JUST THE FACTS

- The Baltimore Ravens kick off their 24th season when they open the 2019 NFL campaign vs. the Miami Dolphins (Sept. 8 at 1 p.m. ET). Fresh off a 4-0 preseason (which includes a streak of 17-consecutive preseason games won since 2016), Baltimore looks to capture a victory in its fourth-straight season opener. Under head coach John Harbaugh, the Ravens are 8-3 on Kickoff Weekend.
- Baltimore owns a 7-6 regular season series lead vs. the Dolphins. Under Coach Harbaugh, the Ravens are 7-1 overall (1-0 playoffs) vs. Miami, which includes a 40-0 victory when the teams last battled during the 2017 campaign. Baltimore last played in South Florida in 2015, when Miami emerged victorious, 15-13.
- Winning six of the last seven games in 2018 — all with QB Lamar Jackson as the starter — Baltimore (10-6) captured its first AFC North Division title since 2012 and earned a playoff berth for the seventh time during Coach Harbaugh's 11-year tenure. The Ravens returned to the postseason for the first time since 2014 and fell at home in the Wild Card round, 23-17, to the Los Angeles Chargers.
- Under Coach Harbaugh, who is in his 12th season, Baltimore owns the NFL's fifth-most total wins (114) since his 2008 Charm City arrival. The Ravens have appeared in three AFC title games (2008, 2011 & 2012) with "Harbs" at the helm, and in 2012, won Super Bowl XLVII.
- This past January, Eric DeCosta, who started as a scouting intern with the Ravens in the team's first year (1996), began his new role as Baltimore's EVP & GM. DeCosta replaces Ozzie Newsome, who continues to hold a significant role in the organization as an EVP.

COACH HARBAUGH SAYS

JOHN HARBAUGH ON THE UNKNOWNNS THAT WEEK 1 BRINGS:

"I don't know what's going to happen on Sunday. We don't know how certain things are going to look or how guys are going to respond. Whatever happens, we'll deal with it. That's the beauty of it; that's what's exciting. That's the drama. We're going to go out there and find out a lot on the first Sunday. We'll come out of it, and there will be a lot of good things that we can build from, but there will be a lot of things that aren't good that we're going to have to get straightened out. That is knowable. I do know that. We'll have to see what those things are."

INJURY UPDATE

The Ravens have six players on Injured Reserve, including standout nickelback Tavon Young, who sustained a neck injury in training camp.

RB MARK INGRAM II ON WHY PEOPLE ARE DRAWN TO QB LAMAR JACKSON:

"He doesn't think he's better than anybody or that anybody needs to put him on some type of pedestal. He's a hard worker, and he wants to be great. Anybody can relate to that. You have to put in the work, and hopefully, you want to be the best at what you're doing, which he does. He's relatable, personable and down to Earth. He has that hunger, and he has that drive. He's just one of the guys, and that's what you respect about him, that's what you love about him."

During the John Harbaugh Era (2008-18), the Ravens have finished in the Top 10 in total defense (yards allowed) eight times, ranking most in the NFL. Baltimore has also tallied eight Top 10 finishes in points allowed, second only to New England (10).

The Ravens produced the NFL's No. 1 overall defense (yards allowed per game) and permitted the league's second-fewest points per game. It marked the second time (2006) in team history that Baltimore posted the league's No. 1 unit.

STRONG ON THIRD DOWN

The Ravens produced the NFL's No. 3 third-down defense and the league's sixth-best third-down offense. No offense in the NFL was better on third-and-short (4 yards or less) than the Ravens, who converted 77.8% of their attempts (49 of 63).

ACTION JACKSON

QB Lamar Jackson rushed for 695 yards in 2018, the most among NFL QBs. In his last seven games alone (all starts with a 6-1 record), Jackson posted 556 rushing yards, which ranked as the NFL's seventh-most overall from Weeks 11-17.

• Ravens senior advisor to player engagement O.J. Brigrance entered the NFL with the Miami Dolphins as a free agent. He played four seasons (1996-99) in Miami, appearing in 60 games (adding five playoff games). Brigrance was voted team captain twice in four years with the Dolphins, and his teammates selected him as the Ed Block Courage Award recipient in 1999.

• Dolphins director of personnel analytics Eugene Shen worked in the Ravens' analytics department from 2014-18.

• Baltimore senior VP of football operations Pat Moriarty spent training camp (RB) with the Dolphins in 1981.

Local Connections

• Ravens QB Lamar Jackson hails from Pompano Beach, FL, just 30 minutes from Hard Rock Stadium. Jackson attended Boynton Beach HS, where he was a four-star prospect in the state of Florida. Jackson received a key to the city in 2017.

• Baltimore WR Marquise "Hollywood" Brown is a native of Hollywood, FL. He attended Chaminade-Madonna HS, located 25 minutes from Miami, lettering in football and track.

• The Ravens have a number of other players from Florida: ILB Chris Board (Orlando), TE Hayden Hurst (Jacksonville), OLB Pernell McPhee (Pahokee), WR/RS Chris Moore (Tampa) and WR Seth Roberts (McClay).

• Ravens assistant special teams coach T.J. Weist served as the offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach at South Florida in 2016. Weist was promoted to interim head coach after the regular season and led the Bulls to a 46-39 victory in OT over South Carolina in the 2016 Birmingham Bowl.

• Ravens Southeast area scout Andrew Raphael attended the University of Miami. He worked as a student assistant to the national recruiting coordinator for the Hurricanes during the 2010 season, and he currently resides in Delray Beach, FL.

• The Ravens' 2019 radio team features Gerry Sandusky and former Ravens OLB Jarret Johnson. Sandusky, WBAL-TV 11's sports director, delivers the play-by-play for the broadcast team, while Johnson serves as a color analyst.

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in seven (2008-12, 2014 & 2018) of his 11 seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of only six teams (NE – 10; GB – 8; Bal., Ind., Pit. & Sea. – 7) to earn at least seven postseason berths in the last 11 years. (Baltimore has won at least one game in six of those seven playoff campaigns.)
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 16.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the fourth-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first 11 seasons all time. (See chart at left.)
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- Of coaches to make the playoffs in at least seven of their first 11 years, "Harbs" is one of four active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll - 8, Andy Reid - 8 & Mike Tomlin - 8).
- Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

RAVENS SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

HORTON INHERITS A RICH HISTORY

Following the 2019 retirement of longtime ST coordinator Jerry Rosburg, Chris Horton took over as the Ravens' special teams coach. Horton served as Rosburg's assistant coach for the past three seasons and now leads Baltimore's standout ST battery.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (237) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.1% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (237-of-263 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

2018: ANOTHER RAVENS RETURN MAN SCORES BIG

• In Week 12's win vs. Oakland, Baltimore native CB/RS Cyrus Jones posted a 70-yard punt return TD, marking the Ravens' first PR-TD since 10/15/17, when Michael Campanaro had a 77-yarder vs. Chicago. Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: Campanaro, Kaelin Clay, Tandon Doss, C. Jones, Jacoby Jones and Lardarius Webb.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS IN JONES' MAGICAL SEASON

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens own the NFL's third-most blocked kicks (13, tied), including an NFL-high 4 (tied) in 2016.

WINK IS THE D.C.

In his first year (2018) as Baltimore's defensive coordinator, Don "Wink" Martindale led the Ravens' unit to a No. 1-overall ranking, allowing an NFL-best 292.9 yards per game. Baltimore also permitted the league's second-fewest points per game (17.9), just behind Chicago's 17.7. For his coaching efforts, Martindale was recognized by *Sports Illustrated/MMQB* as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the APNFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award.

The 2019 campaign marks Martindale's 15th season in the NFL, where he has also spent time with Oakland (2004-08) and Denver (2009-10). In 2010, he served as the Broncos' defensive coordinator.

ROMAN ELEVATED TO O.C.

Following the 2018 season, the Ravens named Greg Roman their offensive coordinator. Roman is a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent 2018 as the team's assistant head coach/TEs coach. He re-joined the Ravens in 2017 as a senior offensive assistant/TEs coach after his first stint with the team as an assistant O-line coach from 2006-07.

Previously, Roman was a successful "O" coordinator with the Buffalo Bills (2015-16) and San Francisco 49ers (2011-14). With each team, Roman worked with QBs who totaled their highest single-season passer ratings under his guidance: Tyrod Taylor (Bills – 99.4 in 2015), Colin Kaepernick (49ers – 98.3 in 2012) and Alex Smith (49ers – 104.1 in 2012).

EVP & GM ERIC DECOSTA

Eric DeCosta's loyalty, love and pride for the Baltimore Ravens are unmatched. A pillar of the organization's well laid foundation, DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019.

Prior to being named executive vice president and general manager this past January – succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome – DeCosta, 48, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore. Simply put, Eric's respect for – and thorough understanding of – the Ravens' culture aligned perfectly with his pursuit of a dream job.

24TH RAVENS SEASON

"The perfect word is seamless. He's had the experience of watching how Ozzie [Newsome] takes over a room – building a consensus, but [knowing] you have to make the final call. Building that strong consensus with great football minds is what has allowed Ozzie to have the success he's had, and I think Eric obviously understands that very well. 

THE WIZARDRY OF OZ

- Tucker is a six-time AFC Special Teams Player of the Month, ranking three more than legends S Ed Reed & K Matt Stover for the most POM awards in Ravens history. (Tucker has also earned a team-record nine AFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.)
- Tucker's 6 FGs on 12/16/13 at Detroit set a team record and a single-game NFL high in 2013. He became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- & 60-yard range in a game.

2016: PERHAPS THE BEST SEASON EVER

- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best pct. in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are facts about his remarkable season, arguably the best ever by a kicker:
- Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- In Week 12 of 2016 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.'" He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

On Day 3 of the 2019 NFL Draft, 13-year-old Mo Gaba stole the hearts of many as he became the first person in history to announce a draft pick in Braille. Live from Baltimore's Inner Harbor, and with millions watching, Mo announced G Ben Powers as the 123rd pick of the draft. On Aug. 27, Mo paid a visit to the Ravens' facility to enjoy a delicious lunch, interact with his favorite players and call the final play of practice. Mo has become a staple in the Baltimore community, so it was no surprise when players and staff lined up for the chance to meet and thank him for being such an inspiration.





JOHN HARBAUGH MONDAY PRESS CONFERENCE

Opening statement: “Good to see everybody; I appreciate you guys being here. Forgive my voice. It was gone, but it’s coming back just in time.”

It looks like a hurricane is happening in Miami. How much do you, as a team, monitor things like that? (Jamison Hensley) “We look at all that. In this case, it shouldn’t be an issue, so we’re not looking at it at all, other than praying for those who are going to be in the way of it. We’re hoping for the best for them.”

Have you decided who will start at left guard? (Bo Smolka) “Yes, we’ve decided. We have our starting lineup all set up, but we’re not going to share that information. Why would we? What would be the advantage for us to do that?”

You’re facing a team with a new head coach in Miami. What are the challenges in preparing for a team that is starting anew? (Mark Viviano) “They’re new in a lot of ways, no question. Obviously, they have Coach [Brian] Flores in there from New England. All three coordinators have ties to that system. I would say that’s kind of their philosophy, scheme and strategy. It’s built along those lines. I have the utmost respect for it. Of course, we studied a lot of that as well. A lot of the study that we’ve done has not just been Miami tape, but it was also a lot of New England tape. We’ve had to take a hard look at the new players they brought in this week. That’s something we’re in the process of doing right now. It’s a big challenge. They have great schemes, excellent coaches and excellent players. We don’t really know what to expect, but I don’t know if you ever really do in your opener. You never know. You expect to get things that are off what you expect, and you just have to apply what you do and try to do as best as you can the way you play the game.”

One of the things about the 53-man roster that was different from previous years was choosing five defensive linemen as opposed to more. What were the factors in going with five? (Aaron Kasnitz) “There is no real factor. We took the guys that played the best. Five is not a low number. If you look at it from an even front standpoint, that would be 10 D-linemen, if you count five defensive ends, which is really what those guys are. None of those guys would be off-the-ball linebackers. We usually go a little heavy in the D-line, to be honest with you, especially with the way the game is being played now. You don’t really see too much base defense anymore. It’s less than 20 percent.”

One player a lot of fans had questions about was RB Kenneth Dixon. He played so much in the preseason, what happened that he wound up on Injured Reserve? (Luke Jones) “He’s hurt. He has a knee ... It’s actually a bone bruise that is a fracture. He has a fractured knee. That’s not to say he would have necessarily made the team. It would have been based on how he played. He’s on IR. He’ll be released injured, so Kenny will be moving on.”

You mentioned that there is a lot you don’t know about an opponent in an opening game. How about what you don’t know about yourself right now with a lot that is new with the Ravens? (Mark Viviano) “That’s true, too. It’s unknowable. [It’s like the] Donald Rumsfeld quote from a few years back: You have to know what the unknowables are, and you can’t worry about them too much. I don’t know what’s going to happen on Sunday. We don’t know how certain things are going to look or how guys are going to respond. We might have confidence. Whatever happens, we’ll deal with it. But that’s the beauty of it. That’s what’s exciting. That’s the drama. We’re going to go out there and find out a lot on the first Sunday. We’ll come out of it, and there will be a lot of good things that we can build from, but there will be a lot of things that aren’t good that we’re going to have to get straightened out. That is knowable. I do know that. We’ll have to see what those things are.”

As you were looking ahead to everything you wanted to do with QB Lamar Jackson, you entrusted a lot of that to offensive coordinator Greg Roman. At this point, with the season here, how pleased are you with the progress they have made together? (Childs Walker) “I’m very pleased. I’m very happy with it. I don’t know how to elaborate on that. What do you want me to talk about? Pleased, yes – happy. I’m looking forward to seeing how it plays out.”

What challenges do the Dolphins present after naming QB Ryan Fitzpatrick their starting quarterback? What challenges does he pose? (Jamison Hensley) “He’s always played well against us if you go back and look at it, so we have nothing but respect for Ryan Fitzpatrick. He’s been good. He’s proven. He’s had a lot of big games. He opened up [last] season with a couple of 400-yard passing games. He’s a little bit of a swashbuckler, I would say. He’s not afraid to throw it in there, run



around. He tries to make plays. Every single play, he tries to make a play out of [it]. A lot of times he does, sometimes he doesn't. Sometimes he hurts them. We're hoping we're able to cause that and do some damage that way. But we have a lot of respect for him. He's a great pro, and I'm not at all surprised that they chose him to be the starting quarterback."

Throughout training camp, you eased WR Marquise Brown along. Where is he at now? Is he full-go going into Week 1? (Aaron Kasnitz) "Yes, he is full-go." (Reporter: "What are the challenges he has to overcome to get off to a good start?") "He's a rookie. He hasn't had a lot of reps. He's going to have to get up to speed quickly. We'll have to be vigilant in what we ask him to do, things that he can do well. It'll be a challenge for them, too, to cover him. He's really fast. He has great hands. That's the challenge the other way."

You said the expectation with QB Robert Griffin III was that he would be ready for Week 1. Has he been officially cleared? (Luke Jones) "My understanding is that he's cleared. That's my understanding right now. We'll practice on Wednesday, and I expect him to be out there full-go."

Similar to the defensive linemen, the choice to leave ILB Otaru Alaka at the fourth inside linebacker ... What did he do that earned him the spot there? Was there concern with keeping just three inside linebackers? Was that part of it? (Bo Smolka) "It really wasn't. That was the plan originally. Anthony Levine can play in there. We have a lot of options with our fronts. We're not just back here lined up and playing standard defense. We could play with one linebacker if we want. We have a lot of ways to manipulate the front and alignments to handle any kind of a shortage that we might have. A few teams have kept three inside linebackers, you may have noticed that. [We took] the best guys. He played really well. He's a big, fast guy. He played well on [special] teams in the preseason, and he earned it. That was really the reason."
