JUST THE FACTS

- The Baltimore Ravens (4-2) travel to face the surging Seattle Seahawks (5-1), who are riding a three-game winning streak. Winners of two-straight games, the Ravens currently stand atop the AFC North standings, while Seattle is second in the NFC West behind the 5-0 49ers. Baltimore boasts the NFL's No. 1 offense (450.7), while Seattle's attack stands No. 5 (399.0), entering Week 7.
- Seattle leads the all-time series with Baltimore, 3-2, most recently winning 35-6 in Charm City during the 2015 campaign. The Ravens have never won in Seattle (0-2) and are looking to snap an overall three-game losing streak to the Seahawks.
- In last Sunday's 23-17 victory over Cincinnati, QB Lamar Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. Baltimore racked up 497 total yards, including a season-high 269 rushing (sixth most in franchise history). Jackson and RB Mark Ingram II each rushed for TDs (Ingram II leads Baltimore with 7 ground scores this season), while K Justin Tucker was 3-for-3 on FGAs, becoming the fastest kicker in league history to reach the 1,000-point milestone (118 games). Baltimore limited the Bengals to just 250 yards, also winning the time of possession battle, 39:42 to 20:18.
- Under Coach Harbaugh, Baltimore owns the NFL's fifth-most total wins (118) since his 2008 Charm City arrival. The Ravens have appeared in three AFC title games (2008, 2011 & 2012) with "Harbs" at the helm, and in 2012, won Super Bowl XLVII.

COACH HARBAUGH SAYS

JOHN HARBAUGH ON IF THE 2019 RUN GAME IS MORE ADVANCED THAN 2018'S:

"Absolutely. Our run game is at a high, high level, schematically. There are a lot of things that [make it] tough to defend. [Opponents] have to make some choices, and you have to be on point with your reads. You probably have to dominate the interior of the offensive line [to successfully defend it]. Our interior guys are not allowing that to happen right now. Our guys are actually winning most of those battles. There are a lot more elements to our run game right now."

INJURY UPDATE

Starters WR Marquise Brown (ankle) and ILB Patrick Onwuasor (ankle) missed Sunday's game vs. Cincinnati, as did CB Jimmy Smith (knee), who has not played since Week 1. S DeShon Elliott (knee) left the Bengals game and has been placed on Injured Reserve. Starting SS Tony Jefferson (knee injury in Week 5) and slot CB Tavon Young (neck injury in training camp) will miss the rest of the season on IR.

NOTE THE QUOTE

DLB MATTHEW JUDD ON QB LAMAR JACKSON:

"He picks us up in critical times and keeps getting first downs. It's hard [for opponents]. It's hard, man. You can't cover everybody and keep a spy on him at all times. I'm just so glad — I've been saying this since we got him — I'm glad I don't have to face him."

NUMBERS TO RAVE ABOUT

1 – Player (QB Lamar Jackson) ever to post at least 200 passing yards and 150 rushing yards in a regular season game. Jackson tallied 236 passing and 152 rushing yards in last Sunday's 23-17 win vs. Cincinnati.

3 – NFL ranking in *both* receptions (34) and receiving yards (410) by all tight ends for Ravens TE Mark Andrews.

9 – TE Mark Andrews' receptions of 20-plus yards, ranking as the NFL's most among 2019 tight ends.

28 – INTs recorded by S Earl Thomas III during his nine seasons with Seattle (2010-18). In 2019 with the Ravens, Thomas III has posted 1 INT, 19 tackles and 2 PD.

37-9 – The Ravens' record under John Harbaugh (since 2008) when rushing for at least 150 yards. Baltimore is 9-3 when rushing for at least 150 dating back to 2018.

55.0 – Rushing yards allowed per game by Baltimore in its past two contests (2-0 record), tying Houston for the NFL's fourth-best mark.

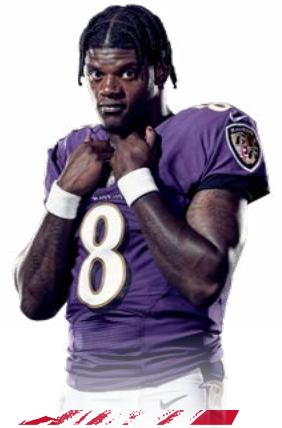

NOTE OF THE WEEK I

Since making his first regular season start in Week 11 of 2018 (11/18), QB Lamar Jackson has led the Ravens to a 10-3 record. During this span, here's where Baltimore ranks in several key offensive categories:



- ✗ Baltimore is second in total yards per game (415.7), only behind Kansas City's 425.9.
- ✗ The Ravens have rushed for 218.2 yards per game, by far the NFL's best average. (Seattle is second at 151.8.)
- ✗ Baltimore stands fourth in third-down conversion percentage, posting a 46.3 success mark.
- ✗ The Ravens have scored 27.7 points per game, ranking fifth best in the NFL.
- ✗ Baltimore has scored 17 rushing TDs, second only to the Rams' 18.
- ✗ Jackson has produced 1,016 rushing yards, ranking sixth best among all NFL rushers. Among QBs, he stands first, with Josh Allen (634) in second place.

NOTE OF THE WEEK II

Baltimore leads the NFL in average TOP per game (includes OT), with a 36:29 mark. (Seattle is fourth with 32:18.) The Ravens have also produced an NFL-high 14 drives that have lasted at least 5 minutes, with 6 of those resulting in TDs (tied for an NFL high). Baltimore has scored 12 times on its 14 5-plus-minute drives.

Franchise Connections

- Ravens **S Earl Thomas III** was selected by Seattle in the first round (14th overall) of the 2010 NFL Draft and played nine seasons (2010-18) with the club. During his time with the Seahawks, he totaled 637 tackles, 28 INTs, 67 PD, 10 FFs and 5 FRs. He also earned six Pro Bowl nods (2011-15, 2017) and *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro honors three times (2012-14). Thomas played in two Super Bowls with the Seahawks (2013 & 2014 seasons), helping Seattle capture the Super Bowl XLVIII title.
- Baltimore **ILB L.J. Fort** spent time on the Seahawks' practice squad in 2014.
- Ravens special teams coach **Chris Horton** received his first NFL coaching experience as a coaching intern for Seattle during training camp in 2013.
- Baltimore tight ends coach **Bobby Engram** played eight seasons (2001-08) for the Seahawks, totaling 399 receptions for 4,859 yards and 18 TDs. He set a career high with 94 receptions in 2007, a Seattle single-season record (tied, Doug Baldwin, 2016) and was voted as the Seahawks' recipient of the Ed Block Courage Award in 2005. Engram also played in nine postseason contests, including Super Bowl XL (2005) with Seattle.
- Seahawks **TE Ed Dickson** was drafted by the Ravens in the third round of the 2010 NFL Draft and played four seasons (2010-13) in Baltimore, totaling 111 receptions for 1,178 yards and 7 TDs. He also saw action in eight postseason games, including Super Bowl XLVII, where he posted two catches for 37 yards.

- Seattle **DT Quinton Jefferson** played collegiately for the University of Maryland from 2012-15, recording 84 tackles and 10.5 sacks in 37 games played (28 starts).

SEATTLE 35, RAVENS 6

M&T Bank Stadium • Dec. 13, 2015 • Week 14

Seattle QB Russell Wilson matched a career-high 5 touchdown passes, guiding the visiting Seahawks to an impressive 35-6 victory over the Ravens at M&T Bank Stadium. Wilson threw 3 touchdowns to WR Doug Baldwin in the Seahawks' fourth-consecutive win and their sixth in their last seven games. For the first time in this difficult season, the Ravens did not have the game decided in the final series. (Baltimore had set an NFL record for having its first 12 contests decided by eight or fewer points.) The injury-depleted Ravens started their third quarterback of the season with QB Jimmy Clausen subbing for QB Matt Schaub, who had replaced starter QB Joe Flacco, who was lost for the season after suffering a knee injury on Nov. 22. The Ravens struggled against the NFL's No. 2-ranked Seahawks defense, held without a TD for the first time since 12/16/13 (an 18-16 triumph over the Lions). Clausen was 23-of-40 for 274 yards with 1 INT. The Ravens managed just 28 rushing yards on 14 carries. Two of Seattle's TDs came after Baltimore turnovers, the first coming with 38 seconds left in the first half when RB Javorius Allen fumbled at the Ravens' 14-yard line. The second followed the Clausen INT by CB Richard Sherman in the fourth quarter. Wilson finished 23-of-32 for 292 yards, including 6 each to WR Tyler Lockett (104 yards) and Baldwin (82). Ravens WR Kamar Aiken caught 5 passes for 90 yards, while WR Jeremy Butler grabbed 7 for 72.

LAST WEEK VS. CINCINNATI

RAVENS 23, BENGALS 17

M&T Bank Stadium • Oct. 13, 2019 • Week 6

QB Lamar Jackson became the first player ever to throw for over 200 yards (236) and rush for over 150 (152) in a regular season game when he guided the Ravens to a 23-17 victory over the Bengals at M&T Bank Stadium last Sunday. Jackson rushed for a career high and scored a touchdown (21 yards) in the important divisional win. The Bengals leaped to a 7-0 lead on the game's opening kickoff



when S Brandon Wilson raced 92 yards for the TD. That was Cincinnati's only TD until QB Andy Dalton scrambled 2 yards for a score with 1:28 left in the contest. After the opening kickoff TD, the Ravens dominated the remainder of the first quarter, compiling a 212 to 6 edge in yardage and 11-0 in first downs. Baltimore scored on each of its first two possessions, initially the 21-yard Jackson sweep and the other on a 1-yard RB Mark Ingram II blast for a 14-7 advantage. The teams exchanged field goals in the second quarter (K Justin Tucker from 40 and Bengals K Randy Bullock, 22 yards) to make the score 17-10 at the half. A pair of Tucker FGs – 49 in the third quarter and 21 yards in the fourth – gave the Ravens a 23-10 lead until the Bengals' penalty-aided (3 called against Baltimore) final scoring drive. The Ravens produced 497 yards of offense, 269 on the ground (a season high), and 228 through the air. The host team totally dominated time of possession: 39:42 for the Ravens and 20:18 for the Bengals. Jackson completed 6 passes to TE Mark Andrews, who led all receivers in the game with 99 yards. Ingram II added 52 rushing yards on 13 carries. Dalton finished 21-of-39 for 235 yards, including 5 for 91 to WR Auden Tate. The Bengals were held to 33 rushing yards on 14 tries (2.4 per attempt.) Tucker became the fastest kicker in NFL history (118 games) to score 1,000 career points. The previous record was held by New England's Stephen Gostkowski (119 games).

RAVENS RADIO BROADCASTS

- The Ravens' 2019 radio team features Gerry Sandusky and former Ravens OLB Jarret Johnson. Sandusky, WBAL-TV 11's sports director, delivers the play-by-play for the broadcast team, while Johnson serves as a color analyst.
- Ravens games can be heard on 98Rock (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM/101.5 FM, baltimoreravens.com, in the Ravens mobile app (when fans are in Baltimore) and on 26 regional affiliates. The network broadcast spans four states – Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware & Kentucky – and Washington, D.C.
- Additionally, Ravens games can be heard in Spanish on WDCN La Nueva 87.7 FM in the D.C. area. Games are called by David Andrade and Gustavo Salazar, with Ximena Lugo as producer.

PLAYOFF PERFORMERS



In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in seven (2008-12, 2014 & 2018) of his 11 full seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of only six teams (NE – 10; GB – 8; Bal., Ind., Pit. & Sea. – 7) to earn at least seven postseason berths in the last 11 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in six of those seven playoff campaigns.)
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 16.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the fourth-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 11 seasons all time. (See chart at left.)
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- Of coaches to make the playoffs in at least seven of their first 11 years, "Harbs" is one of four active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll - 8, Andy Reid - 8 & Mike Tomlin - 8).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

RAVENS SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

HORTON INHERITS A RICH HISTORY

Following the 2019 retirement of longtime ST coordinator Jerry Rosburg, Chris Horton took over as the Ravens' special teams coach. Horton served as Rosburg's assistant coach for the past three seasons and now leads Baltimore's standout ST battery.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (250) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.6% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (250-of-276 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

2018: ANOTHER RAVENS RETURN MAN SCORES BIG

• In Week 12's win vs. Oakland, Baltimore native CB/RS Cyrus Jones posted a 70-yard punt return TD, marking the Ravens' first PR-TD since 10/15/17, when Michael Campanaro had a 77-yarder vs. Chicago. Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: Campanaro, Kaelin Clay, Tandon Doss, C. Jones, Jacoby Jones and Lardarius Webb.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS IN JONES' MAGICAL SEASON

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

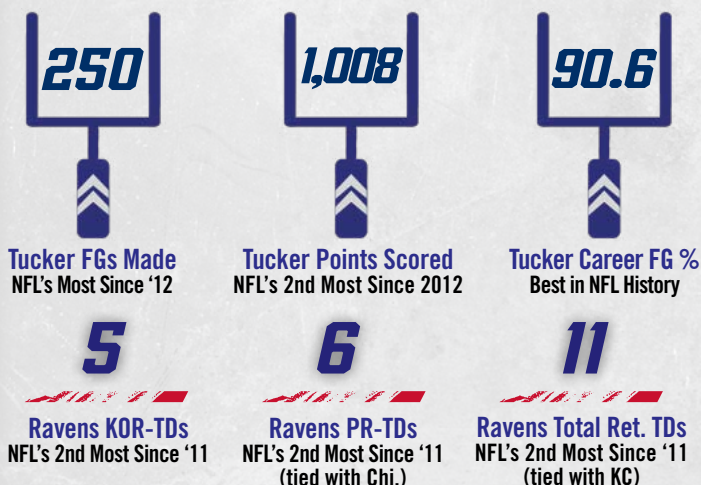

ROMAN ELEVATED TO O.C.

Following the 2018 season, the Ravens named Greg Roman their offensive coordinator. Roman is a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent 2018 as the team's assistant head coach/TEs coach. He re-joined the Ravens in 2017 as a senior offensive assistant/TEs coach after his first stint with the team as an assistant O-line coach from 2006-07.

Previously, Roman was a successful "O" coordinator with the Buffalo Bills (2015-16) and San Francisco 49ers (2011-14). With each team, Roman worked with QBs who totaled their highest single-season passer ratings under his guidance: Tyrod Taylor (Bills – 99.4 in 2015), Colin Kaepernick (49ers – 98.3 in 2012) and Alex Smith (49ers – 104.1 in 2012).

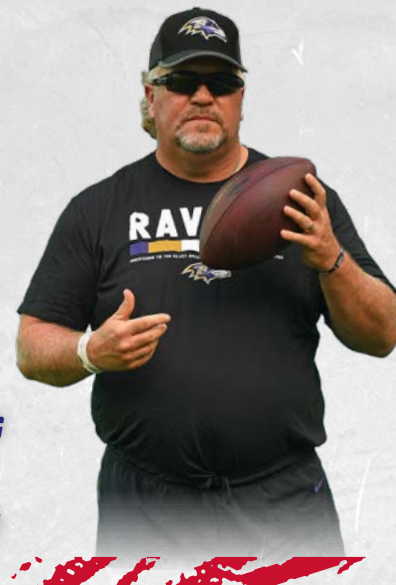

In his first year (2018) as Baltimore's D.C., Don "Wink" Martindale led the Ravens' unit to a No. 1-overall ranking, allowing an NFL-best 292.9 yards per game. Baltimore also permitted the league's second-fewest points per game (17.9), just behind Chicago's 17.7. For his coaching efforts, Martindale was recognized by *SI/MMQB* as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the *AP* NFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award.

The 2019 campaign marks Martindale's 15th season in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he was Denver's D.C.

In 2018's Week 6 win at the Titans, Baltimore racked up a franchise-best 11 sacks, tying for the second most by a team in league history. They also stand as the most in an NFL game since 2012 (SD, 11).

EVP & GM ERIC DECOSTA

Eric DeCosta's loyalty, love and pride for the Baltimore Ravens are unmatched. A pillar of the organization's well laid foundation, DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019.

Prior to being named executive vice president and general manager this past January – succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome – DeCosta, 48, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore. Simply put, Eric's respect for – and thorough understanding of – the Ravens' culture aligned perfectly with his pursuit of a dream job.

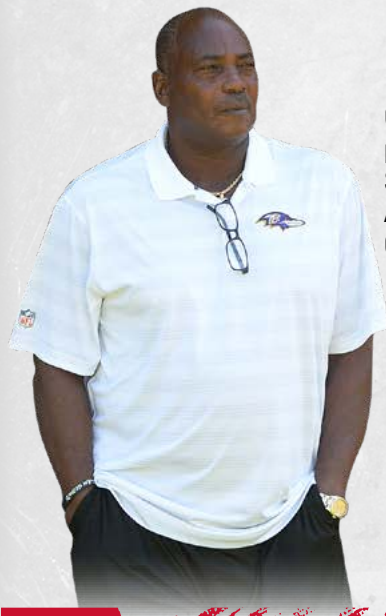

THE WIZARDRY OF OZ

Known throughout all of sports as a premier leader, Newsome is a Hall of Fame player, the architect of Baltimore's 2000 and 2012 Super Bowl championship teams and an elite evaluator who became the NFL's first African American GM. In 2019, his longtime top lieutenant, Eric DeCosta, took over as the Ravens' EVP & GM. However, Newsome maintains a significant role within the organization as its executive VP.

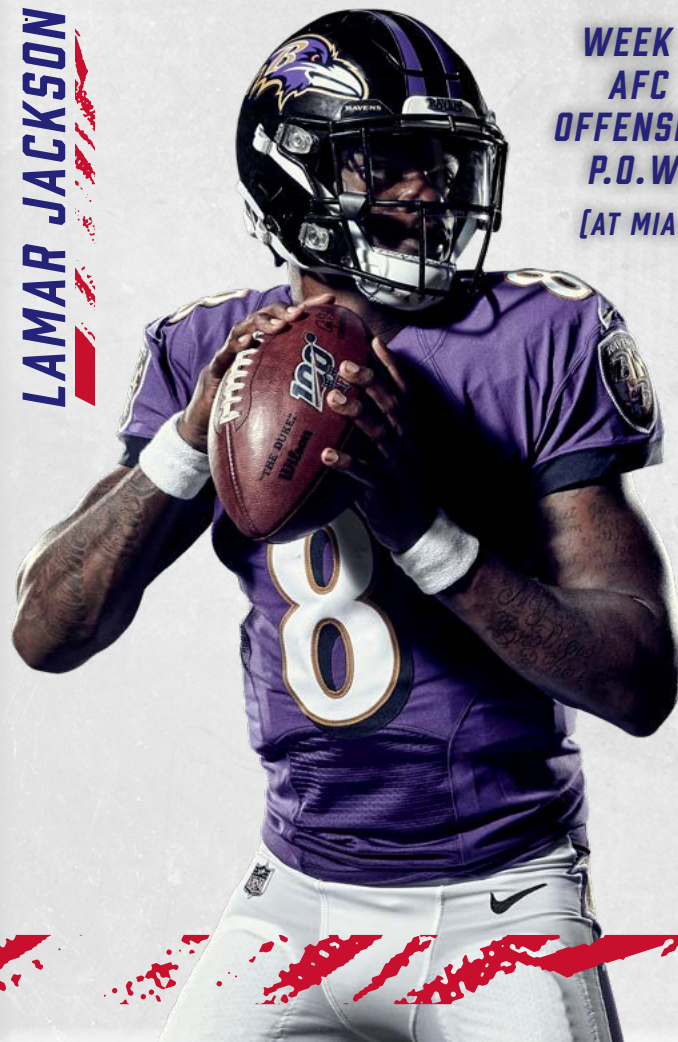

- X Jackson and Robert Griffin III (both 21 games) are the fastest QBs in NFL history to reach the 1,000-yard rushing milestone. (Jackson accomplished the feat in Week 5 at Pittsburgh.)
- X Jackson's 108.0 passer rating on third down ranks fifth in the NFL (30-of-45 for 404 yards, 3 TDs and 1 INT).

Since making his first regular season start in Week 11 of 2018 (Nov. 18), QB Lamar Jackson has led the Ravens to a 10-3 record. *During this span, here's where Baltimore ranks in several key offensive categories:*

- X Baltimore is second in total yards per game (415.7), only behind Kansas City's 425.9.

2016: PERHAPS THE BEST SEASON EVER

- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:
- Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.'" He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

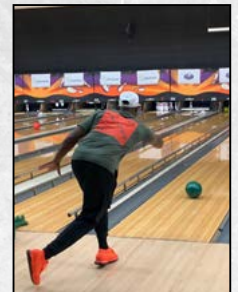
SOUTHWEST TRADING PLACES
