— KEY TRANSACTIONS —

- Bradley Bozeman was selected by the Ravens in the sixth round (215th overall) of the 2018 NFL Draft...Was the third (S DeShon Elliott, 190th, and T Greg Senat, 212th) of Baltimore's three picks in the round

— HONORS —

- Ravens NFL Walter Payton Man of the Year (2020)

— CAREER HIGHLIGHTS —

- Blocks for a rushing attack that has topped 100 rushing yards in 39-consecutive games, marking the second-longest streak of its kind in NFL history (Pittsburgh – 43 games, 1974-77)
- In 2020, started at LG in all 16 games, helping block for the NFL's No. 1 rushing attack (191.9 ypg), which produced the third-most yards (3,071) ever in a 16-game NFL season... Baltimore owned the seventh-best scoring offense (29.3 ppg) and fourth-best third-down offense (48.8%)... The Ravens also tallied a franchise-record 24 rushing TDs
- Started at LG and helped block for a rushing attack that totaled 110 ground yards and 2 TDs in the 24-10 win at Ind. (11/8/20)... Baltimore scored 17 unanswered in the second half to capture the victory and set an NFL record with its 31st-straight game scoring at least 20 points
- In 2019, helped the Ravens set an NFL record for single-season rushing yards (3,296) and produce the NFL's No. 1 scoring offense (33.2 ppg)... Assisted Baltimore in becoming the first team in NFL history to average at least 200 rushing (206.0) and 200 net passing (201.6) yards per game in a season
- Helped the Ravens set new single-season franchise records for total TDs (64), points (531), rushing yards (3,296) and total net yards (6,521)
- Blocked for NFL MVP QB Lamar Jackson, who produced one of the greatest seasons ever by a QB in 2019... Jackson threw an NFL-high 36 TDs (also a franchise record) and posted 1,206 rushing yards, the most by a QB in NFL single-season history
- In the Week 15 win vs. NYJ, blocked for QB Lamar Jackson, who set the NFL single-season rushing record for a QB and threw 5 TD passes in a game for the third time in the 2019 season (12/12/19)
- In 2018, helped the Ravens produce the NFL's No. 2 rushing attack, totaling 2,441 yards (152.6 ypg)... Marked the then-second-most rushing yards in franchise single-season history

- Played 28 snaps at LG, seeing relief for G/T James Hurst, as part of an offensive line that helped pave the way for 242 rushing yards in the 20-12 win vs. TB (12/16/18)... Baltimore became the first team since 1976 (Steelers) to rush for at least 190 yards in five-consecutive games
- Made his first-career start at LG for an O-line that helped the offense record 351 total yards vs. NO (10/21/18)... Filled in for an injured G/T Alex Lewis (neck)

— PERSONAL —

- Made headlines after Alabama's 2017 National Championship win by proposing to his wife, Nikki, on the field... Bozeman and Nikki were married in March 2019
- The couple launched the Bradley and Nikki Bozeman Foundation, which works with at-risk children and their families with a focus on the dangers of childhood bullying, aiming to reinforce the importance of respect and standing up for others in vulnerable positions... The foundation also focuses on food security in underserved communities, regularly distributing thousands of meals to those in need
- Graduated with a degree in exercise & sport science from the University of Alabama and is pursuing a master's in sports business management

2020: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 16/16, 2/2)

- Started at LG in all 16 games, helping block for the NFL's No. 1 rushing attack (191.9 ypg), which produced the third-most yards (3,071) ever in a 16-game NFL season... Baltimore owned the seventh-best scoring offense (29.3 ppg) and fourth-best third-down offense (48.8%)... The Ravens also tallied a franchise-record 24 rushing TDs
- Started at LG and helped block for an offense that totaled a postseason franchise-record 236 rushing yards and a 6.7 yards-per-carry mark in the 20-13 Wild Card Playoff win at Ten. (1/10/21)
- Started at LG and helped block for an offense that totaled a franchise-record 404 rushing yards in the 38-3 win at Cin. (1/3/21)... The 404 rushing yards stand as the fourth most in an NFL game since 1950 and the second most since the 1970 merger... Baltimore registered its fifth-consecutive victory to earn the franchise's third-straight playoff berth
- Started at LG and helped block for an offense that totaled 249 rushing yards in the 27-13 win vs. NYG (12/27)
- Started at LG and helped block for an offense that totaled 250 passing yards and 159 rushing yards in the 40-14 win vs. Jax. (12/20)... Also helped the offense convert on 8-of-12 third downs and notch 40 points for the second-straight week
- Started at LG and helped the offense produce 231 rushing yards and a franchise-tying 5 rushing TDs in the 47-42 win at Cle. (12/14)

- Started at LG and helped the offense produce a season-high 294 rushing yards (the fourth most in single-game franchise history), including a 2020 NFL single-game high 5 rushes of 20+ yards, vs. Dal. (12/8)
- Started at LG and helped block for a rushing attack that totaled 110 ground yards and 2 TDs in the 24-10 win at Ind. (11/8)...Baltimore scored 17 unanswered in the second half to capture the victory and set an NFL record with its 31st-straight game scoring at least 20 points
- Started at LG and helped the offense produce 265 rushing yards against the league's second-ranked run defense entering the game (68.8 yards) vs. Pit. (11/1)...Baltimore's 265 rushing yards marked the most the Ravens have had in a game vs. Pittsburgh and the most the Steelers have allowed since 1993 (267 vs. Seattle)
- Started at LG and helped the offense produce 182 rushing yards on 37 carries (4.9 avg) in the 30-28 win at (10/18)...Helped QB Lamar Jackson (108) record his seventh-career 100-yard rushing game
- Started at LG and helped the Ravens produce 161 rushing yards on 24 attempts (6.7 avg) in the 27-3 win vs. Cin. (10/11)
- Helped the Ravens produce 206 passing yards and 144 rushing yards in the 31-17 win at Was. (10/4)
- Helped Baltimore rush for 158 yards on 21 attempts, producing a 7.5 yards-per-carry average vs. KC (9/28)...The 7.5 yards per carry stands as the third-highest single-game clip in franchise history (8.37 vs. Cle. on 9/14/03 & 7.7 vs. Det. on 12/13/09)
- Helped pave the way for Baltimore's rushing attack to gain 230 yards in the 33-16 win at Hou. (9/20)...Also blocked for QB Lamar Jackson, who completed 18-of-24 passes (75%) for 204 yards and 1 TD
- Helped block for QB Lamar Jackson, who completed 20-of-25 (80%) passes for 275 yards and 3 TDs, producing a 152.1 passer rating in the season-opening win vs. Cle. (9/13)...Jackson also added a team-high 45 rushing yards on 7 carries (6.4 avg.)

2019: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 16/16, 1/1)

- Helped Baltimore set an NFL record for single-season rushing yards (3,296) and produce the NFL's No. 1 scoring offense (33.2 ppg) in 2019
- The Ravens became the first team in NFL history to average at least 200 rushing (206.0) and 200 net passing yards per game (201.6) in a season
- Helped the Ravens set new single-season franchise records for total TDs (64), points (531), rushing yards (3,296) and total net yards (6,521)
- Blocked for NFL MVP QB Lamar Jackson, who produced one of the greatest seasons ever...Jackson threw an NFL-high 36 TDs (also a franchise record) and had 1,206 rushing yards, the most by a QB in NFL single-season history

2018: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 14/1, 1/0)

- Helped the Ravens produce the NFL's No. 2 rushing attack, totaling 2,441 yards (152.6 ypg)...Marked the then-second-most rushing yards in franchise single-season history
- Played 28 snaps at LG, seeing relief for G/T James Hurst, as part of an offensive line that helped pave the way for 242 rushing yards in the 20-12 win vs. TB (12/16)...Baltimore became the first team since 1976 (Steelers) to rush for at least 190 yards in five-consecutive games
- Made his first-career start at LG for an O-line that helped the offense record 351 total yards vs. NO (10/21)...Filled in for an injured G/T Alex Lewis (neck)
- Played 17 snaps at LG, seeing relief for an injured G/T Alex Lewis (neck), in the 21-0 win at Ten. (10/14)...Helped the Ravens' line to not allow a sack of QB Joe Flacco
- In his first-career NFL game, played 7 snaps on special teams and 25 snaps on offense, seeing relief for RG Marshal Yanda in the 47-3 season-opening win vs. Buf. (9/9)

— COLLEGE —

- Appeared in 53 career games (31 starts) in five seasons at Alabama, starting at center for his last two years...Alabama finished 64-7 and won two national championships (2015, 2017) during his playing career
- Anchored a unit that was a finalist for the Joe Moore Award (Most Outstanding O-Line) in 2016 and 2017
- Blocked for 17 100-yard rushers in 31 career starts
- As a captain in 2017, earned first-team *Associated Press* All-SEC honors while garnering second-team All-SEC recognition from the conference coaches...Also named a second-team All-American by all five major outlets and Sports Illustrated

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Prepped at Handley (Roanoke, AL) HS, where he was a four-star offensive lineman and rated the No. 14 overall player in the state of Alabama and the No. 26 offensive tackle nationally by *Rivals.com*
- Was rated No. 7 overall on the final *AL.com* A-List
- Earned first-team 3A All-State honors from the Alabama Sports Writers Association as a junior in 2011
