### JUST THE FACTS

- Riding a nine-game winning streak (the NFL's longest this season), the Baltimore Ravens (11-2) host the New York Jets (5-8) in a Thursday night primetime showdown from M&T Bank Stadium. Baltimore, which secured a postseason berth last Sunday and currently holds the AFC's top playoff seed, can clinch its second-straight AFC North title with a victory on Thursday.
- The Ravens have now earned a playoff berth in eight of head coach John Harbaugh's 12 seasons at the helm in Baltimore. The Ravens are 11-2 for the first time in team history and have produced a franchise-best nine-game regular season winning streak.
- The Ravens rank No. 1 in points (33.1) and rushing yards (200.9) per game, while they're No. 2 in total yards per game (408.2). Baltimore is on pace to become the first team in NFL history to average 200 passing and 200 rushing yards per game in a season. QB Lamar Jackson has accounted for an NFL-high 35 total TDs (28 passing & 7 rushing), while, with three games remaining, Baltimore has already set a single-season franchise record for total TDs (52) and points (430).
- In last Sunday's 24-17 victory at Buffalo, Jackson passed for 3 TDs (16-of-25 for 145 yards) in blustery conditions and eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing milestone (1,017), joining Michael Vick (2006) as the only NFL QBs to do so in a season. The Ravens' defense registered 6 sacks and limited the Bills to 209 yards, with CB Marcus Peters halting a late Buffalo push with a game-sealing PD near Baltimore's goal line on fourth-and-8 with 1:00 left in regulation.
- Baltimore leads the all-time series with the Jets, 8-2. Under Coach Harbaugh, the Ravens are 3-1.

#### JOHN HARBAUGH ON BALTIMORE WINNING CLOSE GAMES THE PAST TWO WEEKS:

"I believe it proves where our guys are at. We often talk about, 'No test, no testimony.' If you want to be able to talk about something, do something special, you have to be tested. #### NEW ERA 8

Here are several fast facts about the MVP-caliber play of QB Lamar Jackson:

- X Baltimore is 17-3 with Jackson as its starter (11-2 this season). Since his first NFL start (Week 11 of 2018), Jackson's 17 regular season wins rank as the most among all NFL starting ΩBs.
- X Jackson is the only QB in NFL history to produce at least 2,500 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a single season. (He has 2,677 passing & 1,017 rushing yards in 2019, with three games still to play.)
- ✓ Jackson has been responsible for an NFL-best 35 total TDs this season (28 passing & 7 rushing).
- In his last six games, Jackson has thrown 17 TDs and 1 INT, completing 71.2% of his passes for 1,027 yards and a 130.3 rating. He also has 441 rushing yards and 4 rushing TDs during this time.
- X Jackson has produced two perfect passer ratings this season (at Cin. & at Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the pristine 158.3 mark twice in a single season.
- ✗ In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou) and 12 (at LAR), Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and have at least 50 yards rushing in back-to-back games.
- After his 101-yard output in Week 13 vs. SF, Jackson owns the NFL single-season record for most 100-yard rushing games (4) by a quarterback.
- ✗ Jackson's 1,017 rushing yards in 2019 are the second most ever in a season by a quarterback. He is on pace to shatter Michael Vick's single-season QB rushing record (1,039) with a projected 1,252 clip.
- ✗ Jackson registered at least 60 rushing yards in nine-straight games (4-12) this season, ranking as the most consecutive 60+ rushing outputs by a QB in NFL single-season history.
- ✗ In 20 regular season starts (17-3 record), Jackson has thrown for 3,791 yards, 33 TDs and 9 INTs, with a 63.8 completion pct. He also has 1,573 rushing yards and 11 TDs in these starts.

#### RAVENS / JETS CONNECTIONS

#### **Franchise Connections**

- Jets general manager **Joe Douglas** began his scouting career in Baltimore in 2000 and spent 16 years (2000-15) with the franchise, helping the Ravens win Super Bowl XXXV and Super Bowl XLVII. Douglas ascended within the organization, serving as Northeast area scout (2003-07), East Coast area scout (2008), Southeast area scout (2009-11) and national scout (2012-15).
- New York senior football advisor **Phil Savage** held several positions in the Ravens' scouting department from 1996-2004. During his nine seasons, the Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV and drafted 10 Pro Bowl players, including Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees, Jonathan Ogden, Ray Lewis and Ed Reed.
- Jets director of player personnel **Chad Alexander** worked in Baltimore's scouting department for 20 seasons (1999-2018). He held various positions in the department, ultimately spending his last nine years as the assistant director of pro personnel.
- Jets college scout **Chris Nolan** spent one season (2015) in Baltimore as a personnel assistant.
- New York senior defensive assistant/outside linebackers coach **Joe Vitt** began his NFL coaching career as a Baltimore Colts strength/quality control coach from 1979-81.
- Jets offensive assistant **Todd Washington** served as the Ravens assistant offensive line coach from 2011-16, helping Baltimore win Super Bowl XLVII.
- Ravens West area scout **Lonnie Young** played defensive back for the Jets (1991-93, 95-96), totaling 236 tackles, 3 INTs, 1 sack, 1 FF and 6 FRs. Young also started his scouting career with New York as a Midwest scout in 2002.
- Baltimore Southeast/Southwest area scout **Kevin Weidl** spent training camp with the Jets in 2007 as an intern with the propersonnel department.
- New York **LB C.J. Mosley** (Injured Reserve) was originally selected by the Ravens in the first round (17th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft. Mosley started 77 games for Baltimore over five seasons (2014-18), totaling 574 tackles, 8.5 sacks, 9 INTs, 35 PD, 6 FFs and 5 FRs. He earned four Pro Bowl nods (2014, 2016-18).
- New York claimed CB Maurice Canady off waivers on Nov.
   7 after he was released by Baltimore. Canady was originally drafted by the Ravens in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft and played in 24 games (three starts) from 2016-19 for Baltimore.
- The Jets claimed **S Bennett Jackson** off waivers on Dec. 3 after he was released by the Ravens.
- New York **OL Alex Lewis** was originally drafted by the Ravens in the fourth round of the 2016 NFL Draft. Lewis spent three seasons in Baltimore (2016-18).
- Jets **WR/RB Ty Montgomery** spent part of the 2018 season with the Ravens, seeing time in six games.
- Jets **LB Brandon Copeland** (a Baltimore native) began his pro career as an undrafted free agent in Baltimore, spending time on the Ravens' practice squad in 2013.
- Jets **TE Daniel Brown** was originally signed by Baltimore as an undrafted free agent in 2015. **QB David Fales** spent time on Baltimore's practice squad during the 2016 season.

#### WEEK 14 AT BILLS RECAP

RAVENS 24, BILLS 17

New Era Field • Dec. 8, 2019 • Week 14

The Ravens clinched a playoff berth and won a franchise-best ninth-straight regular season game in a row with a 24-17 victory over the Bills at New Era Field. The Ravens improved to 11-2, the team's best ever mark after 13 games. Buffalo had its three-game winning streak stopped and fell to 9-4. In a game that featured two of the NFL's best defenses, QB Lamar Jackson threw 3 TD passes and finished 16-of-25 for 145 yards in windy Buffalo. Despite an early 10-0 lead



and a 24-9 advantage with 9:49 left in the game, the contest was not decided until the final minutes of play. Baltimore CB Marcus Peters sealed the victory when he batted away a QB Josh Allen pass intended for WR John Brown at the Ravens' 1-vard line with 63 seconds left in the final quarter. With the score 24-17 after an Allen-to-WR Cole Beasley TD and a 2-point conversion with another Allen-to-Beasley connection, the Bills forced a three-andout and started a drive at their own 28 with 5:27 remaining. Aided by 2 Raven personal fouls and a 26-yard pass interference call, Buffalo had a first down at the Ravens' 18 at the 2-minute warning. After a 2-yard run by RB Devin Singletary, the stout, attacking Ravens defense forced three-consecutive incompletions to secure the win. K Justin Tucker provided the only score in the first quarter when he hit a 36-yard FG. A Jackson-to-TE Nick Boyle 3-yard TD completion gave the Ravens a 10-0, second-quarter lead. A pair of K Stephen Hauschka FGs (36 and 47 yards) made the score 10-6 at the half. The Ravens then came out roaring at the start of the third quarter, scoring on the opening possession on a spectacular 61-yard TD by TE Hayden Hurst on a sharp pass from Jackson. After another Hauschka FG (48 yards) made the score 17-9 after three quarters, Baltimore increased the lead to 24-9 on a Jackson-to-WR Willie Snead IV 4-yard TD before Beasley's score. The Ravens' defense, which held Buffalo to just 122 yards in the first three quarters, sacked Allen 6 times and harassed him continuously throughout the game. Jackson joined Michael Vick as the only QBs to ever rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season.

- Additionally, Ravens games can be heard in Spanish on WDCN La Nueva 87.7 FM in the D.C. area. Games are called by David Andrade and Gustavo Salazar, with Ximena Lugo as producer.

In a magnificent effort showca ing thrilling performances by the defense, offense and special tear units, the Baltimore Ravens w Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.



John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in eight (2008-12, 2014 & 2018-19) of his 12 seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- Entering Week 15 of 2019, Baltimore is riding a nine-game winning streak (the NFL's longest this season). Baltimore, which secured a postseason berth last Sunday at Buffalo and currently holds the AFC's top playoff seed, can clinch its second-straight AFC North title with a victory on Thursday.
- The Ravens are currently 11-2 for the first time in team history and have produced a franchise-best nine-game regular season winning streak.
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 16.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the fourth-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 11 seasons all time. (See chart at left.)
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.




### RAVENS OFFENSIVE NOTES

#### ROMAN ELEVATED TO O.C.

Following the 2018 season, the Ravens named Greg Roman their offensive coordinator. Roman is a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent 2018 as the team's assistant head coach/TEs coach. He re-joined the Ravens in 2017 as a senior offensive assistant/TEs coach after his first stint with the team as an assistant O-line coach from 2006-07.

Previously, Roman was a successful "0" coordinator with the Buffalo Bills (2015-16) and San Francisco 49ers (2011-14). With each team, Roman worked with QBs who totaled their highest single-season passer ratings under his guidance: Tyrod Taylor (Bills - 99.4 in 2015), Colin Kaepernick (49ers - 98.3 in 2012) and Alex Smith (49ers - 104.1 in 2012).



On Sept. 8 at Miami, the Ravens established team records for most points (59) and yards (643) in a game, beating the Dolphins 59-10 on Kickoff Weekend. Here are the top marks in franchise history:

In his first year (2018) as Baltimore's D.C., Don "Wink" Martindale led the Ravens' unit to a No. 1-overall ranking, allowing an NFL-best 292.9 yards per game. Baltimore also permitted the league's second-fewest points per game (17.9), just behind Chicago's 17.7. For his coaching efforts, Martindale was recognized by *SI/MMQB* as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the *AP* NFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award.

The 2019 campaign marks Martindale's 15th season in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he was Denver's D.C.

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

• Two-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (260) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.6% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (260-of-287 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

#### 2018: Another Ravens Return Man Scores Big W

• In 2018's Week 12 win vs. Oakland, Baltimore CB/RS Cyrus Jones posted a 70-yard punt return TD, marking the Ravens' first PR-TD since 10/15/17, when Michael Campanaro had a 77-yarder vs. Chicago. Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: Campanaro, Kaelin Clay, Tandon Doss, C. Jones, Jacoby Jones and Lardarius Webb.

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. #### EVP & GM ERIC DECOSTA

Eric DeCosta's loyalty, love and pride for the Baltimore Ravens are unmatched. A pillar of the organization's well laid foundation, DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019.

Prior to being named executive vice president and general manager this past January – succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome – DeCosta, 48, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore. Simply put, Eric's respect for – and thorough understanding of – the Ravens' culture aligned perfectly with his pursuit of a dream job.

24TH RAVENS SEASON "The perfect word is seamless. He's had the experience of watching how Ozzie [Newsome] takes over a room – building a consensus, but [knowing] you have to make the final call. Building that strong consensus with great football minds is what has allowed Ozzie to have the success he's had, and I think Eric obviously understands that very well. ### LAMAR JACKSON NOTES

#### THE YEAR OF LAMAR

- Lamar Jackson is the only ΩB in NFL history with at least 2,500 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a season. (He has 2,677 passing & 1,017 rushing yards in 2019, with three games to play.)
- Jackson has been responsible for an NFL-best 35 total TDs this season (28 passing & 7 rushing).
- In his last six games, Jackson has thrown 17 TDs and 1 INT, completing 71.2% of his passes for 1,027 yards and a 130.3 rating. He also has 441 rushing yards and 4 rushing TDs during this time.
- Jackson has produced two perfect passer ratings this season (at Cin. & at Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the pristine 158.3 mark twice in a single season.
- In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou) and 12 (at LAR), Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and have at least 50 yards rushing in back-to-back games.
- ✗ Jackson's 1,017 rushing yards in 2019 are the second most ever in a season by a QB. He is on pace to shatter Michael Vick's singleseason QB rushing record (1,039) with a projected 1,252 clip.
- Jackson's 6.74 ypc rush avg. in 2019 ranks No. 1 in the NFL. He has posted an NFL-high 247 rushing yards on third down.
- ✓ Jackson registered at least 60 rushing yards in nine-straight games (4-12) this season, ranking as the most consecutive 60+ rushing outputs by a QB in NFL single-season history.
- In Week 6's victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)
- In Week 2's win over Arizona, Jackson became the only player in NFL history to throw for at least 250 yards and rush for at least 120 yards in a regular season game.
- Michael Vick (8), Jackson (5) and Russell Wilson (4) own the most "double-triples" (at least 100 rushing and passing yards in the same game) in league history.
- ✗ Jackson has registered two 5-TD passing games this season (Week 1 at Miami & Week 12 at LAR), also throwing 4 TDs in Week 11 vs. Hou. His three 4-plus passing TD games are the most in single-season team history.



#### 2016: PERHAPS THE BEST SEASON EVER

- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:
- Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."













