— KEY TRANSACTIONS —

- Signed to Baltimore's 53-man roster from the practice squad on 10/12/20
- Activated from the practice squad (standard elevation) on 10/10/20 (vs. Cin.)
- Signed to the Ravens' practice squad on 9/6/20
- Waived by Baltimore on 9/5/20
- Signed with the Ravens as a undrafted rookie free agent on 4/30/20

— CAREER HIGHLIGHTS —

- In 2021, saw action in 12 games (one start at center), helping block for the NFL's sixth-ranked offense (378.8 ypg) and third-best rushing attack (145.8 ypg)
- Started at center in two games during his rookie campaign in 2020, filling in for C Patrick Mekari...Helped block for the NFL's No. 1 rushing attack (191.9 ypg), which produced the third-most yards (3,071) ever in a 16-game NFL season...Baltimore owned the seventh-best scoring offense (29.3 ppg) and fourth-best third-down offense (48.8%)...The Ravens also tallied a franchise-record 24 rushing TDs
- Started at center in place of the injured C Patrick Mekari (back) and helped block for an offense that totaled a franchise-record 404 rushing yards in the 38-3 win at Cin. (1/3/21)...The 404 rushing yards stand as the fourth most in an NFL game since 1950 and the second most since the 1970 merger
- Started at center in his NFL debut, seeing all 54 offensive snaps at Pit. (12/2/20)

— PERSONAL —

- In 2016, impressed Missouri coaches with his dedication in the weight room and was awarded the team's Lifter of the Year award at the postseason honors banquet
- Chose Mizzou over offers from Iowa State, Minnesota, Illinois and Rutgers

2021: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 12/1)

- Saw action in 12 games (one start at center), helping block for the NFL's sixth-ranked offense (378.8 ypg) and third-best rushing attack (145.8 ypg)
- Made his first start of the season vs. LAR (1/2/22), seeing all 71 of the offensive snaps at center
- Saw 26 snaps at center in relief of Bradley Bozeman, who left the game with a back injury, and helped block for a rushing attack that totaled 187 yards and 3 TDs in the 34-6 win vs. LAC (10/17)

2020: (BALTIMORE RAVENS – 2/2, 0/0)

- Started at center in two games during his rookie campaign, filling in for C Patrick Mekari...Helped block for the NFL's No. 1 rushing attack (191.9 ypg), which produced the third-most yards (3,071) ever in a 16-game NFL season...Baltimore owned the seventh-best scoring offense (29.3 ppg) and fourth-best third-down offense (48.8%)...The Ravens also tallied a franchise-record 24 rushing TDs
- Started at center in place of the injured C Patrick Mekari (back) and helped block for an offense that totaled a franchise-record 404 rushing yards in the 38-3 win at Cin. (1/3/21)...The 404 rushing yards stand as the fourth most in an NFL game since 1950 and the second most since the 1970 merger...Baltimore registered its fifth-consecutive victory to earn the franchise's third-straight playoff berth
- Started at center in his NFL debut, seeing all 54 offensive snaps at Pit. (12/2)

— COLLEGE —

- A three-year starter (2017-19) at center who was heralded for his leadership, strength and durability as an anchor of Missouri's offensive line...Started all 38 games of his career before declaring for the NFL Draft following his junior year
- Started all 12 contests in 2019 and was part of an O-line that helped the Tigers' rushing attack average 151.7 ypg
- Started all 13 games at center in 2018 and was a key performer for an O-line that helped the offense rank 13th nationally (third in the SEC) in total offense (481.8 avg.), 18th nationally (third in the SEC) in scoring (36.6 ppg) and 18th nationally (third in the SEC) in third-down conversions (46.4)...The Tigers also ranked sixth nationally (first in the SEC) in fewest TFL allowed (4.0 avg.) and eighth nationally (first in the SEC) in fewest sacks allowed (1.0 avg.)
- Earned SEC All-Freshman honors after starting all 13 games at center in his first year (2017) of game action...Was also named the team's 2017 Team Underclassman Leadership Award recipient...Mizzou led the SEC (eighth nationally) in total offense (502.2 ypg) for the second-straight season...The O-line led the country in fewest TFL allowed (2.85 avg.) for the second-straight season and led the SEC (fifth nationally) in fewest sacks allowed (1.00 avg.)
- Redshirted in 2016
- Majored in parks, recreation and sport

— HIGH SCHOOL —

- Prepped at Webb City (MO) HS, helping the football team capture three state championships
- Was a multi-sport athlete who also played basketball
