— CAREER HIGHLIGHTS —

- Entering 2020, has appeared in 92 games (88 starts) on the offensive line during his seven-year career
- In his first season with Seattle in 2018, helped the Seahawks lead the NFL in rushing (160.0 ypg)
- After signing with the NYG in 2017, played in nine games (six starts) at RG before being placed on IR (toe)
- Started all 16 games at RG in 2016 and helped the Chargers finish eighth in the NFL in passing yards (262.4 ypg), and ninth in scoring (25.6 ppg)
- In 2015, started all 12 games in his first season at RG and blocked on a Chargers' O-line that helped produce the league's fourth-best passing offense (286.9 ypg)
- Moved to RG in his third year (2015) and started 43 games the next four seasons with San Diego, NYG and Seattle
- In his first two seasons with San Diego (2013-14), started 28 games in the regular season and two playoff games at RT

— PERSONAL —

- Born in New Orleans...Family relocated to Mobile, AL, in 2005 after Hurricane Katrina struck their hometown
- Full name is "Danny Lee Jesus Fluker"
- In San Diego, he frequently visited Juvenile Hall and other facilities that treat at-risk youth...In July 2015, the San Diego Juvenile Justice Commission honored Fluker at its annual awards
- Graduated from the University of Alabama with a bachelor's degree in health studies

- Started at RG in the Divisional Playoff, helping the Seahawks rush for 110 yards and 2 TDs at GB (1/12/20)
- Started at RG in the Wild Card game at Phi. (1/5/20), helping QB Russell Wilson throw for 325 yards (18-of-30) and 1 TD

2018: (SEATTLE SEAHAWKS – 10/9, 1/1)

- Appeared in 10 games (nine starts) at RG, helping Seattle finish as the league's best rushing offense (160.0 ypg)
- Started at RG in the Divisional Playoff at Dal. (1/5/19)
- Blocked for RB Chris Carson, who produced a season-high 122 yards on 19 carries (6.4 avg.), and 1 TD vs. Ari. (12/30)

2017: (NEW YORK GIANTS – 9/6)

- Appeared in nine games (six starts) at RG for the Giants before being placed on Injured Reserve with a toe injury
- Blocked for an offense that finished tied for the league-lead in scoring plays over 20 yards (18)
- Helped block for QB Eli Manning who threw for 366 yards (35-of-47) and 3 TDs with a QB rating of 100.1 at Phi. (9/24)

2016: (SAN DIEGO CHARGERS – 16/16)

- Started all 16 games and blocked for a Chargers' offense that scored 33 passing TDs, tying for fourth-most in the NFL
- Helped RB Melvin Gordon rush for 997 yards on 254 carries and 10 TDs in his 13 games played
- Protected QB Philip Rivers, en route to completing a season-best 73.3% of his attempts (22-of-30), including 242 yards and 3 TDs at Hou. (11/27)...Rivers posted a QB rating of 116.3 behind an O-line that only allowed 1 sack
- Opened lanes for Gordon who produced career-highs in rushing attempts (32), rushing yards (196) and yards per carry (6.1)...Added a rushing TD and 4 receptions for 65 yards vs. Ten. (11/6)

2015: (SAN DIEGO CHARGERS – 12/12)

- Started all 12 games and helped the Chargers finish fourth in the league in passing (286.9 ypg)
- Started at RG and helped block for an offense that produced a season-high 140 yards on the ground...In pass protection, the O-line allowed just 1 sack on 37 attempts as QB Philip Rivers threw for 311 yards and 3 TDs vs. Miami (12/20)
- Appeared at RG as Rivers set franchise records for attempts (65), completions (43) and yards (503) at GB (10/18)

2014: (SAN DIEGO CHARGERS – 16/16)

- Started all 16 games at RT...Part of an O-line that helped generate a 21-point comeback, which is tied for the greatest comeback victory in Chargers franchise history, at SF (12/20)
- Helped pass protect, en route to producing 383 yards and 3 TDs, including a game-winning 10-play, 80-yard drive that

2019: (SEATTLE SEAHAWKS – 14/14, 2/2)

- Started 14 regular season games and two postseason contests at RG

- Blocked for an O-line that helped produce a season-high 162 yards on the ground in a 31-0 shutout victory vs. NYJ (10/5)

2013: (SAN DIEGO CHARGERS – 15/15, 2/2)

- Started 15 games, including two postseason contests at RT, helping the team to a league-best 49.0 third-down conversion percentage...Also part of on O-line that finished tied for fourth in fewest sacks allowed (30)
- Started at RT in the Wild Card game in a 27-10 victory at Cin. (1/5/14)...Blocked for an offense that ran for 196 yards on 40 attempts and 2 TDs
- Earned Pepsi Next NFL Rookie of the Week honors when he shifted to LT as injuries depleted San Diego's O-line...Helped produce 158 rushing yards at Jax. (10/20)

— COLLEGE —

- Played in 37 games (36 starts) at RT at Alabama (2010-12), earning second-team AP All-America and first-team All-SEC as a junior in 2012...Also garnered SEC All-Freshman honors in 2010
- Won the BCS National Championship as a sophomore (2011) and junior (2012)...Redshirted his true freshman season in which the Crimson Tide captured the 2009 BCS National Championship

- Prepped at Foley (AL) HS, where he was named a consensus All-America tackle as a senior in 2009 and was invited to play in the 2009 U.S. Army All-American Bowl
