Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

• The Ravens are one of only eight teams (NE – 9; GB – 8; Pit. – 7; Atl., Bal., Cin., Ind. & Sea. – 6) to earn at least six postseason berths in the last 10 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in each of those playoff campaigns.)

• The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 13.

• "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.

• John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.

• Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.

• In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.

• Harbaugh owns the third-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 10 seasons (since the 1970 merger).

• With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.

• For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first 10 years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).



**SEASONS RAVENS:** 11TH **NFL:** 18TH Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists.

### SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

### Prime Kicker & Punter

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (202) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 90.2% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (202-of-224 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and inside the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

### **RAVENS' BIG RETURNS**

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

### 2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 VS. CHICAGO


• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. RB Bobby Rainey Jr. posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while WR Michael Campanaro registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens became the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

### BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's second-most blocked kicks (13, tied), including an NFL-high (tied) 4 in 2016.

He has also served as offensive coordinator for the New York Jets (2013-14), Philadelphia Eagles (2004-12) and San Francisco 49ers (1997-2000).

# **DON "WINK" MARTINDALE & DEFENSIVE NOTES**

### "WINK" TO LEAD THE DEFENSE

On Jan. 9, 2018, the Ravens promoted Don "Wink" Martindale to defensive coordinator following the retirement of Dean Pees. Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, LB C.J. Mosley has become one of the league's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls.

The 2018 campaign will mark Martindale's 14th season coaching in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he served as the Broncos' defensive coordinator.

"Wink' has earned the promotion to defensive coordinator," John Harbaugh stated. "His aggressive mentality will serve to take our defense to new levels. He is obviously respected by players, many of whom have already benefited from his direct coaching at the linebacker position. He knows the ins and outs of what we have been about on defense and has been an important contributor to our success on that side of the ball. This is an exciting day for Wink and his family, and also one for the Ravens."

- ✓ The Ravens produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3 – the most in a season since the 2003 Patriots).
- ✓ Baltimore allowed 18.9 points per game, which ranked No. 6 in the league. It marked the seventh time during the John Harbaugh Era (2008-17) the Ravens produced a Top 10 scoring "D."
- ✓ The Ravens' defense ranked 12th overall (325.1 ypg), producing the NFL's 10th-best pass defense (213.8 ypg).



• In 2017, the Ravens' +17 turnover ratio ranked No. 1 in the NFL. Baltimore's 34 total takeaways (22 INTs & 12 FRs) also ranked No. 1 for the season.

• Baltimore's +14 turnover margin since Week 8 (final nine games) was the NFL's best mark (Chargers were second at +10).

• The Ravens' 22 interceptions ranked No. 1 in the NFL, with the Jaguars finishing second with 21.

Flacco, who led Baltimore to a Super Bowl XLVII victory in 2012 (and earned game MVP honors), has completed 10 seasons as the Ravens' signal caller. In 2017, he connected on 64.1 percent of his passes for 3,141 yards, 18 TDs and 13 INTs.

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

Since 2014






Net Punt Average NFL's Fourth Best Since 2014


### PERHAPS THE BEST YEAR EVER

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

(Tucker has also earned seven AFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.) "Tuck" earned his fourth POM award in Nov. 2017, going 8-for-8 on FGAs and 6-for-6 on PATs.
