JUST THE FACTS

• Finally, football is back – with the Baltimore Ravens kicking off regular season play by hosting the Buffalo Bills at M&T Bank Stadium on Sunday, Sept. 9. The Ravens, who finished the 2018 preseason as the NFL's only undefeated team (5-0), embark on their 23rd year of existence and their 11th season under head coach John Harbaugh.

• Impressively, Harbaugh has led the team to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 full seasons. Under the veteran coach, Baltimore has played in three AFC Championship games, while in 2012, he guided the franchise to its second Super Bowl title. Including playoffs (10-5), the Ravens are 104-71 since Harbaugh's 2008 arrival, posting the NFL's fourth-most total victories.

• Under Harbaugh (since 2008), the Ravens own the NFL's third-best home winning percentage (.737), going 59-21 in Charm City. Against Buffalo, Baltimore leads the regular season series, 4-3, including a 4-1 mark in games played at M&T Bank Stadium.

• This preseason, starting **QB Joe Flacco** played in two games, completing 12 of 16 passes for 143 yards, 2 TDs and 0 INTs (141.4 rating). The Ravens' defense allowed just 265.0 yards (second best in the NFL) and 14.0 points (eighth) per game. Baltimore also posted an NFL-high 21 sacks and tallied the second-most takeaways (14).

• In 2017, the Ravens won six of their last nine games, finishing second in the AFC North with a 9-7 record and falling one game short of earning a playoff berth (lost on tiebreaker to Buffalo).

• A Week 17 home win over the Bengals was needed to earn the playoffs. However, Baltimore's hopes were dashed when Cincinnati produced a 49-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-12 with just 44 seconds remaining to earn a hard-fought, 31-27 victory that closed out the season in heartbreaking fashion.

HARBS SAYS

JOHN HARBAUGH ON OPENING REGULAR SEASON PLAY:

"[The season opener] is upon us. Everything we've done up to this point, from a work standpoint, is behind us, and yet, it has our back. It's what we stand on, and it's our launching point, so we're ready to go. We're excited, I think the fans are excited, and I know the players are excited. We just can't wait."

INJURY UPDATE

Six-time Pro Bowl **G Marshal Yanda** (offseason shoulder surgery) was activated from the PUP list on Aug. 4, but did not play in the preseason. Yanda missed 14 games in 2017 with a broken ankle. Injured players who are expected to contribute immediately this season include **DT Willie Henry** (umbilical hernia) and first-round pick **TE Hayden Hurst** (foot), both of whom recently underwent surgery.

2018 RETURNING PLAYERS

- The Ravens return all 11 defensive starters from 2017. This unit produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3). Baltimore allowed 18.9 points per game, sixth best in the NFL.
- The Ravens return six offensive players who started at least 12 games in 2017. Additionally, six-time Pro Bowl G Marshal Yanda, who missed 14 games with a broken ankle, returns from injury.

SPOTLIGHT: CB MARLON HUMPHREY

What did you like about being a high school track coach at your alma mater, Hoover, in the offseason? "I ran track there, so I was just able to help other athletes

succeed. I think you learn a lot of life things in track, because track is the one sport where, whether you're the fastest or the slowest, everyone runs a certain time, and you can always improve on your time. Self-improvement is something that comes from hard work and that helps everyone win within themselves."

What do you like to do in your free time? "I try to golf a little bit. I try to bowl a little bit. I watch probably two or three movies a week. Just kind of recreational stuff."

What are your favorite movies? "I don't really have a favorite, but I like 'The Meg' that's out right now. It's the best shark movie that I've ever seen. Halfway through, you're going to think it's over, because that much has happened."

When you were a kid, what did you want to be when you grew up? "I always wanted to be an NFL football player when I was young."

Who was your favorite NFL player growing up? "Even though I wanted to be an NFL player. I didn't really watch much NFL, if any, really, when I was younger. The only people I ever really wanted to be like were Brian Urlacher and my dad [former NFL RB Bobby Humphrey]. It was mainly my dad. I used to play linebacker, so I kind of wanted to be like Brian Urlacher, in a linebacker sense. But more so, what I wanted to be, I wanted to be like my dad."

What advice would you give your younger self? "I probably wouldn't give myself any advice. Situations make you who you are, so I probably wouldn't even tell myself to change anything."

If you could only eat one thing for the rest of your life, what would it be? "Definitely chicken. You've got chicken wings, chicken breasts. There are a lot of different ways to eat chicken - baked, fried, grilled - so definitely chicken."

Marlon Humphrey By The Numbers:

49.6 – Defensive passer rating in 2017 by Humphrey, who proved to be a promising lockdown defender during his rookie season. This figure ranked fourth best in the NFL among cornerbacks who were targeted at least 15 times.

NFL NETWORK'S KYLE BRANDT ON THE RAVENS:

"I like Baltimore a lot. I think their defense is going to blow people away. I think they have really good veteran receivers now. I like [John] Brown. I like [Michael] Crabtree. And, I just like Joe Flacco. In the biggest preseason of this man's life, he's been nails. I think the Baltimore Ravens are a Top 5 AFC team. I love them this year. I love them."

Defensive coordinator Don "Wink" Martindale on the Ravens' 2018 defense:

"I really like where we're going and where we're heading with the defense. I think this defense is starting to take along the personality of the city, like all the great Ravens defenses do – from Dundalk to West Baltimore to Carroll County. I like how we're coming together. I like how we're not flinching."

QB Joe Flacco on free agent addition WR John Brown:

"John is doing a really good job making things happen really quick. We've hit him down the field, we've hit him back shoulder, everything. I really think that's a credit to him and just how well he can get off the ball and get going vertical and put those DBs in a bad position. When you don't get that, it makes it a little bit tough to hang back there and figure out where you're going to put the ball. He's just been doing a great job of beating guys off the line and showing guys what he's made of."

Willie Snead IV on Baltimore's free agent WR signings:

"I think Joe [Flacco] has a lot of confidence in us. Just from the little time that we've been together, just talking to him in the locker room, to coming out here on the field and making plays while he's throwing us the ball – he has a lot of confidence in our group. We just all bring something very different to the table. [Michael] Crabtree is 10 years in and brings that old vet mentality, that different swagger. Me and 'J.B.' [John Brown] came in together in 2014, and he brings that speed downfield. Me – I work the slot, I work everywhere, blocking, especially."

OLB Terrell Suggs on what excites him about the defense:

"A lot of things excite me about this year's unit. It's the same thing we've had for a couple years. It's definitely depth. The personnel we have is very rare. We've had legendary defenses in the past, but we've never been this deep at every position, so that's something exciting to look forward to. And we can be a fresher team coming down the stretch in December and January football."

DT Brandon Williams on LB C.J. Mosley, who has earned a Pro Bowl invitation in three of his first four seasons:

"I feel like C.J. can go as high as he wants to go and be whoever he wants to be. He's got that much talent. He's got that much leadership ability, and I'll follow him anywhere. I think C.J. can be a premier – can be, is, will be forever – a premier linebacker in this league."

ESPN analyst Louis Riddick on the Ravens' offense:

"This is the football team that I think is going to be the breakout offense of the season. They've got weapons on that side of the ball."

CB Brandon Carr on how much his starting streak of 160-consecutive games means to him:

"I take pride in just being available each and every week. I take pride in taking care of my body, trying to play through as many injuries – whether they're big or small – as I can. But, I've been blessed throughout my career just to kind of be lucky and stay out of the way, stay out the fray of everything and play through the injuries I have. But at this point in my career, I'm just enjoying the game of playing football. I'm enjoying being back on the East Coast. I'm enjoying being back in Baltimore. This environment is nothing but football-friendly for me. But as far as just the streak and all, everything has to come to an end at some point. But my goal, my job, is to come out here and compete, battle for a starting job and to keep the streak alive as long as I can."

CBS Sports' Jason La Canfora on RB Alex Collins:

"There isn't much question that Alex Collins is the feature back [in Baltimore], and he has added five pounds of muscle to show up at 205 this year. A year ago, the journeyman wasn't sure he would earn a practice squad spot, but he was a great fit in this offense, and the emphasis on RPOs, and the return of All-Pro guard Marshal Yanda from injury should open more lanes for him this year."

John Harbaugh on third-year OLB Matthew Judon's improvement heading into 2018:

"One thing that jumps out at me right away is if you're watching practice, watch how hard he's practicing. Watch him run to the football. To me, running to the football is what defense is. If you run to the football, you can cover up a lot of issues. He's not only doing it, but he's setting the tone for the rest of the guys to do it. To me, that's what leaders do."

S Eric Weddle on QB Joe Flacco's strong training camp and the connection with his new receivers:

"I've been seeing them all offseason. I love everything about Joe. We have to be better for him. He'll say to them that he needs to be better. But having a healthy offseason for him, getting the new additions, working every day in the offseason and when they had time off ... Seeing them now, I expect Joe to have a career year and him to lead our team to the playoffs."

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing franchise's second World the Championship. After an amazing firsthalf performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

• The Ravens are one of only eight teams (NE – 9; GB – 8; Pit. – 7; Atl., Bal., Cin., Ind. & Sea. – 6) to earn at least six postseason berths in the last 10 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in each of those playoff campaigns.)

• The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 13.

• "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.

• John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.

• Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.

• In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.

• Harbaugh owns the third-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 10 seasons (since the 1970 merger).

• With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.

• For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first 10 years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).

• Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.



ROSBURG LEADS RAVENS SPECIALISTS

SEASONS RAVENS: 11TH **NFL:** 18TH Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

Prime Kicker & Punter

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (202) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 90.2% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (202-of-224 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and inside the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 VS. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. RB Bobby Rainey Jr. posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while WR Michael Campanaro registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens became the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's second-most blocked kicks (13, tied), including an NFL-high (tied) 4 in 2016.

DON "WINK" MARTINDALE & DEFENSIVE NOTES

"WINK" TO LEAD THE DEFENSE

On Jan. 9, 2018, the Ravens promoted Don "Wink" Martindale to defensive coordinator following the retirement of Dean Pees. Martindale, 54, enters his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, LB C.J. Mosley has become one of the league's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls.

The 2018 campaign will mark Martindale's 14th season coaching in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he served as the Broncos' defensive coordinator.

"'Wink' has earned the promotion to defensive coordinator," John Harbaugh stated. "His aggressive mentality will serve to take our defense to new levels. He is obviously respected by players, many of whom have already benefited from his direct coaching at the linebacker position. He knows the ins and outs of what we have been about on defense and has been an important contributor to our success on that side of the ball. This is an exciting day for Wink and his family, and also one for the Ravens."

- ✓ The Ravens produced NFL bests in INTs (22), takeaways (34) and shutouts (3 – the most in a season since the 2003 Patriots).

- ✓ The Ravens' defense ranked 12th overall (325.1 ypg), producing the NFL's 10th-best pass defense (213.8 ypg).

SHUT 'EM DOWN

ASSISTANT COACHES

JERRY ROSBURG

SPECIAL TEAMS COORD. / ASSOC. HEAD COACH In his 40th season coaching, Rosburg has guided an exceptional special teams group over his 10 years (2008-17) with the Ravens. Specifically in the past six full seasons (2012-17), the Ravens' ST units have consistently been acknowledged as one of the league's best. In the annual special teams report from senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin, Baltimore has ranked in the NFL's Top 5 for six-straight seasons (and is the only team to do so).

DON MARTINDALE

"Wink" was promoted to "D" coordinator on Jan. 9, 2018 after six years working with Baltimore's LBs. Originally joining the Ravens in 2012, during the past six seasons, Martindale has guided and helped grow a number of standout linebackers, most notably ILB C.J. Mosley. Martindale was the Broncos' "D" coordinator in 2010, and in 2009, coached all four LBs in the 3-4 scheme.

MARTY MORNHINWEG OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Mornhinweg is in his third year as offensive coordinator, originally assuming the role in Week 6 of 2016. A 34-year coaching veteran and former NFL head coach (Lions), he has an extensive background coordinating offenses and tutoring QBs. Throughout his NFL career, five QBs have earned Pro Bowl honors under his direction: Michael Vick, Donovan McNabb, Jeff Garcia, Steve Young and Brett Favre.

GREG ROMAN

Assistant HEAD COACH / TIGHT ENDS COACH Roman is in his second stint with the Ravens, re-joining the team in 2017. In the latter part of '17, Baltimore's offense made big strides, and following the season, he was promoted to assistant head coach/TEs coach. Since his first term in Baltimore (2006-07), he has been a successful NFL offensive coordinator both in San Francisco and Buffalo.

RICHARD ANGULO

ASSISTANT OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

Angulo is in his fifth year with the Ravens and his second as the team's assistant offensive line coach. In 2017, he helped coach an offensive line that allowed the league's seventh-fewest sacks (27, tied with Minnesota). From 2015-16, he served as Baltimore's tight ends coach after being promoted from his original position of offensive coaching intern (2014).

ANDY BISCHOFF

OFFENSIVE ASSISTANT / TIGHT ENDS

Bischoff is in his fourth year with the Ravens and continues his work with the TEs, while aiding "O" coordinator Marty Mornhinweg and assistant head coach Greg Roman, who also coaches the TEs.

RANDY BROWN

Brown works directly with the kicking group – K Justin Tucker, P Sam Koch (holder) and LS Morgan Cox – and has coached five Pro Bowlers in Baltimore: Koch (2015), Cox (2015 & 2016), Tucker (2013 & 2016), K Billy Cundiff (2010) and K Matt Stover (last kicked for Ravens in 2008).

JOE CULLEN DEFENSIVE LINE COACH

Cullen enters his third year as the Ravens' defensive line coach. He originally joined the team in 2016 following two seasons with the Buccaneers in the same role. A D-line specialist, he has 29 years of experience, including 11 in the NFL with five teams (Bal., TB, Cle., Jax. and Det.).

JOE D'ALESSANDRIS OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

Pronounced *dell-ah-SAN-dress*, he is a 40year coaching veteran who enters his second season as Baltimore's O-line coach. "Joe D" has extensive experience guiding and developing linemen, both in the collegiate ranks and pros. Since transitioning to the NFL in 2008, he's mentored players for the Chiefs, Bills, Chargers and Ravens.

BOBBY ENGRAM Wide Receivers Coach

Engram, who enjoyed a 14-year NFL playing career, is in his fifth season as the Ravens' WRs coach. In his third year (2016) guiding Baltimore's receivers, his group helped record the second-most net passing yards in team history (4,100), including a franchisebest 4,317 by QB Joe Flacco.

THOMAS HAMMOCK RUNNING BACKS COACH

Hammock is in his fifth year as the Ravens' RBs coach. In 2017, he helped guide RB Alex Collins to a breakout season, when the back tallied 973 rushing yards and 1,160 yards from scrimmage. Prior to joining the Ravens, he spent 11 years on the collegiate circuit, including three (2011-13) as Wisconsin's assistant HC/RBs/recruiting coordinator.

CHRIS HEWITT Secondary Coach

Hewitt enters his second season as the secondary coach after being promoted prior to the 2017 campaign. He previously served as the team's DBs coach from 2015-16 and the assistant secondary coach in 2014. In his seventh-overall year in Baltimore, he also spent two years (2012-13) helping guide the special teams unit led by Jerry Rosburg.

CHRIS HORTON Assistant Special Teams Coach

Horton is in his third year as the Ravens' assistant special teams coach, working directly with Jerry Rosburg. Horton has helped Baltimore's special teams units perform outstandingly in the three years he's been involved. In the annual special teams report from senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin, Baltimore has ranked in the NFL's Top 5 for six-straight seasons.

STERLING LUCAS QUALITY CONTROL - DEFENSE

Lucas is in his third year with the Ravens after being promoted to a defensive quality control coach in January 2018, with responsibilities that include finding tips/ tendencies on opponent offenses, selfscouting and working with the LBs.

MIKE MACDONALD LINEBACKERS COACH

Macdonald is in his first season as the team's LBs coach. In his fifth year with the Ravens, he previously spent time as the defensive backs coach (2017) and as a defensive assistant (2015-16). He originally joined Baltimore in 2014 as a coaching intern.

JAMES URBAN QUARTERBACKS COACH

Urban joined the Ravens in 2018. A 15year NFL coaching veteran, he spent the past seven seasons with AFC North rival Cincinnati, coaching the WRs. He entered the NFL with the Eagles in 2004. After five seasons in two roles under Andy Reid, he was promoted to QBs coach his final two years (2009-10), coaching Pro Bowlers Donovan McNabb (2009) and Michael Vick (2010).

CRAIG VER STEEG Senior Offensive Assistant

Pronounced ver-STEGG, he is in his 11th year working with the Ravens. Ver Steeg, who owns 35 years of coaching experience, has an extensive background working with QBs, WRs and RBs. As one of John Harbaugh's original coaching hires (2008), he has assisted in game preparation, game and practice analysis and guiding players.

MATT WEISS

FOOTBALL STRATEGY COORD. / WRS


Weiss is in his 10th season with the Ravens after assisting with the QBs from 2016-17. Prior to joining the offense, he coached on defense in a variety of roles, including CBs, assistant LBs and quality control. In addition to his coaching duties, he's responsible for leading coaching staff analytics, advising John Harbaugh on game management and scripting situational practice periods.

DREW WILKINS ASST. DEFENSIVE LINE / OLBS

Wilkins originally joined the Ravens in 2010 and was promoted to assistant D-line/OLBs coach in 2018. Wilkins, who spent three seasons (2014-16) as a defensive assistant, was responsible for weekly production of the defensive playbook, scouting reports, film breakdown and assisting with the development of the D-line in practice.

RAVENS "20/20" CLUB

• In 2017, the Ravens' +17 turnover ratio ranked No. 1 in the NFL. Baltimore's 34 total takeaways (22 INTs & 12 FRs) also ranked No. 1 for the season.

• Baltimore's +14 turnover margin since Week 8 (final nine games) was the NFL's best mark (Chargers were second at +10).

• The Ravens' 22 interceptions ranked No. 1 in the NFL, with the Jaguars finishing second with 21.



ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

Since 2014






Net Punt Average NFL's Fourth Best Since 2014

PERHAPS THE BEST YEAR EVER

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).

GAMEPLANEARTH



GamePlanEarth (GPE) is a season-long environmental initiative established and led by the Ravens to help make Baltimore a more sustainable city. This program was created to further educate fans about growing environmental challenges and encourage them to recycle, reuse and conserve. On Aug. 28, Ravens staff members (pictured above) joined forces with The 6th Branch, a veteran-led neighborhood development organization, to clear vacant lots and refurbish an abandoned neighborhood garden. Volunteer work included tasks ranging from basic landscaping to removing fencing, trash, concrete, bricks and overgrowth. GamePlanEarth is an extension of the organization's continued efforts to reinforce M&T Bank Stadium's LEED Gold Certification, a designation given to organizations that strive to deliver healthy, environmentalfriendly, cost-saving and energy-and water-efficient operating buildings in the community. Recently, the Under Armour Performance Center's new north wing achieved the prestigious LEED Gold level certification, further cementing the Ravens' dedication and determination to being leaders in sustainability. GamePlanEarth week also saw the opening of the fifth annual GamePlanEarth Ambassador Award applications, a program that recognizes and highlights a Baltimore-area school that has implemented environmental initiatives and is a leader in the community. The winner will receive a \$2,500 grant.

GPE BIKE PARTY

For the last five years, GPE has played an important role in the Baltimore Ravens organization. As they have done for the past several years, the Ravens ended GPE week by co-hosting a Purple Friday Baltimore Bike Party on Aug. 31. This event was created to encourage bike riding as an eco-friendly form of transportation in the city. Bike Party's mission is Ride, Respect, Revelry. Riders were encouraged to ride right, be respectful of all Baltimoreans, revel in the joy of Bike Party and wear purple to support the Ravens. Ravens staff were on hand to distribute team souvenirs to all the riders and cheer them on from start to finish.

Prior to the start of the Ravens-Redskins game on Aug. 30, the Baltimore Union Youth Girls Soccer Team (below) collected recyclable materials in tailgate Lots B/C as part of the Ravens' GPE initiative. JOHN HARBAUGH MONDAY PRESS CONFERENCE: WEEK 1 VS. BILLS

Opening statement: "Good to be here – excited! It's upon us. Everything that we've done up to this point, from a work standpoint, is behind us, and yet, it has our back. It's what we stand on, and it's our launching point, so we're ready to go. Man, we're excited. I think the fans are excited. I know the players are excited, and we just can't wait. We have practice here in a half hour, and I'm really pretty much excited about that. I'm really excited to see you guys and do the press conference, but I'm even more excited about practice. Does that shock you? (*laughter*) What do you have?"

Just with the Bills announcing the starting quarterback decision with QB Nathan Peterman, how much does that help you, knowing who the starter is now, than maybe not knowing at all until gameday? (Jamison Hensley) "It would be pretty hard to keep that secret. You have to practice your starting quarterbacks. I'm sure Sean [McDermott] felt like it was just, 'Hey, he's earned it.' It's not surprising. We were just going to go with whatever. We were going to prepare for the Bills. But, I'm not surprised. I think he's done a very good job in the preseason. He's looked good, and we're preparing for him and the rest of the Bills team."

Staying on quarterbacks, your three quarterbacks, you talk about doing the math during the preseason. Was it tough to do that math, and how, I guess, excited are you to have three quality quarterbacks on your roster? (*David Ginsburg*) "Sure, I'm excited to have three quality quarterbacks. We talked about it last week. It makes our quarterback room stronger, and that's really what it does. From a team standpoint, you can look at it any kind of a number of different ways. There are a lot of factors that go into it that were considered, and that was the way it shook out."

As far as the utilization of the quarterbacks, have you changed your approach with QB Lamar Jackson in that you will have him active each and every Sunday? Is that still the plan going forward? (*Jerry Coleman*) "Yes, we'll do whatever is best for our team. Any given Sunday, we'll have the 46 guys up that give us the best chance to be successful, and we'll just see what that is every week."

Could that mean three quarterbacks being active? *(Jerry Coleman)* "It could mean anything. It won't be any more than three! *(laughter)* It won't be any less than two! We'll see. I really don't know. Hey, it's day-to-day. Any quarterback will tell you, any player, [that] you're one play away. You're one play away from being the guy. Those guys have to prepare just that way."

There's a report that QB Robert Griffin III is going to be the backup. Is that accurate? (*Jeff Zrebiec***) "I don't know. I don't know. What's the source?" (***Reporter: "It wasn't my report, so I don't know."***) "Oh, you read it, though. Was it sourced? I don't know. It's like the old song, 'I've been through the desert on a horse with no name.' I guess he went through the article on a source with no name. (***laughter***) That's good, right? That's good! I don't know the name of the group." (***Reporter: "America."***) "America, I remember them. Yes, all right! Jerry Coleman, that's a good call. Don't play Jerry Coleman in the radio dial game."**

So, going back to his question, is QB Robert Griffin III No. 2 or 3? *(Jerry Coleman)* "I'm not saying. You guys can report anything you want anyway, so just go for it. Or whoever put the report out."

Now that you have QB Robert Griffin III on the team, whether he's No. 2 or 3, not only does he bring the experience, but you talk about him in the room. Do you think he will be helping QB Lamar Jackson along and it's just good to have that veteran experience along with QB Joe Flacco? (*David Ginsburg*) "Sure. All that is good. You can never have enough experience and good guys, good people to draw on, and that's true for all of our players. I know the talk is about Lamar as a quarterback, and he just learned so much from Joe and from Rob – and not just those guys. He learns from all the guys. He learns from the receivers. 'Crab' [Michael Crabtree] is talking to him, John Brown is talking to him, Willie [Snead IV], the coaches. To me, it's a group effort. When we're in here, it's a dynamic. We're talking, dialoguing. They're in their meeting rooms doing those same things, in the locker room. That's the beautiful thing about this great team sport that is football. So, that's the long answer to, yes, it certainly helps. And like we said before, it makes the room stronger."



Do you have any update on P/K Kaare Vedvik, and any more explanation or clarity on what happened? (Bo Smolka) " talked to him yesterday. I went to the hospital. Darren Sanders [vice president of security] and I went down there and talked to him. He was a little better, I think, than what I had heard he was the day before. I guess, the day before, he said when the police talked to him, he was really out of it, and he was pretty out of it when I talked to him, too, still swollen up. He'd had his face kind of stitched up. He told me what he could remember of what happened. It's not for me to get into the details of that, but he's trying to remember as best he can, and I think they're trying to piece some of it together based on some video stuff and things like that. You know what, we're just grateful, and I think he was very thankful for the fact that he's OK and that he's going to be fine. That's the most important thing. His host-family father from Kansas was in. Great man, U.P. [upper peninsula] Michigan guy. He was in, so he's going to be with Kaare for the next week, at least, and get him settled into where he's going to stay. He's going to stay with us. He's going to be on the Non-Football Injury list, so he can kind of recover and train, just as if he was hurt in football, and that will be the way we'll do it. It was disappointing for him, because I think it cost him a chance to kick in this league. He would have had a shot. There were plenty of trade talks and things like that. It's a lesson for everybody. My dad said, 'Nothing good ever happens after midnight,' and it was well after midnight. He'll be talking to the young guys next year, I guess: be a little smarter, be a little more aware of your surroundings, don't be by yourself and understand that there are people out there that have malign intentions - especially when you're a young guy, and maybe even if you're a Raven football player, things like that, be smart."

I know he has been offensive coordinator before, but it's been a couple years. Does the fact that Bills offensive coordinator Brian Daboll comes from college most recently make the Bills a little harder to prepare for, because he doesn't have a recent offense at the NFL level? (*Jeff Zrebiec*) "Coach Daboll has been around this league a long time. He has a really good track record, and there's plenty of tape out there for what he likes to do. We've seen the preseason games. We have a pretty good idea, but you never know in the first game what you're going to get. They could be holding any number of things back to surprise us in the first game. We kind of expect that. So, we just have to be ready to play our defense. Do what we do, and do it as well as we can, do it better than they do what they do."

You mentioned trade talks regarding P/K Kaare Vedvik. What about QB Robert Griffin III? Does that factor in to the preparation knowing that there are probably some teams that would like a guy like him? (*Mark Viviano*) "Well, yes – that's just so hard to predict. I'll tell you what: I've been in this league now for 21 years, 11 as a head coach, and I still don't understand why certain trades get made and other ones don't. It's just mind-boggling. You can try to speculate all you want, then you'll see a trade and you'll be surprised. Or you'll see a trade not get made and you'll be surprised. There are always trade possibilities for every player. I guess if you look at the Khalil Mack deal – you know – everybody's available! The old saying, 'Every man has his price?' I guess every team has their price. It just depends on what someone is willing to offer for a player. It's business. That's just the way it works, and there are always options and possibilities that way."

You were pretty open talking about how QB Lamar Jackson will factor in the two-quarterback scenario. Could QB Robert Griffin III be part of a similar thing for that with his similar skill set? (*Mark Viviano*) "Yes, sure. That's one of the neat things about it. It's probably a good observation. That's something that we can kind of do the same chemistry with all three of our guys – one way or another – and be creative about it somehow. That's what our coaches try to do."

With QB Lamar Jackson in the red zone – especially seeing him in the preseason and seeing how effective he was – how tough is it with his skill set to defend someone like that when it gets to the red zone? (Jamison Hensley) "Anytime you're dealing with a mobile quarterback anywhere on the field, especially in the red zone, you have to cage him – you can't let him out. You have to rush inside and in front; you can't open up rushing lanes. You're going to be one gap short if you rush four, two gaps short if you rush three, you know? If you rush five, now you're a man short in coverage. It creates a dilemma, because the quarterback can score pretty much from anywhere on the field, if you let him get out and run behind the defensive line. That's a factor; it's a valuable trait for any of the guys that can do that in the red zone."

DT Carl Davis was claimed off waivers. What made him expendable to you? *(Aaron Kasinitz)* "I just think if you look at the numbers ... It was just a numbers deal. Carl is definitely good enough to play for us. I talked to Carl; we had a great talk. He's really good about it. He loved it here. He had his best camp. You know, he's been hurt the past two years. I'm not thrilled that he's in Cleveland and we have to play against him twice a year. But kudos to Cleveland. They've taken a number of our D-linemen. It seems like every year they grab one of our D-linemen. They've all done well for them, so I give them a lot of credit

for what they're looking at. We were blessed with some depth there; Carl was on the last year of his contract. All those things kind of factor in, but it certainly wasn't for the way he played. He played well."

Your decision to part ways with WR Breshad Perriman is a conversation ... You don't have to get into details. But his future going forward in the NFL, with maybe a change of scenery, do you think that maybe will needed for him? (Jerry Coleman) "Right, yes. To me, that's the thing that I think he's excited about and I'm excited about for him. You get a chance to get a fresh start, a healthy start. He had his best camp, because he was in camp and played well [and was] very productive in the games and in practice. I'm hopeful for him. I want to see him do well. You become friends with these guys, and I want to see them be successful."

Along those same lines, how tough was it to let LB Albert McClellan go? He's done so much for so long here. (Bo Smolka) "Right, same thing. Oh gosh, I think you mentioned [about] how tough it must be, and it was – but then Albert made it good. Albert was great. We've been together ... Was it seven years? Again, we've been through a lot together, all of us with Albert and the coaches and everything. There doesn't need to be a lot said; it's understood the reasons why and that there's no doubt that he can still play. Who knows? We [could] get him back in a couple days or a couple weeks or whatever happens. I'm sure he'll be playing somewhere this year; he still can play."

Do you have any updates on LB Kenny Young? (*Aaron Kasinitz*) "I don't. I'll see how he does. Probably day-to-day is the best way to describe it. We'll see how he looks today, looks Wednesday, Thursday, and see if he's ready to go Sunday."

You have 12 rookies that made the 53-man roster. From your experience, what does this set now for them from what they accomplished in preseason to now regular season? (*Mark Viviano*) "The biggest thing is probably don't get happy, because I told them today, 'You're not on scholarship.' You didn't just sign the scholarship papers – that's not the way it works. You're day-to-day, and it's day-to-day, and you have to perform every single day. So, my hope is that their intention is to be the best football player they can be every single day and help us win games on Sundays. That's why they're here. That's what they need to do, and they need to go to work today just like they did yesterday."

Can you shed some light on the decision to keep WR/RS Janarion Grant over WR/RS Tim White? *(Ryan Mink)* "Not really, nothing to really add to it. You just do what you think is best at the time. I'm really glad that we still have Tim White in the building – that's a big [thing]. We have them both, and that's the takeaway there is that we have them both. It's not which one or the other. I mean, you could do this. They're both right there. I love them both, they both bring a lot to the table, and they both have upside. It's going to be fun to see how they both develop, and I'm just glad they're both here."

Will WR Chris Moore and WR Willie Snead IV be utilized as return guys? (Jerry Coleman) "I think Chris Moore as a kick returner – he could be the kick returner – or it'll be Janarion [Grant]. Janarion will be the punt returner, and Willie will be the backup punt returner for the game. We'll go from there."
