JUST THE FACTS

- Riding a four-game winning streak, the Baltimore Ravens (6-2) travel to face the Cincinnati Bengals (0-8), who are coming off their bye. The Ravens are 6-2 for the fifth time (2006, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2019) in team history and for the fourth time under head coach John Harbaugh.
- In a Week 9 primetime battle, the Ravens upended the previously undefeated Patriots, 37-20, at M&T Bank Stadium last Sunday. QB Lamar Jackson finished the game with 224 total yards, throwing for 163 (107.7 QB rating) and running for 61 more. Jackson tossed 1 TD (TE Nick Boyle) and ran for 2 more, while RB Mark Ingram II registered 115 rushing yards as part of Baltimore's 210 overall on the ground.
- The Ravens lead the all-time series with Cincinnati, 24-23. Baltimore has won four of the past seven meetings, while under Coach Harbaugh, the Ravens are 11-12 (with a 3-8 mark in Cincy).
- In Week 6's 23-17 victory over Cincinnati, QB Lamar Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. Baltimore racked up 497 total yards, including a season-high 269 rushing. Jackson and RB Mark Ingram II each rushed for TDs, while K Justin Tucker was 3-for-3 on FGAs. Baltimore limited the Bengals to just 250 yards, also winning the time of possession battle, 39:42 to 20:18.
- Under Coach Harbaugh, Baltimore owns the NFL's fifth-most total wins (120) since his 2008 Charm City arrival. The Ravens have appeared in three AFC title games (2008, 2011 & 2012) with "Harbs" at the helm, and in 2012, won Super Bowl XLVII.

NUMBERS TO RAVE ABOUT

3 – Defensive TDs by the Ravens this season (2 CB Marlon Humphrey FR-TDs & 1 CB Marcus Peters INT-TD), tying the NY Jets for the NFL's second most (NE is first with 4).

6.43 – Rushing average for QB Lamar Jackson, who ranks (by far) No. 1 among all qualified NFL rushers. SF's Raheem Mostert (5.58) is second.

9-0 – The Ravens' record when QB Lamar Jackson rushes for at least 70 yards in a game. Baltimore is 10-2 when he reaches 60 rushing yards in a game.

12 – Regular season wins as a starter for QB Lamar Jackson, ranking as the NFL's second most (tied with Tom Brady) since Jackson made his first start in Week 11 of 2018. (During this span, only Russell Wilson – 13 – has more wins.)

17 – Total TDs by QB Lamar Jackson (12 passing & 5 rushing).

Franchise Connections

- Baltimore quarterbacks coach **James Urban** spent seven seasons (2011-17) with Cincinnati as wide receivers coach. From 2011-17, Urban helped Bengals **WR A.J. Green** rank fourth in the league in receiving yards (8,213), fifth in receptions (556) and sixth in receiving TDs (57).
- Cincinnati special teams coordinator **Darrin Simmons** spent his first year (1998) in the NFL with the Ravens as assistant special teams coach/assistant strength and conditioning coach.
- Bengals **CB Tony McRae** spent part of the 2017 season with the Ravens and played in four games, after spending two weeks on the practice squad.

Local Connections

- Several Baltimore coaches and players have ties to the University of Cincinnati: head coach **John Harbaugh** (special teams/TEs, OLBs/RBs; 1989-94 & assistant head coach; 1995-96), defensive coordinator **Don Martindale** (DEs; 1996 & LBs/special teams coordinator; 1997-98), senior assistant/running backs coach **Craig Ver Steeg** (QB/WRs/recruiting coordinator; 1990-93), assistant defensive backs coach **Jesse Minter** (defensive graduate assistant/LBs; 2007-09), and assistant special teams coach **T.J. Weist** (WRs; 2010-12).
- Additionally, Ravens defensive backs coach **Chris Hewitt** (1992-95) and **WR Chris Moore** (2012-15) played collegiately for the Bearcats.
- Both Harbaugh (Perrysburg) and Martindale (Dayton) hail from Ohio, as well as **G/C Matt Skura** (Columbus) and **DE Chris Wormley** (Toledo).
- Ravens **DT Brandon Williams** attended Harmony Prep in Cincinnati.
- Bengals senior defensive assistant **Mark Duffner** served as head coach for the University of Maryland for five seasons (1992-96), compiling an 80-40-1 record and leading the Terrapins back to the national rankings in 1995 for the first time in nine seasons.
- Cincinnati secondary/cornerbacks coach **Daronte Jones** is a native of Capital Heights, MD, and played collegiately at Baltimore's Morgan State University (1997-2000).

RAVENS 23, BENGALS 17

M&T Bank Stadium • Oct. 13, 2019 • Week 6

In Week 6's 23-17 victory over Cincinnati, QB Lamar Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. Baltimore racked up 497 total yards, including a season-high 269 rushing (sixth most in franchise history). Jackson and RB Mark Ingram II each rushed for TDs, while K Justin Tucker was 3-for-3 on FGAs, becoming the fastest kicker in league history to reach the 1,000-point milestone (118 games). Baltimore limited the Bengals to just 250 yards, also winning the time of possession battle, 39:42 to 20:18. The Bengals were held to 33 rushing yards on 14 tries (2.4 per attempt.) Jackson completed 6 passes to TE Mark Andrews, who led all receivers with 99 yards, while Ingram II added 52 rushing yards on 13 carries. Cincy QB Andy Dalton finished 21-of-39 for 235 yards, including 5 for 91 to WR Auden Tate.

WEEK 9 VS. NEW ENGLAND RECAP

RAVENS 37, PATRIOTS 20

M&T Bank Stadium • Nov. 3, 2019 • Week 9

Before a national-television audience, the Ravens beat the previously undefeated Patriots (8-0) – and the defending Super Bowl champions – 37-20 at M&T Bank Stadium. By game's end, the Ravens' enthusiastic home crowd was chanting "MVP" in a salute to QB Lamar Jackson, who finished with 224 total yards, throwing for 163 (107.7 QB rating) and running for 61 more. Baltimore leaped to a 17-0 lead early in the second quarter. The Ravens opened the game with an 11-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 3-yard Jackson touchdown run. After a K Justin Tucker 39-yard FG made it 10-0, RB Gus Edwards raced 12 yards for the game's second TD in the first minute of the second quarter. But, the Patriots roared back, scoring a TD after recovering a CB/RS Cyrus Jones muffed punt at the Baltimore 20-yard line. Four plays later, QB Tom Brady hit WR Mohamed Sanu Sr. with a 4-yard TD strike. Later in the quarter, Ravens RB Mark Ingram II lost a fumble to DT Lawrence Guy (a former Raven) at the Baltimore 19. But the Ravens' defense held, forcing a K Nick Folk 22-yard FG. Folk then added a 19-yard FG to make the score 17-13 at the half. The Patriots opened the second half with an impressive drive until WR Julian Edelman fumbled a Brady pass at the Ravens' 30, and CB Marlon Humphrey picked up the loose ball and sprinted 70 yards to the end zone for a 24-13 lead. (It was the longest fumble return in team history.) Once again, the Patriots fought back, scoring a 1-yard RB James White TD at the end of an 11-play series to make the score 24-20 after three quarters. The Ravens then owned the final period, scoring 2 TDs, the first coming on a Jackson-to-TE Nick Boyle TD toss and the second on a 1-yard Jackson run. Boyle, a 5th-year veteran, scored the first TD of his career and led the Ravens with 5 catches. Ingram II was the game's leading rusher, gaining 115 yards on 15 carries. Brady was 30-of-46 for 285 yards, with two-thirds of his completions going to Edelman (89 yards) and Sanu Sr. (81), who each caught 10. S Earl Thomas III produced the 30th INT of his career.



RAVENS RADIO BROADCASTS

- The Ravens' 2019 radio team features Gerry Sandusky and former Ravens OLB Jarret Johnson. Sandusky, WBAL-TV 11's sports director, delivers the play-by-play for the broadcast team, while Johnson serves as a color analyst.
- Ravens games can be heard on 98Rock (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM/101.5 FM, baltimoreravens.com, in the Ravens mobile app (when fans are in Baltimore) and on 26 regional affiliates. The network broadcast spans four states – Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware & Kentucky – and Washington, D.C.
- Additionally, Ravens games can be heard in Spanish on WDCN La Nueva 87.7 FM in the D.C. area. Games are called by David Andrade and Gustavo Salazar, with Ximena Lugo as producer.

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in seven (2008-12, 2014 & 2018) of his 11 full seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of only six teams (NE – 10; GB – 8; Bal., Ind., Pit. & Sea. – 7) to earn at least seven postseason berths in the last 11 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in six of those seven playoff campaigns.)
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 16.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the fourth-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 11 seasons all time. (See chart at left.)
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- Of coaches to make the playoffs in at least seven of their first 11 years, "Harbs" is one of four active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll - 8, Andy Reid - 8 & Mike Tomlin - 8).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

RAVENS SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

HORTON INHERITS A RICH HISTORY

Following the 2019 retirement of longtime ST coordinator Jerry Rosburg, Chris Horton took over as the Ravens' special teams coach. Horton served as Rosburg's assistant coach for the past three seasons and now leads Baltimore's standout ST battery.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (254) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.7% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (254-of-280 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

2018: ANOTHER RAVENS RETURN MAN SCORES BIG

• In Week 12's win vs. Oakland, Baltimore native CB/RS Cyrus Jones posted a 70-yard punt return TD, marking the Ravens' first PR-TD since 10/15/17, when Michael Campanaro had a 77-yarder vs. Chicago. Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: Campanaro, Kaelin Clay, Tandon Doss, C. Jones, Jacoby Jones and Lardarius Webb.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS IN JONES' MAGICAL SEASON

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

Since 2014, the Ravens own the NFL's fifth-most blocked kicks (13), including an NFL-high 4 (tied) in 2016.

ROMAN ELEVATED TO O.C.

Following the 2018 season, the Ravens named Greg Roman their offensive coordinator. Roman is a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent 2018 as the team's assistant head coach/TEs coach. He re-joined the Ravens in 2017 as a senior offensive assistant/TEs coach after his first stint with the team as an assistant O-line coach from 2006-07.

Previously, Roman was a successful "O" coordinator with the Buffalo Bills (2015-16) and San Francisco 49ers (2011-14). With each team, Roman worked with QBs who totaled their highest single-season passer ratings under his guidance: Tyrod Taylor (Bills – 99.4 in 2015), Colin Kaepernick (49ers – 98.3 in 2012) and Alex Smith (49ers – 104.1 in 2012).

Baltimore also permitted the league's second-fewest points per game (17.9), just behind Chicago's 17.7. For his coaching efforts, Martindale was recognized by *SI/MMQB* as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the *AP* NFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award.

The 2019 campaign marks Martindale's 15th season in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he was Denver's D.C.

EVP & GM ERIC DECOSTA

Eric DeCosta's loyalty, love and pride for the Baltimore Ravens are unmatched. A pillar of the organization's well laid foundation, DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019.

Prior to being named executive vice president and general manager this past January – succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome – DeCosta, 48, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore. Simply put, Eric's respect for – and thorough understanding of – the Ravens' culture aligned perfectly with his pursuit of a dream job.

THE WIZARDRY OF OZ

- X Jackson is the only QB in league history to pass for 1,800 yards (1,813) and rush for 600 yards (637) through the first eight games of a season.
- X In Week 6's victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)

Since making his first regular season start in Week 11 of 2018 (Nov. 18), QB Lamar Jackson has led the Ravens to a 12-3 record. *During this span, here's where Baltimore ranks in several key offensive categories:*

2016: PERHAPS THE BEST SEASON EVER

- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:
- Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.'" He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

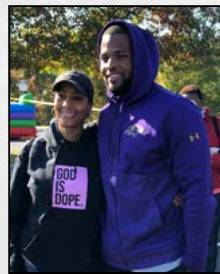
COCA-COLA MILITARY COMBINE
