— KEY TRANSACTIONS —

- Signed a three-year contract with the Ravens on 3/15/21
- Released by the Giants on 3/10/21
- Acquired by the Giants, along with a fifth-round draft pick, from Cleveland, on 3/13/19 in exchange for DE Olivier Vernon and a fourth-round draft choice
- Signed with Cleveland as an unrestricted free agent (Cin.) on 3/9/17
- Originally selected by the Cincinnati Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft

— CAREER HIGHLIGHTS —

- In 2022, started at LG in all 15 games in which he appeared, helping block for the NFL's No. 2 rush offense (160.2 ypg), which produced the league's most rushes (88) of 10+ yards and most games (12) with 150+ rushing yards
- Played on Bengals teams that reached the playoffs in four-consecutive seasons (2012-15) and won two AFC North titles
- Started all 17 games at RG in 2021, blocking for the NFL's sixth-ranked offense (378.8 ypg) and third-best rushing attack (145.8 ypg)... Played an NFL-high 1,223 offensive snaps
- Helped block for a Ravens rushing attack that topped 100 rushing yards in 43 consecutive games (2018-21), tying for the longest streak of its kind in NFL history (Pittsburgh – 1974-77)

— PERSONAL —

- In 2018, finished as runner up on the CBS TV show "NFL's Most Valuable Performer," doing tricks with his rescue dog, Amber... Ravens kicker Justin Tucker won the competition with a rousing rendition of Luciano Pavarotti's "Ave Maria"
- Brothers Eric and Matt played football at Wisconsin Lutheran College
- He and his wife Sarah have two daughters, Kaleia Rose and Parker Lou

2022: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 15/15, 1/1)

- Started at LG in all 15 games in which he appeared, helping block for the NFL's No. 2 rush offense (160.2 ypg), which produced the league's most rushes (88) of 10+ yards and most games (12) with 150+ rushing yards
- Started at RG in the 17-9 victory vs. Atl. (12/24), helping block for a rushing attack that posted 184 yards on 34 attempts (5.4 avg.)... Also helped sustain a clean pocket and protect QB Tyler Huntley, who was kept upright all game (no sacks or QBHs allowed)
- Blocked for an offense that eclipsed 150 rushing yards (188) for the eighth-consecutive game and finished 9-of-15 (60%) on third down in the 27-13 win at NO (11/7)

- Helped block for a Ravens rushing attack that gained 211 yards on 24 carries, averaging a single-game franchise-record 8.8 yards per attempt, at NYG (10/16)
- Started at RG, blocking on an O-line that helped Baltimore rush for a season-high 188 yards and 1 TD on 26 carries (7.2 avg.) in the 37-26 win at NE (9/25)... Protected QB Lamar Jackson, who produced the second game in NFL history (also QB Randall Cunningham in 1990) with 4 passing TDs, 100 rushing yards and 1 rushing TD
- Started at RG, helping QB Lamar Jackson produce 318 passing yards and 119 rushing yards vs. Mia. (9/18)... Jackson threw 3 TDs and ran for another (79 yards), and he set the NFL record for most career 100-yard rushing games (11) by a quarterback

2021: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 17/17)

- Started all 17 games at RG, blocking for the NFL's sixth-ranked offense (378.8 ypg) and third-best rushing attack (145.8 ypg)... Played an NFL-high 1,223 offensive snaps
- Started at RG, helping pave the way for a rushing attack that totaled 249 yards and a season-high 6.9 ypc average vs. Pit. (1/9/22)
- Started at RG at Cin. (12/26), helping protect QB Josh Johnson, whose 304 passing yards were the most by a Ravens' QB in his first start with the team... Johnson was sacked just once, finishing 28-of-40 for 2 TDs and 1 INT
- Started at RG and blocked on all 70 offensive snaps vs. GB (12/19)... Blocked for an offense that produced 215 passing yards and 143 rushing yards, while allowing only 1 sack... Helped QB Tyler Huntley become one of seven NFL QBs since 1960 to throw for 200 yards/2 TDs and rush for 70 yards/2 TDs in a single game
- Started at RG, helping block for a rushing attack that posted 148 yards in the 16-10 win vs. Cle. (11/28)... Baltimore's offense notched 22 total first downs, marking its eighth-consecutive game with at least 20
- Started at RG and helped block for an offense that produced 500 yards (253 passing & 247 rushing) and recorded a franchise record in total first downs gained (36) in the 34-31 OT win vs. Min. (11/7)
- Started at right guard, helping block for a rushing attack that totaled 187 yards and 3 TDs in the 34-6 win vs. LAC (10/17)
- Started at RG, helping block for a passing attack that produced a single-game franchise-record 437 passing yards in the 31-25 win vs. Ind. (10/11)... QB Lamar Jackson finished 37-of-43 passing for 442 yards and 4 TDs (140.5 rating), becoming the first QB in NFL history to complete at least 85% of his passes in a 400-yard game

- Started at RG, helping block for a ground game that extended its 100-yard rushing streak to an NFL-record-tying 43 straight games, in the 23-7 win at Den. (10/3)...Also protected QB Lamar Jackson, who passed for 316 yards and 1 TD
- Started at RG and blocked on all 58 offensive snaps, while adding 6 special teams plays, including K Justin Tucker's game-winning and NFL-record 66-yard FG, in the 19-17 win at Det. (9/26)
- Started at RG and helped block for a rushing attack that produced 251 yards in the 36-35 win vs KC (9/19)...The Ravens eclipsed 100 rushing yards for the 41st-straight game, as the offense converted 6-of-11 (54.5%) third downs and scored a TD on all four red zone opportunities
- Made his Ravens debut while starting at RG at LV (9/13)...Helped Baltimore gain 189 yards on the ground to extend its 100-yard rushing streak to 40 games...Also blocked for QB Lamar Jackson, who completed 19-of-30 passes for 235 yards and 1 TD, adding 86 rushing yards

2020: (NEW YORK GIANTS – 16/16)

- Started all 16 games at right guard in 2020, helping the Giants average 110.5 rushing yards per game and produce 13 rushing TDs
- Blocked for a rushing attack that totaled a season-high 190 rushing yards at Sea. (12/6)
- Helped the Giants tally a season-high 386 net yards, while not surrendering a sack, at Cin. (11/29)

2019: (NEW YORK GIANTS – 15/15)

- Started 15 games at right guard in his first season with New York...Was a member of an O-line that helped QB Daniel Jones set a franchise rookie record with 24 touchdown passes and RB Saquon Barkley rush for more than 1,000 yards for the second-consecutive season
- Started at RG for the Giants' season-high 552-yard output, which tied for the fifth-most yards in franchise history, at Was. (12/22)...It also marked the second time in franchise history the Giants tallied at least 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards in a single game

2018: (CLEVELAND BROWNS – 16/16)

- Started all 16 games for the fourth-consecutive season, blocking on all of Cleveland's offensive snaps...Was named a Pro Bowl alternate...The Browns' O-line did not allow a sack in five of the team's final seven games, permitting an NFL-low 3 sacks during that seven-game stretch
- Played in his 100th career game and saw action on every offensive snap for an O-line that did not surrender a sack for the third-straight contest for the first time since 1988, at Hou. (12/2)
- Helped Cleveland rush for a season-high 211 yards and 1 TD on 29 carries (7.3 avg), while also not permitting a sack in the victory vs. Atl. (11/11)...In 2018, Cleveland was one of five teams (Colts – twice, Panthers, Patriots, Saints) to rush for over 200 yards and not allow a sack in a game

- Played every offensive snap at RG, helping the run game total 208 yards and 3 TDs, at Oak. (9/30)...The 3 rushing TDs marked the most in a game by the Browns since 2014 (twice)
- Helped Cleveland rush for 177 yards vs. Pit. (9/9)

2017: (CLEVELAND BROWNS – 16/16)

- Started all 16 games and played on every offensive snap in his first season with Cleveland
- Helped block for a rushing attack that totaled a season-high 201 rushing yards and 2 TDs at Det. (11/12)
- In his Browns debut, started at RG and played every offensive snap vs. Pit. (9/10)

2016: (CINCINNATI BENGALS – 16/16)

- Started all 16 games at right guard
- Helped block for a rushing attack that totaled 213 rushing yards at Cle. (12/11)
- Helped the Bengals rush for 152 yards and a season-high 3 TDs vs. Was. (10/30)
- Was part of an offense that gained 559 yards, including a season-high 271 on the ground, vs. Cle. (10/23)

2015: (CINCINNATI BENGALS – 16/16, 1/1)

- Started all 16 games and the AFC Wild Card game at right guard...Was a member of an offense that tallied 100-plus rushing yards in 10 games and held opponents without a sack in five games
- Helped block for an offense that registered 321 passing yards and rushed for 4 TDs vs. KC (10/4)...The O-line also did not permit a sack...It marked the second time in franchise history (vs. Dal. – 12/8/1985) Cincinnati totaled at least 300 passing yards and rushed for 4 TDs

2014: (CINCINNATI BENGALS – 12/12, 1/1)

- Started 12 regular season games and the AFC Wild Card game at right guard...Contributed to an O-line unit that did not allow a sack until Week 4 of the season and finished third in the NFL with 23 sacks allowed
- Helped the rushing attack gain a season-high 244 yards, marking the most rushing yards in a game by the Bengals since 2004, at Cle. (12/14)

2013: (CINCINNATI BENGALS – 12/11, 1/1)

- Played in 12 regular season games (11 starts) and started the AFC Wild Card game...Helped the Bengals finish tied for sixth in scoring (26.9 ppg) and 10th in the NFL with 368.2 yards per game
- Helped QB Andy Dalton throw for a career-high 5 TDs vs. NYJ (10/27)

2012: (CINCINNATI BENGALS – 16/16, 1/1)

- Started every game at right guard in his rookie campaign...Helped Bengals RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis eclipse 100 rushing yards four times over a five-game span from Week 11-15
- Blocked for a rushing attack that tallied a season-high 221 rushing yards vs. Oak. (11/25)

- Played in 43 career games at Wisconsin (36 starts)
- Earned first-team All-America honors as a senior in 2011
- Helped the Badgers to consecutive Big Ten titles and Rose Bowl berths in his junior and senior seasons (2010-11)
- Based on team film study, did not allow a sack in his collegiate career
- Majored in kinesiology

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Attended Wisconsin Lutheran (Milwaukee, WI) HS, where he started for a team that twice finished 13-1
- Was named Little Ten Conference Linemen of the Year as a senior
- Ranked as the third-best player in Wisconsin and No. 39 offensive lineman in the nation by *Rivals.com*. . . Also ranked the fourth-best player in the state and 22nd-best offensive lineman in the nation by *Scout.com*
- Also was a two-year member of the wrestling team and one-year participant in track & field
- Member of the National Honor Society
