JUST THE FACTS

- Riding an eight-game winning streak, the Baltimore Ravens (10-2) travel to battle the surging Buffalo Bills (9-3), who have won three-straight games. Sitting atop the AFC North standings with a three-game lead over Pittsburgh, the Ravens are 10-2 for the first time in franchise history. Baltimore's eight-game winning streak is the NFL's longest active stretch and the longest in regular single-season franchise history. The Ravens currently own the AFC's No. 1 playoff seed, holding the head-to-head tiebreaker over 10-2 New England.
- The Ravens rank No. 1 in points (33.8) and rushing yards (207.8) per game, while they're No. 2 in total yards per game (420.8). Baltimore is on pace to become the first team in NFL history to average 200 passing and 200 rushing yards per game in a season. MVP candidate QB Lamar Jackson has accounted for an NFL-high 32 total TDs (25 passing & 7 rushing), while, with four games remaining, Baltimore has already set a single-season franchise record by scoring 49 total TDs.
- Baltimore leads the regular season series with the Bills, 5-3. Under head coach John Harbaugh, the Ravens are 3-1.
- In last Sunday's 20-17 victory over San Francisco, K Justin Tucker nailed a game-winning 49-yard FG as time expired. Baltimore rushed for 178 yards, including 101 by Jackson, who became the first QB in NFL history to rush for 100 yards in four games of a season. Jackson threw for 1 TD (TE Mark Andrews) and rushed for another, adding 105 passing yards (14-of-23) in the rain-soaked, windy affair. Andrews' TD was his seventh of 2019, tying a single-season franchise record by a tight end: Dennis Pitta (2012) and Todd Heap (2005).

COACH HARBAUGH SAYS

JOHN HARBAUGH ON BALTIMORE'S MINDSET ENTERING WEEK 14 AT BUFFALO: "This next game doesn't mean anything for the game after that or the game after that or the game after that. All it means is everything for *this week*, and you need to put one [check] in the left side of the column. That's it. That's what it's about. That's all it's about. All the other stuff is just noise; it's just a distraction. [The long-term future is] not what we're interested in. We're not even going to talk about that stuff, because it doesn't matter to us [right now]."

NUMBERS TO RAVE ABOUT

5 – An NFL-high (tied, D. McCoutry & M. Fitzpatrick) INTs by CB Marcus Peters this season, 3 of which he has returned for TDs (2 with Bal. & 1 while with LAR).

6 – Teams with a winning record that Baltimore has beaten during its eight-game winning streak. (The other two victories came against Cincinnati.) Those six teams (Hou., LAR, NE, Pit., Sea. & SF) own a combined 52-20 record.

6 – Receiving TDs by WR Marquise Brown, ranking as the NFL's most among all rookies.

7 – Receiving TDs by TE Mark Andrews, tying (Darren Fells) for the most among all NFL tight ends.

11 – An NFL-low TDs allowed by the Ravens during their eight-game winning streak. Baltimore's defense has produced 15 takeaways and scored 5 TDs of its own during this time.

12-0 – The Ravens' record when QB Lamar Jackson rushes for at least 70 yards in a game. Baltimore is 14-2 when he reaches 60 rushing yards in a game, including 9-1 this season.

49 – Total TDs scored by Baltimore, marking an NFL high and a new single-season franchise record. (Previous mark was 47 during the 2009 campaign.)

+187 – Baltimore's point differential, ranking No. 1 in the NFL. New England (+177) is second, with San Francisco (+166) third.

271-119 – How the Ravens have outscored opponents during their eight-game winning streak (+152 differential). Baltimore is averaging 33.9 points per game while allowing just 14.9.

NEW ERA 8

Here are several fast facts about the MVP-caliber play of QB Lamar Jackson:



- ✗ Baltimore is 16-3 with Jackson as its starter. Since his first NFL start (Week 11 of 2018), Jackson's 16 regular season wins tie (Russell Wilson) for the most among NFL starting QBs.
- ✗ Jackson is the only QB in NFL history to produce at least 2,500 passing yards and 950 rushing yards in a single season. (He has 2,532 passing & 977 rushing yards in 2019, with four games still to play.)
- ✗ Jackson has been responsible for an NFL-best 32 total TDs this season (25 passing & 7 rushing).
- ✗ In his last five games, Jackson has thrown 14 TDs and 0 INTs, completing 72.9% of his passes for 882 yards and a 136.8 rating. He also has 401 rushing yards and 4 rushing TDs during this time.
- ✗ Jackson has produced two perfect passer ratings this season (at Cin. & at Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the pristine 158.3 mark twice in a single season.
- ✗ In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou) and 12 (at LAR), Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and have at least 50 yards rushing in back-to-back games.
- ✗ After his 101-yard output in Week 13 vs. SF, Jackson now owns the NFL single-season record for most 100-yard rushing games (4) by a quarterback.
- ✗ Jackson's 977 rushing yards in 2019 are the second most ever in a season by a quarterback. He is on pace to shatter Michael Vick's single-season QB rushing record (1,039) with a projected 1,303 clip.
- ✗ Jackson has registered at least 60 rushing yards in nine-straight games, ranking as the most consecutive 60+ rushing outputs by a QB in NFL single-season history.
- ✗ In 19 regular season starts (16-3 record), Jackson has thrown for 3,646 yards, 30 TDs and 8 INTs, with a 63.8 completion pct. He also has 1,533 rushing yards and 11 TDs in these starts.

Franchise Connections

• Ravens offensive coordinator **Greg Roman** served as Buffalo's offensive coordinator from 2015-16. In 2015, Roman guided a Bills offense that led the NFL in rushing yards (152.0 ypg), yards per rush (4.78), big-play TDs (24) and outside-the-red zone points scored (194).

• Baltimore assistant head coach/pass coordinator/wide receivers coach **David Culley** worked as Buffalo's quarterbacks coach from 2017-18. In 2018, Culley coached rookie QB Josh Allen, who posted franchise records for most total TDs by a rookie QB (18), most rushing TDs by a QB (8) and most rushing yards by a QB (631).

• Ravens offensive line coach **Joe D'Alessandris** held the same position for the Bills from 2010-12.

• Bills defensive coordinator **Leslie Frazier** spent the 2016 season as the Ravens' secondary coach, leading a unit that led the NFL with 18 INTs. His son, **Corey Frazier**, currently serves as a pro scout for Baltimore.

• Buffalo defensive quality control/assistant linebackers coach **John Egorugwu** spent the 2015-16 seasons as a Ravens' defensive assistant.

• Several Bills players served previous stints with Baltimore: **LB Lorenzo Alexander** (2006 practice squad), **WR John Brown** (2018) and **K Stephen Hauschka** (2008-09). Brown totaled 42 receptions for 715 yards and 5 TDs in 16 games (15 starts), while Hauschka converted 10 of 15 FGAs and 27 of 28 PATs.

LAST GAME VS. BUFFALO: 2018

RAVENS 47, BILLS 3

M&T Bank Stadium • Sept. 9, 2019 • Week 1



In the 2018 season opener, the Baltimore Ravens dominated the visiting Buffalo Bills, winning 47-3 at M&T Bank Stadium. QB Joe Flacco threw 3 TD passes to his new receivers – John Brown, Michael Crabtree and Willie Snead IV – while each of the Ravens' Top 3 RBs (Alex Collins, Javorius Allen and Kenneth Dixon) scored a rushing TD. Under then-first-year defensive coordinator Don Martindale, the Ravens dominated the first half, limiting the Bills to just 33 yards and 0 first downs. Overall, the Ravens' "D" registered 6 sacks and forced 2 INTs, allowing Baltimore to produce a 44-point margin of victory, the then-third largest in franchise history.

WEEK 13 VS. 49ERS RECAP

RAVENS 20, 49ERS 17

M&T Bank Stadium • Dec. 1, 2019 • Week 13

Pouring rains accompanied stiff winds at M&T Bank Stadium when the Ravens earned a hard-fought 20-17 victory over the 49ers on a K Justin Tucker (the most accurate kicker of all time) 49-yard game-winning FG that smashed through the elements as time expired. The 49ers entered the contest with a 10-1 record. The victory was the Ravens' eighth in a row, the most consecutive wins in one regular season by Baltimore. QB Lamar Jackson weathered the difficult conditions, completing 14 of just 23 passes for 105 yards while rushing for 101, including a key 3-yard dive on fourth-and-1 at the 49ers' 44-yard line on the game-winning drive. That series lasted 6:28 and started at the Ravens' 35. (Jackson became the first QB in NFL history to produce four 100-yard rushing games in a season.) Just as important as the Ravens' winning series were two stops by the defense in the fourth quarter. Early in the period, the Ravens forced a punt and then stopped San Francisco at its 35 when DE Chris Wormley tipped a QB Jimmy Garoppolo pass that fell incomplete on fourth-and-1. That became the last offensive play of the day for the 49ers. SF opened the game with an impressive series that ended when Garoppolo hit WR Deebo Samuel with a 33-yard TD strike on a fourth-and-2. After a Garoppolo fumble on his 23, the Ravens tied the game at 7-7 on a 20-yard Jackson-to-TE Mark Andrews TD. In the second quarter, Jackson finished a 13-play drive with a 1-yard hop and skip to the end zone to give Baltimore a 14-7 lead. The 49ers roared back, tying the game on a 40-yard RB Raheem Mostert sweep. A 30-yard Tucker FG gave the Ravens a 17-14 halftime advantage. After Jackson's first lost fumble of the season, the 49ers tied the game at 17 on K Robbie Gould's 32-yard FG. Garoppolo finished 15-of-21 for 165 yards, while Mostert rushed for a career-high 146 yards on 19 carries (7.7 avg.) RB Mark Ingram II added 59 rushing yards for the Ravens. After 12 games, the Ravens have already set a single-season team record with 49 TDs scored.

• Ravens games can be heard on 98Rock (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM/101.5 FM, baltimoreravens.com, in the Ravens mobile app (when fans are in Baltimore) and on 26 regional affiliates. The network broadcast spans four states – Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware & Kentucky – and Washington, D.C.

• Additionally, Ravens games can be heard in Spanish on WDCN La Nueva 87.7 FM in the D.C. area. Games are called by David Andrade and Gustavo Salazar, with Ximena Lugo as producer.

PLAYOFF PERFORMERS



In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in seven (2008-12, 2014 & 2018) of his 11 full seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of only six teams (NE – 10; GB – 8; Bal., Ind., Pit. & Sea. – 7) to earn at least seven postseason berths in the last 11 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in six of those seven playoff campaigns.)
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 16.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the fourth-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 11 seasons all time. (See chart at left.)
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- Of coaches to make the playoffs in at least seven of their first 11 years, "Harbs" is one of four active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll - 8, Andy Reid - 8 & Mike Tomlin - 8).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

HORTON INHERITS A RICH HISTORY

Following the retirement of longtime ST coordinator Jerry Rosburg, Chris Horton took over as the Ravens' special teams coach in 2019. Horton served as Rosburg's assistant for the past three seasons and now leads Baltimore's standout ST battery.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (259) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.6% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (259-of-286 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

2018: ANOTHER RAVENS RETURN MAN SCORES BIG

• In 2018's Week 12 win vs. Oakland, Baltimore CB/RS Cyrus Jones posted a 70-yard punt return TD, marking the Ravens' first PR-TD since 10/15/17, when Michael Campanaro had a 77-yarder vs. Chicago. Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: Campanaro, Kaelin Clay, Tandon Doss, C. Jones, Jacoby Jones and Lardarius Webb.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS IN JONES' MAGICAL SEASON

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

ROMAN ELEVATED TO O.C.

Following the 2018 season, the Ravens named Greg Roman their offensive coordinator. Roman is a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent 2018 as the team's assistant head coach/TEs coach. He re-joined the Ravens in 2017 as a senior offensive assistant/TEs coach after his first stint with the team as an assistant O-line coach from 2006-07.

Previously, Roman was a successful "O" coordinator with the Buffalo Bills (2015-16) and San Francisco 49ers (2011-14). With each team, Roman worked with QBs who totaled their highest single-season passer ratings under his guidance: Tyrod Taylor (Bills – 99.4 in 2015), Colin Kaepernick (49ers – 98.3 in 2012) and Alex Smith (49ers – 104.1 in 2012).

Baltimore also permitted the league's second-fewest points per game (17.9), just behind Chicago's 17.7. For his coaching efforts, Martindale was recognized by *SI/MMQB* as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the *AP* NFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award.

The 2019 campaign marks Martindale's 15th season in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he was Denver's D.C.

Eric DeCosta's loyalty, love and pride for the Baltimore Ravens are unmatched. A pillar of the organization's well laid foundation, DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019.

Prior to being named executive vice president and general manager this past January – succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome – DeCosta, 48, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore. Simply put, Eric's respect for – and thorough understanding of – the Ravens' culture aligned perfectly with his pursuit of a dream job.

THE YEAR OF LAMAR

- X Lamar Jackson is the only QB in NFL history with at least 2,500 passing yards and 950 rushing yards in a season. (He has 2,532 passing & 977 rushing yards in 2019, with four games to play.)
- X Jackson has been responsible for an NFL-best 32 total TDs this season (25 passing & 7 rushing).
- X In his last five games, Jackson has thrown 14 TDs and 0 INTs, completing 72.9% of his passes for 882 yards and a 136.8 rating. He also has 401 rushing yards and 4 rushing TDs during this time.
- X Jackson has produced two perfect passer ratings this season (at Cin. & at Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the pristine 158.3 mark twice in a single season.
- X In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou) and 12 (at LAR), Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and have at least 50 yards rushing in back-to-back games.
- X Jackson's 977 rushing yards are the second most ever in a season by a quarterback. He's on pace to shatter Michael Vick's single-season QB rushing record (1,039) with a projected 1,303 clip.
- X Jackson's 6.98 ypc rush avg. in 2019 ranks No. 1 in the NFL. He has posted an NFL-high 246 rushing yards on third down.
- X Jackson has registered at least 60 rushing yards in nine-straight games, ranking as the most consecutive 60+ rushing outputs by a QB in NFL single-season history.
- X In Week 6's victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)
- X In Week 2's win over Arizona, Jackson became the only player in NFL history to throw for at least 250 yards and rush for at least 120 yards in a regular season game.
- X Michael Vick (8), Jackson (5) and Russell Wilson (4) own the most "double-triples" (at least 100 rushing and passing yards in the same game) in league history.
- X With 4 TD passes vs. Houston in Week 11, Jackson became the only QB in Ravens single-season history with at least 4 TD passes in multiple games. (He had 5 in Week 1 at Miami.)

2016: PERHAPS THE BEST SEASON EVER

- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:
- Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.' He's debuted a 'boomerang' punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

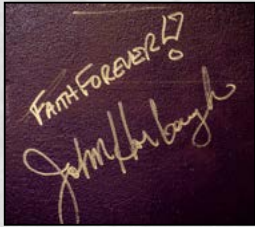
