### JUST THE FACTS

- With a win on Sunday, the Baltimore Ravens (9-6) will clinch their fifth-ever AFC North division title and earn a playoff berth for the seventh time during head coach **John Harbaugh**'s 11-year tenure.
- Hosting a red-hot Cleveland Browns team (7-7-1) that has won three straight and five of its last six, the Ravens close out regular season play from M&T Bank Stadium in a game that was flexed to 4:25 p.m.
- The Ravens, who have won five of their last six games all with rookie **QB Lamar Jackson** as the starter beat the surging Chargers, 22-10, in Los Angeles last Saturday. Los Angeles had won 10 of its last 11, including December road wins at Pittsburgh (33-30) and at Kansas City (29-28). Baltimore's No. 1 defense stymied an outstanding LAC attack throughout the game, holding Pro Bowl QB Philip Rivers to just 181 yards on 23-of-37 passing. Rivers was sacked 4 times, tossed 2 INTs and did not throw a TD pass for the first time this season. Jackson, meanwhile, threw for 204 yards on 12-of-22 passing and produced the longest TD of his brief pro career a 68-yard strike to fellow rookie **TE Mark Andrews**. Rookie **RB Gus Edwards** contributed a game-high 92 rushing yards, part of the Ravens' 159 overall.
- The Ravens own a 29-10 series lead over the Browns, including a 15-4 mark in Baltimore. Under coach Harbaugh, the Ravens are 18-3 vs. the Browns, sporting a 9-1 home record. In Week 5 earlier this season, the Ravens fell, 12-9, at Cleveland in overtime.
- In his 11th season at Baltimore's helm, coach Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a 113-77 overall record (10-5 postseason), posting the NFL's fifth-most total wins since his 2008 arrival. The Ravens have played in three AFC title games ('08, '11 & '12) under "Harbs," while in 2012, he guided the franchise to its second Super Bowl victory.

### HARBS SAYS

#### JOHN HARBAUGH ON HOW QB LAMAR JACKSON POSITIVELY AFFECTS THE DEFENSE:

"Football is complementary; it's all three phases working together. That's the kind of football we've always wanted to play here. We want to stay on the field, we want to get first downs, and we want to score touchdowns. We want to get as many three-and-outs as we can get. Obviously, we want turnovers, but special teams wins the field position battle. Those things all go together. Any group of players and any set of plays that complements the other side of the ball is positive, and Lamar is a big part of that. He's the quarterback, and he's playing great football his way, his style. Our guys have done a great job of adapting. Look at our receivers — look at the job they've done adapting to a different style and how well they are making plays when they have to make plays. Everyone deserves a lot of credit for that."

But we still haven't painted our Sistine Chapel yet. ... We were here [at 9-7, close to a playoff berth] last year. We won in Week 16 last year, as well. ### QUOTH THE RAVEN

### **NFL.COM'S HERBIE TEOPE ON THE BALTIMORE RAVENS:**

"The Ravens pose all kinds of problems for opponents and possess a style of football that's a throwback when compared to the high-flying offenses around the league. With a punishing ground game, a rookie signal-caller coming into his own and a suffocating defense, look out, NFL."

### S Tony Jefferson on the Ravens' announcement that they are working on a contract extension with John Harbaugh:

"That just made me super happy, just based on what everybody is saying outside and how composed he is with the team, how he ignores the noise. It trickles down to the players. That energy, it keeps us going, keeps a positive mindset throughout the year. He's become one of my favorite coaches."

### QB Lamar Jackson on the Ravens' 22-10 victory at the Chargers in Week 16:

"We can play with anyone. That was a great team. We can fight, and everyone sees it now."

#### The Baltimore Sun's Childs Walker on the Ravens' defense:

"For all the talk about Lamar Jackson, the Ravens are winning behind a defense that will go down as one of the best in franchise history. They hinted at their potential with an 11sack shutout in Tennessee. They played a brilliant all-around game in Atlanta against Matt Ryan and Julio Jones. And on Saturday night, the 2018 Ravens defense made its case to be remembered with the record-setting crew from 2000 and the 2006 group that represented the peak of the Ed Reed-Ray Lewis partnership. They're not as physically overwhelming as the 2000 defense, which featured Lewis at his absolute apex and held opponents to an absurd 10.3 points a game. They're not as star-studded as the 2006 defense, which featured Reed, Lewis and youthful versions of Terrell Suggs and Haloti Ngata, all led by the unruly genius of coordinator Rex Ryan. But they do everything well, and they've stifled a murderer's row of opposing quarterbacks, including Most Valuable Player candidate Philip Rivers of the Chargers. Rivers entered with a 112.4 passer rating and at least two touchdown passes in 13 of his 14 games this season."

### Sports Illustrated's Gary Gramling on Baltimore's defense:

"The Ravens don't give you many opportunities to beat them deep. They've now given up just nine passing plays of 25-plus yards over the past eight games, including zero [at the Chargers]. When they do give up big plays, it tends to be a quarterback making a superhuman play late in the down (think the Jameis Winston play, or basically everything Patrick Mahomes did two weeks ago). Baltimore is so instinctive, so prepared, so fast and so fundamental that it feels like opposing offenses are playing in three feet of water. Sustained drives seem virtually impossible. It's a mix of young talent with a core of veteran leaders up the middle: C.J. Mosley at linebacker and free agent steals Eric Weddle and Tony Jefferson at the safety spots."

#### **CBS Sports John Breech on the Ravens:**

"If you want to win in the playoffs, you have to be able to play defense and run the ball, and right now, there's no team in the NFL that does both of those things better than the Ravens. The scary thing for other teams is that when it comes to throwing the ball, [Lamar] Jackson is looking better each week."

#### CB Marlon Humphrey on how he has leaned on S Eric Weddle:

"I lean on him a lot. He's definitely got the nose for the football, inside and out. He's someone you can definitely see coaching one day, just because when you're on the field, it's almost as if you have a coach back there. You have a coach that's your safety. He can see things that you cannot always see, and he knows things that you don't always know. Just his brilliance in the game is phenomenal."

### Chargers head coach Anthony Lynn on the combination of rookies RB Gus Edwards and QB Lamar Jackson:

"Gus is running hard right now. He's very decisive, hitting the holes, physical, creating plays after contact. They have a good thing going. They are a good complement to one another, because Lamar makes you protect the perimeter, and Gus, when the defense gets soft in the middle, Gus attacks it down the line in the middle. It's a good complement to one another with what they're doing and how they're used in the scheme. I've worked with [assistant head coach/tight ends] Greg Roman before. A lot of the stuff I've seen before, I've used. So, they're executing very well."

### CB Brandon Carr on the Ravens' defense stepping up to close out the Week 16 win at Los Angeles:

"This showed who we are. We've been talking about getting turnovers the whole season. Now we're getting them. The icing on the cake is taking the football. We've played a lot of these high-caliber teams, and we haven't finished the game out. [The Chargers win] was taking the game into our own hands."

### Browns QB Baker Mayfield on Ravens TE Mark Andrews, one of his best friends from Oklahoma:

"Obviously, he's a very big dude. He's 6-5, I think he's about 260, but he can run. It's the size plus the talent, which normally you don't get that mixture, so he's blessed with that. And then, I think his football I.Q. is something people didn't realize until you sit down and talk with him. He's a guy that realizes what you want to accomplish on offense, and then when you mix that with how talented he is, that's a dangerous duo."

#### **RAVENS 22, CHARGERS 10**

StubHub Center • Los Angeles, CA • Saturday, Dec. 22

The Ravens beat the hottest team in the NFL when they stopped the Chargers, 22-10, at the StubHub Center in Los Angeles last Saturday. The Chargers had won 10 of their last 11, including December road wins at Pittsburgh (33-30) and at Kansas City (29-28). Baltimore's No. 1 defense stymied the outstanding Chargers' offense throughout the game, holding Pro Bowl QB Philip Rivers to just 181 yards on 23-of-37 passing. Rivers was sacked 4 times, tossed 2 INTs, and did not throw a TD pass for the first time this season. Baltimore's rookie **QB Lamar Jackson**, meanwhile, threw for 204 yards on 12-of-22 passing and produced the longest TD pass of his brief pro career – a 68-yard strike to fellow rookie TE Mark Andrews. The Ravens took a 6-0 lead on 2 K Justin Tucker field goals (24 and 35 yards) and held a 6-3 halftime advantage after K Michael Badgley's 38-yard FG. Ravens RB Kenneth Dixon then fumbled on the first play from scrimmage in the second half, and LA's Melvin Ingram III recovered at Baltimore's 17-yard line. Three plays later, RB Melvin Gordon III scored on a 1-yard plunge to give the Chargers their only lead of the day, 10-6. Jackson and the Ravens' offense bounced right back when the first-year signal-caller hit Andrews with the long TD throw. A 56yard Tucker FG gave the Ravens a 16-10 lead entering the fourth quarter. The Ravens' final TD came when **CB Tavon Young** scooped up a TE Antonio Gates' fumble, which was caused by LB Patrick **Onwuasor**, and raced 62 yards to the end zone. Along with his forced fumble, Onwuasor added 2 sacks and helped hold the Chargers to only 198 total yards. CBs Brandon Carr and Marlon Humphrey each provided an interception. Baltimore rookie RB Gus Edwards rushed 14 times for 92 yards for an impressive 6.6 average. Jackson finished with a 101.3 QB rating, while Rivers was at 51.7. After a Pittsburgh loss to New Orleans the following day, the Ravens moved into first place by a half-game in the AFC North. I

### TOP RAVENS-BROWNS CONNECTIONS

- Ravens GM/EVP and Hall of Fame TE **Ozzie Newsome** played 13 seasons in Cleveland. After his playing career, he then held positions as a scout, assistant to the head coach/offense/pro personnel, and director of pro personnel before moving to Baltimore as VP of player personnel in 1996.
- Baltimore special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** was the ST coordinator for the Browns from 2001-06, while Ravens defensive line coach **Joe Cullen** held the same title in Cleveland for one season (2013).
- The Ravens' staff is comprised of many who were invited to join the franchise when it moved from Cleveland: SVP of football administration **Pat Moriarty**, EVP of public & community relations **Kevin Byrne**, VP of football video operations **Jon Dubé**, SVP of operations **Bob Eller** and VP of IT **Bill Jankowski**.
- Ravens senior personnel assistant **George Kokinis** was the Browns' GM in 2009. Kokinis began his career with Cleveland as an operations intern (1991) and then as a scout (1992-95).
- Baltimore director of pro personnel **Vincent Newsome** played two seasons (1991-92) for the Browns before becoming a special assignment scout from 1993-95.
- Baltimore secondary coach **Chris Hewitt** was a Browns intern in 2001 through the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship.
- Browns senior offensive assistant **Al Saunders** served the same role for the Ravens from 2009-10.
- Ravens east area scout **Bobby Vega** spent 2005-18 with the Browns' scouting department, starting as a scouting assistant and working his way up to director.
- Ravens **QB Robert Griffin III** played for the Browns during the 2016 season. Baltimore **WR Willie Snead IV** was signed by Cleveland in 2014 as a rookie free agent.
- WR Breshad Perriman was selected by Baltimore in the first round of the 2015 draft. Browns QB Tyrod Taylor was drafted by the Ravens in the sixth round in 2011 and spent four years with the team. DT Carl Davis was a third-round pick in 2015 and played for the team through the 2018 training camp. DL Trevon Coley spent the 2016 training camp with Baltimore.

#### 2018 PRO BOWL RAVENS

Three Ravens were voted to the Pro Bowl for their standout performances during the 2018 season. **LB C.J. Mosley** (fourth), **S Eric Weddle** (sixth – third with Ravens) and **G Marshal Yanda** (seventh) were selected to play in the NFL's annual All-Star game.

- All games can be heard on 98Rock (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM, baltimoreravens.com, the Ravens mobile app (when in Baltimore) and on 21 regional affiliates. These broadcasts spans three states Maryland, Pennsylvania and Delaware and Washington, D.C.
- Additionally, Tico Sports produces a Spanish radio broadcast. With a crew consisting of David Andrade (play-by-play), Allen Gutierrez (analyst) and Juliana Lopez (producer), Tico Sports broadcasts games on Radio La Jefa WDMV 700 AM, the Ravens' flagship Spanish radio partner.







### SPOTLIGHT: OZZIE NEWSOME



**Ozzie Newsome**'s legacy is unlike any the game of football has produced. Known throughout all of sports as a premier leader, Newsome is a Hall of Fame player, the architect of Baltimore's Super Bowl XXXV and Super Bowl XLVII championship teams and an elite personnel evaluator who became the NFL's first African American

GM in 2002. Here's what the football world has said about Newsome throughout his legendary career, further proving that "The Wizard" will forever remain in a class of his own:

**HOF GM Bill Polian:** "If Ozzie wasn't already in the Hall of Fame as a tight end, they would be putting him in as a general manager."

Former Ravens HC Brian Billick: "The genius of his ability to absorb all the information is second to none. I always equate it to watching him look at the draft boards is like watching Russell Crowe [playing Nobel Laureate in economics John Nash] in the movie 'A Beautiful Mind,' in that scene where the math just kind of comes off the board for him. That's Ozzie with all those names and statistics. Of course, he has a great eye for talent, too, but his ability to orchestrate that process, to gain that information, is unmatched."

Ravens HC John Harbaugh: "He makes you your best self. You can have a good day, and he makes you be better. You can have a bad day, and he still brings out the best in you. He's a mentor, he's a friend, confidant — all those things. You can go seek advice and talk to him about becoming a better coach or a better evaluator. It's just been an amazing 11 years, and I'm looking forward to the next however many years we both walk on this Earth."

**ESPN's Chris Mortensen:** "There's a saying within the Ravens that goes, 'In Ozzie We Trust.' The reason for that is his track record is tremendous. He has a philosophy, he stays true to it, and they're not going to deviate from that."

Former Giants GM Jerry Reese: "Really, Ozzie is an ambassador for the NFL, period. I think about three 'Cs' when I think about Ozzie: classy, consistency and championships. That's what I think about. We're all chasing Ozzie Newsome, man. He doesn't talk about it, but go in his office, he's got skins on the wall. He doesn't have to talk about it. His resume says it all for him."

**Hall of Fame T Jonathan Ogden:** "Ozzie is synonymous with the Ravens. You can't mention the Baltimore Ravens without Ozzie Newsome coming up relatively quickly in the conversation."

**USA Today's Jarrett Bell:** "[His] stand-up accountability reflects why Newsome is one of the league's most revered front office figures, a man whose authority within the Ravens' building has been bolstered by the close relationships he has developed over the years."

Ravens Assistant GM Eric DeCosta: "He said to me one time that his strengths are my weaknesses, and my strengths are his weaknesses. So, you know what? We're a family, we want to win, and we're competitive people. We believe in what we do, we want to be good, and we want to build a team that [fans] are proud of. I've got probably the best GM in the history of football. At least one of the Top 5, here right now, and I hope he always stays."

Longtime NFL Coach Gary Kubiak: "Ozzie is the most impressive man I've ever been around in pro football, and I've been around some good ones. To watch him work, to watch him work in the draft, to watch him handle the football team and to watch him work with John [Harbaugh], I can't say enough."

New England HC Bill Belichick: "I probably learned more from him than he learned from me. He's a very astute, sometimes quiet kind of guy, but the wheels are always turning; he's taking a lot in. When he speaks, you listen because you respect him, and you know that he's just not saying things to hear himself talk. He's saying them because he's given it a lot of thought, and he has a very important observation or opinion to share. He's had a great career. I can't think of many people that did what he did as a player and then in his current position and all the other things along the way."



LB Ray Lewis - 2000 Super Bowl XXXV MVP

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

### THE HARBAUGH FILE

**John Harbaugh** has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his 10 full seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

#### Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of only eight teams (NE 9; GB 8; Pit. 7; Atl., Bal., Cin., Ind. & Sea. 6) to earn at least six postseason berths in the last 10 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in each of those playoff campaigns.)
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 13.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the third-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 10 seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first 10 years, "Harbs" is one of four active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

### ROSBURG LEADS RAVENS SPECIALISTS

SEASONS RAVENS: 11TH NFL: 18TH Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists.

#### SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

#### PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (233) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.0% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (233-of-259 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

#### 2018: Another Ravens Return Man Scores Big

• In Week 12's win over Oakland, Baltimore native **CB/RS Cyrus Jones** posted a 70-yard punt return TD in the second quarter, marking the Ravens' first PR-TD since 10/15/17, when Michael Campanaro had a 77-yarder vs. Chicago. Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: Campanaro, Kaelin Clay, Tandon Doss, C. Jones, Jacoby Jones and Lardarius Webb.

#### RAVENS' BIG RETURNS IN JONES' MAGICAL SEASON

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

### BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's third-most blocked kicks (13, tied), including an NFL-high (tied) 4 in 2016.


### DON "WINK" MARTINDALE & DEFENSIVE NOTES

### "WINK" LEADS THE DEFENSE

On Jan. 9, 2018, the Ravens promoted **Don "Wink" Martindale** to defensive coordinator following the retirement of Dean Pees. Martindale, 54, is in his seventh year with the Ravens after serving as LBs coach from 2016-17 and ILBs coach from 2012-15. Under his guidance, **LB C.J. Mosley** has become one of the league's top defenders, earning three Pro Bowls.

The 2018 campaign marks Martindale's 14th season coaching in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he served as the Broncos' defensive coordinator.

"Don has done a great job," **John Harbaugh** stated in November. "He has certain skills and gifts as a coach that are unique to him and are really strong. It's a team effort, too. We have a great staff. All those guys have done a great job, and our players are involved. We have the right kind of culture. I'm proud of all those guys. We have a bunch of young coaches who are really smart guys. Don does a great job of bringing them all in to it and including them."

### MARTY MANS THE OFFENSE

Marty Mornhinweg was elevated to offensive coordinator on Oct. 10, 2016. A 24-year NFL coaching veteran, Mornhinweg, who joined Baltimore as QBs coach in 2015, is a former head coach of the Lions (2001-02). He has also served as offensive coordinator for the New York Jets (2013-14), Philadelphia Eagles (2004-12) and San Francisco 49ers (1997-2000).

#### FIVE PRO BOWLERS

• Throughout his NFL coaching career, five quarterbacks have earned Pro Bowl honors under Mornhinweg's direction: Michael Vick, Donovan McNabb, Steve Young, Jeff Garcia and Brett Favre.





### MARTY'S NFL COORDINATOR ROLES

#### 1997-2000: 49ers - Offensive Coordinator/QBs Coach

- During this span, SF offense ranked third in total net yards (364.6 ypg), including third in rushing (131.4 ypg) and fifth in passing (233.2 ypg).

### **ASSISTANT COACHES**

#### **JERRY ROSBURG**

#### SPECIAL TEAMS COORD. / ASSOC. HEAD COACH

In his 40th season coaching, Rosburg has guided an exceptional special teams group over his 10 years (2008-17) with the Ravens. Specifically in the past six full seasons (2012-17), the Ravens' ST units have consistently been acknowledged as one of the league's best. In the annual special teams report from senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin, Baltimore has ranked in the NFL's Top 5 for six-straight seasons (and is the only team to do so).

### DON MARTINDALE DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

"Wink" was promoted to "D" coordinator on Jan. 9, 2018 after six years working with Baltimore's LBs. Originally joining the Ravens in 2012, during the past six seasons, Martindale has guided and helped grow a number of standout linebackers, most notably ILB C.J. Mosley. Martindale was the Broncos' "D" coordinator in 2010, and in 2009, coached all four LBs in the 3-4 scheme.

### MARTY MORNHINWEG OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Mornhinweg is in his third year as offensive coordinator, originally assuming the role in Week 6 of 2016. A 34-year coaching veteran and former NFL head coach (Lions), he has an extensive background coordinating offenses and tutoring QBs. Throughout his NFL career, five QBs have earned Pro Bowl honors under his direction: Michael Vick, Donovan McNabb, Jeff Garcia, Steve Young and Brett Favre.

#### **GREG ROMAN**

### ASSISTANT HEAD COACH / TIGHT ENDS COACH

Roman is in his second stint with the Ravens, re-joining the team in 2017. In the latter part of '17, Baltimore's offense made big strides, and following the season, he was promoted to assistant head coach/TEs coach. Since his first term in Baltimore (2006-07), he has been a successful NFL offensive coordinator both in San Francisco and Buffalo.

### RICHARD ANGULO ASSISTANT OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

Angulo is in his fifth year with the Ravens and his second as the team's assistant offensive line coach. In 2017, he helped coach an offensive line that allowed the league's seventh-fewest sacks (27, tied with Minnesota). From 2015-16, he served as Baltimore's tight ends coach after being promoted from his original position of offensive coaching intern (2014).

### ANDY BISCHOFF

### OFFENSIVE ASSISTANT / TIGHT ENDS

Bischoff is in his fourth year with the Ravens and continues his work with the TEs, while aiding "O" coordinator Marty Mornhinweg and assistant head coach Greg Roman, who also coaches the TEs.

### RANDY BROWN SPECIALISTS COACH

Brown works directly with the kicking group – K Justin Tucker, P Sam Koch (holder) and LS Morgan Cox – and has coached five Pro Bowlers in Baltimore: Koch (2015), Cox (2015 & 2016), Tucker (2013 & 2016), K Billy Cundiff (2010) and K Matt Stover (last kicked for Ravens in 2008).

### JOE CULLEN

#### **DEFENSIVE LINE COACH**

Cullen enters his third year as the Ravens' defensive line coach. He originally joined the team in 2016 following two seasons with the Buccaneers in the same role. A D-line specialist, he has 29 years of experience, including 11 in the NFL with five teams (Bal., TB, Cle., Jax. and Det.).

### JOE D'ALESSANDRIS OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

Pronounced *dell-ah-SAN-dress*, he is a 40-year coaching veteran who enters his second season as Baltimore's O-line coach. "Joe D" has extensive experience guiding and developing linemen, both in the collegiate ranks and pros. Since transitioning to the NFL in 2008, he's mentored players for the Chiefs, Bills, Chargers and Ravens.

### BOBBY ENGRAM WIDE RECEIVERS COACH

Engram, who enjoyed a 14-year NFL playing career, is in his fifth season as the Ravens' WRs coach. In his third year (2016) guiding Baltimore's receivers, his group helped record the second-most net passing yards in team history (4,100), including a franchise-best 4,317 by QB Joe Flacco.

### THOMAS HAMMOCK RUNNING BACKS COACH

Hammock is in his fifth year as the Ravens' RBs coach. In 2017, he helped guide RB Alex Collins to a breakout season, when the back tallied 973 rushing yards and 1,160 yards from scrimmage. Prior to joining the Ravens, he spent 11 years on the collegiate circuit, including three (2011-13) as Wisconsin's assistant HC/RBs/recruiting coordinator.

### CHRIS HEWITT SECONDARY COACH

Hewitt enters his second season as the secondary coach after being promoted prior to the 2017 campaign. He previously served as the team's DBs coach from 2015-16 and the assistant secondary coach in 2014. In his seventh-overall year in Baltimore, he also spent two years (2012-13) helping guide the special teams unit led by Jerry Rosburg.

### CHRIS HORTON ASSISTANT SPECIAL TEAMS COACH

Horton is in his third year as the Ravens' assistant special teams coach, working directly with Jerry Rosburg. Horton has helped Baltimore's special teams units

perform outstandingly in the three years he's been involved. In the annual special teams report from senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin, Baltimore has ranked in the NFL's Top 5 for six-straight seasons.

### STERLING LUCAS QUALITY CONTROL - DEFENSE

Lucas is in his third year with the Ravens after being promoted to a defensive quality control coach in January 2018, with responsibilities that include finding tips/tendencies on opponent offenses, self-scouting and working with the LBs.

### MIKE MACDONALD LINEBACKERS COACH

Macdonald is in his first season as the team's LBs coach. In his fifth year with the Ravens, he previously spent time as the defensive backs coach (2017) and as a defensive assistant (2015-16). He originally joined Baltimore in 2014 as a coaching intern.

### JAMES URBAN QUARTERBACKS COACH

Urban joined the Ravens in 2018. A 15-year NFL coaching veteran, he spent the past seven seasons with AFC North rival Cincinnati, coaching the WRs. He entered the NFL with the Eagles in 2004. After five seasons in two roles under Andy Reid, he was promoted to QBs coach his final two years (2009-10), coaching Pro Bowlers Donovan McNabb (2009) and Michael Vick (2010).

### CRAIG VER STEEG SENIOR OFFENSIVE ASSISTANT

Pronounced *ver-STEGG*, he is in his 11th year working with the Ravens. Ver Steeg, who owns 35 years of coaching experience, has an extensive background working with QBs, WRs and RBs. As one of John Harbaugh's original coaching hires (2008), he has assisted in game preparation, game and practice analysis and guiding players.

### **MATT WEISS**

#### FOOTBALL STRATEGY COORD. / WRS


Weiss is in his 10th season with the Ravens after assisting with the QBs from 2016-17. Prior to joining the offense, he coached on defense in a variety of roles, including CBs, assistant LBs and quality control. In addition to his coaching duties, he's responsible for leading coaching staff analytics, advising John Harbaugh on game management and scripting situational practice periods.

#### **DREW WILKINS**

#### **ASST. DEFENSIVE LINE / OLBS**

Wilkins originally joined the Ravens in 2010 and was promoted to assistant D-line/OLBs coach in 2018. Wilkins, who spent three seasons (2014-16) as a defensive assistant, was responsible for weekly production of the defensive playbook, scouting reports, film breakdown and assisting with the development of the D-line in practice.



### JACKSON'S STARTING DEBUT

**QB Lamar Jackson** made his first-career start in Week 11 vs. Cincy, boosting the Ravens to a 24-21 victory. Here are several notable feats by the first-round draft pick (32nd overall) from the game:

- Jackson completed 13 of 19 passes for 150 yards and 1 INT, adding 119 rushing yards on 26 carries.
- It marked the first time in NFL history that a team had a rookie QB and RB (Gus Edwards, 115) each surpass 100 rushing yards.
- Jackson's 119 rushing yards are the third most by a rookie QB since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, with only **QB Robert Griffin III** (138 on 10/14/12 with Washington) and Josh Allen (135 on 12/2/18 for Buffalo) having more.
- The 119 stand as the most rushing yards by a QB in a starting debut, while his 26 attempts are the most by a QB in the modern NFL era.

In Week 12's 34-17 win vs. Oakland, rookie **RB Gus Edwards** rushed for over 100 yards for the second-straight game, finishing with 118 on 23 carries (5.1 average). With that performance...

- Edwards became the second rookie in Ravens history with back-to-back 100-yard games (Jamal Lewis, 2000, Weeks 12-13).
- Edwards became the sixth undrafted rookie in the NFL's common draft era to produce 100-plus rushing yards in consecutive games. He joined Branden Oliver (2014), LeGarrette Blount (2010), Dominic Rhodes (2001), Fred Lane (1997) and Clark Gaines (1976) in accomplishing the feat.

Despite not playing until Week 6 this season, Gus Edwards (642) ranks fifth in the NFL in rushing yards by a rookie.

#### KING CRAB NOTES

**WR Michael Crabtree**, a 10-year NFL veteran, signed with the Ravens as a free agent this past spring. Through 15 games, he has tallied 52 catches for 587 yards and 3 TDs. Here are several fast facts about the standout wideout:

- Crabtree has produced at least 8 receiving TDs in a season four times, including in each of the past three years (9 – 2015, 8 – 2016 & 8 – 2017).
- His 28 receiving TDs since 2015 (see chart above) tie (A.J. Green) for the NFL's sixth most.
- Crabtree and Steelers WR Antonio Brown are the only NFL players to post at least 8 TD catches in each of the past three full seasons.
- Crabtree has totaled at least 85 catches in a season three times, with a career-high 89 during the 2016 campaign (earned Pro Bowl alternate honors).

#### ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

### 2016: PERHAPS THE BEST YEAR EVER

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)



### JOHN HARBAUGH MONDAY PRESS CONFERENCE: WEEK 17 VS. BROWNS

Opening statement: "OK, good to see you guys here – appreciate everybody being here. We're looking forward to the next challenge. [We] had the day yesterday. I got in – coaches were working, a number of players were working. We had a number of players get off the plane with a couple of coaches, myself included, who got off the plane and got a workout in right away. So, you're kind of fired up when you see 10 guys in training off the plane. So, that was good. And then, we'll be in today working. This will be like a Tuesday day for us in terms of our preparation with our guys. We'll start at 12:15 with special teams, work our way through the afternoon as if it were a Tuesday, and then the guys – the players and the coaches – will have tomorrow off, which is a big day. Merry Christmas! And then we'll be back at it Wednesday with our normal routine."

Your team was really prepared and emotionally up for that game Saturday night. How big of a challenge is it in the NFL to have a team emotionally up two weeks in a row at that level? (Stan Charles) "I think we've done that. I think we've been doing that pretty regularly. I don't think we've not been emotionally up really all year, so we've played better in different games, but our guys have been great about that. I appreciate that about them. They get themselves ready to play and peak at the right time."

From the get-go, you talked about the importance for winning the division and then perhaps getting a home playoff game. To be on the cusp of that, do you feel that, realizing nothing is done, that you have your goal within reach right here? (David Ginsburg) "Absolutely. That's the first goal. It's not the top goal, but it's definitely the first goal — we set it every year — is to win the division, to be division champions, and we're playing a championship game on Sunday. That's what you work for. That's what we put all that time in for, and in order to do that, we've had to weather some storms and overcome some challenges and win some games, and guys have done a great job. We appreciate where we're at. This is the opportunity that we wanted, and now it's ours to go get."

The way things played out yesterday, you have to be pleased. What will be your message to the team? Does that change in any way, because now, all you [have to do] – it's pretty simple – win and you're in? (Jerry Coleman) "As I just said, I think the answer is exactly what we just talked about. It's our opportunity that we've been working hard for, and that's our goal."

Will you mention anything about the past, or is the past the past? You have a lot of players on the team that experienced last year being in a similar situation. Will that be reminded? (Jerry Coleman) "We all know where we've been. We don't need to talk about anything. We all know. We've all learned from all of our past experiences this year, last year, previous years, all those things, the guys who have been here. The guys who weren't here, they're not going to understand it anyway until they experience it. The guys who were here, that drives us, certainly. It's an experience that, like any experience, you want to learn from those experiences. And, when you have a gut-wrenching experience, a tough one like we had the last two years, you take those with you, and it makes you stronger. It forges you as a person, as a competitor, so that's what I expect."

What can you say about the way QB Lamar Jackson has handled all of this? This has been a playoff push for weeks now, and he's really shown poise for a rookie. (David Ginsburg) "He has. He's done very well. He's a very poised player. He makes plays. He expects to make plays. He's not afraid to go for it, so to speak, and that's how we want all of our guys. We want all of our guys to think that way. I think all the work you put in, everything — you stand on everything that you've done before, everything you've experienced, like Jerry [Coleman, reporter] is talking about — you stand on all that stuff, and you apply it to the next game. I think Lamar is a quick learner. All of our guys are smart players, and we appreciate that about them."

OLB Terrell Suggs is going to be completing his 16<sup>th</sup> year for this franchise. What has he meant? Most of his years have been with you. What has he meant to this franchise? (Jamison Hensley) "I don't know if I could sum it up here in a sentence. I'm not thinking about what Terrell Suggs means to the franchise right now; we're thinking about playing this game. And, I'm quite sure that if you asked him, he would say the exact same thing. So, why don't we just leave it at that? I think we all know what Terrell Suggs means to the franchise, and I really appreciate him as a player, and a person, and a leader. I love being around him every single day – couldn't be around a better guy, a better football man. And, that's what we're here for, so that's what we're focusing on."



How has QB Baker Mayfield grown since the last time you played the Browns? (Jordan Schatz) "He's grown. He's a good player. I don't compare; who cares how much he's grown since the last time we played him? It's not our job to determine that or to measure that. Our job is to compete against him and try to stop him – him and the whole team, and that's the challenge. Their offense revolves around the quarterback, Baker Mayfield. He's playing very well. He is who he is. He runs his style. I think they do a good job of recognizing what his strengths are, and they play to them. I'm sure he's more experienced than he was last time, or whatever. But, he's going to extend plays. He's going to keep his eyes downfield. He's going to run when he has to. He's going to change things at the line when he needs to; he's going to try to make plays. He's going to push the ball downfield. He's an accurate passer. He's certainly not afraid to push the ball in there, and they're almost like a touchdown check-down kind of team. They throw shots all the time – in the pocket, out of the pocket – they'll drop screens down to everybody. They have tremendous – I think they have playmakers out there. They have good backs that can line up as wide receivers, so they throw a lot of slants. They have an offense that's designed for what [Mayfield] does well, and they run it very well."

Big picture, are you happier to play a team that's still really playing hard at this point in the season, rather than, say, a 3-12 team? (Stan Charles) "I haven't even thought about that. I wouldn't even have that answer. We're playing the Browns this week, and they're very good. It's going to be a hotly-contested rivalry game at the end of the year. We've been in these before, as you know, and that's our challenge."

I know most of yesterday was probably preparation for the Browns. How much were you able to watch the Steelers vs. Saints game, though? (Jamison Hensley) "I watched most of that game, yes." (Reporter: "Were you quite pleased towards the end of the game?") "I don't root. We just see what the... Whatever is going to happen is going to happen. If you get all emotionally caught up in all those kinds of things, they drive you crazy. I don't know how people even watch these games in this league. (laughter) It's just too crazy."

Now that you're a couple days removed from it, have you reflected on what the teams' announcement Friday that you'd be back next season has meant to you? (Aaron Kasinitz) "No, I haven't."

Do you think it's a non-story? Because, the team announced it on a Friday night right before your biggest game of the year, and it was a big deal to a lot of people. (Jerry Coleman) "I think it's a non-story. I think it's just... We're just trying to win football games. We've kept it simple, kept it about football. Everybody is on a one-year deal. You're on a one-week deal, as far as I'm concerned, in this league, players and coaches. That's how we are. We get that. Players and coaches understand that. We don't think too much about all of that. You try to go out and do your best the very next game, have the best day you can have, and that's how we look at it. So, all that stuff is really not something that you dwell on or think about. There are a few other things to think about."

There was talk that a comedian broke the news to the players. Was it part of a joke, or were they taking it seriously? (*Jerry Coleman*) "It was part of his act. I mean, he just threw it into his act there. It was very funny how he did it. I wouldn't want to risk embarrassing myself up here explaining how he did it. I don't have that kind of talent, but it was great. We had a guy who was great – he's kind of become a friend. He was just really funny with all the guys – did a great job. He threw it in there and everybody got a big kick out of it – to my expense and Steve's [Bisciotti] expense, so that was OK."

Do you have a message to the fans? This is the first game in a long time the fans are really looking forward to a game and pack the place and be like the old days four or five years ago. (Stan Charles) "I love our fans. I'm looking forward to it. I look forward to it every time we get to M&T Bank Stadium – I can't wait. You drive up to that place, it's beautiful, you see the people out there tailgating and excited. I've never seen a fan in there who's not excited for the game. Every time we go in there, the fans there are loud, they're into it, they're having fun, they're laughing, they yell at us – and most of the time it's really positive what they say. Our fans are like that. It's a little different than other stadiums that way. They don't get too negative. They want to see us do well – that's what I love about our fans. Yes, I'm looking forward to it. I can't wait."

After the game, S Eric Weddle said the Ravens are a team that no team really wants to face. Is this a formula that really – since it's so unique – might give other teams problems? It has: strong defense, running game, which is pretty much anti-NFL right now. (David Ginsburg) "Well, you hope so. I mean, any time you put something together you hope it's going to be tough



on your opponent. That's the whole idea is to impose your will upon your opponent however you can do it based on what your personnel is, and how you want to play and what your fundamental beliefs are. In Baltimore, our coaching staff, our players, our whole organization ... You look at [general manager and executive vice president] Ozzie [Newsome] – I think we all have a certain vision for how we like to play the game. And that is also built around the players' talents and their gifts. You have to be able to adapt your strategy to your players. Those are the guys who out there playing the game and making the plays. So, we've tried to do that, but still built around our core beliefs and principles about how the game should be played and won – how you win games. That's what we're trying to do – I think you see it. It's pretty clear what we're trying to do and just kind of roll with that and see what happens."

I think there's a stat that QB Lamar Jackson has the second-best passer rating in the league when trailing. What do you attribute that success to? (Aaron Kasinitz) "That's a great stat, man! I don't know, because I don't care, and I haven't thought about it. It's really irrelevant to us, but it's great for you guys to look at and study. I love that. I will be looking forward to reading about it, too — what you think — because it'll be interesting. But, seriously, it just doesn't matter to us. I don't mean to downplay it, because it probably says that, 'Hey, Lamar can bring you back and makes plays just like the other guys do.' But I look at it from a team aspect. I mean it's him, but it's the other guys [too]. I'm sure guys are making catches, and we're making runs. It's team football. We're a team."

You guys have been practicing since July. How impressive is it for your defense to be able to fly around like that so late in the season, and keep the momentum going even though they've practiced probably longer than any team in the NFL? (Todd Karpovich) "That's a great point. I'm glad you brought it up. It's very impressive, and it's a credit to the players, to the strength coaches, to the coaches and to everything. But it's mainly a credit to the players. Our guys have worked very hard. Our guys get in that weight room, our guys get out in practice, they run around ... We practice. They run around and practice hard, and I think we have a lot of calluses built up. I think we're in great shape, and that shows up in December."

Along those same lines, how important was the tackling on Saturday? The Chargers have a lot of quick players. Do you think that was a key factor in the end, especially on defense with your ability to get people down in the open-field? (*Jeff Zrebiec*) "Right, absolutely. That's been really important all the way through here: The fact that we're running to the ball and we're able to play physical, we're able to get off blocks. But I think the effort that our players play with is at a very, very high level. They deserve a lot of credit for that."

TE Mark Andrews seems like he's been consistent from start to finish this year. Your young players seem to not be hitting the so-called "rookie wall." Would you agree with that and what would you attribute that to? (Cliff Brown) "[No], because the rookie wall is a phantom. It's a mirage. It's a figment of your imagination or whoever thinks there is a rookie wall. The only walls in life are the ones we build ourselves. If there's a wall, we're climbing over it or getting around it, whatever. There's no wall. You have a day. You get a good 10-hour sleep, you're fresh and ready to go the next day. For an athlete – you need at least eight hours for a normal person – an athlete needs 10 hours of sleep: Get in bed, get ready to go and have a great day. Let's go. That's true for a rookie or a veteran. What difference does it make? That's my theory; I'm sticking with it." (laughter) (Reporter: "How many hours of sleep do you get?") (laughter) "Enough, I guess. Plenty, plenty! Good! We're doing good. I get lots of sleep. Our staff does a great job. It's a team effort, man."

Back in September you said you were happy to see WR Breshad Perriman get a fresh start. I guess to see him catch on in Cleveland and really produce these past couple weeks, how much have you seen of that and what have you seen from him? (Jonas Shaffer) "That's a very good observation. Breshad's playing very well. He's made numerous big plays, he's playing fast, doing a great job. He's going to be a factor that we have to contend with for sure with our defense. He's bringing what you always expected him to be able to bring to the table. He's found that there in the last few weeks, and they've done a good job with him."
