— KEY TRANSACTIONS —

- Daniel Faalele was selected by the Ravens in the fourth round (110th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft... Was the first of six Ravens' draft picks (CB Jalyn Armour-Davis, 119th; TE Charlie Kolar, 128th; P Jordan Stout, 130th; TE Isaiah Likely, 139th and CB Damarion Williams, 141st) in the round

— CAREER HIGHLIGHTS —

- Saw action in 16 games (two starts) for the Ravens in 2023, helping block for the NFL's No. 1 rushing offense (156.6 ypg) and No. 4 scoring offense (28.4 ppg)... The ground game eclipsed 100 yards in all 17 contests, while also setting a single-season franchise record with 26 rushing TDs
- Appeared in 16 games (one start) as a rookie in 2022, seeing action on 170 offensive snaps (16%) and 71 special teams snaps (18%)
- Filled in for injured LTs Ronnie Stanley and Patrick Mekari, making his first-career start, vs. Buf. (10/2/22)... Helped protect QB Lamar Jackson and secure running lanes for a ground game that totaled 162 yards and 1 TD
- Saw his first significant action on the offensive line (54 snaps), filling in at LT for the injured OL Patrick Mekari (ankle), in the 37-26 win at NE (9/25/22)... Blocked on an O-line that helped Baltimore rush for a season-high 188 yards and 1 TD on 26 carries (7.2 avg.)... Protected QB Lamar Jackson, who produced the second game in NFL history (also QB Randall Cunningham in 1990) with 4 passing TDs, 100 rushing yards and 1 rushing TD

— PERSONAL —

- Grew up in Melbourne, Australia, where he originally played basketball and rugby when he was younger... Moved to the U.S. (Bradenton, FL) to attend IMG Academy and began playing football in 2016
- Was originally discovered as a football prospect by a University of Hawaii coaching staffer who was recruiting in Australia... Faalele later participated in a "satellite football camp" in Australia that was organized by Michigan head coach Jim Harbaugh, the brother of Ravens head coach John
- In 2019, was featured in *GQ Australia* as one of "Australia's 50 Greatest Living Athletes"
- Has one younger brother (Taylor), who currently attends IMG Academy and is a defensive lineman
- Was roommates with Ravens WR Rashod Bateman while they were teammates at Minnesota
- Graduated with a degree in business and marketing... Enjoys building computers in his spare time
- **Last name pronounced: FAH-ah-LAY-lay**

2023: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 16/2, 2/0)

- Saw action in 16 games (two starts), helping block for the NFL's No. 1 rushing offense (156.6 ypg) and No. 4 scoring offense (28.4 ppg)... The ground game eclipsed 100 yards in all 17 contests, while also setting a single-season franchise record with 26 rushing TDs
- Saw action at RT, helping block for a Ravens offense that scored twice through the air and twice on the ground, while producing the third-highest postseason rushing mark (229 yards) in franchise history, in the 34-10 Divisional Playoff win vs. Hou. (1/20/24)
- Saw action at RT, blocking for an offense that produced 491 yards of offense (331 passing & 160 rushing) and a season-high 56 points in the No.-1-seed-clinching 56-19 win vs. Mia. (12/31)... Baltimore's 56 points also marked the second-highest total in franchise history and the most points ever scored at M&T Bank Stadium
- Filled in at RT, blocking for an offense that rushed for 251 yards and 1 TD in the playoff-clinching 23-7 win at Jax. (12/17)... Baltimore's 251 rushing yards marked the 30th-straight game in which the rushing attack eclipsed triple digits, tying for the fourth-longest streak since the 1970 merger
- Saw action at RT, helping block for an offense that totaled 325 yards (125 rushing yards & 210 passing yards) and 1 TD at Pit. (10/8)
- Saw action at RT in place of the injured T Morgan Moses, who left the game and did not return after sustaining a shoulder injury in the second quarter, helping block for an offense that completed 15-of-19 passes (78.9%), rushed for 131 yards and reached the end zone on all 4 red zone trips in the 28-3 victory at Cle. (10/1)

2022: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 16/1, 1/0)

- Appeared in 16 games (one start) as a rookie, seeing action on 170 offensive snaps (16%) and 71 special teams snaps (18%)... Made his first-career start vs. Buf. (10/2)
- Filled in for injured LTs Ronnie Stanley and Patrick Mekari, making his first-career start, vs. Buf. (10/2)... Helped protect QB Lamar Jackson and secure running lanes for a ground game that totaled 162 yards and 1 TD
- Saw his first significant action on the offensive line (54 snaps), filling in at LT for the injured OL Patrick Mekari (ankle), in the 37-26 win at NE (9/25)... Blocked on an O-line that helped Baltimore rush for a season-high 188 yards and 1 TD on 26 carries (7.2 avg.)... — COLLEGE —

- Starting 31 of 34 career games, helped Minnesota produce a 23-11 record in contests in which he played
- Scored a 2-yard rushing TD against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl, which was his last collegiate game
- As a senior in 2021, helped the Gophers to a 9-4 record by blocking for an offense that totaled 4,681 yards and 25.5 ppg
- As a sophomore in 2019, helped block for an offense that registered 5,616 yards (third most in school history), for a school-record 3,293 passing yards and 443 points scored (second most in school history)⁵
- His college honors include: Senior Bowl invitation (2022); first-team All-Big Ten by the coaches (2021); second-team All-Big Ten by the *Associated Press* (2021); third-team All-Big Ten by the media (2021); Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Finalist (2021); Academic All-Big Ten (2020-21); honorable mention All-Big Ten (2018-19); Minnesota's Outstanding Offensive Freshman (2018)

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Attended IMG Academy (Bradenton, FL) from 2016-17, when he first learned to play competitive football
- In 2017, helped IMG produce an undefeated season by anchoring an offense that averaged 27.8 points and 177 rushing yards per game
- In 2016, only practiced with the team as he became acclimated to the sport of football



— FAALELE'S COMMUNITY IMPACT —

- Attended the Ravens annual Holiday Helpers event at Target to shop for gifts with Baltimore youth in need (2023)
- Participated in the Baltimore Ravens' annual organization-wide volunteer day to build a state-of-the-art playground and provide significant upgrades at Morrell Park Elementary/Middle School and Recreation Center in Baltimore City (2023)...The construction and renovation project marks a \$200,000 community investment fully funded by the Ravens Foundation, Inc., in partnership with KABOOM!, Heart of America, Baltimore City Public Schools and Baltimore City Recreation and Park
- Joined teammates and Ravens President, Sashi Brown, for the ribbon cutting ceremony of the new Ravens-themed playground in Northwest Regional Park (2022)
- Participated in the Baltimore Ravens' annual organization-wide volunteer day to establish new educational spaces at Baltimore City's Franklin Square Elementary/Middle School (2022)...Fully funded by the Ravens Foundation, Inc., the \$200,000 investment project featured multiple renovations with the goal to provide inspiring and engaging learning spaces in Baltimore City...The event was coordinated in partnership with Heart of America, a national nonprofit focused on educational equity through space transformation and resource distribution
