TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS VS. BALTIMORE RAVENS WEEK 15 – SUNDAY, DEC. 16, 2018 (7-6)

JUST THE FACTS

• The Baltimore Ravens (7-6), who have won three of their past four games, host the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (5-8) this Sunday in a battle that kicks off at 1 p.m. from M&T Bank Stadium. Baltimore currently holds the AFC's second Wild Card playoff position and sits just a half-game behind Pittsburgh (7-5-1) in the AFC North. Tampa Bay has won two of its past three games and is 1-5 on the road this season.

• Last Sunday, Baltimore took the Chiefs, who own the AFC's best record (11-2), to overtime before dropping a 27-24 heartbreaker at Arrowhead Stadium. K Harrison Butker's 35-yard FG in the extra period was the difference. The Ravens jumped to a 24-17 lead with 4:04 left in regulation on **QB Lamar Jackson**'s 9-yard TD throw (his second of the day) to **WR John Brown**. Kansas City then produced an 11-play, 75-yard TD drive that included two fourth-down conversions, including a fourth-and-3 at the Ravens' 5, where QB Patrick Mahomes hit RB Damien Williams for the game-tying TD. The Chiefs won the OT coin toss and produced a FG on that drive. Baltimore was then unable to capitalize on its ensuing possession, giving the Chiefs a hardfought victory. The Ravens sacked Mahomes 3 times and registered a season-high 15 QB hits, while Jackson (71), **RB Gus Edwards** (67) and **RB Kenneth Dixon** (59) helped Baltimore rush for 198 yards.

• The Ravens are 3-2 all time against Tampa Bay, including a 2-0 mark under head coach **John Harbaugh**. These teams last met in 2014, when Baltimore prevailed, 48-17, at Raymond James Stadium.

• In his 11th season at Baltimore's helm, Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a 111-77 overall record (10-5 postseason), posting the NFL's fifthmost total wins since his 2008 arrival. The Ravens have played in three AFC title games ('08, '11 & '12) under Harbaugh, while in 2012, he guided the franchise to its second Super Bowl victory.


INJURY UPDATE

NOTE OF THE WEEK

• Last Sunday at KC, the Ravens finished 2 yards shy (198) of rushing for 200 yards for the fourth-straight game. Still, Baltimore became the first NFL team since 2003 (Denver) to rush for at least 190 yards in four-consecutive games.

• Over the season's past four games (since Week 11), Baltimore has rushed for an NFL-high 914 yards (see chart below).

• **RB Gus Edwards** (382) ranks fourth in NFL rushing since Week 11, while **QB Lamar Jackson** (336) stands eighth.

CHIEFS HEAD COACH ANDY REID ON THE RAVENS' QUARTERBACK SITUATION:

"They're blessed to have two really good quarterbacks – well, really three – but the two that are playing and have played together, and that's a unique combination. Lamar, he can run like a running back, he's as fast as a wide receiver, and he can throw like a son of a gun, like a quarterback. That's a pretty good combination to have. He's a talented kid, and so is the other guy; [Joe] Flacco is a talented one. That's a good situation right there that Marty [Mornhinweg] and John [Harbaugh] have."

OLB Terrell Suggs on the the Ravens' mindset after a near-win at Kansas City in Week 14:

"A lot of us are pissed off. But that's a good thing. It's good to be pissed off in December. We're going to take that and channel it into our preparation for Tampa Bay."

CB Brandon Carr on if the Ravens received a "moral victory" in last week's OT defeat at 11-2 Kansas City:

"I'm not into moral victories. All this loss says is that you have to find a way to finish. You have to find ways to win these tough ball games against good opponents on the road, in unfriendly territory. We have to make our plays and find ways to get a victory moving forward."

LB C.J. Mosley on how the Ravens should feel after last week's tough loss at Kansas City:

"[The Chiefs] have a heck of a team. That's December football; that was like a playoff game on the road. It was a great test for us. As a whole, we played a pretty good game, but it wasn't perfect. You want to try your best to be perfect, especially on the road. ... I don't think we're discouraged at all. Nobody in this locker room should walk out with their heads down."

QB Lamar Jackson on the Ravens moving forward after the Week 14 defeat at Kansas City:

"We are a strong team. We can fight with anybody. I know a lot of people doubted us [and thought we'd] lose [the Kansas City] game anyway, but it was not how they thought it was going to be. We just have to get better next week and move on."

Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes on the Ravens' defense:

"This defense is really good. They're the real deal. They did a lot of things, like cover zero. Or, if it was exotic blitzes, they really mixed it up. It was like it was a different coverage every single play. When you're a young quarterback, I haven't seen some of those things they were doing."

Defensive coordinator Don Martindale on CB Brandon Carr being named the Ravens Walter Payton Man of the Year: "There's been talk before about that he's the 'Iron Man' now with his [173-] consecutive starts, but he's the 'Iron Man' also out in the community. The same guy that we get here, who makes plays for us, and we count on all the time, that's who he is as a person. I think everybody in this organization sees it. What a great honor bestowed on him to be nominated for this award, and what a great award it is."

Rookie RB Gus Edwards on how much the running back group has worked together the past couple weeks:

"I think we're doing a good job at that. Guys are rooting each other on, we're working hard, trying to compete. I think we're doing a good job at just getting along and also helping each other get better. I feel like the competition in our running backs room is really good right now. Guys are working hard, and we're also bringing each other along."

Head coach John Harbaugh on how he would classify OLB Matthew Judon's potential:

"He's an all-around player, yes. He can be a dominant pass rusher according to his style – a very physical, explosive, leverage-type of a pass rusher, great quickness – but also, really good run edge-setter, and that's the combination you really want. That's what Terrell Suggs has been over the years. I'm not making that comparison just yet, but he's watched 'Sizz' [Suggs] play and kind of patterned himself a little bit after that. And to me, he's a very similar kind of player."

QB Lamar Jackson on the Ravens' tight ends group:

"Those guys do a great job. They're athletes as well. They're not just blocking tight ends. They can get out in space, catch the ball, make defenders miss, break tackles. They can put points up on the board. Those guys are great aspects to have on the field."

LT Ronnie Stanley on where he has seen QB Lamar Jackson improve over the course of the season:

"He's improved tremendously over the past three weeks. It's been little by little every week, and that's all we can ask for. It's just constant progression and just keep taking steps forward and not backward. He's been a great leader. We have a lot of plays in our playbook, and that [was] a challenge at first, but he's been doing a great job of learning that and communicating more clearly."

S Eric Weddle on how CB Tavon Young strengthens the secondary and what he brings to the defense:

"He's one of our best cover guys and just our best football players, when you look at our team and look at what he can do. He's played special teams, and obviously, gives us a dynamic player – a nickel who can blitz, who plays the run, who's physical and can run with those slot guys. It's nice to have a guy in there that can run around and cover guys that we need, especially going against a passing offense."

WEEK 14 GAME RECAP

CHIEFS 27, RAVENS 24 (OT)

Arrowhead Stadium • Kansas City, MO • Sunday, Dec. 9

The Ravens took the Chiefs, who own the AFC's best record (11-2), to overtime before dropping a 27-24 heartbreaker at Arrowhead Stadium last Sunday. K Harrison Butker's 35-yard FG in the extra period was the difference. The Ravens jumped to a 24-17 lead with 4:04 left in regulation on a QB Lamar Jackson 9-yard TD throw to WR John Brown. Kansas City, which entered the game with the NFL's No. 1 scoring offense, then produced an 11-play, 75-yard TD drive that included 2 fourth-down conversions. The first came on a fourth-and-9 from their own 40, when a scrambling QB Patrick Mahomes threw an impressive cross-body heave (48 yards) to WR Tyreek Hill for a first down at the Ravens' 12-vard line. The second came on a fourth-and-3 at the Ravens' 5, when Mahomes hit RB Damien Williams for the tying TD. The Chiefs won the OT coin toss and produced a FG on that drive. The Ravens then crossed midfield (44-yard line), but a holding call (LT Ronnie Stanley) put them back to the Baltimore 45. QB Robert Griffin III, who replaced an injured Jackson for the last two plays, threw incomplete to a tightly-covered WR Willie Snead IV on the game's final play. After exchanging possessions in the first quarter, Kansas City scored on a Williams' 1-yard run. Baltimore then tied the game, running the ball all 8 plays on a TD series that ended with RB Kenneth Dixon's 3-yard score. A 28-yard K Justin Tucker FG gave the Ravens their only lead in the first half (10-7). Another Mahomes-engineered drive that ended with a 15-yard TD throw to TE Travis Kelce and a 24-yard Butker FG made the score 17-10 at the half. The Ravens produced the only points in the third quarter in a series that started with S Chuck Clark's interception of Mahomes at the Baltimore 37-yard line. Facing a fourth-and-2 at KC's 10, the Ravens went for it and scored with Jackson hitting TE Maxx Williams for a 10-yard TD toss. The game stayed at 17-17 until Brown's go-ahead TD late in the fourth quarter.

• Baltimore defensive line coach **Joe Cullen** spent two seasons in the same role with Tampa Bay (2014-15). Over two years with him guiding the Bucs' D-line, Tampa Bay ranked No. 7 in the NFL in combined tackles for loss (173) and sacks (74).

• Buccaneers **C Ryan Jensen** was selected by Baltimore in the sixth round of the 2013 draft and spent five seasons with the team, playing in 48 games (38 starts). In 2017, he was part of an O-Line that permitted the league's seventh-fewest sacks (27), helping the team produce the NFL's ninth-ranked scoring attack (24.7 ppg). In 2016, Jensen helped protect **QB Joe Flacco**, who threw for a franchise-record 4,317 yards.

• Ravens director of player engagement **Harry Swayne** was drafted (seventh round) by Tampa Bay in 1987 as a DE, later switching to OT. He spent four seasons with the Bucs (1987-90).

LOCAL CONNECTIONS

• Both of Baltimore's 2018 first-round draft picks have Florida roots: **TE Hayden Hurst** (Jacksonville) and **QB Lamar Jackson** (Pompano Beach).

 Several other Ravens players hail from Florida: RB Javorius Allen (Tallahassee), ILB Chris Board (Orlando), WR John Brown (Homestead), RB Alex Collins (Fort Lauderdale), WR/RS Janarion Grant (Trilby), CB Stanley Jean-Baptiste (Miami), WR Chris Moore (Orlando) and WR Willie Snead IV (Winter Park).

• Tampa Bay defensive coordinator **Mark Duffner** served as head coach at the University of Maryland from 1992-96. During his tenure, the Terps returned to the national rankings for the first time in almost a decade.

• Tampa Bay **T Donovan Smith** is originally from Owings Mills, MD, and attended Owings Mills HS. As a senior, Smith earned first-team All-State honors.

• Buccaneers practice squad **OL Cole Boozer** (Hunt Valley) and **CB Ryan Smith** (Upper Marlboro) also call Maryland home.

• Buccaneers senior communications manager Allen Barrett is from Baltimore, where he attended The Gilman School. In 2007, he interned for the Ravens' public relations department.

RAVENS RADIO BROADCASTS

• The Ravens' 2018 radio team features Gerry Sandusky, with former Ravens standouts OLB Jarret Johnson and TE Dennis Pitta splitting half the games as analysts. 98 Rock's Kirk McEwen serves as the sideline reporter for home games, while former Ravens RB Justin Forsett is the away game sideline reporter.

• All games can be heard on 98Rock (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM, baltimoreravens.com, the Ravens mobile app (when in Baltimore) and on 21 regional affiliates. These broadcasts spans three states – Maryland, Pennsylvania and Delaware – and Washington, D.C.

• Additionally, Tico Sports produces a Spanish radio broadcast. With a crew consisting of David Andrade (play-by-play), Allen Gutierrez (analyst) and Juliana Lopez (producer), Tico Sports broadcasts games on Radio La Jefa WDMV 700 AM, the Ravens' flagship Spanish radio partner. The broadcast also digitally streams games on the Ravens Mobile App.







SPOTLIGHT: MICHAEL PIERCE

Which cause did you chose to support through "My Cause, My Cleats?" "Israel Collective is an umbrella group under Christians United for Israel. They sponsored myself, Johnny [Shelton, team chaplain],

Darren Sanders [VP of security], and 30 other guys from around the league – both current and former players – for an offseason trip to bring insight and knowledge to what's going on in Israel. We got involved in the Shabbat dinner and saw historical sights."

Why is this cause important to you? "It's a very important cause to me. I made some friends over there on that trip. It was something that I wanted to honor those guys by doing this."

Where did you learn your gymnastics ability? You recently showcased your skills with a roundoff. "One of my really close friends from high school, Katie Deterding, was a cheerleader. I never could do the backflip, because I was always scared. I was a big guy, and it was pretty dangerous. I thought I could learn a roundoff – which is a handstand, but it's like a half-flip. I learned that from her, and I've been able to do it ever since."

In high school, you were a linebacker. How did you transition to be a defensive tackle? "I was a big, big linebacker – probably around 265. In lower Alabama, they run a lot of power [offenses]. There are a lot of running backs, so it played to my strengths. I was really athletic for a bigger guy, so I was able to cover intermediate passing routes. When colleges came to recruit me, they don't have 265-pound linebackers. They foresaw me moving to defensive end or tackle. When I got to college, they were like, 'Hey, you're a little short for defensive end. So if you can gain 20-30 pounds over three years, you can be a good defensive tackle.' I got into lifting and changed my diet, and it went from there."

Do you enjoy stopping the run or rushing the passer more? "I've just developed a love for stopping the run. But anytime you can get a sack as a nose guard – those are really special. I still remember my first one in Cleveland. They're few and far between, but stopping the run is my bread and butter. Anytime I can do that, get a tackle for loss, that gets me pumped!"

People refer to you as "The Juggernaut." How did that nickname come about? "Sizz' [Terrell Suggs] actually gave me that nickname. 'Sizz' and Lawrence Guy did. I actually have 'The Juggernaut' tattooed on the inside of my right calf. It's a comic book character from Deadpool 2. I've always been a comic book guy. It kind of just took life from there. It basically means you kick butt all the time; you run through stuff. It's what I enjoy. It's fitting."

Does anyone else on the defensive line have a superhero nickname? "Brandon Williams is called 'The Hulk.' They call 'Urb' [Brent Urban] 'Salsa Blanca,' because he has a lot of flavor. He dresses really, really well. He has the kicks and the dress. But I think it's just Brandon and me who have superhero ones."

Who has been the most influential person in your life? "My dad. He came from a poor family in Mobile and worked his way up. He went to college and was the first to graduate. He heads a nonprofit in Mobile and gives back to the community that he grew up in."

If you could sit down with one NFL player and pick his brain, who would it be? "Damon Harrison. I actually reached out to him on Instagram and scheduled a workout with him this offseason. Outside of Brandon [Williams], I identify him as the best nose guard in the NFL. I look up to him and watch film on him – really any great nose guard. I think being a student of the game has helped me tremendously."

What has been your proudest achievement outside of football? "I started a kids football camp back home with guys I played with in high school. It's myself and four other guys I played with when we won our state championship together. Just to come home and get the kids out means a lot to me."

LB Ray Lewis - 2000 Super Bowl XXXV MVP

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing franchise's second World the Championship. After an amazing firsthalf performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 full seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

• The Ravens are one of only eight teams (NE – 9; GB – 8; Pit. – 7; Atl., Bal., Cin., Ind. & Sea. – 6) to earn at least six postseason berths in the last 10 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in each of those playoff campaigns.)

• The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 13.

• "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.

• John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.

• Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.

• In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.

• Harbaugh owns the third-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 10 seasons (since the 1970 merger).

• With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.

• For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first 10 years, "Harbs" is one of four active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).

• Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

JERRY ROSBURG & SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

ROSBURG LEADS RAVENS SPECIALISTS

SEASONS RAVENS: 11TH **NFL:** 18TH Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

Prime Kicker & Punter

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (228) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.5% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (228-of-252 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

2018: Another Ravens Return Man Scores Big

• In Week 12's win over Oakland, Baltimore native **CB/RS Cyrus Jones** posted a 70-yard punt return TD in the second quarter, marking the Ravens' first PR-TD since 10/15/17, when Michael Campanaro had a 77-yarder vs. Chicago. Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: Campanaro, Kaelin Clay, Tandon Doss, C. Jones, Jacoby Jones and Lardarius Webb.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS IN JONES' MAGICAL SEASON

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's third-most blocked kicks (13, tied), including an NFL-high (tied) 4 in 2016.

SIX STRAIGHT IN THE TOP 5

In the past six full seasons (2012-17), the Ravens' special teams units have consistently been acknowledged as one of the league's best. In the annual special teams report from senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin, Baltimore has ranked in the NFL's Top 5 for six-straight seasons. (Gosselin's report is recognized by NFL teams as a special teams measuring stick.)

"WINK" LEADS THE DEFENSE

On Jan. 9, 2018, the Ravens promoted Don "Wink" Martindale to defensive coordinator following the retirement of Dean Pees. Martindale, 54, is in his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, LB C.J. Mosley has become one of the league's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls. **RAVENS: 7**TH

The 2018 campaign marks Martindale's 14th season coaching in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he served as the Broncos' defensive coordinator.

"Don has done a great job," John Harbaugh stated in November. "He has certain skills and gifts as a coach that are unique to him and are really strong. It's a team effort, too. We have a great staff. All those guys have done a great job, and our players are involved. We have the right kind of culture. I'm proud of all those guys. We have a bunch of young coaches who are really smart guys. Don does a great job of bringing them all in to it and including them."

Marty Mornhinweg was elevated to offensive coordinator on Oct. 10, 2016. A 24-year NFL coaching veteran, Mornhinweg, who joined Baltimore as QBs coach in 2015, is a former head coach of the Lions (2001-02). He has also served as offensive coordinator for the New York Jets (2013-14), Philadelphia Eagles (2004-12) and San Francisco 49ers (1997-2000).

ASSISTANT COACHES

JERRY ROSBURG

SPECIAL TEAMS COORD. / ASSOC. HEAD COACH In his 40th season coaching, Rosburg has guided an exceptional special teams group over his 10 years (2008-17) with the Ravens. Specifically in the past six full seasons (2012-17), the Ravens' ST units have consistently been acknowledged as one of the league's best. In the annual special teams report from senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin, Baltimore has ranked in the NFL's Top 5 for six-straight seasons (and is the only team to do so).

DON MARTINDALE

"Wink" was promoted to "D" coordinator on Jan. 9, 2018 after six years working with Baltimore's LBs. Originally joining the Ravens in 2012, during the past six seasons, Martindale has guided and helped grow a number of standout linebackers, most notably ILB C.J. Mosley. Martindale was the Broncos' "D" coordinator in 2010, and in 2009, coached all four LBs in the 3-4 scheme.

MARTY MORNHINWEG OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Mornhinweg is in his third year as offensive coordinator, originally assuming the role in Week 6 of 2016. A 34-year coaching veteran and former NFL head coach (Lions), he has an extensive background coordinating offenses and tutoring QBs. Throughout his NFL career, five QBs have earned Pro Bowl honors under his direction: Michael Vick, Donovan McNabb, Jeff Garcia, Steve Young and Brett Favre.

GREG ROMAN

Assistant HEAD COACH / TIGHT ENDS COACH Roman is in his second stint with the Ravens, re-joining the team in 2017. In the latter part of '17, Baltimore's offense made big strides, and following the season, he was promoted to assistant head coach/TEs coach. Since his first term in Baltimore (2006-07), he has been a successful NFL offensive coordinator both in San Francisco and Buffalo.

RICHARD ANGULO

ASSISTANT OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

Angulo is in his fifth year with the Ravens and his second as the team's assistant offensive line coach. In 2017, he helped coach an offensive line that allowed the league's seventh-fewest sacks (27, tied with Minnesota). From 2015-16, he served as Baltimore's tight ends coach after being promoted from his original position of offensive coaching intern (2014).

ANDY BISCHOFF

OFFENSIVE ASSISTANT / TIGHT ENDS

Bischoff is in his fourth year with the Ravens and continues his work with the TEs, while aiding "O" coordinator Marty Mornhinweg and assistant head coach Greg Roman, who also coaches the TEs.

RANDY BROWN

Brown works directly with the kicking group – K Justin Tucker, P Sam Koch (holder) and LS Morgan Cox – and has coached five Pro Bowlers in Baltimore: Koch (2015), Cox (2015 & 2016), Tucker (2013 & 2016), K Billy Cundiff (2010) and K Matt Stover (last kicked for Ravens in 2008).

JOE CULLEN DEFENSIVE LINE COACH

Cullen enters his third year as the Ravens' defensive line coach. He originally joined the team in 2016 following two seasons with the Buccaneers in the same role. A D-line specialist, he has 29 years of experience, including 11 in the NFL with five teams (Bal., TB, Cle., Jax. and Det.).

JOE D'ALESSANDRIS OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

Pronounced *dell-ah-SAN-dress*, he is a 40year coaching veteran who enters his second season as Baltimore's O-line coach. "Joe D" has extensive experience guiding and developing linemen, both in the collegiate ranks and pros. Since transitioning to the NFL in 2008, he's mentored players for the Chiefs, Bills, Chargers and Ravens.

BOBBY ENGRAM Wide Receivers Coach

Engram, who enjoyed a 14-year NFL playing career, is in his fifth season as the Ravens' WRs coach. In his third year (2016) guiding Baltimore's receivers, his group helped record the second-most net passing yards in team history (4,100), including a franchisebest 4,317 by QB Joe Flacco.

THOMAS HAMMOCK RUNNING BACKS COACH

Hammock is in his fifth year as the Ravens' RBs coach. In 2017, he helped guide RB Alex Collins to a breakout season, when the back tallied 973 rushing yards and 1,160 yards from scrimmage. Prior to joining the Ravens, he spent 11 years on the collegiate circuit, including three (2011-13) as Wisconsin's assistant HC/RBs/recruiting coordinator.

CHRIS HEWITT SECONDARY COACH

Hewitt enters his second season as the secondary coach after being promoted prior to the 2017 campaign. He previously served as the team's DBs coach from 2015-16 and the assistant secondary coach in 2014. In his seventh-overall year in Baltimore, he also spent two years (2012-13) helping guide the special teams unit led by Jerry Rosburg.

CHRIS HORTON Assistant Special Teams Coach

Horton is in his third year as the Ravens' assistant special teams coach, working directly with Jerry Rosburg. Horton has helped Baltimore's special teams units perform outstandingly in the three years he's been involved. In the annual special teams report from senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin, Baltimore has ranked in the NFL's Top 5 for six-straight seasons.

STERLING LUCAS QUALITY CONTROL - DEFENSE

Lucas is in his third year with the Ravens after being promoted to a defensive quality control coach in January 2018, with responsibilities that include finding tips/ tendencies on opponent offenses, selfscouting and working with the LBs.

MIKE MACDONALD LINEBACKERS COACH

Macdonald is in his first season as the team's LBs coach. In his fifth year with the Ravens, he previously spent time as the defensive backs coach (2017) and as a defensive assistant (2015-16). He originally joined Baltimore in 2014 as a coaching intern.

JAMES URBAN QUARTERBACKS COACH

Urban joined the Ravens in 2018. A 15year NFL coaching veteran, he spent the past seven seasons with AFC North rival Cincinnati, coaching the WRs. He entered the NFL with the Eagles in 2004. After five seasons in two roles under Andy Reid, he was promoted to QBs coach his final two years (2009-10), coaching Pro Bowlers Donovan McNabb (2009) and Michael Vick (2010).

CRAIG VER STEEG Senior Offensive Assistant

Pronounced ver-STEGG, he is in his 11th year working with the Ravens. Ver Steeg, who owns 35 years of coaching experience, has an extensive background working with QBs, WRs and RBs. As one of John Harbaugh's original coaching hires (2008), he has assisted in game preparation, game and practice analysis and guiding players.

MATT WEISS

FOOTBALL STRATEGY COORD. / WRS


Weiss is in his 10th season with the Ravens after assisting with the QBs from 2016-17. Prior to joining the offense, he coached on defense in a variety of roles, including CBs, assistant LBs and quality control. In addition to his coaching duties, he's responsible for leading coaching staff analytics, advising John Harbaugh on game management and scripting situational practice periods.

DREW WILKINS ASST. DEFENSIVE LINE / OLBS

Wilkins originally joined the Ravens in 2010 and was promoted to assistant D-line/OLBs coach in 2018. Wilkins, who spent three seasons (2014-16) as a defensive assistant, was responsible for weekly production of the defensive playbook, scouting reports, film breakdown and assisting with the development of the D-line in practice.



Flacco, who led Baltimore to a Super Bowl XLVII victory in 2012 (and earned game MVP honors), is in his 11th NFL campaign. In nine games this season, Flacco has completed 232 of 379 passes (61.2%) for 2,465 yards, 12 TDs and 6 INTs (84.2 rating).

WR Michael Crabtree, a 10-year NFL veteran, signed with the Ravens as a free agent this past spring. Through 13 games, he has tallied 51 catches for 567 yards and 3 TDs. Here are several fast facts about the standout wideout:

- Crabtree has produced at least 8 receiving TDs in a season four times, including in each of the past three years (9 2015, 8 2016 & 8 2017).

ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

2016: PERHAPS THE BEST YEAR EVER

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

JACKSON'S STARTING DEBUT

QB Lamar Jackson made his first-career start in Week 11 vs. Cincy, boosting the Ravens to a 24-21 victory. Here are several notable feats by the first-round draft pick (32nd overall) from the game:

- Jackson completed 13 of 19 passes for 150 yards and 1 INT, adding 119 rushing yards on 26 carries.
- It marked the first time in NFL history that a team had a rookie QB and RB (Gus Edwards, 115) each surpass 100 rushing yards.

• Jackson's 119 rushing yards are the second most by a rookie QB since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, with only **QB Robert Griffin III** having more (138 on 10/14/12 with Washington).

• The 119 stand as the most rushing yards by a QB in a starting debut, while his 26 attempts are the most by a QB in the modern NFL era.



MOST THROUGH FIRST FOUR

Rookie **QB Lamar Jackson** has rushed for 336 yards in Baltimore's past four games (3-1 record). The first-round pick (32nd overall) has produced the most rushing yards by a QB in the first four starts of a career during the Super Bowl Era.

RAVE REVIEWS FOR ROOKIE RB

In Week 12's 34-17 win vs. Oakland, rookie **RB Gus Edwards** rushed for over 100 yards for the second-straight game, finishing with 118 on 23 carries (5.1 average). With that performance...

• Edwards became just the second rookie in Ravens history to post back-to-back 100-yard rushing games (Jamal Lewis, 2000, Weeks 12-13).

• Edwards became the sixth undrafted rookie in the NFL's common draft era to produce 100-plus rushing yards in consecutive games. He joined Branden Oliver (2014), LeGarrette Blount (2010), Dominic Rhodes (2001), Fred Lane (1997) and Clark Gaines (1976) in accomplishing the feat.

• Edwards also became the first Raven to rush for back-to-back "100s" since RB Justin Forsett, who had three such games in November of 2014.



RAVENS IN OUR COMMUNITY

LAKEWOOD ELEMENTARY

On Monday, Dec. 3, the Ravens and their players contributed nearly \$200,000 to Baltimore City Public Schools for efforts to upgrade the heating and air conditioning (HVAC) units at Lakewood Elementary School. Scheduled to begin running in January 2019, the HVAC installation is part of the Ravens' Social Justice Program, in which the team has pledged to match player donations that support social justice initiatives and engagement in the Baltimore community. The donation to Lakewood Elementary school marks the first funding distributed from the players' pledge through their fund. Ravens president Dick Cass, LS Morgan Cox, OLB Matthew Judon, DB/LB Anthony Levine Sr., WR Chris Moore, LB C.J. Mosley and DT Brandon Williams joined congressman Elijah Cummings, Baltimore City mayor Catherine Pugh and CEO of Baltimore City Public Schools Dr. Sonja Brookins Santelises to announce the contribution. Serving pre-K and kindergarten students, Lakewood Elementary is an early education school located in eastern Baltimore. Lakewood has an enrollment that consists of 65% of students on free and reduced lunch, and 50% of the student body is special needs.





TEAM SMILE

On Monday, Dec. 3, Ravens Cheerleaders, mascot Poe, LS Morgan Cox and CB/RS Cyrus Jones (below) participated in a TeamSmile event in Baltimore City. Working with TeamSmile for the first time, the Ravens helped support a day of free dental care for undeserved children. One hundred dental professionals, students and volunteers provided 300 area children from three local schools with free dental care. TeamSmile is a non-profit organization that has created partnerships with professional sports teams, local dentists, dental organizations, dental schools and area volunteers to help promote the importance of oral health care. Their mission is to create a fun dental experience to undeserved children.

On Monday, Dec. 3, Ravens **S Tony Jefferson** (below), hosted the second annual Tony Jefferson's Shop With A Jock event. JOHN HARBAUGH MONDAY PRESS CONFERENCE: WEEK 15 VS. BUCCANEERS

Can we get an update on QB Lamar Jackson's ankle injury? *(David Ginsburg)* "Should be fine. It looks like it's OK – that's what [head certified athletic trainer] Ron Medlin told me this morning. I'm sure they'll look at Lamar again this [afternoon] as he comes in, but he hadn't been in yet, which is a good sign. I think he's going to be OK."

Do you feel like there are any positives you can take away from going toe-to-toe with a team like Kansas City? *(Jerry Coleman)* "Yes, there are lots of positives. No matter what the outcome would've been, it would've been the same game we played. There would've been so many things to learn from it and so many things to take from it, in terms of just the way the guys played. I thought the players played a really, really good football game, went toe-to-toe, fought like crazy, had a bunch of opportunities to win the game, fought back into the game, overcame a lot of adversity, made a lot of good plays. It was really good to see. I'm really proud of our guys. [We] got a lot of pressure on the quarterback. You can tick off a lot of things. I thought our coaches did a fantastic job with game-planning – have done a great job all year. In all three phases our coaching staff has been phenomenal. I'm very proud of our coaching staff. I think they stand for the right things, and our focus now as coaches is to make sure we take care of the things that are important in December. Let's make sure we're playing fundamental football. Let's make sure we're on point with our details. The thing I love about our players is they buy in to that; they believe in that. It shows up in the way that we've been playing – this game and the games before building in to that. So, what's important is what we do from here on out. We need to win. The way we look at it [is] we need to win three games in a row. We've been here before. Let's do it. But all we need to think about right now is Tampa Bay, our upcoming opponent, and play our best football on Sunday. That's what we'll be focused on doing."

Were you able to watch any of the Steelers game coming back? (Jamison Hensley) "No, we don't get the TV on the plane. We got the report right before we touched down though." (Reporter: "Any reaction to it?") "I was happy. I was very happy. Yes, can't say that we weren't happy. I mean, that's just the way it is. We're in a fight for the division against a coarse team that we have great respect for. But they're on their path, and we're on our path. We need to take care of our business. You want to advance in the National Football League? You have to win games, and that's what we're focused on doing."

You have two ways to get in the playoffs. I realize you want to win your division, but you're only a half-game out of there. You already have a Wild Card spot as it stands now. Is it nice to have at least two options there? (David Ginsburg) "It helps – sure. We just need to win games and let all that take care of itself – that's the main thing we need to do. Really, all we need to do is just focus on playing our best football on Sunday. Keep it simple; keep it about football. That's what we've been about from Day One. Our guys have been all about that, and I really appreciate that about them. I'm proud of this football team. I'm not just talking about yesterday's game. I'm talking about all year, from Day One when we first got here, and the mindset they've taken, the accountability, how trustworthy they are. As a coach, that's all you can ask for. Like I've said, it's been a joy every single day, coming in and coaching these guys. I told them it was an honor taking the field with them. It was an honor to take the field with them yesterday – coaches and players. Let's keep fighting and be the best we can be."

With the situation that came up yesterday with FB/DL Pat Ricard and his tweets ... He addressed it, but is that something you, as the head coach, would feel the need to address to the entire team? Or do you let them work that out? (*Childs Walker*) "That'll be based on what our team thinks. I probably will ... I know we will ... It's unacceptable. I don't care when it happens. I don't care if it happens [however] many years ago it happened. It's just not acceptable. He knows that; he said that. He told me that yesterday on the plane coming back – the first time I had the chance to talk to him about it. He's distraught. But still, that has to be dealt with. I'm not in the position. I don't live that. I think our players will be the ones to guide the ship on that just a little bit. I'll definitely be seeking their input. We'll see where it goes from there. It'll be dealt with internally, for sure."



Is his status on the roster in question? (*Jeff Zrebiec*) "I don't know anything right now. We haven't come to any decisions. Like I said, I think it's an internal matter. It has to do with the relationships on our team and amongst those guys, and that's between a group of men. We'll let a group of men work it out."

Was he going to be inactive regardless? (Jerry Coleman) "Oh, yes. He was going to be inactive regardless. Yes."

Is trying to find potentially bad stuff on social media from years back something that NFL organizations are trying to be more vigilant about? (Jonas Shaffer) "You mean like for when we evaluate for the draft and those kinds of things?" (Reporter: "Yes.") "Very vigilant, very vigilant. They do that. Eric [DeCosta, assistant general manager] could give you all the details to that, as far as they do deep dives on social media. They do everything they can to uncover that stuff before the fact, before it comes out. I'm certain we didn't have that. First I've heard of it was yesterday."

It seemed like CB Marlon Humphrey didn't play too much in the second half. How is he doing? How did CB Anthony Averett do with his most extensive action this season? (*Luke Jones*) "Yes, good question. Marlon did play in the second half, but we rotated him with Anthony as we went. So, to your point – you're exactly right. Anthony played well. He played really well, not surprisingly. He's been playing well. He's answered every bell so far that we've ... Every round he's gone out there, he's done a good job. He only gets better. It just makes our corner situation even better than it was before. I was really pleased with how he played. It helped Marlon, too, as far as the long-term health for him."

Is CB Marlon Humphrey's injury something you feel like you're going to have to worry about going forward? *(Childs Walker)* "Well, that's what it is – it's just a groin. It's annoying. It takes a while for it to go away completely. Sometimes you can re-tweak it a little bit, too. It's probably something he's going to be feeling for a while. It's just the way groins are."

Now that you've had a chance to go back and look at the fourth-and-9 play yesterday, what did you see after looking at the film as opposed to seeing it live? Anything different? (Jerry Coleman) "It was kind of just a miraculous kind of play, to be honest with you. So that's what I saw." (Reporter: "Have you seen anything like that before?") "Yes. I saw one in Denver a few years back, a big playoff game. (laughter) Except that one went for a touchdown." (Reporter: "So that was a miracle? Seriously? That's the way you saw it yesterday? A miraculous play?") "I don't want to downgrade the term 'miracle.' There are a lot of miracles happening out there every single day."

What did you think of the way that RB Kenneth Dixon ran? Can you see him taking a bigger role moving forward because he's running so well? (*Ryan Mink*) "I could, yes. Kenneth played really well – ran hard, broke tackles, made people miss, did a good job in pass protection. He's getting more comfortable with the offense again, assignment-wise, and things like that. So yes, I'd definitely expect to see Kenneth's role to grow based on the fact he's doing well with what he's been given so far. You continue to earn more as you go."

Since the bye week, you've went from a pass-heavy offense to more of a run-heavy offense. It seems like that transition has been seamless. How difficult is it to shift from one style of offense during the season to another? (Jamison Hensley) "It's very difficult. But I also think that it wasn't something that was impossible for us. Normally to do what's been done would be basically impossible – expect for the fact that we've already built that into our offense. So, we were working the blocking schemes all along in practice, in training camp and all that. We've been calling more passes in games than we do now, by far. The read-option element is a much bigger part of it than it was – those RPOs also – than it was before. It was much more of a dropback, three-, five-, seven-step dropback game more before. But that's also part of our gameplan still, just obviously, it's all switched. It's not impossible for that reason, but I think it's remarkable and vary impressive that our coaches and players have been able to do that. We just have to try to find a way to win the next game."

Do you expect QB Joe Flacco to be active and play this week? (*Luke Jones*) "I haven't had a chance to sit down with all the parties, yet, involved. I think it stands to reason that if Joe is ready to go, then he'll be part of the gameplan. He's too



good of a player not to be. We'll just figure that out as we go this week, to what degree, how it works. Everybody will know going in – perhaps except everybody outside, mostly – unless I change my mind on that. I'm excited. If we get Joe back, it's good, because it's another good player. I'll say this also: Rob Griffin [III] has done a great job. When he's gone in, he's played very well. He's been really good at practice. It's a good situation to have, and we'll see where it takes us."

You and QB Joe Flacco have a close relationship. Does that make the situation easier or more difficult to deal with? *(Jeff Zrebiec)* "I haven't thought about it as easier or more difficult. I don't think it's a problem. It's a football decision. Everybody understands what we're trying to do. [We're] trying to put the best football team out there from one play to the next that we can – that's all. That's always what it's about. All the guys sitting in those chairs, where you're sitting right now, they understand that. We don't make it about anything other than football. We keep it simple, like I've said before. It's about football – that's what we're here for. Guys come from every part of the world, every background, every race, religion, creed – whatever else you want to say – town, country, East Coast, West Coast. They come together to sit in a room for what purpose? For football – that's what we're here for. So, we keep it about that, and let's roll."

How did you think G/T James Hurst looked in the game? (James Hurst) "I thought he was good. He would probably tell you not as good as he can be or as he has been, because he hasn't played for so long. He's only been lifting weights for about a week-and-a-half. I thought he did well, very well, for the circumstances. I know he can play a lot better. That's the good side: He's only going to get better. I know he'll get up to speed quickly because he's back at it now."

Given your background in strength and conditioning, are most professional athletes able to regain the strength that they lost during that time off pretty quickly? (Jonas Shaffer) "I think so. ... It comes back quick. You get strong quickly. So, he'll get it right back."

How has CB/RS Cyrus Jones developed into his spot on special teams? (Todd Karpovich) "He has. He's done a really good job. Maybe we do things a little differently [than New England]. I think he had some things he had to learn. I'm sure he'd tell you that, in terms of the way we read the returns and blocking and things like that. It did take him a few weeks to get accustomed to it, to get a feel for it – but he has now. He's doing a great job of setting up his blocks and taking advantage of what their coverage gives him. Our guys have done a good job of blocking, and that was huge for us. It was a huge play in the game for us. We had off-setting penalties; we elected make them kick it again. It turned out to be a great decision. [Special teams coordinator/associate head coach] Jerry Rosburg made that decision and wanted to do that, and boom – we got a big return. A lot of credit goes to the punt return team and coach Rosburg and [assistant special teams] coach [Chris] Horton."

You had RB Kenneth Dixon in there for some of the really key plays at the end of the game. Did he earn that with the way he was running earlier in the game? (Childs Walker) "Yes, absolutely."

You had 15 QB hits yesterday. How do you feel about the pass rush right now? How much is it a credit to what the secondary is doing, allowing that to happen? (*Cliff Brown*) "You're exactly right. You hit right on the head. I do feel good about our pass rush. Our guys are relentless. They're very energetic; they're strong guys. We do a lot with pressures and things like that – that's when the secondary comes in. They come in and cover early. It's not easy. There were times where ... I'll tell you – it was a heck of a challenge. It was a chess match, in terms of us covering and finding matches and hiding our coverages, and their offense and their quarterback figuring when we were going to free up some guys on routes, and it kind of went back and forth."

Just as a clarification: You said QB Joe Flacco would be part of the gamelan if he's ready to go. Could that entail being a starter, or is that ... (Jamison Hensley) "Like I said, I'll just have to let you know. It could entail anything right now. I know what we want to do; I have a plan. We have a plan. We talked about it. We have to talk to the guys about it, and whether we share that publicly, we'll decide as the week goes on."
