JUST THE FACTS

- The Baltimore Ravens (13-2), who have clinched the AFC's No. 1 playoff seed, close out regular season play when they host the Pittsburgh Steelers (8-7) at M&T Bank Stadium. The Ravens, winners of a regular season franchise-record 11-straight games, are the first team in Baltimore pro football history to earn a No. 1 playoff seed.
- The Ravens have earned a playoff berth in eight of head coach John Harbaugh's 12 seasons at the helm and have won the AFC North four times. Baltimore is 13-2 for the first time in franchise history, and with a win Sunday, would produce the best-ever record by a Ravens team.
- The Ravens rank No. 1 in points (33.5) and rushing yards (204.9) per game, while they're No. 2 in total yards (414.5). Baltimore is on pace to become the first team ever to average 200 passing and 200 rushing yards in a season. The Ravens also need 93 rushing yards to set a new NFL single-season record, currently held by the 1978 Patriots (3,165).
- QB Lamar Jackson has accounted for an NFL-high 43 total TDs, including a league-best (and franchise record) 36 passing scores. Baltimore has already shattered single-season franchise records for total TDs (62), points (503) and rushing yards (3,073 – which includes 1,206 by Jackson, setting a new NFL record by a QB).
- Last Sunday, Jackson threw 3 TDs – 2 to TE Mark Andrews – and rushed for 103 yards in a 31-15 win at Cleveland. Baltimore racked up 481 total yards (243 rushing) and limited the Browns to 241 yards.
- In the all-time Baltimore-Pittsburgh series, the Steelers lead the regular season count, 25-22 (3-1 playoffs). Under head coach John Harbaugh, Baltimore is 13-13 (including playoffs) against the Steelers.

COACH HARBAUGH SAYS

JOHN HARBAUGH ON BALTIMORE EARNING THE AFC'S NO. 1 PLAYOFFS SEED:

"It's a big accomplishment. The players deserve a tremendous amount of credit for it, because it's hard. It's difficult and challenging to win a game in the National Football League. When you have put together the kind of season that these players have put together, it's quite an accomplishment. It's probably the best regular season in the National Football League this year by any team, and we still have another game to play, which we take very seriously and want to win."

The 2019 Ravens are the first team in Baltimore pro football history (includes Colts) to earn a No. 1 playoff seed. With a win on Sunday, the Ravens would also finish 14-2, setting a new single-season franchise record (13-3, currently tied with 2006 team).

NUMBERS TO RAVE ABOUT

4 – Receiving yards TE Mark Andrews (852) needs to pass Todd Heap (855, 2005) for the most by a TE in team single-season history.

7 – Times in NFL single-season history two teammates have each rushed for 1,000 yards, including QB Lamar Jackson (1,206) and RB Mark Ingram II (1,018). The previous duo to reach this feat was Carolina's DeAngelo Williams & Jonathan Stewart in 2009.

7 – Receiving TDs by WR Marquise Brown, tying for the NFL's second most among rookies and tying the Ravens' record for total TDs by a rookie (Marlon Brown, 2013 & Torrey Smith, 2011).

10 – Receiving TDs by TE Mark Andrews, No. 1 among all NFL TEs and second overall in the league (WR Kenny Golladay, 11). The 10 also stand as the most by a Ravens' TE in a single season and rank third most among all receivers in team history.

14-0 – The Ravens' record when QB Lamar Jackson rushes for at least 70 yards in a game. Baltimore is 16-2 when he reaches 60 rushing yards in a game, including 11-1 this season.

15 – Total TDs by RB Mark Ingram II (10 rushing & 5 receiving), tying RB Ray Rice (2011) for the single-season franchise record.

15.6 – Points per game the Ravens' defense is allowing during the team's 11-game winning streak, marking the NFL's second fewest (NE, 15.5) since Week 5.

17 – TDs allowed by Baltimore during its 11-game winning streak, ranking as the NFL's fewest since Week 5. The Ravens' "D" has scored 5 TDs and forced 19 takeaways during this time.

93 – Rushing yards Baltimore needs to set a new 16-game single-season NFL record, currently held by the 1978 Patriots (3,165).

NEW ERA 8

Here are several fast facts about the MVP-caliber play of QB Lamar Jackson:



- ✗ Baltimore is 19-3 with Jackson as its starter (13-2 this season). Since his first NFL start (Week 11 of 2018), Jackson's 19 regular season wins rank as the most among all NFL starting QBs.
- ✗ Jackson is the only QB in NFL history to produce at least 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a single season. (He has 3,127 passing & 1,206 rushing yards in 2019.)
- ✗ Jackson (36/7) is the third QB in NFL history to produce at least 35 passing TDs & 7 rushing TDs in a season. Steve Young (35/7 in 1994) & Cam Newton (35/10 in 2015) both won MVP honors after also accomplishing this feat.
- ✗ Jackson has been responsible for an NFL-best 43 total TDs this season (36 passing & 7 rushing). His 36 TD passes lead the NFL and are the most in franchise single-season history.
- ✗ In his last eight games, Jackson has thrown 25 TDs and 1 INT, completing 69.4% of his passes for 1,477 yards and a 130.3 rating. He also has 630 rushing yards and 4 rushing TDs.
- ✗ Jackson has rushed for 1,206 yards in 2019, marking the most by a quarterback in NFL single-season history.
- ✗ In Week 15 vs. NYJ, Jackson produced his third game this season (also at Mia. & at LAR) with 5 passing TDs, becoming the sixth QB in NFL history to register at least three 5-TD passing games in a single season.
- ✗ Jackson has thrown at least 4 TDs in an NFL-best four games this season. He has also thrown at least 3 TDs in an NFL-best eight games this season (also a Ravens' record).
- ✗ In Week 15 vs. NYJ, Jackson rushed for at least 85 yards while throwing for 5 TDs for the second time in his career. (He also did this on 11/25/19 at LAR.) Cam Newton is the only other player in NFL history to accomplish the 85 rushing yards/5 passing TDs feat in a game, doing so one time during his 2015 MVP campaign.
- ✗ Jackson has produced two perfect passer ratings this season (at Cin. & at Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the pristine 158.3 mark twice in a single season.
- ✗ In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou) and 12 (at LAR), Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and have at least 50 yards rushing in back-to-back games.
- ✗ Jackson owns the NFL single-season record for most 100-yard rushing games (5 in 2019) by a quarterback.
- ✗ Jackson registered at least 60 rushing yards in nine-straight games (4-12) this season, ranking as the most consecutive 60+ rushing outputs by a QB in NFL single-season history.

Franchise Connections

• Ravens asst. head coach/pass coord./wide receivers coach **David Culley** served as the Steelers' wide receivers coach from 1996-98. In the 1997 campaign, WR Yancey Thigpen tallied a career-high 1,398 receiving yards (third most in the NFL) and 7 TDs on 79 receptions.

• Baltimore head strength & conditioning coach **Steve Saunders** was independently contracted by more than 20 Steelers players for advanced strength and speed training, rehab and recovery during the 2005-09 seasons, assisting the team to two Super Bowl titles (2005 and 2008).

• Pittsburgh inside linebackers coach **Jerry Olsavsky** was a linebacker for Baltimore in 1998.

• Steelers senior defensive assistant/secondary **Teryl Austin** was the Ravens' defensive backs/secondary coach from 2011-13, helping the team win Super Bowl XLVII.

• Before attending South Carolina, Ravens **TE Hayden Hurst** played baseball in the Pittsburgh Pirates' minor league system (2013-14).

Local Connections

• Ravens head coach **John Harbaugh** (tight ends, 1987), offensive line coach **Joe D'Alessandris** (offensive line, 1996) and tight ends coach **Bobby Engram** (wide receivers, 2012-13) all coached at the University of Pittsburgh.

• D'Alessandris is also a native of Alquippa, PA, and attended Center HS. In 2010, he was inducted into the Beaver County and Center HS Sports Hall of Fame.

• Engram is also one of the most prolific and decorated WRs in Penn State football history and the inaugural recipient (1994) of the Biletnikoff Award. He was a three-time All-American and three-time All-Big Ten selection (1993-95) for the Nittany Lions.

• Baltimore **QB Trace McSorley** is one of the most decorated QBs in Penn State history. He is the only QB in PSU history to throw for more than 9,000 career yards, to record 50-plus TD passes and to post multiple 3,000-yard passing seasons.

• Baltimore QBs coach **James Urban** is a native of Mechanicsburg, PA, and attended Trinity (Camp Hill) HS. He also coached wide receivers and tight ends at Clarion (PA) University for two seasons (1997-98) and worked as the director of football administration/operations at the University of Pennsylvania from 1999-2003.

• Ravens head strength & conditioning coach **Steve Saunders** was born and raised in Myerstown, PA.

• Baltimore asst. D-line coach & OLBs **Drew Wilkins** was born in Doylestown, PA, and attended La Salle College (Glenside) HS.

• Ravens SE/SW area scout **Kevin Weidl** was born in Pittsburgh, where he attended Mt. Lebanon HS and was a standout QB. He went on to play QB at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, starting for three seasons (2004-06).

• Steelers CB Joe Haden prepped at Friendly (Fort Washington, MD) HS. ... Pittsburgh rookie **S Marcus Allen** is a native of Silver Spring, MD, and attended Dr. Henry Wise (Upper Marlboro) HS.

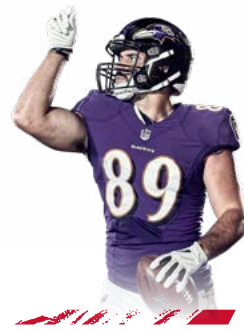

WEEK 16 AT BROWNS RECAP

RAVENS 31, BROWNS 15

FirstEnergy Stadium • Dec. 22, 2019 • Week 16

The road to the Super Bowl in the AFC will go through Baltimore. The Ravens clinched homefield advantage for the AFC playoffs, which includes a first-round bye, and won a team-record 11th-consecutive game with their 31-15 victory over the Browns at FirstEnergy Stadium last Sunday. (The Browns were the last team to defeat the Ravens, 40-25, on Sept. 29 in Baltimore.) QB Lamar Jackson threw 3 TD passes (20-of-31 for 238 yards and a 120.1 QB rating) and rushed for 103 yards to further secure his NFL MVP status. After a scoreless first quarter, the Browns took a 6-0 lead on a 1-yard QB Baker Mayfield flip to TE Demetrius Harris. (PAT was missed.) With 1:50 remaining in the second quarter and no timeouts, the Ravens rallied for 2 TDs to take a 14-6 halftime lead. (Both TDs came on Jackson-to-TE Mark Andrews connections: the initial on a 39-yard scoring play with 1:18 remaining, and the second on a 14-yarder with 9 seconds left.) The Ravens then opened the third quarter with a 13-play, 69-yard drive that ended with a Jackson-to-RB Mark Ingram II 12-yard TD for a 21-6 advantage. Cleveland fought back with a 10-play scoring series that was completed by K Austin Seibert's 47-yard FG. K Justin Tucker added a fourth-quarter FG (31 yards) to put the Ravens up 24-9. A Mayfield-to-WR Odell Beckham Jr. 3-yard TD brought the Browns within 9 at 24-15 (2-point conversion failed) with 8 minutes remaining. The Ravens then went on an 8-play 84-yard TD drive that was finished with RB Justice Hill's 18-yard TD sweep. RB Gus Edwards and Ingram II ran for 66 and 55 yards, respectively, while Andrews caught 6 passes for 93 yards. Mayfield was 20-of-33 for 192 yards with 2 TDs and 1 INT (CB Marlon Humphrey). WR Jarvis Landry caught 7 for 74 yards to lead the Browns. The Ravens outgained the Browns, 481 to 241, while limiting the explosive Cleveland offense to just 3-of-12 on third down.

PLAYOFF PERFORMERS



In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in eight (2008-12, 2014 & 2018-19) of his 12 seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- Entering Week 17, Baltimore is riding an 11-game winning streak. The Ravens, which last Sunday won at Cleveland, have secured the franchise's first No. 1 playoff seed, also marking the first-ever in Baltimore pro football history (includes Colts).
- The Ravens are currently 13-2 for the first time in team history and have produced a franchise-best 11-game regular season winning streak.
- Coach Harbaugh has led the Ravens to four AFC North Division titles (2011-12, 2018-19).
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 16.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the fourth-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 11 seasons all time. (See chart at left.)
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

Previously, Roman was a successful "O" coordinator with the Bills (2015-16) and 49ers (2011-14).

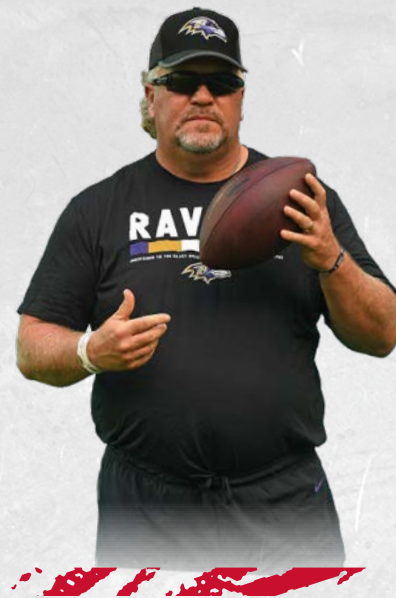

RAVENS DEFENSIVE NOTES

WINK IS THE D.C.

In his first year (2018) as Baltimore's D.C., Don "Wink" Martindale led the Ravens' unit to a No. 1-overall ranking, allowing an NFL-best 292.9 yards per game. Baltimore also permitted the league's second-fewest points per game (17.9), just behind Chicago's 17.7. For his coaching efforts, Martindale was recognized by *SI/MMQB* as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the *AP* NFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award.

The 2019 campaign marks Martindale's 15th season in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he was Denver's D.C.

Following the retirement of longtime ST coordinator Jerry Rosburg, Chris Horton took over as the Ravens' special teams coach in 2019. Horton served as Rosburg's assistant for the past three seasons and now leads Baltimore's standout ST battery.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Three-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (261) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.6% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (261-of-288 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

2018: ANOTHER RAVENS RETURN MAN SCORES BIG

• In 2018's Week 12 win vs. Oakland, Baltimore CB/RS Cyrus Jones posted a 70-yard punt return TD, marking the Ravens' first PR-TD since 10/15/17, when Michael Campanaro had a 77-yarder vs. Chicago. Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: Campanaro, Kaelin Clay, Tandon Doss, C. Jones, Jacoby Jones and Lardarius Webb.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS IN JONES' MAGICAL SEASON

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

Since 2014, the Ravens own the NFL's third-most (tied) blocked kicks (15), including an NFL-high 4 (tied) in 2016.

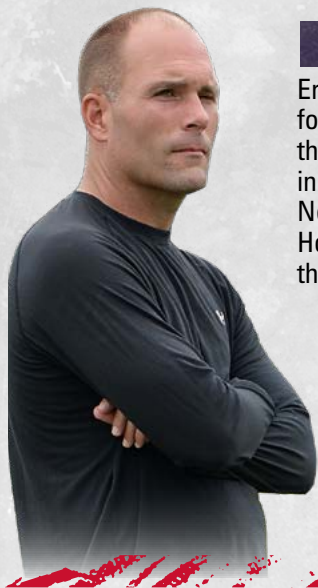

LAMAR JACKSON NOTES

THE YEAR OF LAMAR

- X Baltimore is 19-3 with Jackson as its starter (13-2 this season). Since his first NFL start (Week 11 of 2018), Jackson's 19 regular season wins rank as the most among all NFL starting QBs.
- X Jackson is the only QB in NFL history to produce at least 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a single season. (He has 3,127 passing & 1,206 rushing yards in 2019.)
- X Jackson (36/7) is the third QB in NFL history to produce at least 35 passing TDs & 7 rushing TDs in a season. Steve Young (35/7 in 1994) & Cam Newton (35/10 in 2015) both won MVP honors after also accomplishing this feat.
- X Jackson has been responsible for an NFL-best 43 total TDs this season (36 passing & 7 rushing). His 36 TD passes lead the NFL and are the most in franchise single-season history.
- X In his last eight games, Jackson has thrown 25 TDs and 1 INT, completing 69.4% of his passes for 1,477 yards and a 130.3 rating. He also has 630 rushing yards and 4 rushing TDs.
- X Jackson has rushed for 1,206 yards in 2019, marking the most by a quarterback in NFL single-season history.
- X In Week 15 vs. NYJ, Jackson produced his third game this season (also at Mia. & at LAR) with 5 passing TDs, becoming the sixth QB in NFL history to register at least three 5-TD passing games in a single season.
- X Jackson has also thrown at least 4 TDs in an NFL-best four games this season. He has also thrown at least 3 TDs in an NFL-best eight games this season.
- X In Week 15 vs. NYJ, Jackson rushed for at least 85 yards while throwing for 5 TDs for the second time in his career. (He also did this on 11/25/19 at LAR.) Cam Newton is the only other player in NFL history to accomplish the 85 rushing yards/5 passing TDs feat in a game, doing so one time during his 2015 MVP campaign.
- X Jackson has posted two perfect passer ratings in 2019 (at Cin. & Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the 158.3 mark twice in a season.
- X In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou) and 12 (at LAR), Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and have at least 50 yards rushing in back-to-back games.
- X Jackson owns the NFL single-season record for most 100-yard rushing games (5 in 2019) by a quarterback.
- X Jackson registered at least 60 rushing yards in nine-straight games (4-12) this season, ranking as the most consecutive 60+ rushing outputs by a QB in NFL single-season history.
- X In Week 6's victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)
- X In Week 2's win over Arizona, Jackson became the only player in NFL history to throw for at least 250 yards and rush for at least 120 yards in a regular season game.
- X Michael Vick (8), Jackson (6) and Russell Wilson (4) own the most "double-triples" (at least 100 rushing and passing yards in the same game) in league history.

2016: PERHAPS THE BEST SEASON EVER

- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:
- Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.' He's debuted a 'boomerang' punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

RAVENS ALL-TIME LEADER

P Sam Koch owns a 45.4 career gross average and 39.5 career net, both marks that rank first in Ravens history. In 2014, he posted a career-high and team-record 47.4-yard gross (matched again in 2018) and 43.3-yard net average.
