— COLLEGE —

- Finished fourth all time among Oregon TEs with 1,225 career receiving yards and became just the eighth TE in school history to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards in their career
- Finished with career totals of 74 receptions for 1,225 yards and 13 TDs...Secured a reception in 30 career games, including 24 grabs over 20 yards
- As a senior in 2019, led Pac-12 TEs with 6 receiving TDs, despite playing just six games...Was also one of only six FBS TEs to have 2 receiving TDs in two different games
- Appeared in 12 games (10 starts) as a junior and notched 24 catches for 377 yards and 2 TDs...Ranked third on the team and fourth among Pac-12 TEs in receiving yards...Ranked second on the team with 8 receptions of 20-plus yards
- As a sophomore, recorded 18 catches for 320 yards and a team-high 5 TDs (4 of which exceeded 20 yards), which tied for the Pac-12 lead for TDs among TEs...Led the team with 7 catches of 20-plus yards and averaged 17.8 yards per catch, good for fourth in the Pac-12 among players with at least 15 receptions
- As a redshirt freshman in 2016, saw action in 11 games...His first collegiate reception went for a career-long 63 yards against Washington State
- Graduated with a degree in mathematics

— HIGH SCHOOL/PERSONAL —

- Prepped at Trabuco Hills (Mission Viejo, CA) HS, where after initially playing QB for the Mustangs, he moved to WR and set school records for career TD receptions (22), receiving yards in a single game (208), season (1,028) and career (1,940), and most receptions in one game (14)
- His late father, Garrett, played LB at USC and was selected in the 10th round of the 1986 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Rams
- Roomed with Chargers 2020 first-round pick QB Justin Herbert in college

— COLLEGE —

- A three-year starter (2017-19) at center who was heralded for his leadership, strength and durability as an anchor of Missouri's offensive line...Started all 38 games of his career before declaring for the NFL Draft following his junior year
- Started all 12 contests in 2019 and was part of an O-line that helped the Tigers' rushing attack average 151.7 yards per game
- Started all 13 games at center in 2018 and was a key performer for an O-line that helped the offense rank 13th nationally (third in the SEC) in total offense (481.8 avg.), 18th nationally (third in the SEC) in scoring (36.6 ppg) and 18th nationally (third in the SEC) in third-down conversions (46.4)...The Tigers also ranked sixth nationally (first in the SEC) in fewest TFL allowed (4.0 avg.) and eighth nationally (first in the SEC) in fewest sacks allowed (1.0 avg.)
- Earned SEC All-Freshman honors after starting all 13 games at center in his first year (2017) of game action...Was also named the team's 2017 Team Underclassman Leadership Award recipient...Mizzou led the SEC (eighth nationally) in total offense (502.2 ypg) for the second-straight season...The O-line led the country in fewest TFL allowed (2.85 avg.) for the second-straight season and led the SEC (fifth nationally) in fewest sacks allowed (1.00 avg.)
- Redshirted in 2016...Impressed Missouri coaches with his dedication in the weight room and was awarded the team's Lifter of the Year award at the postseason honors banquet

## — COLLEGE —

- Played in 42 games (35 starts) on the Tar Heels' defensive line, registering 128 tackles (51 solo), 15.5 TFL, 7 sacks, 1 FF and 1 FR
- Started all 13 games as a senior and earned All-ACC honorable mention honors after recording 50 tackles (23 solo) and 3 sacks...Added 9 TFL, which tied for second most on the team...His 91.2 run defense grade was the best among Power 5 interior D-linemen, according to *Pro Football Focus*
- In 2018, appeared in only two games after suffering an injury in fall camp
- As a sophomore in 2017, started all 12 games at DT and tallied 29 tackles (12 solo), 5 TFL, 3 sacks and 1 FR
- Played in all 13 games (10 starts) as a redshirt freshman and finished with 42 tackles (15 solo), 1.5 TFL and 1 sack...Made a career-high 10 tackles (5 solo) and earned his first-career sack in a 41-7 win vs. The Citadel
- In 2015, granted a medical redshirt after playing in just two games before suffering a season-ending knee injury
- Earned bachelor's degrees in economics and management and society

## — HIGH SCHOOL/PERSONAL —

- Prepped at Stone Bridge (Ashburn, VA) HS, earning first-team 5A All-State honors and All-Metro honorable mention as a senior
- Collected 69 total tackles and 8 sacks as a junior, helping his team reach the Virginia 5A North Region Semifinals
- Finished third in the state wrestling championships his junior year
